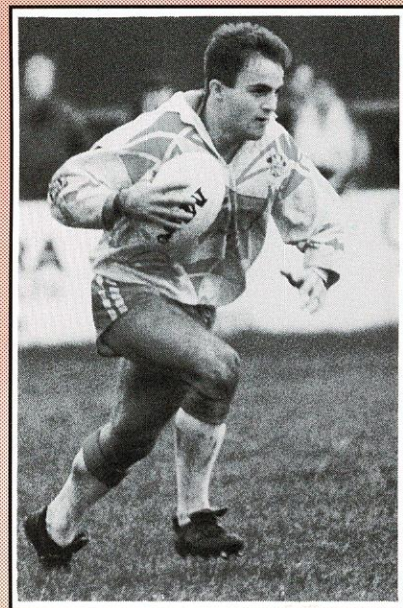
Our form has been good in recent weeks.

A Watersheddings welcome to . . . Sheffield Eagles

Daryl Powell (25): The Eagles' first signing in 1984, Powell has played over 200 games for the club, and has enjoyed success at international level, having played in the last ten Test matches for Great Britain.

Mark Aston (23): Mark is a prolific points scorer who last year achieved his ambition of international selection. A key figure in Eagles' promotion drive.

Mark Gamson (24): The Eagles' second signing in 1984 from Leeds Colts. Mark has occupied every back position and two forward positions in his career.

Anthony Farrell (22): A record signing from Huddersfield. Now settled into the loose forward position with good effect. Ellery Hanley look-a-like with side-step to match.

David Mycoe (19): Had a sensational debut season after joining the Eagles from Criggleston under-17s. Won Great Britain under-21 honours international status last season. Can play full back, centre or stand-off and his talent and pace suggests he could go all the way to the top.

David Close (23): A former county junior at Rugby League and Rugby Union who signed from Pontefract Labour ARLC in 1987.

Richard Price (21): £25,000 signing from Hull at the end of last season. Clever and elusive player who is at home at centre or stand-off.

Paul Broadbent (22): Another recruit from Lock Lane under-19s, Paul has emerged as one of the game's most up-and-coming prop forwards. Very big work rate and an ability to offload the ball suggests that representative honours could come his way.

Mick Cook (29): Rated by many as one of the game's best ever hookers, Mick's terrific tackling displays have alerted the attention of several leading Australian clubs. Another signing from Queens Park ARLC and last season's Player of the Year.

Hugh Waddell (31): A £50,000 signing from Leeds, Hugh has added experience and mobility to the forwards. Well remembered for his Man of the Match award in Great Britain's defeat of Australia in 1988. He is keen to reclaim a Test place this season.

Nick Grimoldby (28): Born in Doncaster, Nick learned his Rugby League in the South before signing to Fulham. Transferred to the Eagles in January, 1989. A powerful running forward with plenty of pace and a sound defence.

Andy Young (25): A former Eastmoor amateur and voted the best-looking player of 1991. Has made his appearances mainly on the wing. A very strong runner and tackler with a good turn of pace, who is settling in well after moving into the forwards.

Simon Rhoades (17): A signing from Bransholme under-17s in Hull. Represented England under-17s and captained Yorkshire. Very pacy and talented player and an excellent goalkicker.

Nick Halafihi (22): A former Hull Colt who signed in 1988. Nick is hoping to pin down a first team place. Very fit and fast forward with an eye for scoring tries.

Tim Wilby (33½): A much-travelled player who joined the Eagles from Hull at the start of this season. A good defender with a neat side-step.

Keith Mumby (33): A signing from Bradford Northern, where he spent 17 seasons and represented Great Britain on many occasions. His vast experience makes him a valuable member of the squad.

David Plange (26): Eagles' signing from Castleford. David is a very strong and fast winger with an eye for the try line. David has represented Great Britain and hopes to further his international career with the Eagles.

Richard Picksley (20): Very fast young winger hoping to establish himself in the first team after some very promising performances.

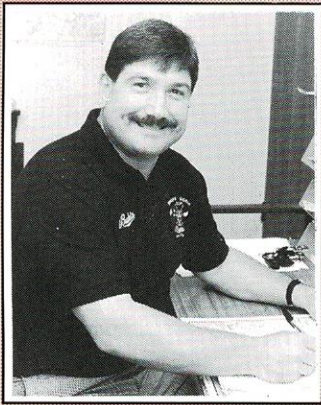

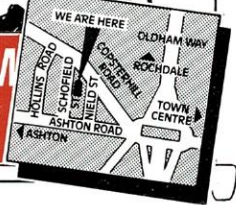

A LOOK AT THE PAST — FIVE YEARS AGO

OLDHAM'S fixture with Wakefield Trinity on January 11th, 1987, was postponed because of the weather, but a week later Oldham defeated the elements by taking their home match against Featherstone Rovers to

Maine Road. The decision was justified when Oldham won a free-flowing encounter on the wide pitch by 20-16. A match-winning cover tackle by Mick Burke lives in the memory from this game. The attendance of 2,719 was below average, but receipts would have been good as only seated accommodation was in use. Oldham's scorers were Foy, Sanderson, Burke and Bridge, with Hobbs landing two goals.

The Oldham team that day was: Burke, Sherman, Foy, Bridge, Taylor, Topliss, Kirwan, Clark, Sanderson, Waddell, Hobbs, Flanagan and Raper. Subs: Edwards and Clawson.

Unfortunately, 1986-7 turned into a relegation season. Oldham collapsed from mid-table respectability to go down fourth from bottom with an inferior scoring record to Leeds. For comparison, Oldham's record read: Played 30, Won 13, Drawn 0, Lost 17, For 554, Against 679, Points 26. Leeds: Played 30, Won 13, Drawn 0, Lost 17, For 565, Against 571, Points 26.

That any team winning 13 matches can be relegated shows how absurd the structure of the Rugby League has been over the years. On this occasion, of course, four sides were relegated and only two promoted in order to reduce the size of the First Division. Hunslet and Swinton were the promoted teams, but neither could bridge the gap and were immediately relegated in 1987-8, while Oldham, under Eric Fitzsimons, came straight back as Champions and Premiership winners. However, what the yo-yo systems reveals is the impossibility of establishing any kind of continuity of playing fortunes, with massive turnovers of players either to cut costs if relegated or to mount a

challenge if promoted. This instability has driven the middle range of clubs — notably Leigh, Halifax, Oldham, Swinton, Barrow, Hull KR, Wakefield and York — to the brink of extinction and surely cannot be for the long-term good of the game.

With hindsight, of course, Oldham contributed to their own demise. The premature announcement of Frank Myler's decision to leave the club undermined morale and Oldham lost their last six matches when a point from anyone would have condemned Leeds to the Second Division! Worse of these defeats was the 22-24 reverse at Barrow, a match which could easily have been won. Humiliation was to follow when Leigh thrashed the Roughyeds at Watersheddings by 54-12.

Other contributory factors to Oldham's plight were the untimely sales of the influential Ray Ashton and David Hobbs. The early return of Aussies Gary Bridge and 'Bruiser' Clark also left holes in the side which would not be plugged.

On the brighter side this season, but also highlighting the absurdity of the structure of RL in Britain, were two never-to-be-forgotten nights at Watersheddings which proved that Oldham were never a relegation side. The first was the tour match on November 4th when Oldham came nearer than anyone else to halting the invincible Australians. The tourists scraped home 22-16 after being given the fright of their lives by an Oldham side which performed heroically before 5,678 rapturous fans. In a match which was Bruiser's finest hour, Oldham fielded: Edwards, Sherman, Foy, Warnecke, M'Barki, Topliss, Ashton, Clark, Flanagan, Clawson, Worrall, Hobbs, Raper. Subs: Hawkyard and Nadiola.

Additional cheer this season came on February 4th, 1987, when Oldham were the last team to defeat Wigan in the Challenge Cup, Paddy Kirwan's memorable last-minute try ensuring his place in any future Oldham Hall of Fame. 11,906 saw an enthralling match which will live forever in the minds of all those present. Oldham's heroes that night were: Burke, M'Barki, Foy, Bridge, Taylor, Topliss, Kirwan, Clark, Sanderson, Waddell, Worrall, Hobbs, Flanagan. Subs: Warnecke and Raper.

SPOTLIGHT ON TIM STREET

OLDHAM supporters breathed a huge sigh of relief when Tim Street escaped a suspension after being sent off on Boxing Day against Rochdale, as the prop forward has been in outstanding form all season. Tim, 23, who signed from Swinton during the summer, is clearly one of the key players to lead Oldham's promotion charge.

His firmly established front-row partnership with fellow prop Ian Sherratt is built on mutual respect. "Ian is still the best prop I've ever played with in my career. He will play all day for you and the amount of work he will put in during a match is incredible. We are working really well together."

Tim, who signed for Billy Benyon's Wigan in 1986 at the age of 18, is enjoying his rugby more than at any other time in his career. "Before I joined Oldham, I never took the game too seriously. Now I am really enjoying my rugby and have worked very hard on my fitness. I have really concentrated on my rugby this season, especially after spending four and a half months in Kirkham prison. That was the worst experience of my life, not just because of the effect on me but also because I hurt my family badly. I can definitely say I have learnt my lesson and will never go back. The one benefit is that the spell inside finally convinced me to knuckle down to my rugby."


And Tim has been knuckling down to dramatic effect ever since then with a string of performances that have earned the Oldham-born former Leigh forward rave reviews, ignoring opposition players who have deliberately set out to provoke him. "Certain players will play act to get fellow players sent off. I unfortunately have a reputation in the game which makes them assume I am an easy target. However, they are wasting their time. That's not the way me or any of the lads at Oldham play. All I am interested in is concentrating on my rugby."

Now Tim hopes to match his hard work on the pitch off the field. "I am interested in finding a job and would be delighted to hear from anyone who can help. All they need to do is contact me via the club."

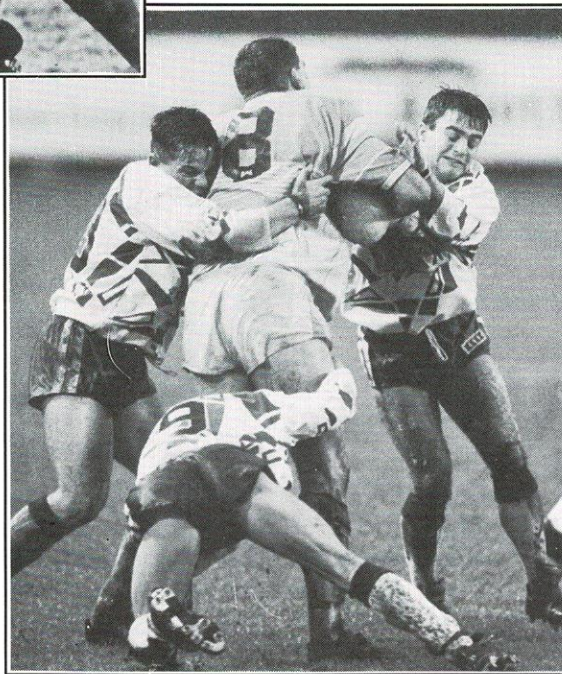
