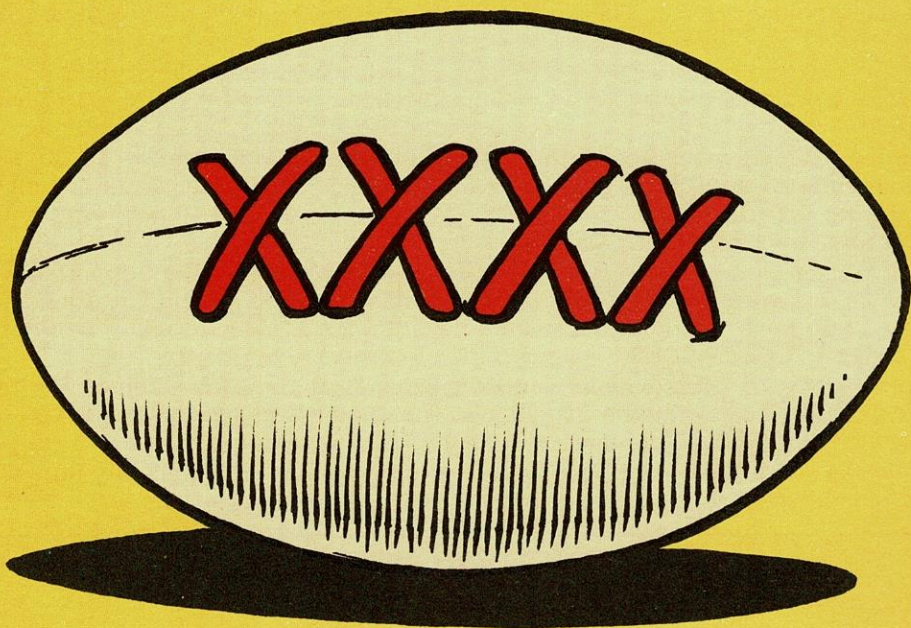

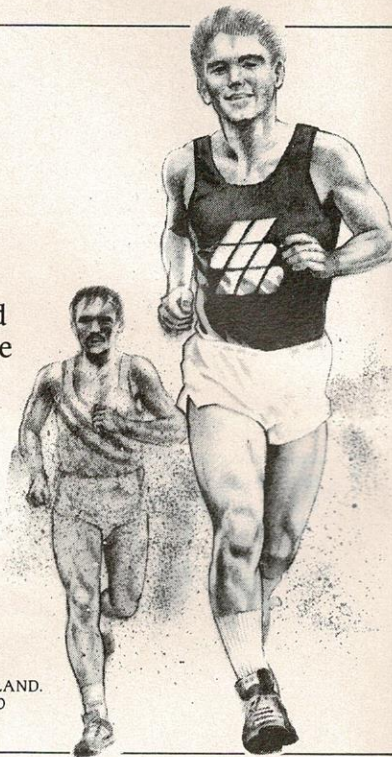

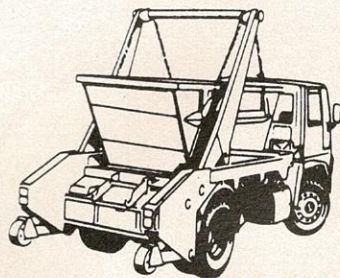

FROM the BOARDROOM

'Discipline' is a word that has become well-used in recent times in the Rugby League man's dictionary. In many cases you can hear a coach standing on the touch-line and demanding 'discipline' from his team, when what he really means is that he does not want his players going around thumping or generally breaking rules.

Of course 'discipline' in its widest sense means a lot more than that.

I do not pretend to be a professional Rugby League man. The football side of life at Watersheddings is left entirely to Peter Tunks and that is how it should be.

Peter also employs a lot of 'discipline' in his approach to the job. He demands it on and off the field and that means that he expects his players to behave like professionals at all times and to be 'disciplined' in their way of life and in their attitude to sticking to tactics, team patterns of play and the like.

I was thinking of these things the other night and it struck me that, if the Oldham Board of Directors is to best serve the club and its supporters, it must also have a certain amount of 'discipline'.

We have to be 'disciplined' in ensuring that everything possible is done to see that the club runs smoothly. We have to be 'disciplined' in our approach to the club's financial problems and make sure we do not get side-tracked from our intentions to make inroads into the debt.

We have to be 'disciplined' in making sure that we make the best possible use of the money available to us (in many cases YOUR money) and we have to be 'disciplined' in our attitude to and regard for all those people who help the club in such a wide variety of ways.

With all this in mind, each member of the Board has now been given specific responsibilities in a particular field that is suited to him.

We have many things to administer: the commercial side, the secretarial side of Rugby League matters, the financial problems and our association with the bank and creditors, the ground and its environs and a thousand and one other things that crop up in relation to the running of a Rugby League club.

We have worked hard recently to ensure that we get the best possible deal wherever money has to go out of the club and it is our intention to curtail expenditure, so that when money comes in to the club, it does not go out just as quickly through another door.

All this needs 'discipline' so I took the trouble the other day to look up the word in the Little Oxford Dictionary.

'Discipline', mental or moral training, orderly behaviour maintained among persons under control or command.

If we can strive for that, in all aspects of Watershedding life, I don't think we will go far wrong.

EASTWOOD NEARS 100

Paul Eastwood of Hull starts the season needing one try for a club career century of touchdowns.

A former Hullensians Rugby Union player, the Great Britain Test winger made his debut for Hull as a substitute in a 22-10 Division One win at Oldham on 3rd February, 1985.

His full debut followed on 29th March, 1985, when Hull won 17-14 at home to Wigan in a Division One Match.

Eastwood's only hat-trick for Hull was in a 48-0 Division One home defeat of Barrow in 1989-90, when he also kicked eight goals for a 28 point haul.

His best season's total was 22 tries in 1989-90 and he has yet to finish in the top ten.

Eastwood has also scored 19 tries in representative matches, including seven Test touchdowns for a career total of 118.

WIGAN TITLE TREBLE

Wigan start the new Stones Bitter Championship season seeking to extend their record run of successive titles to four. During their three years as Champions, Wigan have only lost 14 League matches, drawn two and won 62.

Yet they failed to win their opening match in each season. They lost 6-18 at home to Warrington, drew 18-18 at Sheffield Eagles and lost 26-38 at Castleford a year ago. Their last League defeat was on 13th November, when they lost 24-10 at Salford. Wigan were then fifth in the Stones Bitter C hampionship but they won their last 17 matches to take the title. 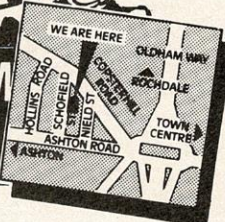

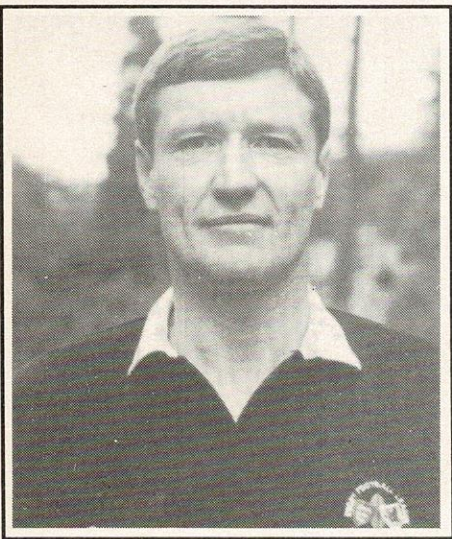
A WATERSHEDDINGS WELCOME TO **CARLISLE**

- ROB ACKERMAN** - Powerful Welsh International, second rower or centre, who proved a big crowd pleaser last season. As yet unable to agree terms for 1992-93 and is on the transfer list.
- DEREK ARMSTRONG** - Signed at the end of last season from HAWICK R.U. Strong runner who could fill a number of positions once he adjusts to Rugby League.
- SETH ARMSTRONG** - A lot of responsibility will fall on this tall prop or second rower this season. Made excellent progress last term, breaking fully into the first team and showing an appetite for hard work.
- STEVE BRIERLEY** - Long-serving, hard-running prop who has stepped down from the first team this season, though he may play in the Alliance side.
- GARY CHARLTON** - Uncompromising loose-forward or second rower who hits hard and always aims for the gap. Scored five tries in 21 appearances last season.
- MARK DOYLE** - On the come-back trail yet again, after dislocating his shoulder for the fourth time. Gutsy long-serving winger who has scored some great tries.
- CLAYTON FRIEND** - Kiwi scrum-half oozing class, who is still to finalise a third term at Carlisle. Top-scorer with 17 tries last season.
- STEVE GEORGALLIS** - Another classy import from Australian Eastern Suburbs club who will be having his second season at Gillford Park. Model pro, with eight tries in 18 appearances in 1991-92.
- GEORGE GRAHAM** - One of the finds of last season. Former Scottish B Rugby Union prop, who took to League like a duck to water. Hard to stop, stocky and fast with a great future.
- GRANT HARRIS** - Another ex-Scottish R.U. success story. Signed as a centre, he showed a great eye for finishing on the wing and picked up six tries in just eight appearances.
- MIKE KAVANAGH** - Doubtful whether this talented but unsettled young scrum-half will be seen much this season, as a swap deal with his home-town team of Barrow is being mooted.
- SIMON KNOX** - Ex-Hensingham and BARLA Young Lion. Second rower who made a strong start to his professional career last season. Slotted comfortably into the full-back spot and grabbed three tries.
- PETER LUNT** - Ex-Aspatia ARL second rower who made just one appearance at sub for Carlisle last season and went on loan to Whitehaven. However, back with a bang this pre-season and looking in good form.
- ALAN MACLAGAN** - City-based utility forward who has been hovering on the bring of a first team place. Solid tackler and runner.
- PHIL MANNING** - Pacey winger who has put some weight on over the summer and is bidding to establish a regular first team place. Good side-step.
- GARY MURDOCK** - Long-serving ex-Ellenborough scrum-half who was unlucky to be injured in the Cumbria Cup at Workington as he was playing some of the best rugby of his career. Hoping for a quick return.
- KEVIN PAPE** - Carlisle's record try scorer and longest-serving player. Nine tries last season and was pressed into service at stand-off as well as his favoured centre.
- COLIN PAXTON** - Ex-Hawick RU stand-off whose hopes were badly hit when he broke his leg earlier this summer in a freak horse riding accident. Hopes to be back around Christmas.
- PAUL ROBINSON** - Big chance for this deceptively fast and elusive prop-second rower to establish a regular first team place this season. Usually beats the first line of defence.
- TONY SCOTT** - Long-serving second rower, whose distinctive windmill running style and all-enveloping tackling have become a Carlisle trademark.
- DAVID SMITH** - Big Australian centre from the Newcastle Knights club recommended to the Raiders by Wigan skipper Dean Bell.
- EDDIE SOUTHWELL** - Hoping to put in jury problems behind him this season. Slick-handling stand-off who has been denied a regular first team run by some unlucky injuries.
- MALCOLM THOMASON** - Tackling machine, hooker and prolific try scorer, from close in to the line. Usually tops the tackle count and has been a fine servant to Carlisle since signing from Broughton Red Rose

BACK PAGES

Today's photo shows an incident from the First Round Challenge Cup tie at Hunslet on 3rd February, 1968.

The action shows Hunslet's speedy winger, Tommy Thompson, being hauled down by Oldham prop Colin Smith. I remember the incident well. Thompson, a real speedster, had swept past all the Oldham cover, when the unlikely figure of Smith came across with what seemed a futile chase but, as you can see, after a despairing dive, Colin nailed his man.

As Roger Halstead wrote at the time, this tackle 'knocked the heart' out of the Parksiders and Oldham went on to win 9-4.

In the Second Round, Oldham beat the then mighty Bradford Northern after a replay, before falling to Leeds at Watersheddings in Round Three.

In an era when R.L. attendances were in steep decline, the three subsequent matches after the Hunslet game produced crowds of 17,500 +. So what price Colin's tackle? It was certainly one of the best I can remember.

* * *

It is, painfully, common knowledge that Oldham have never reached Wembley, yet before the move to the capital in 1929 the 'Roughyeds' were regular finalists (three wins, four runners-up) being the first Lancashire team to take the trophy in 1899.

Perhaps the most mystifying part of the non-Wembley saga, was the failure of the great team of the mid to late 1950's to achieve this goal. A force that was feared throughout Rugby League, still Wembley eluded them.

Some of our older supporters will probably remember; Brian Bevan's interception try in 1954; the Leigh mud-heap in 1957; Wigan finally ending Oldham's run of 13 consecutive victories against them in a Watersheddings blizzard in Round Three, 1958 . . . our day WILL come.

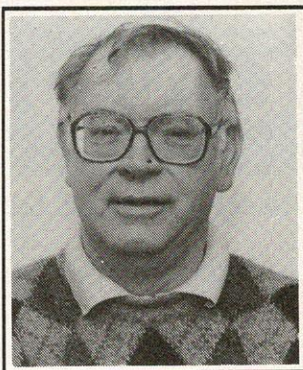
