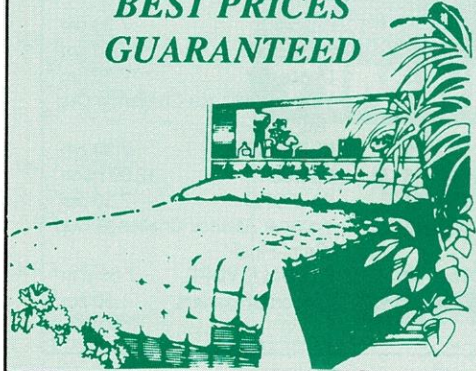

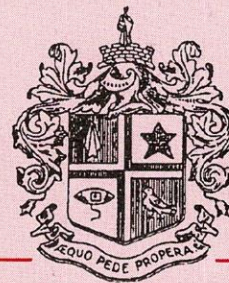

DENIS RAMSDALE

Following our defeat against Castleford on Sunday it is my job not to allow the players head to fall. Sure it was a bitter pill to swallow losing so heavily especially as the feeling in the Club was expecting a marked improvement. Certainly from my own point of view I was expectant of an immediate improvement following a good weeks preparation, but unfortunately it wasn't to be.

Our defence was indisciplined at marker and we had too many players who were not prepared to work in this area, our general defence started off reasonably well but was sustained only for about 20 minutes, and the only excuse I can give for this was lack of commitment

from some of the players. The result of even one player not performing to the required standard affects the whole team and its organisation.

Against Oldham tonight I expect to see far greater commitment from the side selected, better communication on the field and a great

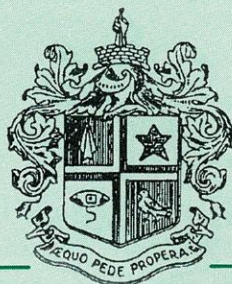
desire to WIN.

VISITORS TODAY

OLDHAM

The scene is set tonight for a cracker of a match and I will be surprised if there is not a big crowd to watch it.

Oldham, of course, come here this evening having recorded a narrow win in their league programme at Huddersfield last Sunday and fresh from their Lancashire Cup triumph against Warrington ten days ago. It was a tremendous performance against the Wire and Oldham were deserving winners of the £500 team of the round prize from the Sponsors Greenalls.

They will come tonight hoping to repeat that feat and take home another First Division scalp.

Our disappointing performance against Castleford at the weekend will have given Oldham a great lift, and they will be confident of success.

The game takes on an extra dimension with many ex Leigh players now on show at Oldham and ex Oldham players appearing in the Leigh colours. Apart from the play-

ers involved in the recent 'swop' Oldham will be displaying Leigh born players Sean Devine, Paul Jones, Tommy Martyn and Sean Tyrer and all will be out to do well and so hold up their heads in the Town after the match.

Sean Tyrer would seem to have taken over the full back berth since the transfer of Duncan Platt to Hilton Park. Sean is a very reliable goal kicker although Sean Devine and Tommy Martyn shared the kicking duties at Fartown on Sunday, Devine kicking three and Martyn one.

The wing positions are taken up by ex Swinton three quarter Scott Ranson whilst ex Bradford wingman Hugh Gumbs is occupying the No.5 shirt. Gumbs too is not a bad goal kicker so coach Peter Tunks will not have many problems in the goal kicking department this season, despite an abnormal number of misses at Fartown on Sunday.

Iva Ropati is one of the most respected centres in the game today certainly in a class of his own in Division Two. The player has excellent pace and superb handling ability, and had to be the bargain of last season when he was captured from Sheffield Eagles. His dismissal

against Huddersfield was a sickener and will leave a massive 'hole' if he collects a suspension tomorrow.

The pack are a strong mobile unit with Mark Sheals adding new dimension to the squad and Tiny Solomona adding the power up front. 'Tiny' nicknamed because of his massive frame was "surplus to requirements" at Naughton Park and Oldham's gain is certainly a Widnes loss.

Former Wigan three quarter Richard Russell is the Oldham skipper and operates these days either from the loose forward or hooking position but with David Bradbury excelling in the hooking role in recent weeks Russell will continue to control things from the base of the pack.

Oldham will be playing in their change strip this evening and will be out to reach the semi final of the Greenall Sponsored Competition, they will be a difficult nut to crack and the game should provide some splendid entertainment.

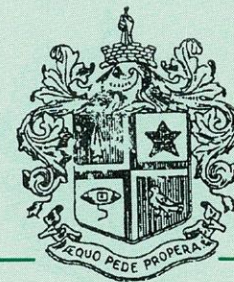

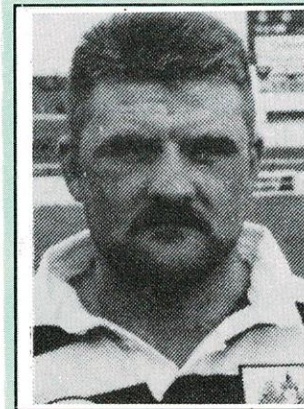

MARK SHEALS

MARK SHEALS must think life is full of "if only's". If only he'd not been sent off at the start of last season he'd have won his first representative honour; if only Leigh hadn't chosen Jim Crellin as coach, then there's every chance he'd still be a Leigh player.

But life must go on and Mark is professional enough to have put his recent disappointments firmly behind him and doubtless will play a key role in tonight's Lancashire Cup tie.

Mark made no secret of the fact that he'd no real desire to leave Hilton Park but he felt he couldn't work under Jim Crellin a second time and when the opportunity came to move to Watersheddings in the swap deal that brought Tim Street, Duncan Platt and Keith Newton to Hilton Park, the powerful and popular prop jumped at the chance.

He'd long been a target for Oldham coach Peter Tunks who perhaps sees some of his playing style in that of the all-action Sheals.

Now if Sheals can reproduce the sort of exciting form he regularly produced at Hilton Park, he could still

get the representative recognition he's looking for.

The Second Division isn't the easiest place to get notice—nobody knows that better than Sheals after two seasons with Leigh—but he's already proved it can be done.

At the start of last season he was playing the best rugby of his career, a fact that was rightly recognised by then Lancashire coach Ray Ashton.

Ashton selected Sheals in his Lancashire side for the annual War of the Roses clash with Yorkshire at Headingley last September. A good game in front of Mal Reilly, perhaps a Test debut later in the season against the French and the carrot of Britain's tour 'down under' as the big prize.

It all seemed to be going right

until, at all places, he was sent off for a high tackle at Oldham. A subsequent two match ban put him out of the War of the Roses match and sadly he never again seemed to get into the international reckoning.

But now he's got a second chance and anyone who saw him in his two years at Hilton Park will know he's capable of playing at a far higher level.

Perhaps again this season circumstances have contrived to work against him. Because of the World Cup Final at Wembley next month, this season's Roses game has been shelved, thereby limiting opportunity for players to grab some representative recognition.

But perhaps if the Rugby League decide to squeeze in an England v Wales fixture in mid season it could be a useful exercise to see the respective merits of the 'fringe' players such as Sheals.

It seems as though Sheals has already become a firm favourite with the fans at Watersheddings. He deserves that recognition and the chance to try his luck higher up the Rugby League ladder.

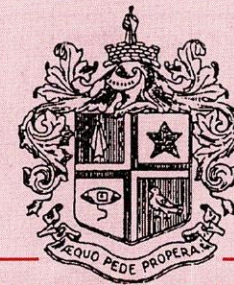

STATEMENT Re SALE OF HILTON PARK

The old company is still in administration and the current company has no control over that. When the lease agreement was started last summer we had no players, they were bought en bloc from the administrator.

From April last year until the current time the administrator has not been able to sell the ground. In the summer this club went to great expense to engage a top commercial surveyor to prepare a report on a professional and commercial basis to find what Hilton Park is worth.

The current club has made an offer to the administrator which is double the price the report recommended. That's an indication of how determined we are to secure Hilton Park.

Checks with the administrator have shown that he has no other bids for Hilton Park on the table and in the unlikely event of any sort of planning permission being granted, no further bids are envisaged. Ours is the only firm offer he has.

We believe that we've offered a very fair price for Hilton Park and feel the administrator should now recommend to the owners that they accept.

Our ultimate objective is to put a team out on the park that the town can be proud of, but first of all we've got to secure Hilton Park. Which would the fans prefer—a good team and no ground or an ordinary team and a ground that's secure forever. Virtually every penny we raise is earmarked for the purchase of Hilton Park. Previous administrations at Leigh have tried to run things with just two or three people in charge. Now we've got 40-50 who have the best interests of the club at heart. We've got Board members, a Management Committee and a Supporters Club—people all willingly giving their time and effort to help out.

Securing this club's future is our top priority and the fans can rest assured that every step is being taken to ensure that happens.

Other News . . .

Duncan Platt's injury, sustained last Sunday, is not as bad as was first feared. He went to hospital for X-Rays on a painful shoulder but there was no break. He has a problem within the shoulder blade which should keep him out of action for two weeks.

Lee Hansen who began his comeback after injury in the Reserves at Hemel Hempstead suffered no reaction and is certainly back in contention after a strong game in the Capital.

News is not as good in regard to Simon Booth who has a fractured ankle following an off the field accident. Simon is expected to be sidelined for up to eight weeks.

Paul Topping has revealed that he will not play for Leigh again. The out of contract full back has been the subject of an enquiry from Castleford and Salford and both clubs are offering players, neither having any money to spend.

The Leigh club is interested in a deal providing it is the right deal for us—we will not be rushing into a deal until it is absolutely right for us. The message to Castleford and Salford is "think again" the players offered are not right for us.

The Club are pleased to secure the capture of James Cassidy, an outstanding amateur from Widnes Amateurs Appleton Park. James, who has been attracting the attention of several top clubs including Warrington and St Helens will complete the signing at half time this evening.

James impressed in his debut against Hemel Hempstead on Saturday and is delighted to be joining the Club.

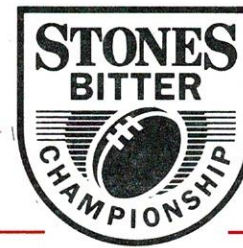

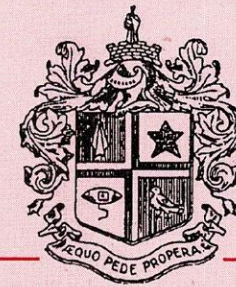

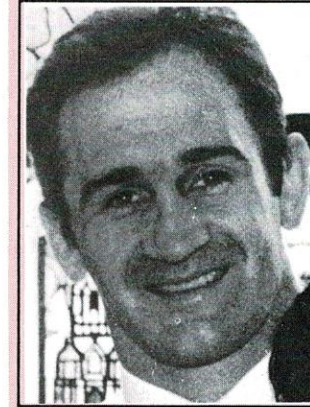
CAPTAIN'S VIEWPOINT

I am sure a change of fortune will come about but it is up to everyone at the Club to work as hard as possible so we can get on winning ways sooner rather than later.

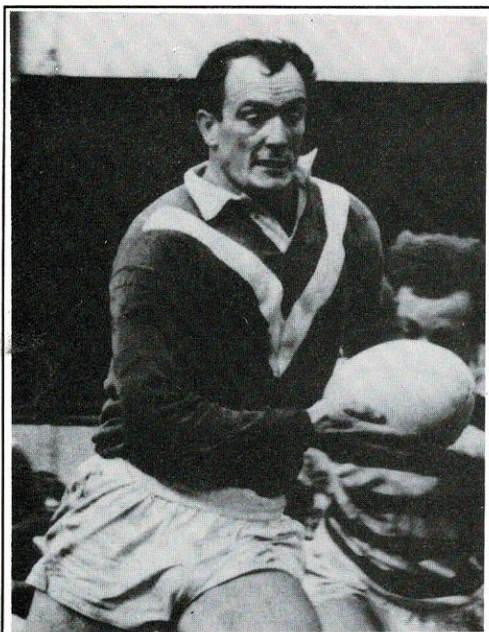

A 22-year old centre playing for Swansea R.U. Club, Gordon Lewis decided to forego the chance of winning a cherished Welsh cap to take up Leigh's offer to turn professional in 1958. He went on to play for Leigh for over 12 years, giving the club loyal and distinguished service. Rock solid in the tackle and strong in attack, he had the misfortune to play in what was at the time a largely undistinguished Leigh side. Lewis won one GB cap and played for the Welsh RL side, finishing his career with a short spell at Swinton.
