To our rivals from Watersheddings for what I am sure will be a very keenly contested match. This is of course our fourth meeting and we have registered two excellent away victories, but the opening match of the season at Don Valley resulted in a 16 all draw and I wouldn't be surprised to see a similar score today. These notes were written before our game against London on Thursday night and at the time of writing our injury list was growing. It requires a huge phy6sical and metal effort on behalf of the players to play three times in one week, but if we are to achieve our goal we have to overcome suchs obstacles. Players often carry injuries into games and over their careers they learn to cope with pain and other disabilities. Of course, the fans are not aware - sometimes the coach isn't either - and we all tend to take for granted the need to perform at a consistant level.

There has been a lot of talk and speculation recently regarding a Superleague and/or a breakaway of leading clubs. As one who has attended recent meetings of leading clubs I can report that this is a long way from the truth, but there is an undercurrent of concern from most of the top clubs on such issues as Voting; TV Disbribution and Levy payments. In Rugby League each of the 36 clubs has the same status and is entitled to the same financial payout. There is now however a growing feeling that a different arrangement needs to be introduced which rewards the clubs who have succeeded and shown initiative, whilst at the same time protect clubs not so fortunate. Further developments are expected in the next few weeks as the leading clubs make various suggestions.





KNOW THE GAME

Tim Butcher



- Tackle count. Quite straight forward you may think, but with the pace of today's game, often a caller and scribbler is needed. On top of tackles made, tackles missed by each player are recorded, and consecutive tackles (doubles and trebles).
- 2. Possession count. A recording of each set of 6 plays, whether each play finished satisfactorily, or if it didn't, then why not this indicates how well a team has controlled possession of the ball.
- 3. Drive count. A record of how many times each player took the ball to the defence, how many times he or she off loaded, how many times he or she busted the line.
- Territorial Record. A cross on a plan of the field for every play the ball for each team, which will indicate the success of any territorial game plan.
- A stop watch for each team when they have possession of the ball obviously the longer you can keep the opposition from the ball, the less chance of them scoring.

Stats can tell a coach a lot about his team and his individual players.
For instance, a players tackle count can be used as a means of raising his next performance, similarly his work rate in attack if his drive count is unsatisfactory. Obviously, the number of tackles and drives expected from a prop will be normally higher than from a winger.
A coach will also use stats to plan his coaching schedule for the next week. For example, if there is a low count on consecutive tackles this may indicate more work is needed on marker defence, or if the team has spent no time in the opposition's quarter, then he will have to work on controlling the ball, getting in a good kick and an effective chase.
On the whole, the proper use of statistics will make a coaching job a little bit easier and at the top level, mean the difference between top four and relegation.




It was interesting to see that today's combatants were the only clubs from the second division to be invited to the so-called 'Super League' meeting.

The Eagles snatched revenge for their earlier cup defeat with a last gasp try by former Keighley player Kevin Farrell.

Despite putting Keighley under a lot of early pressure, Eagles had only Farrell's fourth minute try and were three points behind at the interval, thanks to a Dixon drop goal and an opportunist try by Regan from a kick ahead against the run of play, which left Dixon with a simple goal.

Eagles brough on both substitutes and it paid a quick dividend with Aston collecting a loose ball for a try which he goaled and then Lidbury found space on the right to race in at the corner.

But within ten minutes, Atkinson and Putterfield both breaked the Eagles line to give Keighley the lead and, just as the Eagles final burst seemed destined to failure, Lidbury having been pushed into touch, Farrell broke through for the winning try.


Eagles's first captain came via a family connection – Steve Cooper being the brother-in-law of Gary Hetherington. The two had played together at York almost ten years earlier. Gary had moved on to Leeds, Huddersfield and Kent, whilst Steve had remained at York.

Steve made his debut in the Eagles first match against Rochdale and played sufficiently well to earn the Man of the Match award ahead of hat trick hero, Paul McDermott.

After two months in the job, Steve asked to be relieved of the captaincy, arguing that the responsibility was affecting his game. He continued as a player, taking part in 21 of the Eagles 31 games that season.

A strong running second rower, Steve was never a great try scorer and, in fact, managed only a couple of drop goals during his short stay with the Eagles, one of these a forty yard angled effort which proved crucial in a close fought 16-11 victory over Carlisle.

Steve's Eagles career ended unhappily with his being sent off for the first time in the last minute of Good Friday derby at home to Mansfield. He decided to call it a day and announced his retirement from the game, but will always be remembered as a player who made a major contribution to the Eagles' first faltering footsteps in the game.




