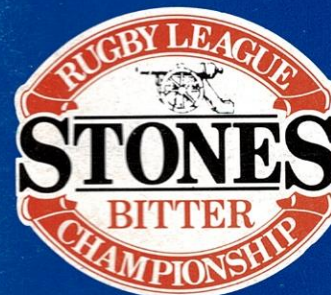

Today's Opponents

As far as Hornets fans are concerned, this is the match of the season version 4. The old enemy from Watersheddings always give a hard game and this season has been no exception. A marvellous win by Hornets early in the season has been overshadowed somewhat by two defeats since but we have a chance to redress the situation today. Since our last meeting Oldham have swapped former favourite Charlie McAlister for Sheffield Eagles centre Iva Ropati, who has continued his rich scoring vein. A win today is vital for both teams, for Hornets a guaranteed Premiership place and for Oldham a lifeline possibly to the first division.

Iva Ropati One of at least five rugby playing brothers. Iva has moved to Oldham this season after becoming Sheffield's leading try scorer. A devastating finisher, he has carried on where he left off.

Shaun Allen A hard-working member of the pack, Shaun joined Oldham from St.Helens in the Tony Barrow era. He has figured in many of Oldham's most important matches in recent seasons and has returned to the senior squad under Peter Tunks after impressing in pre-season training.

Ian Bates Dewsbury boy and the nephew of former GB internationals, Alan and John Bates. Small, but with the heart of a lion. Basically a scrum-half, but can play at stand-off, hooker or even full-back.

David Bradbury Signed from Leigh Miners after touring New Zealand with the BARLA under-19 squad, David is a strong-running loose-forward, who impressed on Oldham's pre-season tour of France.

Gary Burns Stand-off or scrum-half, Gary is a typical Widnesian and a typical half-back... cheeky, with a touch of humour! Reminds one a lot of Ray Ashton at his age and if he plays as well, he'll do all right. Toured New Zealand with BARLA.

Richard Irving A blockbusting winger from the Huddersfield area, Richard won youth international honours before turning pro for Oldham in Eric Fitzsimons's first spell at Watersheddings. Played regularly in the first team for the past couple of seasons.

Chris Joynt A young man from Wigan whom Oldham believe will have a big future. Chris is 19 and he joined Oldham after winning county youth honours in the same team as Tony Barrow junior. Went to Australia last summer, along with his

Oldham colleagues Paddy Mitchell and Richard Pachniuk, to play for a NSW country team.

Charlie McAlister A New Zealander, Charlie signed for Oldham three years ago from Bradford and Bingley RU club in Yorkshire. Can play centre or second-row and is also a good goal-kicker. A powerful man, Charlie has played in Australia.

Barrie McDermott Strong and powerful despite his 19 years, local boy Barrie is yet another member of the BARLA squad to throw in his lot with Oldham. He is a dedicated young professional and he's quickly made enough impression to earn a place on the bench in Oldham's early season matches.

Tommy Martyn A player of exciting potential, Tommy is the son of former Leigh, Warrington and GB forward Tommy Martyn and the nephew of Mick Martyn, who set scoring records as a forward with Leigh in the early 80's. He is a stand-off or centre, who can 'sniff' tries out of nothing — a 'poacher' of the Rugby League variety who can turn a match at a stroke.

Vince Nicklin An Aussie with a New Zealander's passport. Vince came to Oldham from Sydney via Limoux in France. Sort that one out! As a boy he played with St.George and Easts in Sydney, before making a name for himself in France and then joining Oldham in the summer. Currently playing full-back, but can also operate at half-back, stand-off or in the centre.

Richard Pachniuk a 20 year old from Dewsbury with Polish grandparents, Richard starred in the 'A' team last season, did well pre-season in France and made his debut in the first home game of the current season against Leigh. A clever, creative, thinking type of hooker, he is expected to go a long way.

Tim Street Career followed a similar pattern to Russell's. Local lad he signed for Wigan and then moved to Leigh and Swinton before joining Oldham in the summer in a swap move, with John Fairbank and Neil Clawson going to Station Road. A strong prop, Tim earned GB Colts and Under 21 honours during his Wigan days.

Steve Warburton Steve was the BARLA open age international stand-off last season. He signed for Oldham from Warrington amateur club Woolston and made his debut as substitute against Hull in the last match of last season. Did well and enhanced his reputation further in France. A clever attacking player with poise and class.

THE BRITISH RUGBY LEAGUE COACHING SCHEME

Highly successful Coach Accreditation Courses will again take place throughout the country, but this summer they will be under the control of the British Rugby League Coaching Scheme.

The Scheme will be headed by Phil Larder and John Kear, and the Courses will be run by leading professional and amateur coaches.

The Courses Are:

Level 1 (A New Course) A Course lasting 7 hours (1 day) which has an emphasis upon fundamental skills teaching and the organisation of enjoyable small sided games. The Course can be run for individual clubs and is ideal for those beginning coaching, particularly if they are working with young children. A Certificate is awarded on attendance.

Level 2 (formerly Level 1) A four day Course which introduces sound and tested coaching methods through the important fundamental skills and the playing of enjoyable small sided games.

Level 3 (formerly Level 2) A four day Course which develops both individual and unit skills, but with a main emphasis upon team coaching, tactics, motivational techniques, game's analysis and ideas on producing a physical conditioning programme. The Laws of the Game, and Sports Injuries are also an integral part of a demanding but enjoyable Course.

Level 4 (formerly Level 3) This Course has been suspended until next year. Coaching Certificates awarded since 1987 will be honoured, but it is strongly suggested that those coaches who hold a Certificate should enrol on the new Courses as soon as possible.

Those who do not hold Certificates can enter the Scheme at either Level 1 or Level 2.

Go on, gloat a bit. Enjoy it. Feels good, doesn't it? As the Hornets premiership band wagon gathers momentum — fuelled by a new air of confidence — we leave Sheffield and Leigh in our wake.

Eagles first: 'Hornets dent promotion hopes' led the League Express headline and then went on to describe Hornets' victory as both '... scintillating' and '... spectacular'.

They seemed to see the sin-binning of Mark Aston as the turning point of the game, but being reduced to 12 for 10 minutes didn't do US any harm as we rattled in 12 points in that time. Hornets defence was '... superbly marshalled by Webster and Duane' and the pick of the tries was from 'Brett Clark's exquisitely timed pass which sent Abram galloping home.'

If this was the sort of form that Mr Hetherington thinks will establish Sheffield as one of a 'Big 17', he's in for a shock and the cheers of the Eagles fans were reciprocated by shouts of 'Feeble, Feeble!' by a section of the home supporters.

Nottingham City

Nottingham City have become only the third team to lose all their matches in a season. They lost all 26 Third Division matches plus three Cup ties.

Runcorn Highfield lost all 28 Second Division matches and three Cup ties in 1989-90. In 1906-7 Liverpool City lost all 30 of their League matches plus two Cup ties and dropped out after only one season. They did manage a home League draw against Bramley but when they were unable to fulfil a return fixture the match was expunged from League records.

Nottingham have the current longest losing run of 36 matches made up of seven in the Second Division last season, 26 in the Third Division plus one each in the John Smiths Yorkshire Cup, the Regal Trophy and the Silk Cut Challenge Cup.

They last won on 3 March 1991 when they beat Runcorn Highfield 20-14 in a Second Division home match.

The record longest losing run is 61 by Runcorn from January 1989 to February 1991.

Steve Carroll

Steve Carroll is one point short of the Bramley record of 276 in a season by George Langfield with 123 goals and 10 tries in 1956-57. Carroll's total is made up of five tries and 131 goals including seven drop goals.

He is also set to join the few players who have scored in every match throughout a season.

Wigan have the current longest winning run of 19 matches, 15 in the Stones Bitter Championship and four Silk Cut Challenge Cup ties. They last lost on 30 November at Salford when they went down 24-14 in the third round of the Regal Trophy.

Neil Turner, the Hull and former Doncaster winger, needs one try for a career century of touchdowns.

Whitehaven Records

Vince Gribbin finished the season with a club record 31 tries and Steve Maguire kicked a club best 12 goals in a match, as Whitehaven ran up their highest score in an 80-6 Third Division home defeat of Nottingham City.

Needing three tries to equal the club record of 29 in a season, Gribbin smashed it with five to give the winger 10 in Whitehaven's last three matches.

The previous record was set by winger Billy Smith with 29 in 1956-57;

Gribbin also holds the club record of six in a match, against Doncaster in 1984.

Maguire beat the goals record of 11 by Bill Holliday in a 61-0 home League defeat of Hunslet on 31 March 1962. Holliday also scored a try for a club record 25 points.

Whitehaven's previous biggest victory was 72-6 in a Lancashire Cup first round home tie against Fulham on 14 September 1986 when they scored 12 tries, compared with 14 on Sunday.

Carroll has scored in 31 matches and Parrish in 30 matches. Neither scored in the final match of last season.

SPORTING COMMENT

'Rules is Rules!' — The future of R.L. by The Man With The Plan

As another season draws to a close — and another plan to launch a 'Big 17 Super-duper League' dissolves — I've come up with a great new idea for restructuring the league which makes about as much sense as any that come out of Sheffield.

There will be four divisions numbering 2, 15, 15 and 4. Division 4 contains the current 10th, 11th, 12th and 13th clubs from the current 3rd Division.

Divisions 2 and 3 divide equally all the remaining clubs except the bottom team in the league — and Wigan! So, Division 1 contains Wigan and Nottingham — that way the fans at Central Park can get to see lots of tries — because that's all they understand!

The 4th division will act as a 'feeder' division to the first division — with the bottom club being promoted into the first and the bottom club in the first division being compulsorily expelled from the league — in keeping with the R.L.'s expansion plans.

Relegation from the 2nd & 3rd divisions will be two down (two up from the third) and the club finishing top of division two will receive a pat on the back from Uncle Maurice.

The Rugby League Levy will be increased to 50%, paid by all teams outside the first division and then distributed evenly to the club at the top of division one.

All television money will be split 85-15 with the team at the top of the first division because they have a new stand to pay for. At Council meetings of the R.L. there shall remain the practice of one club one vote — Wigan shall become the one club and they will have the vote, the chairman of the RFL Board of Directors carrying the right to veto.

The remaining 35 clubs will be allowed to register their vote if they can raise a minimum majority of 36.

The number of players made available to Great Britain by the team leading the first division shall be decided by: the club chairman, the chairman of the R.L. Board of Directors and the Gt. Britain Manager.

Anyone attempting to form a new club in any area other than one designated a 'development area' shall be refused entry to the league on the grounds that they are not London Crusaders, and the new clubs must meet the following criteria: in a catchment area of almost 10 million people you must **NOT** attract crowds in excess of 350 or you shall lose your development status. The exception to this rule shall be: if you give away 5000 free tickets to artificially boost your attendance figures you shall be heralded as a genius.

The league shall introduce the sin-bin for the new offence of "BEING BORING". Henceforth London Crusaders will comply by only playing 35 minutes each way every week ... and Bradford Northern!

So there you have it — a great new plan to take Rugby League back to the halcyon days of unlimited tackles, fat, useless forwards, eighty minutes of 'one man ploughing a furrow up t'middle with t'ball up his shirt' (as still used by Bradford Northern) and an isolated, regional, flat caps, whippets, cobbled streets, 'dahn t'pit' image. I think it will really catch on. Nurse, the screens!

ALLIANCE REVIEW

Hornets "A" finally wound up their season on Monday night thrashing Hapless Chorley 74-0. It has been a magnificent season, and one that has seen us achieve our ultimate aim of promotion to the Alliance Division!

It was quite clear we were going to be a force to be reckoned with after just six days of the season had gone, by then we had chalked up two away wins, at Whitehaven (32-6) and at the Willows (32-24).

The first of three slip up's came on a cold October Friday evening in Barrow when we were over run by the massive Barrow pack finally going down 18-9.

Crystal Palace was the next port of call in the Lancashire Shield, the journey being worth while, Hornets winning 25-14. The second round was an anti climax with Hornets stumbling at Whitehaven before going down 16-13.

At the start of December Hornets were clearly on a roll having put together a run of 6 wins from 7 games, Chorley (H) 70-6, Swinton (A) 17-5, Huddersfield (A) 30-24, Whitehaven (H) 46-36, Carlisle (A) 24-18, Salford (H) 22-14. Lack of regular fixtures became a problem for Hornets around Christmas, with postponements becoming a regular event.

Hornets final loss of the season came on the 14th December at Fartown, with windswept conditions being the major factor as Hornets went down 22-8.

Seven wins on the trot secured Hornets position in the Alliance first division, the wins being: Barrow (H) 44-22, Carlisle (H) 22-14, Keighley (A) 32-18, Leigh (H) 44-18, Keighley (H) 40-20, Chorley (A) 74-0, Swinton (H) 73-4.

In between these league games, Hornets lost to Warrington in the Challenge Cup 34-8 at Spotland.

The end of season cup competition proved a major disappointment for Hornets. After winning their respective pool group. Bramley (A) 18-4, Salford (H) 38-32, Sheffield (A) 30-26 and Doncaster (H) Bye, Hornets went to Monks Cross Stadium in Ryedale for the semi final. After leading 11-2 at half-time the second half turned out to be a nightmare, before the "kick that never was" put us out of the competition 18-17.

Putting aside that disappointment, the season has been absolutely superb with the growing band of Alliance fans being treated to a Rugby League at it's best.

It would be wrong to single out individual players, because it has been a magnificent team effort that has won us promotion. But in my mind Steve Turner must be singled out for the way he has led the side to this achievement, and all the players have responded to him, showing him the utmost respect.

Thoughts should also be spared for Ian Gormley and Kevin Lowe. Ian is currently recovering from a badly broken jaw, which he suffered in an ugly incident against Swinton last Saturday. We all wish him well.

As for Kevin, what more can we say about this free scoring Hooker cum second row forward, all we can do is say thanks for the effort he in particular has put in this season.

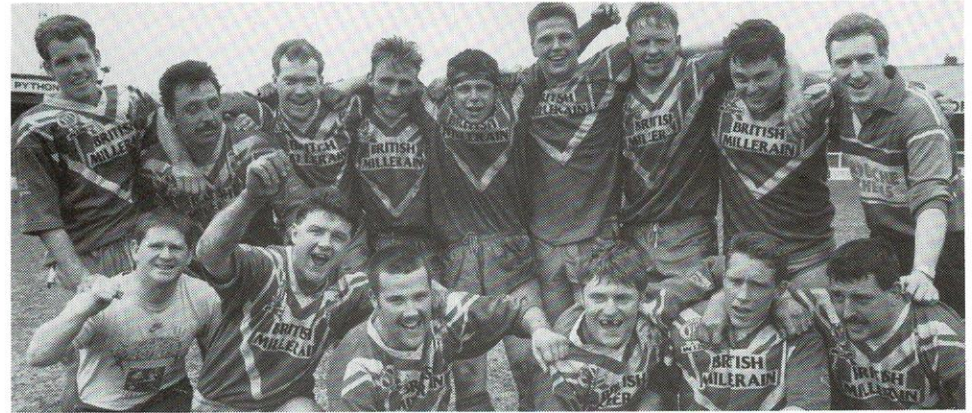
