

# FROM the BOARDROOM

#### CHAIRMAN JAMES QUINN

It would be remiss of me at this time if, on behalf of the Board of Directors, I did not offer congratulations to all concerned in our First Round Lancashire Cup win over Warrington.

It was a tremendous performance by the players and it owed much to the preparation undertaken by Peter Tunks and Eric Fitzsimmons.

Teamwork was the platform on which the win was built, but I think all

the players would take off their hats for this one to three-try match-winner Iva Ropati and to the heavyweights of the front row, Mark Sheals and Tiny Solomona, both of whom had magnificent games.

It was a big night for the Oldham club and it must have been particularly pleasing to Peter, who has put in so much hard work in his first 18 months with us.

Did you also notice what a lot of national publicity we got from the tie, both in the following morning's papers, on television and during the week?

That sort of exposure is important for the club in terms of putting us in the public spotlight because it is only when you are in the BIG LEAGUE of national publicity that you are in a position to fulfil potential on sponsorship, marketing etc.

We got much more exposure from the Warrington game than we got in a full season of Second Division football last year and that underlines how important it is that we win promotion this time, so that we will be in the BIG LEAGUE every week next season.

Talking of sponsorship and commercial activities, we had a deputation from a marketing company at the Board Meeting last Monday.

At the time of writing, the outcome was unknown but it was expected that we would be taking the firm on board

to spearhead our drive for more income from sponsorship and advertising, both national and local.

The firm would be working on a commission basis and would take a lot of pressure off Peter Young and John

Watkins, who have done a tremendous job over recent months, in running Cashline and Lifeline without the back-up of a Commercial Manager.

It makes their job easier when we have the sort of win we enjoyed against the Wires and it is also some reward for the ever-growing band of voluntary workers, who are giving of their time and commitment to help the club through a patch when expenses have to be kept to a minimum.

A lot of people are helping voluntarily. I can't mention them all but a special word for ALEX GIVVONS and JOE

BUCKLEY, who do such a wonderful job in the dressing rooms.

The Supporters' Club, too, are doing a magnificent job for no return but job satisfaction and the knowledge that they are working voluntarily for the club that means so much to them.

They man the Club Shop daily, run their own canteens on match days, organise refreshments for the players after training on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and put on a full cooked breakfast for them after their Saturday morning session.

They also provide after-match refreshments in the Boardroom and all the Club has to pay for is the actual cost

to the Supporters' Club of the food involved. We also have now the benefit of keen supporters who are doing jobs around the ground and can be seen, on

most evenings, putting their talents to good use for the benefit of the club.

The contributors to the programme do it voluntarily and there are, literally, scores of keen helpers, either full-time or part-time, who provide the club with their time and talents.

Tom Patterson, our Ground Director, has assembled an excellent team of volunteer workers on match days and it may not be generally known that the Club's Safety Officer, retired Police Superintendent Roger Norris, also provides his skill, expertise and vast experience of these matters on a voluntary basis.

We are back to the grass roots, with people coming forward in numbers to help us out. That's terrific. Thank you all.

#### LAW CHANGES FOR SEASON 1992-93

At its meeting on 28th May, 1992, the Rugby Football League International Board approved some amendments to the Laws of the Game and after discussions with RFL Referees and the International Rules Committee, they are as follows in layman's terms:

#### 1. Field Markings

- (a) 20 metre lines will be substituted for the 22 metre
- (b) The transverse lines marking the distance of 10 metres from the goal lines, 20 metre lines and halfway line must be marked across the full width of the field. (Previously this was optional.)

#### 2. MARKS FOR SCRUMS

It has been agreed that all scrums will be awarded on the 10 metre line from the goal line for the "upright tackle" of an attacking player in possession or for an attacking player who cannot ground the ball in the ingoal area (tackles 1-5) and for all infringements (knock-ons etc.), which occur between the 10 metre line and the goal line.

#### 3. MARKS FOR HANDOVERS

It has been agreed that the handover will be awarded on the 10 metre line from the goal line for the upright tackle of an attacking player in possession, or an attacking player who cannot ground the ball in the ingoal area, on the last tackle and for all other sixth completed tackles, the handover will be awarded at the point of tackle.

#### 4. MARKS FOR PENALTIES

It was agreed that the penalty mark be awarded 10 metres from the goal line or touch line for the following

(a) a kick through by an attacking player which goes over the dead ball line or hits the corner flag or goes over the touch in-goal line or bounces in the in-goal area and that player is subsequently obstructed.

(b) where an attacking player commits a penalisable offence, in his opponent's in-goal area.

(c) where a defending player commits a penalisable offence in his own in-goal area, unrelated to a try scoring movement.

(d) misconduct in touch.

In all other cases, penalty awards in the field of play. particularly between the goal line and the 10 metre line, will be made at the point of the offence.

#### 5. MISCONDUCT

No contact will be allowed above the shoulders, when effecting a tackle unless contact is accidental or a player in possession ducks into the tackler or tacklers.

#### 6. BLOOD BIN AND KICK FOR GOAL

It was agreed that a player can return from the Blood Bin to the field of play to specifically kick for goal, if that player so chooses, provided that player is no longer bleeding and his replacement has left the field of play.





# BACK PAGES

First of all I'm sure that I speak for everyone connected with Oldham R.L.F.C., in wishing a warm welcome to all the ex-players who are attending this afternoon's Club Reunion.

This event was first organised three years ago, to coincide with the Centenary of the Opening of Watersheddings on 28th September, 1889 and has now become an Annual feature on the corresponding weekend to the original date.

The opposition for that first match, as today, were the "Lions" of Swinton and before a crowd of 7,000, they rather tempered the celebrations by inflicting defeat on the home team. This game was also the first time Oldham played in red and white shirts, having previously sported amber and black.

The honour of kicking off the first match on the new ground fell to the Oldham captain Bill McCutcheon, a Welshman, who was a member of the first-ever Wales team to win Rugby Union's coveted Triple Crown, however, even in those far off pre-Northern Union, non-professional days, the top players were still lured to the top Northern teams, usually by a guarantee of employment. After 10 years service on the playing staff, where he gained County Honours for his adopted Lancashire, Bill went on to become a leading referee, handling Cup Finals and test Matches and also served for many years on the Oldham Committee.







## PREVIOUS ENCOUNTERS

Swinton and Oldham have not met many times in recent seasons because the clubs have hopped through the divisions and have often missed each other en route.

Last season, for instance, the Lions finished in bottom place in the First Division while Oldham ended up third in the new, eight-club Second Division.

There was just one meeting between Swinton and Oldham last season and that was at Station Road in the first round

of the Lancashire Cup on September 15th, 1991 when Oldham won a thriller 22-21.

The Oldham team was as follows: Nicklin, Irving, Martyn, McAlister, Henderson, Warburton, Flanagan, Donegan, Pachniuk, Street, Round, Newton, Russell. Subs: Longstaff, Tupaea.

There was a crowd of 3,285 and the Oldham scorers were as follows: Goals, Martyn (3); Tries, Pachniuk, Martyn, Nicklin, McAlister.

I recall that Richard Pachniuk was awarded a hotly-disputed try in the dying minutes, after Tim Street and Shane Tupaea, on his debut as substitute, led the Oldham victory charge against their former team.

Little did we know that this would be Oldham's last appearance on the famous Station Road Ground, which has been the scene of so many Oldham triumphs and disasters in Cup Semi-Finals and other big matches over the years.

It is interesting to note too, that of the Oldham team that bid its farewell to Station Road (since sold for housing development), only Martyn, Pachniuk, Russell and Tupaea are likely to be in today's line-up.

Scott Ranson scored a try for Swinton last September, little knowing at the time that he would be an Oldham player before the end of the season, moving here in an exchange for Tony Barrow Jnr., Richard Irving and Simon Longstaff.

Sadly, Richard was badly injured while playing for the Lions against Rochdale Hornets on the opening day of the season and he could be out of action for several months.

However, it will be a big day for Longstaff and Barrow, on their return to their former club and also for Swinton coach, Tony Barrow Snr., who was boss here for more than two years prior to the Peter Tunks era.

On the other side of the coin, Oldham's ex-Lions, Ranson, Tupaea, Mark Meadows and Mark Sheals, will be keen to come out of today's game with flying colours, although Meadows missed last week's game at Huddersfield with a calf muscle injury and he may be out of the reckoning.

The connections between the clubs do not end there. Former Oldham Chairman, Harvey Ashworth, joined the Swinton Board when he left here and another ex-Oldham Committee man, Jack Bowden, is still on the Board of a club which now plays its home games on the Bury soccer ground at Gigg Lane.

The clubs did not meet at all during 1990-91, when Oldham were relegated from the First Division and Swinton promoted from the second.

In 1989-90, when both clubs were in Division Two, Oldham won 29-14 at home and lost 15-12 away, before gaining revenge nine days later with a 32-10 win at Watersheddings in the First Round of the Second Division Premiership play-off.




