



DOWN AT THE GRASS ROOTS - PIP BURKE

Christmas didn't come early for the York & District junior league with just one outstanding game to play York have failed to record a win at any age level from Under 9 through to U 15.

The sad statistic is that York played nearly 20 matches against three West Riding towns with the experience and organisation of their opponents coming through every time.

With just four junior club set-ups in York, the city was always going to be at a big disadvantage, and until there is a much wider choice, York are always likely to struggle.

At least York's youngsters were given their chances to show their individual talent to the league's selectors who shortly announce their squads to take on North West Counties and Humberside leagues.

This has been made possible by some enthusiastic local coaches who are prepared to give up their time for the betterment of amateur rugby league football.

The inquest into York's performances has already begun with that new junior league headed by former York Directors Peter Gerarghty (President) and Paul Duffield (Chairman) planning the way forward for junior rugby in and around York.

Some well-attended meetings have brought about plenty of constructive comments but the overall opinion is that York needs more youngsters playing the game - quantity must bring quality - and more coaching, hopefully on the lines of schools of excellence.

This all takes time, money and more adult help, and following an initial £25 donation from the member clubs Heworth, Clifton Moor, All Blacks and Acorn the league are shortly to approach the York and District league for financial help which could come from their relatively new Development Fund.

Everyone recognises that junior and youth rugby is such a vital area and though York have followed the national trend of a big boost in teams this season more is needed.

As has been said many times in the past everyone will benefit in the long term.

The local open-age Sunday league needs new blood fast with teams decreasing each season to a point that with any more teams falling by the wayside or opting for Saturday rugby then the league will fold.

As a starting point for players making the transition from schoolboy/youth to open-age this competition must be kept going at all costs. Thankfully, plenty in the city are now pulling in the same direction with Ryedale-York doing their bit by encouraging the youngsters with curtain raisers.

Today brings Acorn U13s playing Clifton Moor U13 in a match that also takes in Yorkshire League points.


Leaving the junior scene the open-age have been involved in cup and representative rugby with Southlands 'A' and Hartlepool making it to the first Sunday final and Acorn waiting for the winners of Heworth and Civil Service in a Saturday final.


It's a big day today for Ryedale York Director Peter Warters who takes his National inter-league open-age side to Wakefield for the semi-finals.

Ray Ashton's dismissal as coach of Workington Town was a major shock. At the start of the season he was hailed as one of the rising young coaches who had transformed the fortunes of the Cumbrians. Widnes were beaten in the first round of the Lancashire Cup and our own Ryedale-York were thrashed at home in the opening league match. Most people reckoned promotion beckoned and Ashton was picked as Lancashire coach. But inexplicably a run of bad results set in and after the 35-2 defeat at home at the hands of Sheffield, the Workington board swung the axe. It seems they want someone to add enthusiasm just three months after he was being praised to the rafters.

Bradford Northern's move to Valley Parade seems to be growing ever more certain. Rugby League's decision to give Odsal the thumbs down and stage the Regal Trophy semi-final at Valley Parade was another kick in the teeth. Reports from Bradford seem to only add top the confusion. Peter Fox has back-tracked on earlier comments in favour of the move while my spies inform me that half Bradford say they'll never go to Valley Parade while the other half say they're fed up with Odsal's bleak stadium and won't go there.

Hull have sacked Aussie stand-off

Wayne Portlock, another from Down Under to find the game in Pommie land is a little harder than they reckoned. Still no news at the time of print about John Gallagher joining London Crusaders on loan. Ryedale-York made a tentative inquiry and were quoted at least £1,000 a match to meet his contract payments! The Londoners claim to have sponsorship from Air New Zealand and Kiwi brewers, Steinlager, for Gallagher.

Another coach on the move is Norman Turley, who resigned from Trafford Borough. The club has also lost director and former chairman, Mike Marsland, but deny their future is in jeopardy despite embarrassingly-low gates and humiliating results. Instead they revealed they were making plans to move back to Blackpool.

Leeds reject, Eddie Rombo, is proving a snip for his new club Dewsbury. He scored a debut try with his first touch of the ball against Scarborough and followed up with the winner. A third try was added in the defeat of Huddersfield.

Salford coach Kevin Tamati has told the club he will return to New Zealand when his contract expires at the end of the 1993 season. He is front-runner to coach Auckland, expected to be the first New Zealand team to play in Australia's top competition, the Winfield Cup.

ALASTAIR YEOMANS TALKING RAL



There is something that has been rankling with some of you for some time - the lack of Ryedale York commentaries on BBC Radio York when they play away from home.

I'd like to explain why.

Before this season coverage of the Wasps was carried in Rugby League North, a programme originated from Leeds which concentrated on all the teams in Yorkshire.

We were lucky to hear more than five or six reports on York during a Sunday afternoon.

At the beginning of this season I negotiated a deal with the BBC so that Radio York could launch its own Rugby league programme entitled Rugby League Sunday, which would concentrate on York and the Scarborough Pirates.

I was committed to providing full, live commentaries on the home games of our two teams, which I hope

are enjoyable.

I admit it would be more valuable to have live commentaries, but there are technical difficulties involved in this, although I do promise to increase coverage of York's away games wherever possible.

There is also a question of cost. I AM the sports department at York and only have the budget to buy in one other reporter and a technical operator for every Rugby league Sunday programme.

I believe that we should have our own Rugby League programme for North Yorkshire and fear that the amount of coverage we would get for the Wasps and the Pirates would be negligible if we returned to Leeds based programmes - especially if the unthinkable happens and both teams are in the Third Division.
