WELCOME TO CENTRAL PARK
SUNDAY AUGUST 9th 1992

Welcome back to Central Park for the opening preliminaries to the 1992/93 season. The Wigan Sevens has been the opening occasion here since 1959 and provides spectators with some fine running rugby League.

The truncated form of the game enhances the running and passing skills that make it so entertaining. Today's prelude to the season will have a carnival feel to it with three Roses clashes scheduled for the first round.

The first of these comes as Halifax take on Salford. Both sides are attack-minded under normal circumstances and they should get the competition off to a flying start. There is plenty of speed about both squads. Mark Preston particularly enjoys scoring here in Halifax colours.

Last season's runners up Wakefield Trinity take on the 1989 Winners Sheffield Eagles in the second tie. A year ago Trinity's young squad contained the competitions top scorers in David Jones and Craig McEhattan, Jones also winning the Man of the Tournament award. The Eagles were first round losers last year and will hope to repeat their efforts three years ago which also followed promotion and a Premiership victory.

Holders Oldham begin their title defence against Hunslet. Though the Yorkshiremen are a Third Division side, that counts for nothing today. Hunslet failed to score last year in their contest with Wakefield - a rarity in this type of game - so a score against the defending champions would be very welcome.

The final first round tie brings together the home side and World Sevens Champions Wigan, with Leeds. The Loiners have introduced names like Rambo and Gallagher during this competition and today we may catch a glimpse of former bath winger Jim Fallon signed in May. The Wigan squad may well be different to that which brought glory from Sydney in February but will be favourites today.

There are two other items on the bill this afternoon. Once the first round is completed (School A) take on (School B) in the Ackers Memorial Trophy. Some of the youngsters may be back in a few years time contesting the Annual Academy Challenge against Leeds. This years contest comes as a prelude to the final today.

Wigan were comfortable winners of last season's contest which was the prelude to an excellent season for the Wigan squad under the guidance of Andy Goodway.

This afternoon, with the blessing of a fine day and a restored pitch seeing it's first competitive use, the fans of eight clubs get together and discuss the events of the summer while enjoying the action.

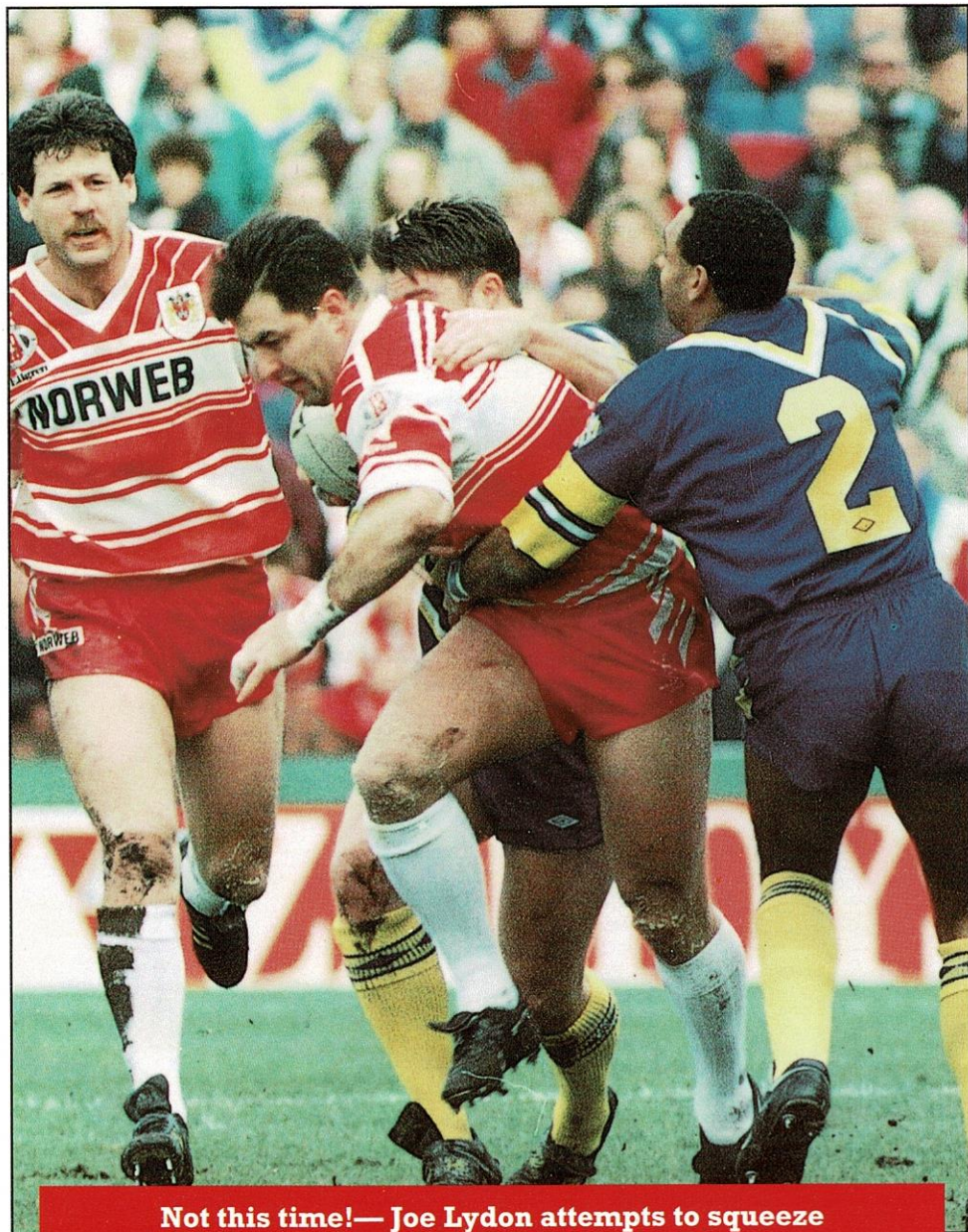

Whilst the Wigan first team created another piece of history last season with a Challenge Cup, 1st Division Championship and Premiership Treble success Graeme West's Alliance squad also went from December to the end of the season unbeaten to achieve a Cup and League "Double." Starting with four emphatic victories from five games, the only defeat a controversial one at Widnes, Wigan had already scored 154 points by the end of September, but there was a big disappointment at Warrington in the Lancashire Shield 1st Round when the home side fielded a very experienced side. Recovering from this setback October was a very successful month, with the highlight a 58-10 thrashing of St. Helens at Knowsley Road. This was followed by a 45-14 win over Leeds at Headingley, but November became the worst month of the season with three defeats, at Hull, Halifax and Castleford when the Yorkshire sides, obviously having heard about Wigan's superb form, packed their teams with a number of first team players.

However after this Wigan went from strength to strength, crushing victories over Widnes, Halifax and Oldham consolidating their position at the top of the 1st Division table by the turn of the year. The Challenge Cup competition began at the end of January with another big win over Halifax by 38 points to 0, and after a hard second round win in the wind and rain at York, without the regular back three of Andrew Farrell, Barrie-Jon Mather and Mick Cassidy, who were with the Great Britain Academy side in France, a 66-0 third round thrashing of Alex Murphy's Huddersfield set up a semi-final clash with Leeds, the main challengers in the Championship. In atrocious conditions Wigan went through by 18 points to 6 to a Final confrontation with old rivals Widnes. A great crowd of 4,087 gave Wigan a standing ovation as they lifted the first half of the Double with a 38-14 win.

League form had followed the same pattern, and by the beginning of April, Wigan, with five games remaining, needed just two wins to clinch the Championship. This was done with the biggest win of the season, 76-0 over Hull K. R. at Central Park, but they also went on to win the other three games, passing the 1,000 League points mark in the last fixture against Leeds. Top try scorer for the season was Paul Gartland with 24, closely followed by Andrew Farrell and Andre Stoop on 21 each. Gartland and Brendan Barr made most appearances, 32 each, but it was Steve Blakeley, with 285 points from 16 tries, 110 goals and one drop goal, who took the Supporters' Associations' Alliance Player of the Season Award.

RULES

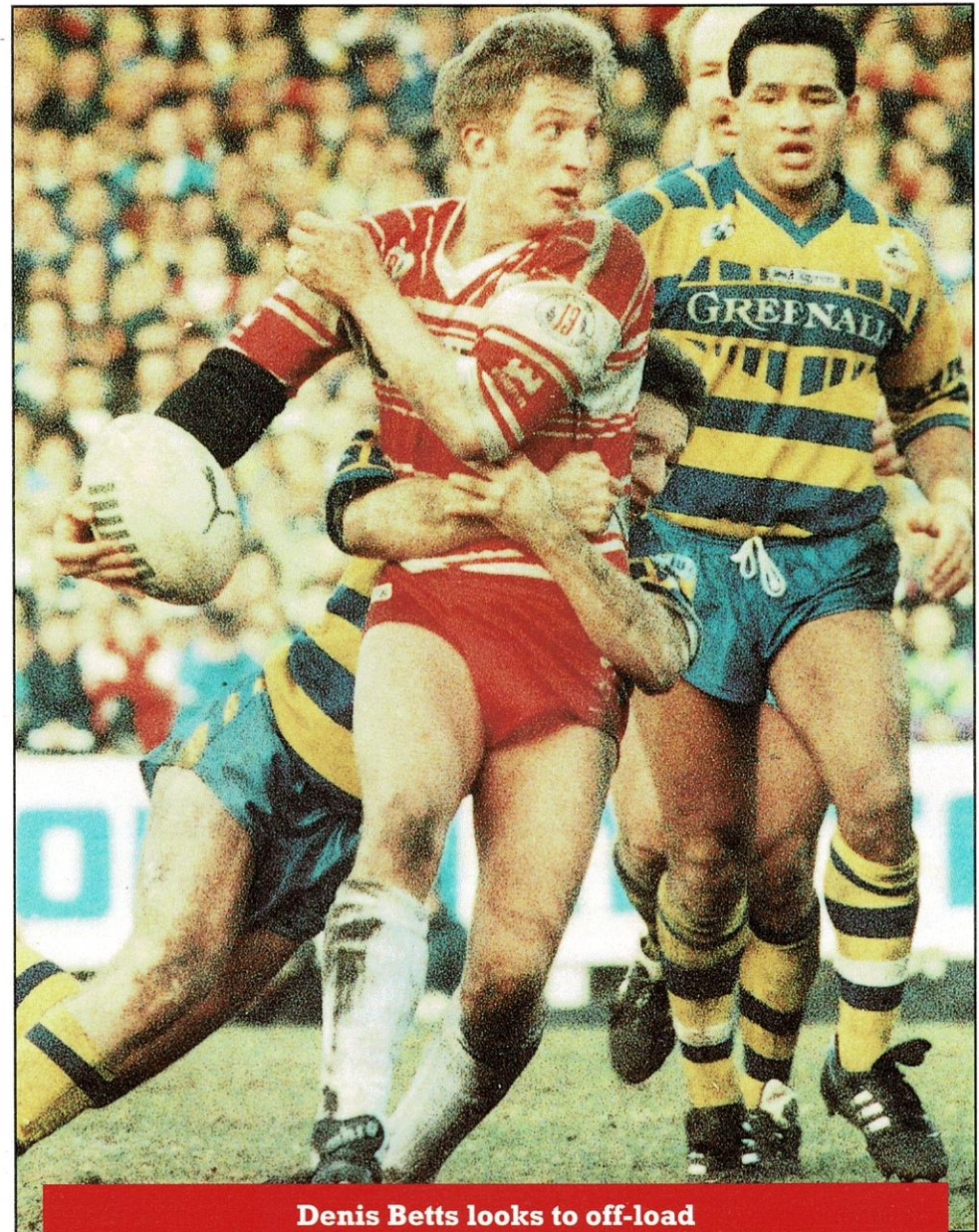
WHITBREAD SEVENS COMPETITION

1. Games shall be played under the laws of the Rugby Football League EXCEPT:-
 - a) At a kick off following a score, the ball need not travel ten yards forward
 - b) The three tackle rule shall apply.
2. Each side shall consist of seven players and one substitute. Unlimited substitution is permitted, at the touch line, with the consent of the touch judge.
3. The duration of each game before the final will be seven and a half minutes each way with one minute interval. If the scores are level at full time, the teams shall change over and continue playing and the next score shall decide the winning team. Ends will be changed every 7½ minutes if necessary and there will be no interval during extra time.
The final tie will be played for ten minutes each way. If the scores are level at full time, similar arrangements to those for previous rounds shall apply, with ends being changed every ten minutes if necessary.
4. Time is checked by independent time keepers and the "Klaxon" will sound at the end of each period, regardless of the state of play.
EXCEPT:-
 - a) Injury time, as indicated by the referee will be allowed
 - b) A penalty awarded within the Klaxon time shall be permitted, to completion, but only if an attempt to kick a penalty goal is elected.
 - c) An attempt to convert a try scored within "Klaxon time" shall be permitted.
The time keepers will cater for these situations before ending each session.
5. Rugby Football League disciplinary arrangements apply EXCEPT:-
 - a) The "Sin-Bin" rule shall not be implemented.
 - b) A dismissed player will result in the offending team fielding only six players and one substitute for the remainder of the competition.

These recommendations are made having had discussion with the officials and team coaches re; time keeping etc, over the past few years.

 ATTENDANCE ANALYSIS**

Wigan were Rugby League's top gate pullers in 1991-92 for the eighth successive season as attendance increases were recorded in four major competitions.

The first ever end-of-season treble winners - League, Championship and Premiership - maintained their 14,000 plus average home gate in Stones Bitter Championship matches, Leeds strengthening their command of second place by adding 1,062 fans per League game for an average of 12,164.

Upward attendance trends were recorded in the Regal Trophy - the biggest annual increase of 14% - the Silk Cut Challenge Cup, the Stones Bitter Championship and the Stones Bitter Premiership, despite a reduced capacity at Manchester United's Old Trafford.

Half of the 36 professional clubs attracted

an increased home League attendance, Halifax being boosted by a 60% upsurge to move into fourth place in the gate chart, St. Helens also having a four-figure increase per month to retain third place. Oldham were the best supported side in the new look Second Division, while inaugural champions Huddersfield nearly doubled their Fartown crowds to top the Third Division attendance table. There was a total of 47 five-figure crowds, four more than in the previous season which featured an Australian tour. Wigan attracted 19 10,000+ crowds to Central Park, Leeds pulling in 10 five-figure gates at Headingley. Six gates exceeded 20,000, including Wembley, the Premiership Trophy doubleheader and the Foster's World Club Challenge. Of the 47 five-figure gates, 29 were in the Stones Bitter Championship.

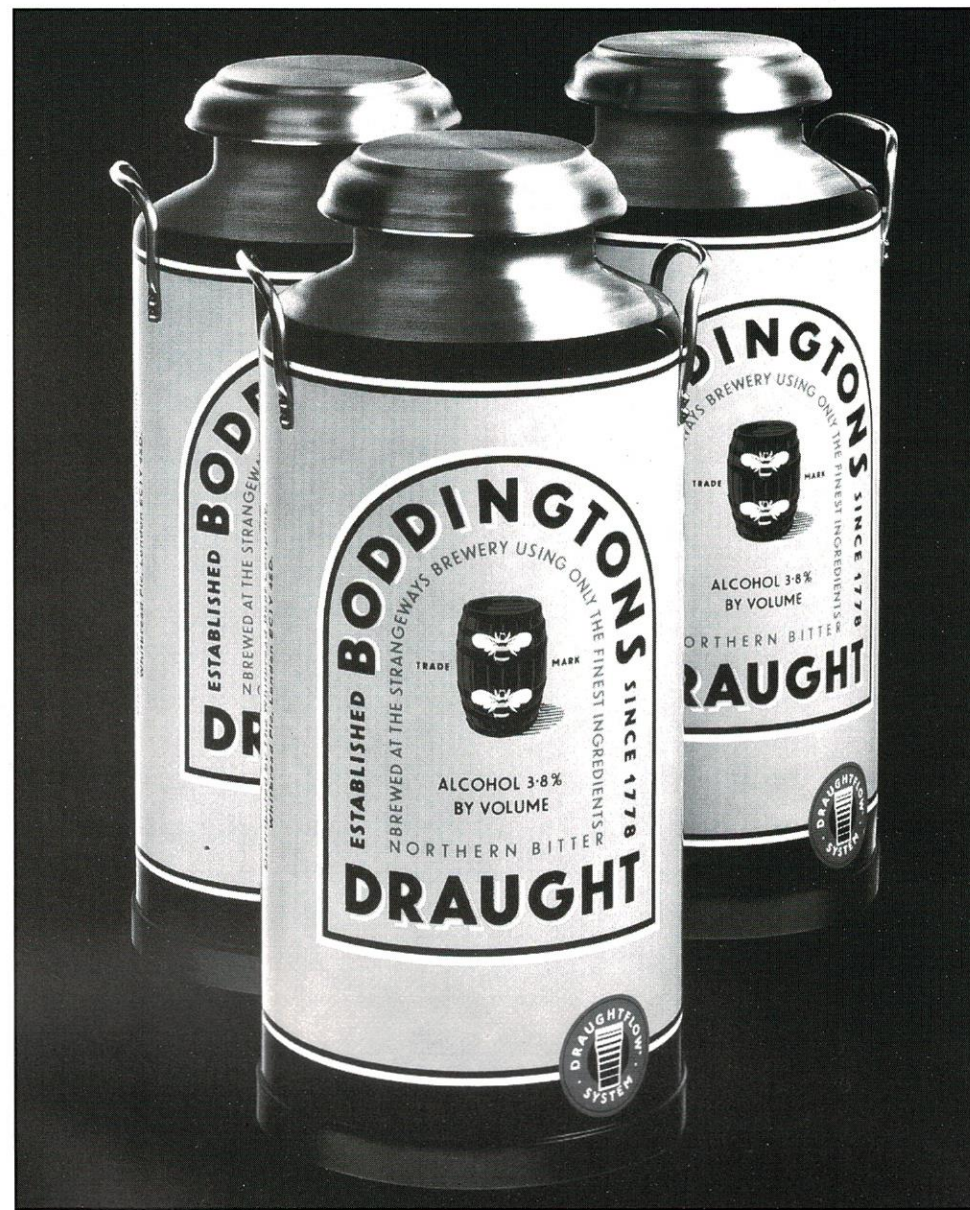
