London Crusaders

Colin Atkinson: Signed from Halifax, this very fast centre/wing has extensive experience of the game. Previously with Keighley and Bramley. Former student international. Will frighten a few defenders this season.

Ben Beevers: Signed from Halifax to be in contention for a first-team place today. Highly experienced, hard-tackling front rower.

Shane Buckley: Recruited by Struddy from Valleys, Brisbane. A current Queensland representative side member. Extremely capable full-back/centre whose pace and positional skills will enthral Crusaders supporters.

Lachlan Churchill: Came into the side last season after the departure of Craig Grauf, and looked the part of a tricky, play-making half-back. Sparkled at Barrow last season when given added responsibility, and should develop under Struddy even more this year. One to watch.

Nick Halafihi: Fast-moving second-row forward with an eye for scoring tries. Started his career with Hull Colts, achieved international honours at student level as well as playing for Sheffield Eagles. Had an impressive debut for the London Crusaders, scoring a try and earning the man of the match award.

Ben Olsen: Crusaders' Great Dane. A convert by the London side from Queensland RU. Set to play an important role in the second row. Has excellent ball-handling skills, and should provide some of the penetration lacking from the side last year.

Darryl Pitt: Well known to Cumbrian RL followers from his Carlisle days, Darryl was Crusaders' top try-scorer last season. Has formed a strong centre partnership with Mick Taylor. Interception tries a speciality, and always quick to spot an opening.

Steve Rosolen: Originally with Bundaberg and then Brisbane Norths for three years. He spent his last two years with North Sydney playing in the grand final reserve grade winning side. A new and exciting second-row/loose forward looking forward to a successful career with London Crusaders.

Dave Rotheram: Very consistent performer during 1990-91, at hooker. Has come through the ranks as a student international, and continues to be a reliable and valuable team member. May well convert to prop this season, but will in any event provide quality in the forwards.

Chris Smith: Former RU full-back who Studdy is converting into a second-row forward. London-based, Chris originates from Northampton. Fast and mobile, definitely one to watch this season.

Mick Taylor: Highly-rated centre, who followed Studdy south from Halifax, having gained considerable experience at Thrum Hall and at Oldham, where he began his professional career. Reliable and consistent, Mick is a firm favourite with Crusaders fans.

Bernie Wilkinson: Played extremely well for the club during 1990-91, and was another Struddy recruit from former club Halifax. What has been Halifax's loss has certainly been Crusaders' gain, and much more is expected from him this season.

Jason Wing: Resigned from the Great Britain Olympic bobsleigh squad to join Crusaders. A nationally ranked sprinter (100m) and long jumper. Appropriately earmarked for the left-wing slot, and set to become a crowd-pleaser if potential fulfilled.

Glen Workman: Coached the Alliance Side for part of last season, but decided that he could still make a valuable contribution to the first team. Never stops running; a strong motivating hooker who is set to make Crusaders tick at the play-the-ball.

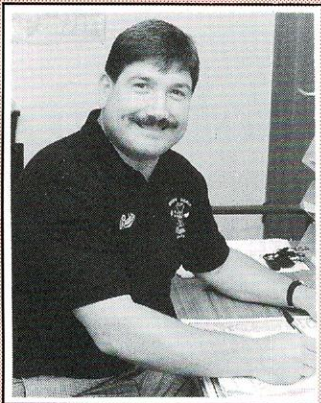

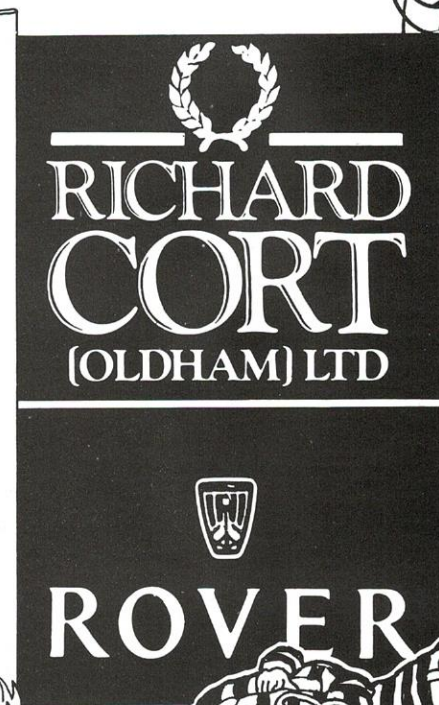

RECORD MONEY FOR REGAL TROPHY SILVER JUBILEE

THE Regal Trophy celebrates 25 years of sponsorship with a record £300,000 investment in this year's competition. £180,000 of this total will be handed out in prize money with the winner of the trophy picking up a cheque for £32,000.

THE draw for the second round of the Regal Trophy will be broadcast live on the BBC's Radio Five sports programme on Monday from the Rugby League headquarters in Leeds at 7.45 a.m. on Monday, 18th November. Making the draw are the League's chairman, Bob Ashby, deputy chairman Rodney Walker and chief executive David Oxley.

LONDON CRUSADERS 'UNENVIABLE RECORD'

LONDON Crusaders, formerly known as Fulham, have the longest run of not appearing in the second round of the Regal Trophy. Their last appearance was in the club's first season way back in 1980-81. Wigan and St. Helens hold the records for the most consecutive appearances in the second round dating back to the 1981-82 season.



EAGLES' WINNING STREAK

SHEFFIELD Eagles, Oldham promotion rivals and runaway leaders of the second division, have the longest unbeaten run in the League, stretching back to nine matches. This includes eight games in the Second Division, including the recent victory at Water-sheddings, and one Regal Trophy cup-tie. Nottingham City have the longest losing streak, covering 18 matches. The club's last victory was against Runcorn Highfield.

SCORERS

WIGAN'S David Myers is the current top try-scorer with 14 touchdowns. He is followed by Halifax winger Greg Austin (13) and Paul Newlove (Featherstone Rovers) and John Devereux (Widnes), who have 12 each.

Dewsbury's Chris Vasey heads the goalscoring list with 52, followed closely by Bramley's Steve Carroll, who has 51, and Hull's Paul Eastwood, with 50.

The leading scorers in the league are Jonathan Davies (Widnes) and Paul Eastwood (Hull), who both have 124 points.

SPOTLIGHT ON IAN SHERRATT



A FAMILIAR face returned to Oldham last week in a move that took the Rugby League world by surprise when popular forward Ian Sherratt rejoined Oldham after two years with Salford. Big Ian, whose massive 16 and a half stone, 6' 3" frame will add power and aggression to the Oldham front row, signed last weekend in a straightforward exchange deal that took Austin Donegan to Salford.

He went straight into the side to play Workington and had an impressive debut in the Oldham pack. A pleasant reminder of the match is a nasty looking black eye. "My ambition for the season is to help Oldham win promotion although it is going to be a hard campaign," says the 25-year-old bachelor.

Having signed a two-year deal with the club, Ian is looking forward to teaming up with Tim Street to give the Oldham front a bite that will take them back into the first division in an increasingly tough division.

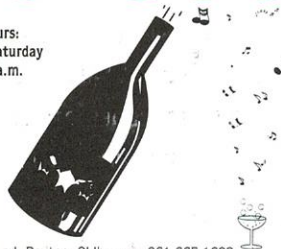

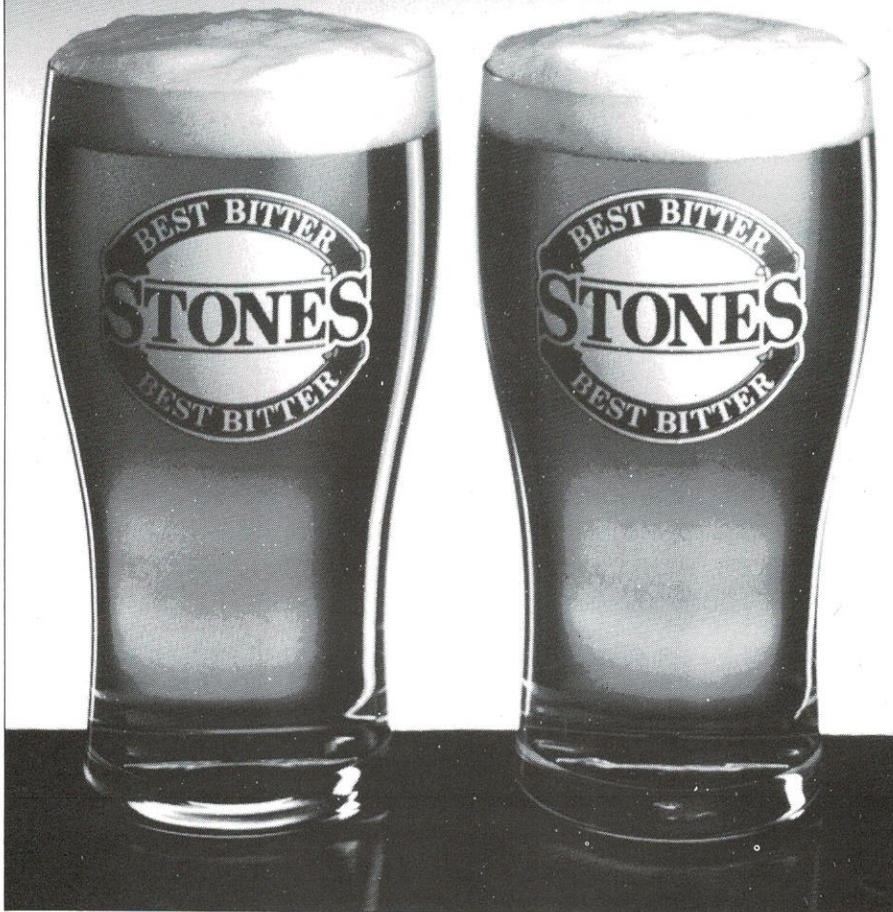

FOLLOWING our home win against Featherstone, the 'A' team gave a terrific gutsy display against Workington at Derwent Park to collect two points and pull away from the relegation zone. The first team match at Leigh during midweek meant that I was unable to announce a team until 18 hours before the game, and injuries and call-ups to the first team for the home game against Workington certainly depleted our forward strength, at least on paper.

The lightweight pack consisting of only two recognised forwards — Barrie McDermott and Craig Mort; three half-backs — Ian Bates, Jake Green and Mark Mulligan; and Darrel Rogers at prop (he started the season as a winger) showed true character and determination against a huge Cumbrian pack. The Workington team was certainly a different proposition from the team that lost 84-6 at Watersheddings earlier in the season.

Several minutes later Dave Pitts scored a fine individual try with a kick and chase over the full-back from the half-way line. Paul Hourigan landed both goals to give us a 16-2 lead. In the last 20 minutes, however, the sheer size of the Cumbrian forwards began to tell, and they hit back with two tries. The attitude of the lads shone through, though, and they held on to win 16-12.

**A LOOK AT THE PAST —
40 YEARS AGO**

IN 1951-52 Oldham's programme would have set you back 2d (less than 1p). It consisted of eight pages, most of them being advertising. Among the regular advertisers in the programmes of the fifties were the UCP cafe on High Street; Jack Errock, Window Cleaning Contractor; Stanton's Travel Agents; G. Barlow & Sons and Haigh's Marine Stores at Cross Street.

Braddock's Chemists, Manchester Street, advertised Hair Restorer "for increasing the growth of hair, preventing it from falling out, and restoring grey or faded hair to its natural colour!" Price — 1/8½d a bottle (9p). H. C. Cooke Sports of Manchester had rugby jerseys at 15/11d (c80p), shorts at 10/6d (c52p) and socks at 5/6d (27p). British Rail were running trains to Rochdale for the match on January 19th. Fares 1/1d (less than 6p).

Regular pubs advertising were the Black Swan at Mumps, The Regent at Market Place and The Wellington and Highfield on Ripponden Road.

On January 5th, 1952, Oldham entertained Widnes with a 2.15 kick-off and recorded a 24-7 victory. Jack Keith, Terry O'Grady and W. Mitchell scored tries, with Bernard Ganley landing six goals. Widnes replied with a try by Hill and two goals from Jolley.

The teams were: Oldham — Ganley, Platt, Mitchell, Davies, O'Grady, Warham, Stirrup, Ogden, Keith, Jackson, Winslade, Anthony, Goldswain. Widnes — Sale, Dawson, Shaw, Jolley, Hill, Hazelhurst, Anderson, Naughton, Hayes, Wilcox, De Witt, Lamb, Worthington.

Oldham were enjoying a successful season. Over the holiday period Keighley and Swinton were beaten and Workington, the reigning RL champions, lost 3-0 at Watersheddings on Boxing Day. However, the Roughyeds lost heavily at Bradford on December 29th. Oldham eventually finished the season in fifth place in a 31 club league with a record which read P36 W25 D1 L10 F558 A331 Pts51. Bradford Northern finished first with 57 points, while Workington were eighth on 46.
