Only one league game played last weekend when the **Carlisle Border Raiders** were stung to death by **Rochdale Hornets**. A disappointing result as far as Town were concerned as a Carlisle win would have kept the Hornets nicely within striking distance. It was certainly a disappointing result for Carlisle who were unable to capitalise on a one man advantage after the sending off of Hornets Ian Gormley for an alledged high tackle on Kevin Pape. This was the Raiders fifth successive defeat and no doubt Cameron Bell and his dog will not be relishing this weekend's visit to much improved **Rydale-York** who of course beat Hornets in a league game at Spotland last Thursday. Rydale are now only two points behind Town and in racing

parlance would be described as "coming up on the rails." From looking cast iron certainties for relegation they have struck form and with three recent wins under their belts are beginning to believe in themselves. All this makes the clubs from 3rd place down, vulnerable to surprise defeats which in turn can throw them into the relegation zone. LEAGUE SCENE

The league scene is dominated this week by the quarter final Silk Cut Cup draw which took place last Monday evening. As far as **Workington** are concerned any home draw was a good draw however with the teams available **Hull** must have been as good a bet as any from a Town point of view. Don't get me wrong I know Hull will start as everyone's favourites but they are not a powerful side in the 1st Division and in spite of having two regular G.B. Internationals in their side in Lee Jackson and Paul Eastwood most of the side will be relatively unknown to Town supporters. Noel (Crusher) Cleal will no doubt be swatting up on us as we speak but that works both ways and I've no doubt plans are afoot to smuggle Ike Southward into Hull's next match complete with false beard and notebook!

The **Saints v Wigan/Warrington** tie would seem to hold one of the Wembley finalists however it is unwise to count chickens as they say, but it will be a cracker. With **Castleford** on song at the moment they will be favourites to beat local rivals **Featherstone Rovers**, however the Rovers have an impressive cup record and won't be surrendering it without a fight. **Halifax** and **Bradford** is the meeting of the two big packs. Wigan winners of the first ever **Sydney Sevens** can lay claim to be the best club team in the world after adding the sevens title to the World Club Championship they won at Liverpool when beating **Penrith** 21-4 in October. Now perhaps they can return here and stop holding up what is probably the greatest knock-out

competition in the world of Rugby League - the Challenge Cup. **Warrington** are just the type of side that could take Wigan on a one-off basis and I'm sure not too many tears would be shed (outside of Wigan of course) if the Wire managed to do just that!

The other main spin-off of Wigan's round the world trip is the opportunity for Malcolm Reilly to blood new players in the International with France at Perpignan. This will be a particularly useful indicator with the main event - the Aussie Tour coming up at the end of our domestic season. With **Jonathan Davies** appointed Captain in the absence of Hanley and his team-mate Schofield also out through injury the team will probably contain three or four of the names which played in the corresponding fixture last season. Steadman, and Crookes from Cas have an opportunity to revive their chances and Bobby Goulding must seize his chance to grab the number 7 jersey for himself, however with Kevin Ellis & Mark Aston breathing down his neck it won't be easy. With the wingers on show at St. Helens particularly after their devastating display of wingplay against Leeds on Saturday Messrs Hunte and Sullivan must have pencilled themselves into the reckoning.

I am sure all R.L. fans will be delighted with the news that Swinton's winger **Martin Leyland** who was seriously injured during the Cup game with **Doncaster** has now been moved from the intensive care unit at Doncaster hospital into the normal hospital ward. Hopefully it will not be too long before he is fit enough to be discharged. This tragic accident may accelerate the widespread use of safety helmets for additional protection.

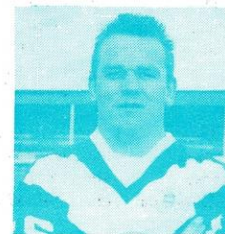

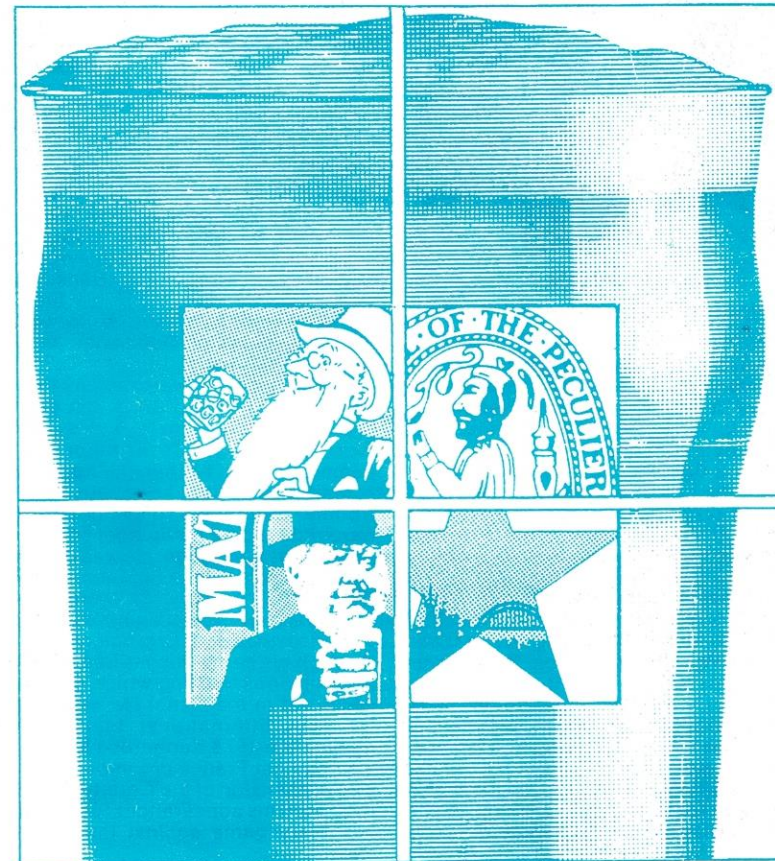

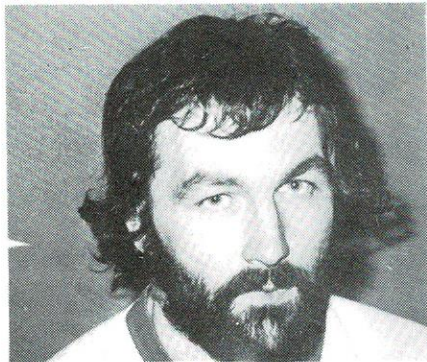

WHATEVER HAPPENED TO ?



IAN HARTLEY
Workington Town Player 1974-86

I have always thought what a grand acquisition Ian would have been bringing on the youngsters in the 'A' team. Firstly as player coach and then as coach. I'm afraid Ian was another player who left the club feeling aggrieved, and rightly so, by the treatment he received at the end of his benefit season.

He left and re-joined his old club Egremont Rangers, firstly as a player, then assistant coach and for the last three years as first team coach.

Ian's interest in rugby was first planted at Egremont R.U. Bleach Green ground. At that time the formidable Mr. Colin Wright was teaching at Wyndham School. Rugby was compulsory at school and in the summer holidays Colin would have up to forty youngsters learning the rudiments of the game at Bleach Green. Ian went along as a ten year old with his elder brother John, who later played for Whitehaven. Rugby League took a hold on Ian in his later years at School, so he joined the Egremont Rangers club. This was in the 1970/71 season when Syd Lowden was coach. He played U17 regularly and had a few games at U19 level as well. Sol Roper became coach and it was he who convinced Ian to sign for Town. At that time he was a hooker come second-rower. During his time at Egremont they won the Lancashire cup defeating Waterhead of Oldham - the first time a team outside of Lancashire had taken the cup.

Ian won many honours as an amateur

although he did not win a Cumberland medal and he was disappointed he never made the England amateur side.

By 1972/73 he was in the eyes of the selectors for the "Shadow" International squad. The amateur game was in serious decline. BARLA was formed but wasn't recognised by Chapeltown Road. As Cumberland R.L. sided with the 'Rebels' none of its players were deemed eligible for official recognition.

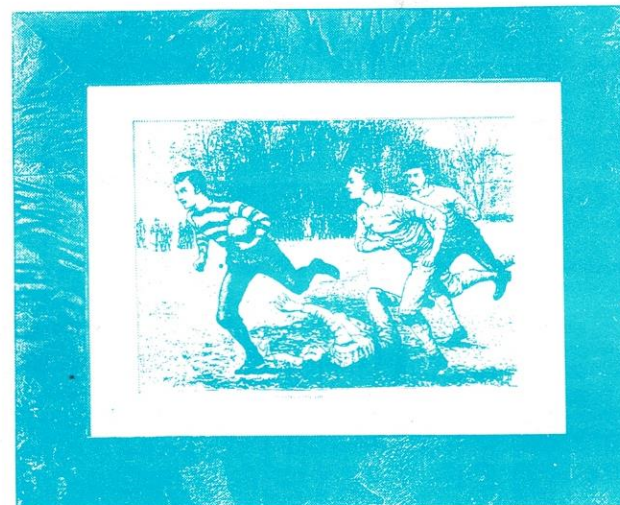
After signing for Town at the close of 1973/74 season, although Wigan had shown determined interest, he was unable to play for Town's 'A' team as it had been disbanded and Ian spent long periods playing for Egremont on permit. His debut for Town came in the spring of 1975, playing as hooker because of injuries to Alan Banks and Smiler Allen, against Hunslet. In his first game at Derwent Park, he was loose forward in a 50 point drubbing of Doncaster, in which he scored two tries. In fact Tom Mitchell promised a wristlet watch to any forward who scored a hat-trick of tries. Ian duly obliged and so did Gavin Brown (4 tries). In Ian's first four seasons with Town he only started 18 games, with a further 10 appearances as substitute. His right knee caused him a lot of trouble during his playing career, which required surgery for ligament repairs and the removal of a cartilage. He was out for a whole year and by that time Bill Pattinson and Peter Gorley had established themselves in the pack. Ian was non playing sub when Town won the Lancashire Cup against Wigan. Right through his career he has been renowned for his tenacious tackling which often made you wince sat in the stand! He was a member of the U24 International team who played against the 1978 Kangaroos at Hull K.R. and also against France at Limoux in early 1979. The suspension of the County Championship restricted his appearances for Cumberland to a solitary game against the Australians in 1982.

During his time as coach at Egremont they have won the National Cup in 1989/90. At present Ian is working at Sellafield and is married to Ruth and they have three children - John, David and Hannah, the youngest aged 5.

Thanks for your company and those long "cracks" we had about rugby on those long journeys at away games. I sincerely respect your honesty and integrity. D.V.

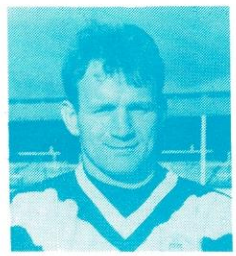

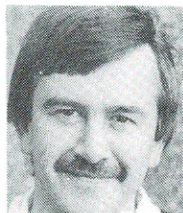

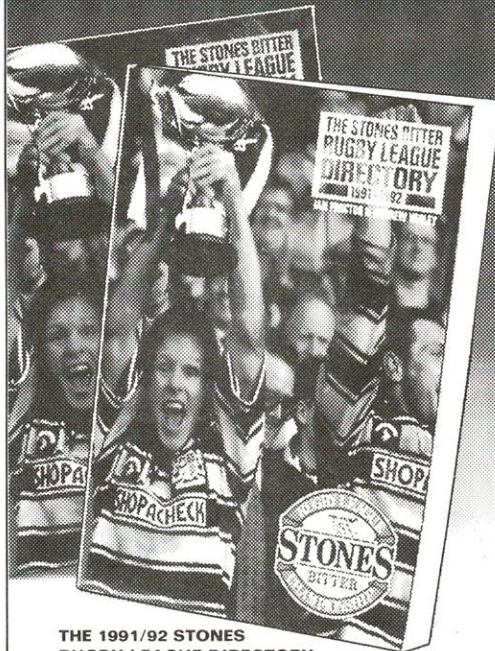
