

Our visitors this New Year's Day afternoon are Oldham and we would like to extend the compliments of the season to the players, officials and supporters of the Roughyeds.

Peter Tinks' side were in action on Boxing Day at home to Rochdale when they were hoping to avenge a shock home defeat suffered at the hands of the Hornets earlier in the campaign.

Former Australian test prop-forward Tinks, who last season played for Salford and Sheffield, has had a hard introduction to coaching as he has been forced to rebuild the Oldham side after they were relegated in 1990-91.

A number of experienced players have been shed as Oldham turn to youth and attempt to build for the future. Former Oldham hooker Andy Ruane has certainly proved a fine acquisition for Leigh and has been in outstanding form of late.

Brett Clark moved on to Rochdale, last season's player-coach John Fieldhouse joined Halifax, Mike Ford went of Castleford, Paul Round to Wakefield and Austin Donegan to Salford. At the time of writing Oldham were reportedly on the verge of swapping Kiwi Charlie McAlister for Castleford's Martin Ketteridge and Aussie Graham Bradley while Neil Holding was interesting Trafford.

Newcomers have included the versatile

Vince Nicklin, an Aussie who made his name playing in France, Richard Pachnuik, a prolific try-scoring hooker from Dewsbury who made a fine start to his pro career before sadly being sidelined by appendicitis, and Ged Byrne, the talented former Salford, Wigan and Wakefield back.

Prop Tim Street came to his hometown club from Swinton while lan Sherratt, so impressive against Leigh in the Lancashire Cup last season, returned to the Watersheddings from Salford. Sean Tyrer is a recent additions, joining Oldham from Wigan where his first-team opportunities were limited. Wigan-born Chris Joynt, still only 19, looks a fine forward prospect and has been joined in the pack by other BARLA youth products Barrie McDermott and Leigh-born Dave Bradbury. Another youngster signed from local amateur rugby, Paddy Mitchell, has also been given his chance.

Former Leigh star John Henderson, fine servant to the Hilton Park club and a prolific try-scorer, now finds himself one of the longest-serving players at the club, such has been the turnover in personnel in recent months. It said much for the introduction of new players that 21-year-old scrum-half Neil Flanagan, a former amateur youth international, has been appointed club captain.

After the famine came the feast. Leigh, without a game at Hilton Park for over 6 weeks, began a run of 3 home matches in the space of 11 days with a thrilling victory to go within one point of leaders Sheffield.

But Kevin Ashcroft's injury-hit side were hanging on desperately at the end as enterprising Hornets staged a dramatic recovery. The visitors looked well out of contention as they trailed 6-24 with only six minutes to go, yet almost snatched a share of the spoils deep in injury time.

Livewire scrum-half Steve Gartland began the revival with a 74th minute try aftr a length-of-the-field movement involving the impressive Brett Clark and Matt Calland. Tony Humphries siezed on a loose ball to score a six-pointer under the posts and then Gartland raced in again for another converted try after Paul Okesene's bursting run.

In the fourth minute of injury time Andrew Collier was penalised at the ruck but Bob Eccles' touchline penalty attempt drifted wide of the posts to leave Leigh the victors and secure them a league double over the Hornets.

"We got out of jail" was Leigh scrumhalf Jason Donohue's honest assessment while coach Ashcroft was also a relieved man. "We had so many players carrying injuries that it was desperation stakes at the end, but overall it was a pleasing display." Full back Paul Topping, with a suspected broken hand, was the worst of Leigh's lengthy casualty list. The dramatic finale overshadowed a confident home performance which, for 70 minutes at least, established a firm hold on the game. Once again Leigh were indebted to the brilliant John Woods, who gave an outstanding display against his former club. He was involved in both Leigh's first-half tries as they established a 12-0 lead.

Leigh stretched their lead to 18-0 when Donohue ducked under an attempted tackle, broke away and sent lan Jeffrey over. Though Hornets replied with a Calland try created by the irrepressible Clark, David Ruane and Topping combined to send Tongan Lee Hansen diving in for his first Leigh try. Woods converted all four scores and his faultless kicking proved decisive in the final analysis.

Leigh's revival is such that, only four months or so after nearly going out of existence, they have their sights set on a championship and premiership double in the New Year.


SOME HOPES FOR 1992

PLAYER PROFILE

JASON DONOHUE

If 1991 was a good year for Jason Donohue, 1992 promises to be even better. Established as one of the game's most outstanding young prospects and a great favourite with the Hilton Park crowd, it is easy to forget that Jason is only 19, such is his maturity and deportment on and off the field.

The selection of the GB Under 21's side for the games against France will be eagerly awaited by Leigh supporters to see if their scrum half's performances have come to the attention of those who matter.


New Year's Day is also memorable for Jason in another sense, not only for the prospect of an exciting game against Oldham and an interesting duel with another fine young prospect, Neil Flanagan, but because this evening Jason and his girlfriend Zoe, daughter of former Leigh coach Billy Benyon, get engaged.

Jason came up through the local school's sides but at one time was nearly lost to the game. His elder brother Nigel won a bronze medal at wrestling in the Commonwealth Games and is now concentrating on Judo with the next Olympics in mind. Jason could have followed in his footsteps.

"I spent a lot of my youth involved in both sports," recall Jason, "but rugby was always my first love. I've always watched Leigh and it was my ambition to play for the club right from being at junior school.

"Judo and wrestling are both tough contact sports and many of the skills and training techniques are similar to those you need at rugby, in particular the tackling side of the game." Jason's outstanding ability to wrap up the man and the ball in a tackle can thus be traced back to his schooldays.

"I was very fortunate to get plenty of good



coaching as a junior from the likes of Leigh school teacher David Jones and then John Prince at the Golborne club. My father John, who was a professional with Leigh in his younger days, has also been a big influence. Sadly his career was ended early by a knee injury and he never quite made the first team."

After playing as an amateur, Jason signed pro. forms in the spring of 1989 and served two years apprenticeship under Bob Beardmore. "Bob was a really big help to me and was always passing on advice and the benefit of his experience."

It was towards the end of that season that Jason emerged as a regular first-teamer and, in a short space of time, quickly bridged the gap between Alliance and firstteam football.

"Having a lot of local lads has certainly boosted team spirit - they are all playing for this club from the heart. After all the summer's trauma we have done well to get to this position and will be looking to maintain our improvement in the New Year.

Up and coming youngsters now want to play for their home town club and the formation of the Academy side will also be a good thing in that it will hopefully provide Leigh with many of their future players.

With the help of our marvellous fans, 1992 should be a good year - certainly everyone at Hilton Park is very optimistic."



PREVIOUS ENCOUNTERS

Oldham return to Hilton Park this New Year's Day afternoon looking to avenge their defeat here a couple of months ago. Tommy Martyn was the Roughyeds' try scorer in a 4-20 reversal. This season is the first time the sides have met in league football since 1986-87 and, since two divisions were reintroduced in 1973, there have been only twot other second division encounters between Leigh and Oldham on this ground.

On 16th February, 1975, Oldham won 18-4 at Hilton Park in front of a crowd of 1867. The visitors had two men sent off but had few problems overcoming a pathetic Leigh effort. Mick Stacey kicked two penalties for Leigh with Oldham's scorers being Phil Larder and David Treasure (tries) with goals from John Blair (4) and Larder. Blair also kicked 2 drop goals.

On 13 November 1977 Leigh recorded a 24-3 victory with John Woods continuing his prolific points scoring, adding a try and 6 goals to his tally. He had now kicked 70 goals and scored 9 tries in the opening 14

games of the season. John McAttee, Dave Macko and Clive Jones also scored tries with Oldham's sole reply coming from Eddie Barton. The crowd was a more healthy 3801.

Leigh and Oldham have met on New Year's Day on only one previous occasion, in 1929, when Leigh recorded a 5-3 victory at Mather Lane.

It was a former Leigh player, Abe Johnson, who opened the scoring with a try for the Roughyeds but Leigh responded strenuously and Dick Higson's try, converted by Tommy Clarkson, decided a hardfought game played in front of 4,000 spectators.
