TODAY'S OPPONENTS

Oldham have gone, indeed are going through a transitional phase with new faces appearing as Peter Tunks looks for the right formula. We can welcome back to Hornets Logan Edwards who has joined Oldham for a month and also Shane Tupaea who played one game two years ago.

OLDHAM PEN PICS

Shaun Allen A hard-working member of the pack, Shaun joined Oldham from St. Helens in the Tony Barrow era. He has figured in many of Oldham's most important matches in recent seasons and has returned to the senior squad under Peter Tunks after impressing in pre-season training.

Ian Bates Dewsbury boy and the nephew of former GB internationals, Alan and John Bates. Small, but with the heart of a lion. Basically a scrum-half, but can play at stand-off, hooker or even full-back, anywhere in fact, where he is asked to worry the opposition.

David Bradbury Signed from Leigh Miners after touring New Zealand with the BARLA under-19 squad, David is a strong-running loose-forward, who impressed on Oldham's pre-season tour of France.

Gary Burns Stand-off or scrum-half, Gary is a typical Widnesian and a typical half-back ... cheeky, with a touch of humour! Reminds one a lot of Ray Ashton at his age and if he plays as well, he'll do all right. Toured New Zealand with BARLA.

Richard Irving A blockbusting winger from the Huddersfield area, Richard won youth international honours before turning pro for Oldham in Eric Fitzsimons's first spell at Watersheddings. Played regularly in the first team for the past couple of seasons.

Chris Joynt A young man from Wigan whom Oldham believe will have a big future. Chris is 19 and he joined Oldham after winning county youth honours in the same team as Tony Barrow junior. Went to Australia last summer, along with his Oldham colleagues Paddy Mitchell and Richard Pachniuk, to play for a NSW country team.

Charlie McAlister A New Zealander, Charlie signed for Oldham three years ago from Bradford and Bingley RU club in Yorkshire. Can play centre or second-row and is also a good goal-kicker. A powerful man, Charlie has played in Australia and has just been appointed as the club's vice-captain.

Barrie McDermott Strong and powerful despite his 19 years, local boy Barrie is yet another member of the BARLA squad to throw in his lot with Oldham. He is a dedicated young professional and he's quickly made enough impression to earn a place on the bench in Oldham's early season matches.

Tommy Martyn A player of exciting potential, Tommy is the son of former Leigh, Warrington and GB forward Tommy Martyn and the nephew of Mick Martyn, who set scoring records as a forward with Leigh in the early 80's. He is a stand-off or centre, who can 'sniff' tries out of nothing — a 'poacher' of the Rugby League variety who can turn a match at a stroke.

Vince Nicklin An Aussie with a New Zealander's passport. Vince came to Oldham from Sydney via Limoux in France. Sort that one out! As a boy he played with St. George and Easts in Sydney, before making a name for himself in France and then joining Oldham in the summer. Currently playing full-back, but can also operate at half-back, stand-off or in the centre.

Richard Pachniuk a 20 year old from Dewsbury with Polish grandparents, Richard starred in the 'A' team last season, did well pre-season in France and made his debut in the first home game of the current season against Leigh. A clever, creative, thinking type of hooker, he is expected to go a long way.

Tim Street Career followed a similar pattern to Russell's. Local lad he signed for Wigan and then moved to Leigh and Swinton before joining Oldham in the summer in a swap move, with John Fairbank and Neil Clawson going to Station Road. A strong prop, Tim earned GB Colts and Under 21 honours during his Wigan days.

Steve Warburton Steve was the BARLA open age international stand-off last season. He signed for Oldham from Warrington amateur club Woolston and made his debut as substitute against Hull in the last match of last season. Did well and enhanced his reputation further in France. A clever attacking player with poise and class.

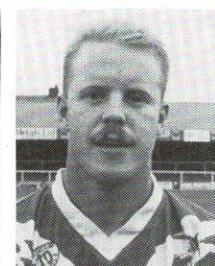

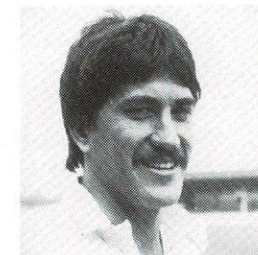

LEAGUE ROUND-UP

Following an enforced absence from the league activities, this week we can look back at the league so far. In the first division, St Helens have sneaked into a lead over Widnes, who have a game in hand, and Leeds. It is quite surprising to see Wigan in fifth position having lost four of their nine games. In fact there is a whole pack of teams on 10 points including two of the promoted teams, Halifax and Salford. Two points adrift are the Humberside Clubs followed by Featherstone (now coached by Allan Agar), Swinton and finally Bradford Northern who must wonder what has hit them since the return of the prodigal son, Peter Fox. Fox must also be wondering if his move was a good career decision as Northern are struggling in the League. In the second division, Sheffield have stormed into pole position with some brilliant attacking Rugby. After a somewhat shaky start Leigh have proven they cannot be discounted at the end of the season, but a loss at Crystal Palace last week gives Hornets a chance should we win our two games in hand. Oldham have gone through a sticky patch and now have 10 points from 10 games, and the early

season pace makers Carlisle and Workington seem to have fallen away, Workington's demise being excused by an horrendous injury list which makes Liverpool FC's look small. Finally in division two, Ryedale York gained their first point, as you all know, against Hornets, putting up a vastly improved performance — this following the return of some key players.

The third division is dominated by the heavy woolen district of Dewsbury & Batley plus Leeds (in the shape of Hunslet and Bramley). Scarborough are showing well in their first season.

Whilst Doncaster are struggling to show the form which made them title contenders at the start of the season, Whitehaven and Highfield have not produced the form they are capable of, Highfield especially have not continued their early season form which started with 2 wins from 2 games. To close, spare a thought for Chorley, Trafford Borough and Nottingham City. No wins, over 1000 points conceded between them, and not as many points scored as Hornets. Things can only get better.

REGAL TROPHY — THIRD ROUND

Featherstone Rovers are the only club in the last eight of the Regal Trophy who have never appeared in the semi-finals since the competition began in 1971-72 although this is their fourth appearance in the third round.

Widnes have made the most semi-final appearances with a total of 11, including last season when they were beaten.

LEADING SCORERS

Deryck Fox of Featherstone Rovers has gone to the top of the goals chart with 64 after totalling 17 in three Regal Trophy ties in six days.

Greg Austin of Halifax remains at the top of the try chart with 17 and Jonathan Davies is still the leading point scorer with 152 from 10 tries and 56 goals.

TRY SCORING RUN

Mark Preston of Halifax has the current longest try scoring run covering seven successive matches. The winger's sequence has brought him ten tries as follows:

1-4-1-1-1-1-1

Preston's centre partner, Greg Austin, has scored in six successive matches as follows:

5-1-2-1-3-1

Salford winger Tex Evans has scored one try in each of their last five matches.

Injury ended John Devereux's try scoring run for Widnes at seven matches and Paul Newlove's sequence for Featherstone Rovers stopped at five when he failed to score in the drawn Regal Trophy match at Bramley.

POINT SCORING SEQUENCE

Barry Vickers of Carlisle holds the current longest point scoring run covering 21 matches. The full back's sequence began with eight goals in a 52-14 Second Division win at Trafford Borough on 24 March 1991.

WINNING RUN

Sheffield Eagles' winning run ended at ten matches when they lost 44-10 at Bradford Northern in the Regal Trophy second round.

Salford now have the longest winning run of five successive matches covering three Stones Bitter Championship games and two Regal Trophy ties.

LOSING RUN

Nottingham city have the current longest losing run covering 19 matches. City's last win was 20-14 at home to Runcorn Highfield on 3 March 1991. Since then they have lost eight matches in the Second Division last season, nine in the Third Division, a John Smiths Yorkshire Cup tie and a Regal Trophy tie.

MILESTONES

Mike Fletcher needs eight points for a club career total of 1000 for Hull KR.

Phil Ford of Leeds needs three tries for a career total of 200.

RUGBY LEAGUE ACADEMY

The last game of Phase 1 of the Academy was played on Friday 22 November, when Widnes defeated Salford by 24-12 to secure a position in the First Division for Phase 2 which begins on Saturday 30 November.

SPORTING COMMENT

One of the greatest sights in modern day Rugby League is that of Martin Offiah in full flight; the effortless glide as he eats up the ground, the hopelessly beaten opponents trailing in his wake, the superlatives gushing from the lips of commentators the world over and the awe on the face of his hero worshipping fans as they salute yet another masterpiece of scoring.

His well documented dispute with his current employers, Widnes, apparently for no reason, has often been the media's only coverage of Rugby League. This we can do without and the only person capable of ending this sorry tale is Mr Offiah himself. I feel that if he does not listen to some good advice soon, the game will lose one of its greatest ever exponents.

The presence of that scourge of modern day sport, the agent, does not appear to be helping the situation and one wonders where this particular chap was when Martin Offiah's 10 year contract was being negotiated. One would like to think that the agent is looking for the best deal for his client, but many horror stories from other sources would suggest that a percentage cut from any deal could be a motivating force! This, of course, is not to discount the age old problem of player "tapping".

Whatever people may be thinking now, it appears that Widnes took an almighty gamble in the first place by offering such a large and long contract to an untried player. If Widnes had "cut" Offiah after 4 years of a failed experiment, the breach of contract would have been the clubs and Offiah would have had legal grounds to sue. As it is, Widnes have him on a watertight contract which originally he was happy to sign and which has about 5 years to run. Widnes have therefore, the right to place him on the transfer market at whatever price THEY see fit — a tribunal will not be required for a few years yet.

The only person able to resolve this situation is Martin Offiah. If greed is his motivation, then he will come off the worse when bonuses fail to appear. His international career is, at present, over and the fat overseas contract will not be forthcoming, likewise TV appearances.

Widnes are quite within their rights to freeze him out of ANY sport and, after all, are currently enjoying a great start to the league and Regal campaign without him. As an Offiah fan however, there are three questions I would love to put to him;

1. Who in the World of RL would make as many scoring opportunities for him as Widnes? After all this is the one thing upon which he thrives and upon which his fame is based.
2. Having himself valued three years of his service at £600,000, who can he see being able to justify that contract money to the rest of their first team squad?
3. Who in their right mind would shell out a total sum in excess of a million quid in a "legally binding contract" for a man who appears not to know the meaning of the phrase.

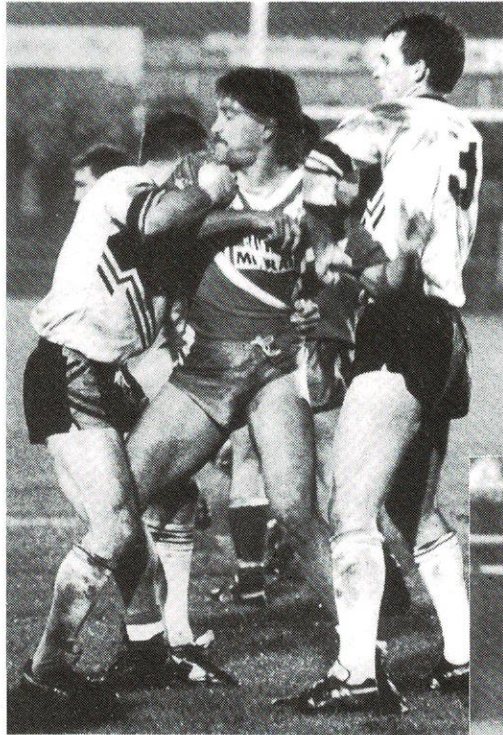
