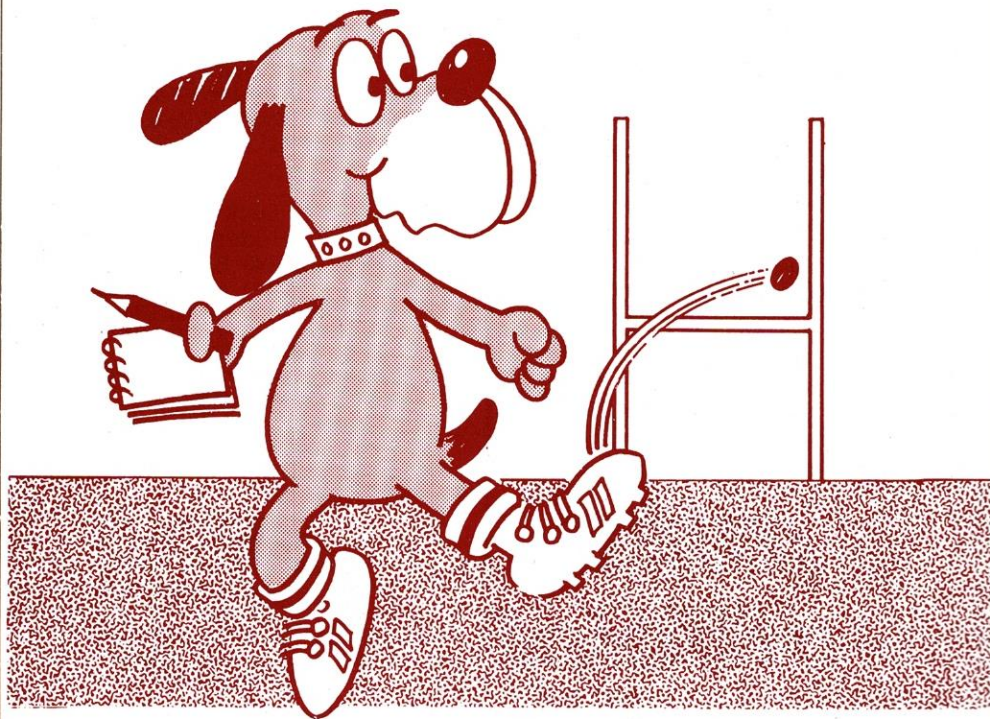

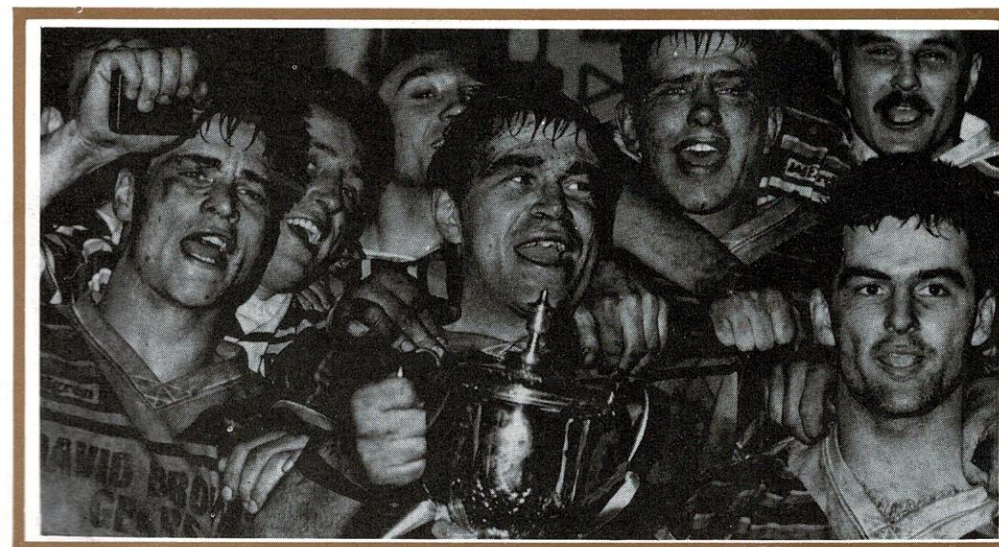

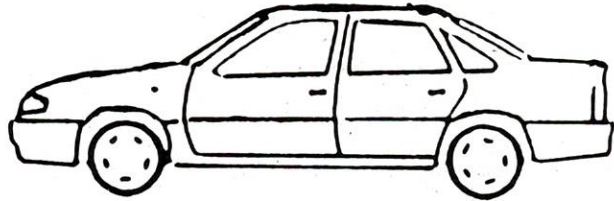

TINY SOLOMONA A Kiwi of Western Samoan origin, Tiny signed for Oldham in early 1992 from Widnes, but did not make his debut until the start of the 1992-93 season, because of groin trouble. Playing at the top of his form now and won the Man of the Match Award in Oldham's First Round Lancashire Cup win against First Division club, Warrington.

DAVID BRADBURY Signed for Oldham from Leigh Miners touring New Zealand with BARLA Under 19 squad. David is a strong running loose forward, who impressed on Oldham's pre-season tour of France.

IVA ROPATI A member of the famous New Zealand footballing Ropati family, Iva is the top try scorer in the country this year. A new signing for Oldham and an exciting prospect for the team.

SCOTT RANSON Twenty four year old St. Helens player and the top try scorer from his former club, Swinton. Signed for Oldham in March 1992.

RICHARD PACHNIUK A twenty year old from Dewsbury with Polish grandparents. A clever, creative thinking type of hooker, he is expected to go a long way.

RICHARD RUSSELL Captain of the side, Richard is a local lad who arrived home at Watersheddings via Wigan. Played for Wigan in the World Club Championship against Manly,

but is now mainly regarded as a stand off or loose forward. Creative player with an excellent pair of hands.

TOMMY MARTYN A player of exciting potential. He is a stand off or centre, who can sniff tries out of nothing....Poacher of the Rugby League variety, who can turn a match at a stroke.

MARK SHEALS Rugged, hard working prop, who joined Oldham in the three-for-one swap with Leigh in the summer of 1992. Won a Lancashire Cap last season but missed his county debut due to suspension.

SEAN DEVINE A 22 year old scrum-half, whom Oldham boss Peter Tunks also recruited in an exchange deal.

MARK MEADOWS A second-row forward who had seen service with Swinton and Trafford Borough, when Tunks snapped him up on the eve of the 1992/93 season, from the new Blackpool Gladiators club.

HUGH GUMBS A young winger from Yorkshire, who signed for Bradford Northern when David Hobbs was boss. Had a spell with Batley and then signed for Oldham as a free agent in the summer of 1992. Went to Australia that summer in the Students World Cup.

STUART COCKER Yet another of Tunk's famous wheeler-dealer signings, Cocker joined Oldham in the deal that took Neil Flanagan and Des Foy to Fartown. A try poacher....well known for his scoring habits....Stuart scored twice in each of his first two games for Oldham against London Crusaders and Carlisle.

PAUL JONES 6ft 3ins and 17 stone, Leigh based Jones had more than 60 senior appearances for St. Helens behind him, albeit many of them as substitute, when he signed for Oldham with Sean Devine in the Chris Joynt deal.

BEN OLSEN This Danish born forward made a name for himself with London Crusaders and signed for Oldham in the famous swop-shop summer of 1992.

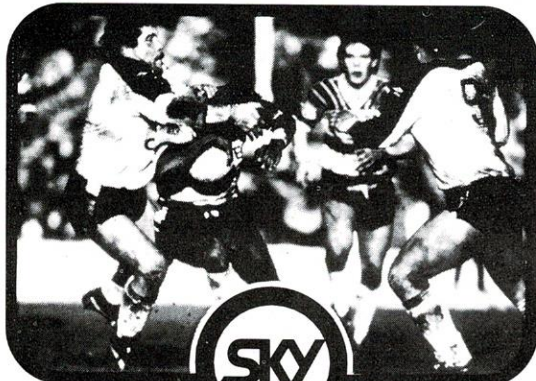

HUDDERSFIELD AND OLDHAM — HEAD TO HEAD

Keen rivalry has always existed between Huddersfield and Oldham and at one time the games at Fartown took place on Honley Feast Monday. Later Easter Monday was the regular date.

It was at Watersheddings that the late Harold Wagstaff appeared for the last time in the Huddersfield first team (March 23, 1925).

Oldham's record home attendance is 28,000 who were present for Fartown's visit on February 24, 1912.

The two clubs last met in 1989/90 when Oldham won all four games (2 league, and encounters at Watersheddings in the Challenge Cup and Regal Trophy).

Our last victory was in January 1978 and since then Oldham have won on 12 successive occasions.

New Laws for Season 1992-93

Scrum and penalty positions — No scrum will be formed within 10 metres of the touchlines or the goal lines.

Attacking player tackled in-goal — If a player in possession is tackled in his opponents' in-goal area but cannot ground the ball for a try, a scrum will be formed 10 metres from the line, with head-and-ball going to the team who were in possession. However, should this occur on the last tackle, a handover will be awarded on the 10 metre line.

Blood-bin — A player in the "blood-bin" may return onto the field to take a kick at goal even though he was not on the field when either a try was scored or a penalty was awarded. However, the player must have first satisfied the match officials that the flow of blood has been halted. (N.B. A substitute still cannot enter the field and immediately take a kick at goal).

Head tackles — A penalty will be awarded against any player who touches the head or neck of an opponent in either a deliberate, reckless or careless manner while attempting a tackle. A penalty might not be given if the referee considers that the player in possession put himself into a position which made contact with his head unavoidable.

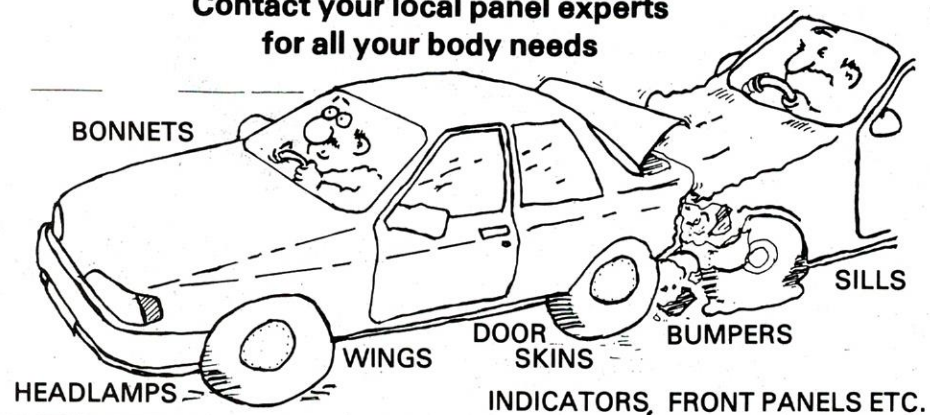

IN TOUCH WITH RUGBY LEAGUE

DARYL POWELL

Daryl Powell of Sheffield Eagles needs four tries to become the first player to score a century of touchdowns for the club. And with two Test match tries for Great Britain he is only two off a career century in club and representative matches.

The former Redhill (Castleford) Under-19 amateur was the first player to sign for Sheffield when they were formed in 1984-85. He made his professional debut at centre in their first match when they beat Rochdale Hornets 29-10 on 2 September 1984.

Powell has remained a regular first team player at centre, stand-off and loose forward with a club record 244 appearances, including three as substitute.

He also holds the club record of most tries in a match with five against Mansfield Marksman on 2 January 1989. He has scored three other hat-tricks, including one in last season's Stones Bitter Divisional Premiership Final defeat of Oldham, which earned him the Man of the Match award.

Powell's best season's tally for Sheffield is 28 in 1988-89 which was a club record until broken by Iva Ropati's 30 last season.

LEADING SCORERS

Brimah Kebbie of Bradford Northern extended his early lead as this season's top try scorer by scoring two tries and taking his total to eight at the weekend. The winger has scored two tries in each of his four matches for Bradford since leaving Huddersfield in the close season.

Former Leeds player Phil Ford is another winger to have made a high scoring start for his new club and is second after his five for Salford against Whitehaven took his season's total to six.

Tea Ropati (St. Helens), Tommy Martyn (Leigh), and Dean Marwood (Workington T.) are the leading goal scorers with 15 each. Ropati and Marwood have also scored two tries to be joint top point scorers with 38.

LOSING RUN

Swinton ended their losing run of five with a 40-10 home defeat of Highfield in the first round of the Greenalls Lancashire Cup.

Castleford now have the longest losing run of five stretching back to last season.

POINT SCORING RUN

Mike Smith of Chorley Borough has the longest point scoring run of 17 matches stretching back to last Boxing Day.

MILESTONES

Paul Medley, the Bradford Northern and former Leeds and Halifax international forward, needs three tries for a career century of touchdowns.
