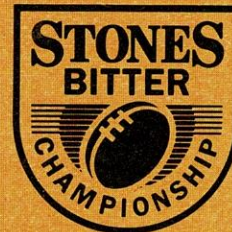

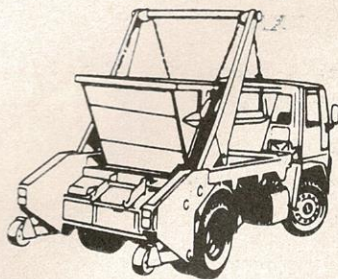

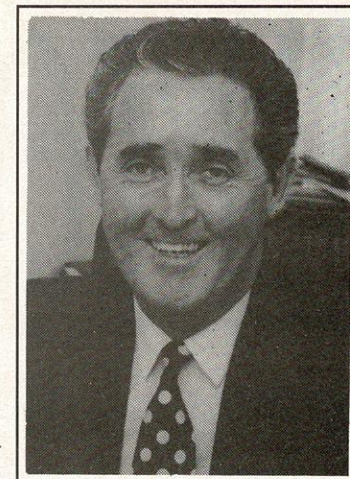

FROM the BOARDROOM

The Oldham Club was to the forefront of last week's major debate by the Rugby League Council into the circumstances of the special arrangements made on overseas players at London Crusaders.

Our Council representative, Tom Patterson, questioned London's use of 10 overseas players on the opening day of the season at Watersheddings.

We all thought they were allowed to use five: that, in itself, being two more than every other club in the Rugby League. One or two unconfirmed whispers had got around, about Crusaders also being allowed to use an additional five 'residents', but there was no confirmation of this until it was revealed on the BSKyB 'Boots N' All' television programme more than 24 hours after we had played the Londoners.

All was revealed at the Council meeting, when Tom sparked the big debate on Oldham's behalf and it emerged that London had, in fact, been given permission to field five 'overseas' men, plus five 'residents' - a total of TEN players with Aussie or Kiwi accents.

For your information 'residents' are players born overseas, who have lived in this country for more than two years.

The League has worked hard to establish the exact status of each London player and opposing clubs are now within their rights to examine the credentials and identity cards of the Crusaders players before each match.

You might ask why London should be given what many people would regard as an advantage over everyone else. The theory behind it all is that London are disadvantaged anyway because they are outside the traditional League area and that the whole of the Rugby League would benefit if there were a thriving, successful club in our capital city.

I do not disagree with that. Indeed, in terms of media exposure for our game and its appeal to major, national sponsors, there would be enormous advantages to be gained if we had a TOP club in London.

'Top', of course, is a crucial word. A London club would have to be chasing honours and among the leading clubs in the First Division, before it could begin to make much of an impact down in the south.

It is my firm contention, therefore, that if the Rugby League is serious about London, it should be prepared to go into the project wholeheartedly, establish a club with the financial clout to bring over top Aussies, put London into the First Division and let the First Division clubs argue about what advantages, if any, they should be allowed.

The present London club will always struggle to make an impression in the First Division and, in the meantime, it is being given a big advantage over the other Second Division clubs, ourselves included, who are desperate to get into the First Division.

Second Division clubs are fighting for their very existence and the financial benefits to be gained from winning promotion are considerable. Only those clubs in the Second Division, who are competing with London for a place in the top two, have a vested interest.

It is easy for clubs in the First and Third Divisions to speak glibly of 'development' in London, when they are not playing them four times a season in life-or-death battles.

The Council is to debate the whole issue again next month and this club will be pinning its flag finally to the mast of one set of rules for ALL clubs in the Second Division.

To conclude, I would like to wish Des Maea a speedy recovery from the injuries he received in a road accident in Auckland. It was a terrible blow for him and for the Oldham club, but you can rest assured that we will be doing our best to ensure that the club suffers as little as possible, while showing Des as much sympathy and understanding as we possibly can.

IN TOUCH

GARRY SCHOFIELD

Garry Schofield needs four tries for a career century of touchdowns with Leeds. His total of 96 tries has come in 151 matches, including one substitute appearance. The former Hunslet Parkside junior began his professional career at Hull, in 1983, before being transferred to Leeds for a then record £155,000 in October 1987.

Playing at centre, he scored two tries on his Leeds debut in a 29-25 home defeat against the touring Auckland side on 25th October, 1987. Schofield played mostly at centre in his first two seasons with Leeds, before moving permanently to stand-off, in the latter half of 1989-90. He has now played 81 matches at stand-off, 66 in the centre, twice at loose forward, one scrum-half plus one substitute appearance.

Schofield's best season's try total for Leeds was 22 in 1987-88, followed by 20 in each of the next three seasons. His three four-try feats for Leeds include his only hat-tricks for the club.

At Hull, he scored 107 tries in 12 matches, including six substitute appearances.

His grand total in club and representative matches is 249, including 27 in Tests for Great Britain.

NOTTINGHAM CITY

Nottingham City ended their run of 37 defeats, with their 19-12 win at Barrow, on Sunday. It was their first win since a 20-14 home victory over Runcorn Highfield on 3rd March, 1991.

City's losing run was made up of 34 League matches, one Yorkshire

Cup, one Regal Trophy and one Silk Cut Challenge Cup.

Centre Tony Chappell was the only member of Sunday's starting line-up who played in their previous win. Darryl Jackson, who went on as a substitute at Barrow, was in the second row against Runcorn. Nottingham's win was their first away since 20th October, 1989, when they won 17-14 at Runcorn Highfield. It ended a run of 35 away defeats.

LOSING RUN

Following Nottingham City's win after 37 successive defeats, the longest losing run now belongs to Castleford and Swinton, who have lost five in a row since last season.

LEADING SCORERS

Brimah Kebbie of Bradford Northern is the early season leading try scorer with six, after scoring two tries in each of his first three matches for Northern.

Whitehaven's Steve Maguire is the top goal kicker with 12 in two matches.

Tea Ropati of St. Helens has scored most points with 30 from 11 goals and two tries.

POINT SCORING RUN

Mike Smith of Chorley Borough has the longest point-scoring run of 16 matches, stretching back to last Boxing day.

MILESTONES

Paul Medley, the Bradford Northern and former Leeds and Halifax International forward, needs three tries for a career century of touchdowns with the club.

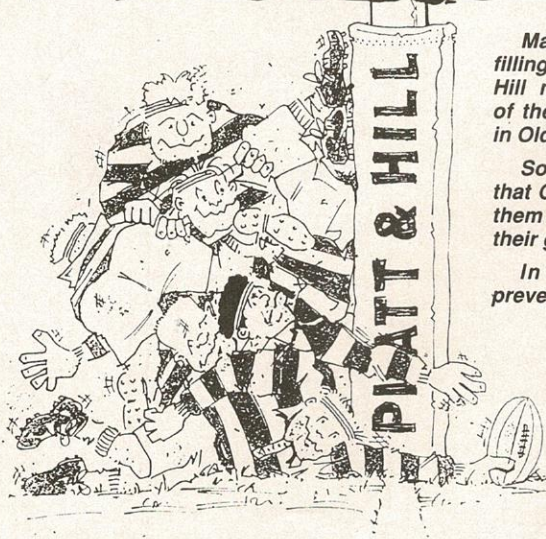

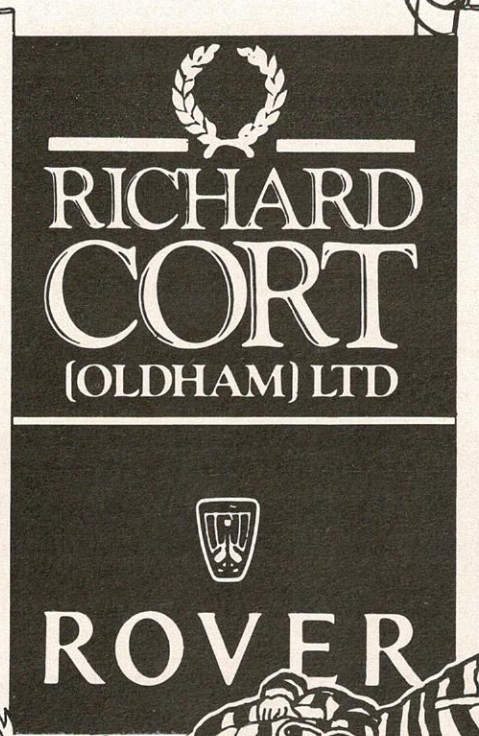

DAVID LYON. Goalkicking full-back. Joined Warrington in 1987 from Widnes, in one of the first cases settled by the R.L. 'Tribunal'. Has toured with Gt. Britain and was very unlucky not to be selected on this season's tour. Began his career in the second row, but now relished the full-back role.

NEIL KENYON. Quickly becoming Warrington's premier wingman. Scored 10 tries from 17 outings last season and has now firmly established his first team spot. St. Helens born, he is in his fifth season at Warrington, having served his apprenticeship with distinction in the Alliance team.

ALLAN BATEMAN. Another player whom many thought should have gone on tour. An exciting ex-Welsh R.U. International, highly thought of at Warrington and has scored 14 tries in his 50 games for the Wires.

TONY THORNLEY. A local lad who joined Warrington in 1986 from Woolston ARLC. His career has been dogged by injury, which he happily now seems to have overcome, and this has curtailed his appearances for Warrington. An aggressive running centre, much is expected from him this season.

CHRIS RUDD. Missed the last half of the 1991-92 season with injury. A naturally talented centre, signed from Kells ARLC two years ago and is widely tipped as a future International.

MARK FORSTER. Celebrating his testimonial year, having joined Warrington in 1981. Has scored 88 tries so far for the 'Wire', including many memorable long-distance efforts. A former G.B. International who still has plenty to offer.

ROBERT TURNER. Has recently signed a new contract with Warrington. He is a Wigan lad who joined Warrington from Blackbrook ARLC in 1987. Has earned Under 21 honours and can play in most back positions and is more than a useful goal kicker.

KEVIN ELLIS. Has just returned from the tour to Papua/Australia and N.Z., where he played all his rugby at stand-off, as opposed to his favoured position of scrum-half. Signed two years ago from Bridgend RUFC and has converted well to the 13-a-side code. Already has more than 50 games under his belt for Warrington.

ROBERT MYLER. Talented full-back who will be aiming to make the No. 1 spot his own this season. Has played just 18 first team games, but could well break into the first team on a regular basis this season. Has suffered from a series of niggling injuries which have hampered his first team progress.

RICK THACKRAY. Recently signed after a year in the amateur game. Rick was previously with Warrington, before being sold to Widnes in 1985, but injury forced him into temporary retirement two seasons ago. Has now been given the all-clear again and is determined to resurrect his impressive career.

PAUL DARBYSHIRE. Joined Warrington from Wigan St. Patricks and is another player whose career has been badly hit by injury. Missed nearly all of last season with a groin injury and played in just four first team games. He played for 'Wire' in the Challenge Cup Semi-Final, when just 17 years old and has an exciting future ahead of him.

NEIL HARMON. Joined Warrington in 1987 from Blackbrook ARLC and should be the regular No. 8 this season. A strong forward with an immense work rate, he has already played over a century of games for Warrington and has earned Under 21 honours.

DUANE MANN. New Zealand hooker and a vastly-experienced player, who gives a solid look to the Wires pack. Another 80 minutes player and is highly-respected throughout the game. Joined Warrington in 1989 and has just signed a further contract, much to the relief of all at Wilderspool.

PHIL SUMNER. Was playing first team rugby for Warrington when he was just 17. A tremendous prospect, who is now coming to terms with the rigours of First Division first team football. Is still a teenager with a great future ahead of him. Currently Gt. Britain Under 21 International prop forward.

BASIL RICHARDS. Joined Warrington in 1989 from the Yorkshire Amateur code and is another player whose development has shown a marked upturn towards the end of last season. A fast-running second row forward, of whom much is expected this season.

GARY SANDERSON. Wires Mr. Dependable. Rarely has an 'off day' and has a work rate second to none. Has played in 150 games for Warrington since he signed from Thatto Heath and has, hopefully, now recovered from an injury which forced him to miss most of last season.

GARY TEES. Prop forward signed from Barrow two seasons ago and has struggled to break into the first team, having played 18 games so far. He has great potential and works hard and is determined to claim a first team spot this season.

BOB JACKSON. Now in his second spell with Warrington, Fulham being his first English club. Can play equally well in the front or second row and has now played almost 200 games for Warrington. A popular man with both spectators and players and his style and enthusiasm rubs off on all around him.

KELLY SHELFORD. In his second season with Warrington. Part of the New Zealand Shellford 'clan', who produce so many great players. A good organiser with plenty of vision, he will be needed to lead the Wires pack in the absence of Mike Gregory.

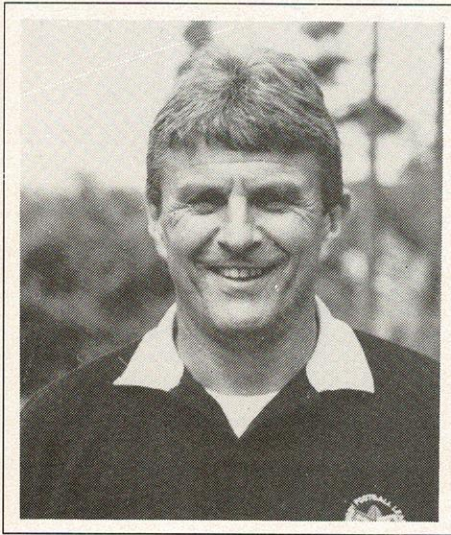
PAUL CULLEN. Has just celebrated a well-earned benefit. Paul has been a tremendous servant to Warrington, having played in almost 250 games with, I am sure, more to come. Began his career at centre, but has recently reverted to the loose-forward role. He is also Warrington's Commercial Manager.

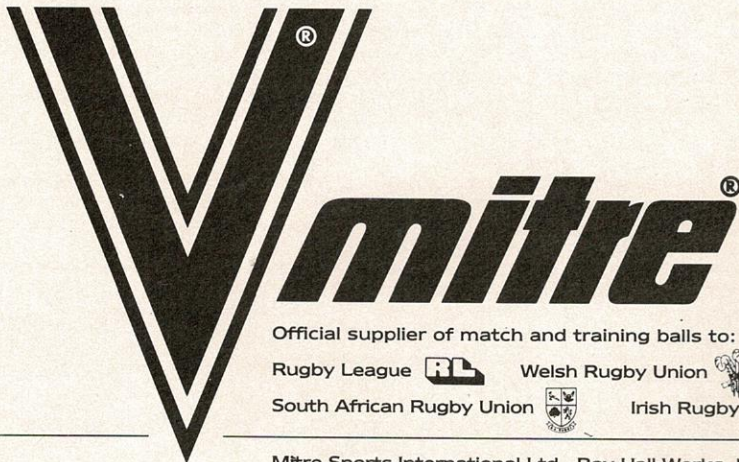

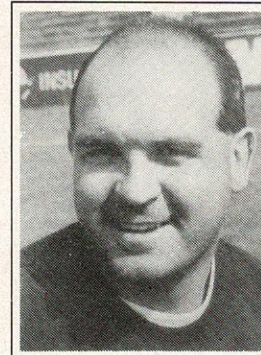

Enjoy the game.

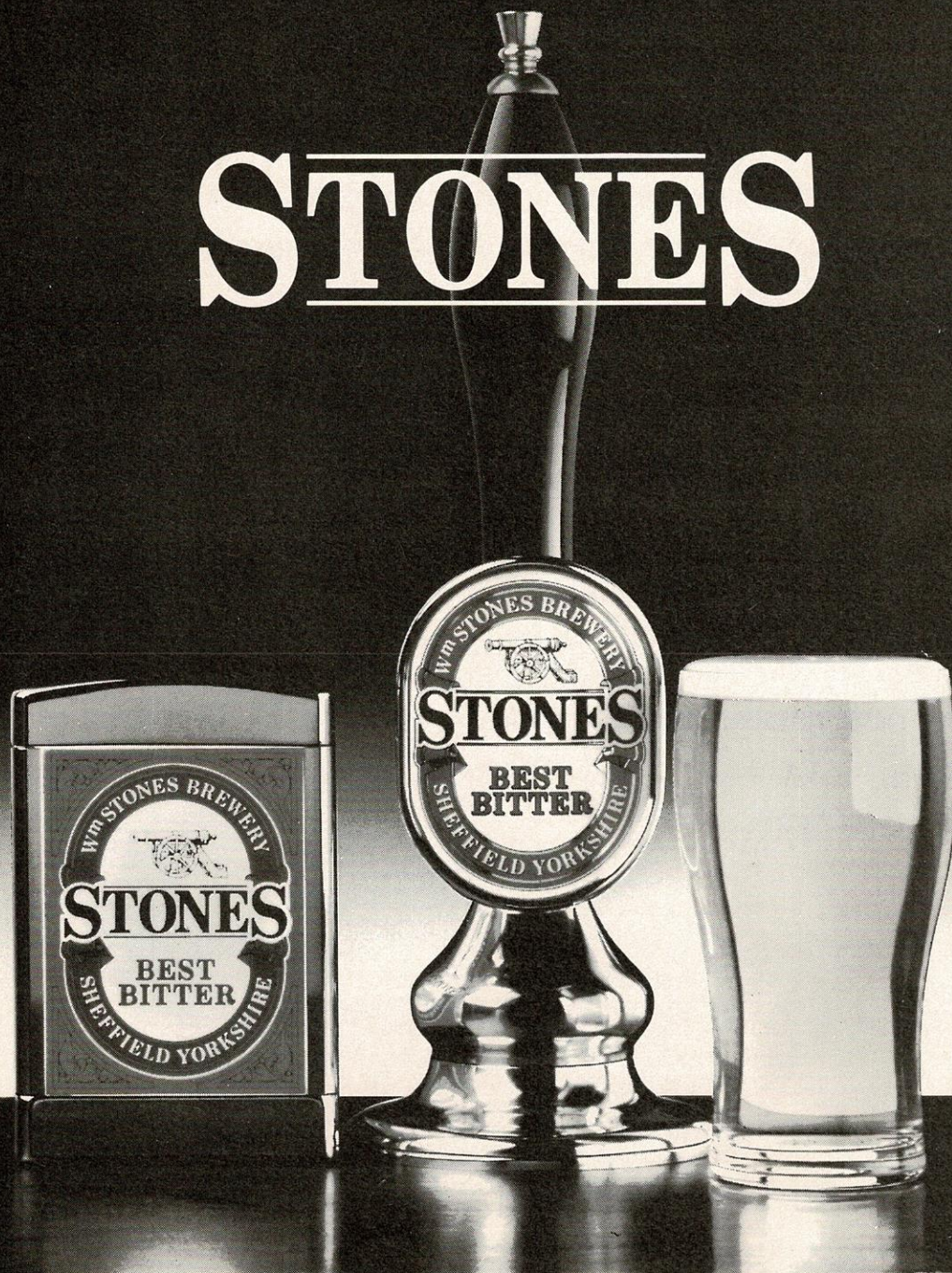

BACK PAGES

First of all, can I apologise for the error that appeared in the last 'Back Pages'. I stated that Oldham had 13 consecutive victories over Wigan in the 1950's, actually the figure should have been 14. The first on 27th December, 1952 and the last of 1st February, 1958. Wigan ended the run with the Third Round Cup victory, four weeks later.

The first request for a match review came from local supporter Mr. George Cowburn, who asked about an Oldham v. Leeds match, when four forwards were sent off in the same incident.

The game took place on 27th January, 1981 and the dismissals came in the 12th minute after a scrum had erupted in a brawl. The referee, Mr. Hodgson of Maryport, who had already warned several players, ordered off Platt and Clarkson from Oldham and Dickinson and Townend of Leeds. This loss of so many players early in the game made for a fast open match, which Oldham won by 19 points to 12, thanks to two tries from Geoff Munro, one try from Dennis O'Neill and five goals kicked by Mick Parrish. The attendance was 3,100 and Oldham lined up as follows: Murphy, Munro, Caffery, Parrish, Sullivan, O'Neill, Ashton, Clarkson, Walker, Harris, Platt, Mordell, Flanagan.

PHOTO FEATURE

This week's photograph shows the above-mentioned Mick Parrish kicking a goal at Workington on 7th March, 1982, one of four that helped Oldham to a 17-13 victory. This was the season that Mick became the only Oldham player, so far, to play and score in every match in a season. A feat he also achieved with his previous club, Hunslet.

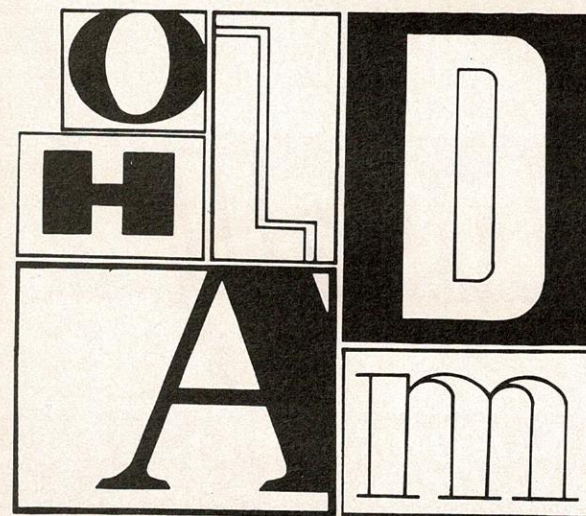

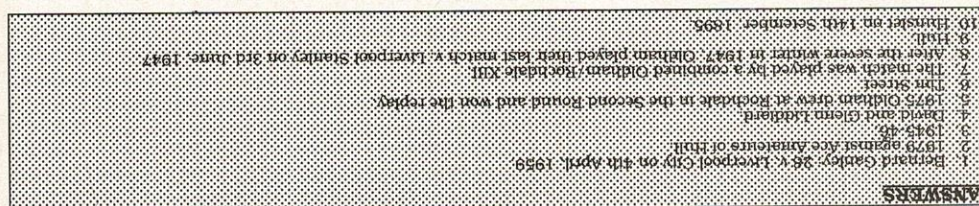

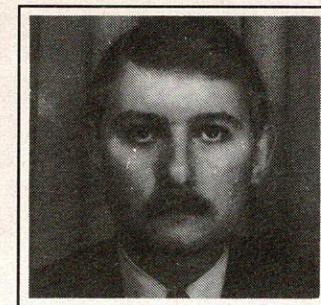

I'll be back with more from the players and Peter Tunks in two week's time.

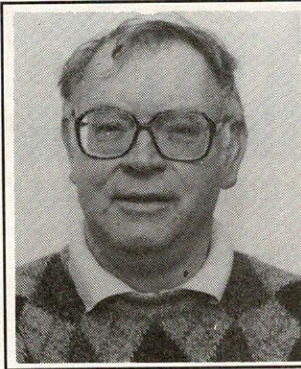

ROGER HALSTEAD looks at PREVIOUS ENCOUNTERS



There is little danger of Warrington underestimating their Second Division opponents, Oldham, in today's Lancashire Cup First Round tie.

It is little more than seven months since the Wires were here, in the First Round of last season's Silk Cut Challenge Cup, in which they scraped through 8-3 after a tremendously competitive and evenly-balanced tie.

Brian Johnson, the Warrington coach, was quoted later as saying: 'I'm just glad we are through. Oldham gave a tremendous performance. I don't want to come back here in a cup-tie for a long time'.

Well, here he is and with both cubs having made significant changes in their ranks since last February, it will be interesting to see how today's tie compares with that absorbing contest in the Challenge Cup.

The teams that day were as follows:

OLDHAM: Platt, Christie, Edwards, Nicklin, Tyrer, Martyn, Flanagan, Sherratt, Bates, Street, Maxwell, McAlister, Pachniuk. Subs: Russell, Atkinson.

WARRINGTON: Lyon, Drummond, Rudd, Bateman, Kenyon, Ellis, Crompton, Harmon, Mann, Jackson, Sanderson, Mercer, Shelford. Subs: Cullen, Chambers.

Of the Oldham team that day, only Christie, Tyrer, Martyn, Sherratt, Bates, Maxwell, Pachniuk and Atkinson are still on the books and there is a distinct possibility that only one or two players will wear the same number on their backs today as they did the last time the teams met.

Warrington will also show significant change and will be without Lyon, Drummond, Crompton and Mercer, the first two being involved in contract disputes and the latter two having been transferred to Wigan and Leeds respectively. The most significant replacement is that of Aussie scrum-half Greg Mackey, who has returned to Wilderspool after a successful spell at Hull.

In the last four or five seasons, Oldham and Warrington have been involved in some stunning Cup ties, including a Lancashire Cup Final and that thrilling Challenge Cup Semi-Final at Wigan when Oldham, once more, came so desperately close to breaking their Wembley duck.

Last season's First Round tie was just as enthralling. There was only one try in the game and it came on the stroke of half time, when Welshman Kevin Ellis capitalised on a Chris Rudd break, deep inside his own quarter, to score a long-range try that was to prove decisive.

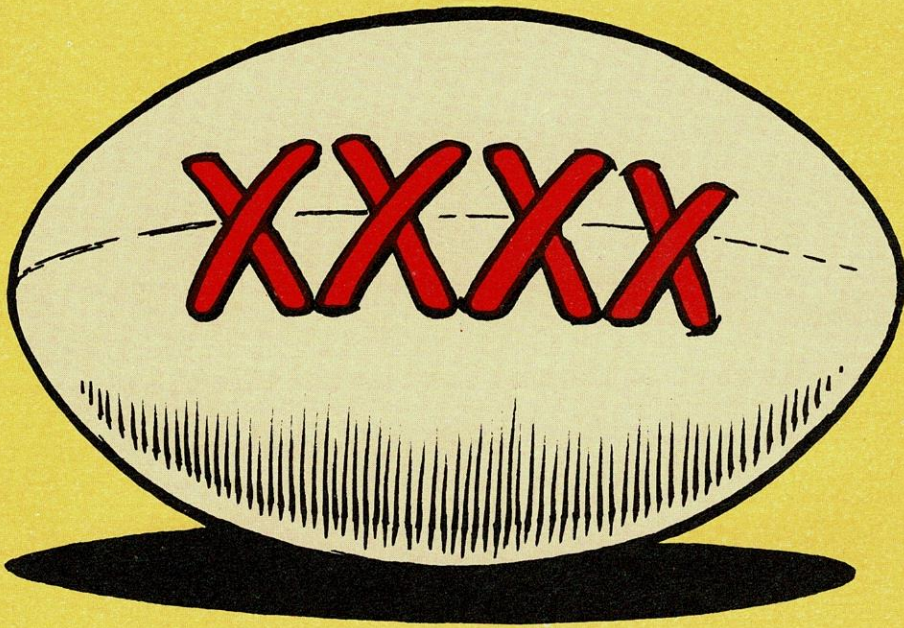

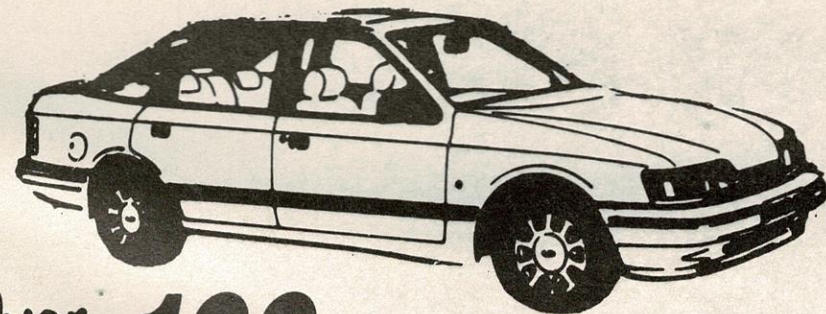
