Although our chances may look remote on paper, sport is a funny old game, to borrow Jimmy Greaves' old cliché, and stranger things have happened.

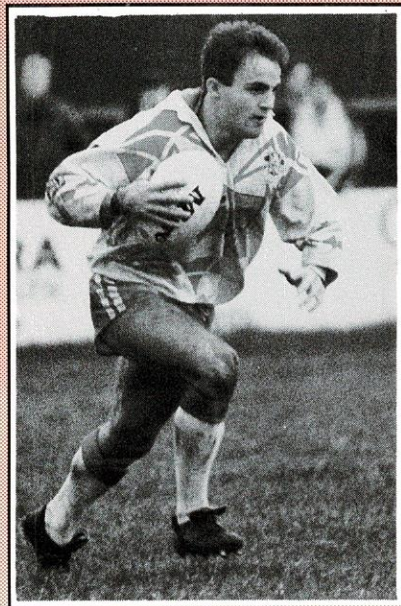

Paul Topping: Outstanding full-back or loose-forward signed from Swinton two years ago. Made his Lancashire debut earlier this season. Leigh's captain and top try scorer.

Simon Booth: Former Leigh Miners three-quarter, now in his second season in the professional game. A regular this term, impressing as a determined runner and opportunist.

Ian Jeffrey: A fine acquisition from Liverpool — St. Helens RU in December 1986, the former Lancashire RU Fly-half has been a most consistent performer in the centre position, rarely missing a game.

Mark Dainty: One of a number of last season's BARLA is Leigh East's players to turn professional, this strong and determined centre has had an impressive debut season.

Barry Ledger: Former St. Helens and GB winger who has been a prolific try scorer throughout his career.

David Tanner: Versatile back signed from St. Helens at the turn of the year, the former Fylde RU player has settled in to the full-back position at Hilton Park.

Lee Hansen: Strong forward who has made rapid progress since arriving last Autumn. Has also played in Australia and New Zealand and club football.

Tommy Hayes: Former Leigh East back-row forward who joined his hometown club after successful trials earlier in the season.

John Costello: Another Leigh East star who turned pro, after a short spell across town with the Miners.

Russ Bridge: Former Fulham hooker who joined Leigh last season after trials with Wigan. The ex GB students international has switched successfully to loose-forward.

Adrian Earner: Hard working prop or second row signed four years ago from St. Helens, he has been a regular in recent years.

Craig Rodgers: Former Wigan half-back signed last summer along with team-mate Andrew Collier.

Gary Hendlebury: Another East Leigh star to try his luck in the pro game, the versatile back was once on Wigan's books.

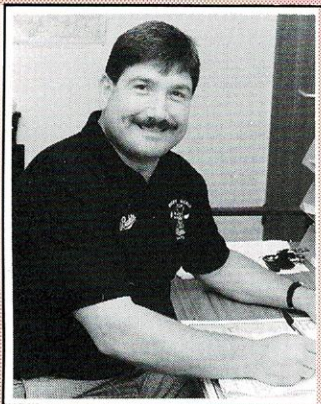

COACHING THIS SUMMER

COACH Accreditation Courses will be taking place throughout the region this summer under the control of the British Rugby League Coaching Scheme.

Headed by Phil Larder and John Kear, the courses are split into four different levels and will be run by leading professional and amateur coaches in the game.

Level 1 is a one day course that is ideal for those beginning coaching, especially if they are working with young children, covering fundamental teaching and the organisation of small sided games. Oldham RLFC will be running their own level 1 course at a cost of £10 per head, subject to 20 applicants or more applying. Those interested should contact Eric Fitzsimons at the club on 061-620 4870.

Level 2 is a four day weekend course run by Graham Starkey at Watersheddings on May 23-24 and May 30-31. This introduces sound and tested coaching methods with those attending having the opportunity to obtain a Level 2 Grade 1 Certificate. Applicants should contact either Graham on 0706 490449 or Rugby League headquarters on 0532 624637.

Level 3 is another four day course which develops individual and unit skills with the emphasis on team coaching, tactics, motivational techniques, analysis, physical conditioning and sports injuries. Successful students will earn a Level 3 grade 1 Certificate, which is the minimum certificate required by the Rugby Football League and BARLA representative teams.

Level 3 takes place at Watersheddings on July 27-31. Again, interested parties should contact Eric Fitzsimons.

Level 4 has been suspended until next year. Coaches interested in more details on any of the aforementioned courses should contact the Rugby League on 0532 624637 at 180 Chapeltown Road, Leeds.



IVA'S INCENTIVE

SHAUN Edwards' late burst of tries had put him ahead of the competition on the top ten try scorers list with 35 — however, Oldham's latest signing, Iva Ropati, is still in a position to catch the Wigan half back.

With two games to go and Oldham desperate for points to try and catch Leigh for the second place in the Second Division, Iva will be looking to add to his 32 tries scored this season.

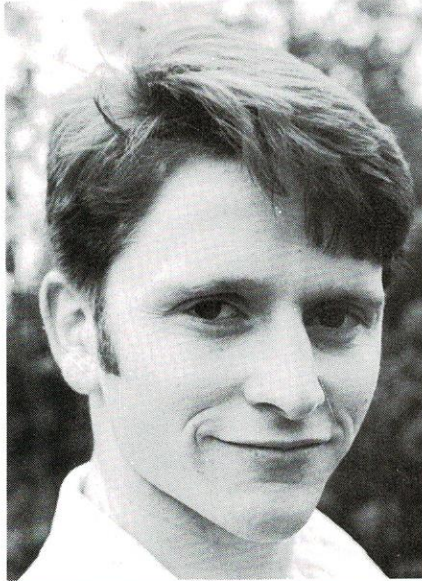

SPOTLIGHT ON SCOTT RANSON

FLYING right winger Scott Ranson justified Peter Tunks' confidence in his try scoring abilities when he scored four tries in the recent home game against Workington, the first time an Oldham winger had noched up four tries since Kevin Meadows eight years ago.

A delighted Scott who joined Oldham from Swinton earlier this year, is justly proud of the achievement in only his third game for the club.

"I love scoring tries and I always try to score as many as I can as often as I can. Games like the one against Workington are the ones I really enjoy although having treated Oldham fans to four I'd like to score six of the best in a game," commented Scott, who won BARLA honours against Australia before joining Swinton in 1987.

The flying Scott experienced promotion and relegation during his time with Swinton as well as the disappointment of losing a Premiership Final against Sheffield. Now, however, St. Helens based Scott is looking forward to taking his career up a gear in the fast lane.

"I have the usual ambitions for a Rugby League player. I want to go to Wembley for the Challenge Cup Final and win it. I want to win Lancashire and GB honours and tour down under too." Scott is looking to realise his ambitions at Oldham under the watchful eye of Peter Tunks.

"I was very impressed with the reputation Peter Tunks had as a coach so naturally I was interested when Oldham showed an interest in me. The club seems to be well run. Since I've joined the club my choice has been proved right," commented Scott, who unfortunately damaged his ankle tendons twice this year against Leeds playing for Swinton and against York playing for Oldham.

"The ankle injuries were the first I have experienced and hopefully the last so I can concentrate on what I like doing best — scoring tries," says Scott, whose wife Tina is expecting their first child later this year.

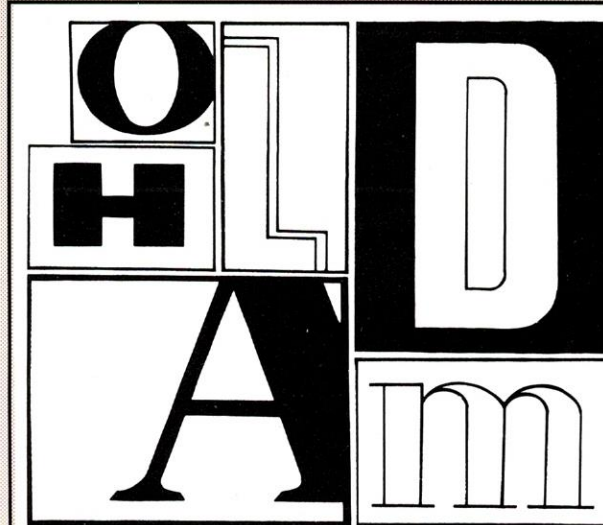

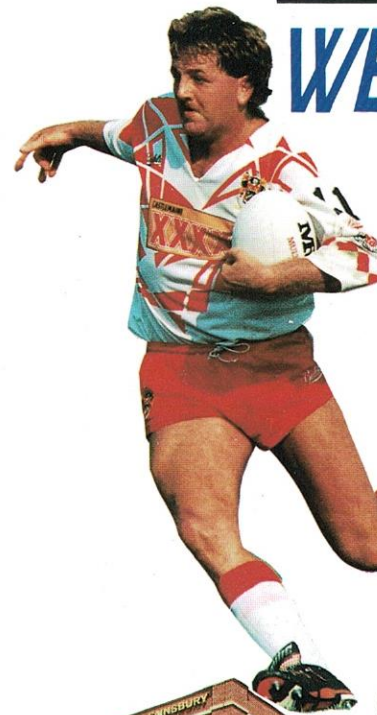
