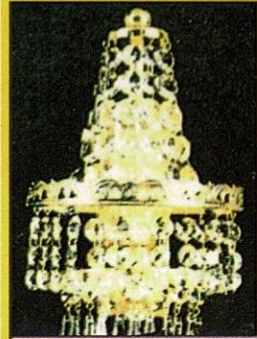

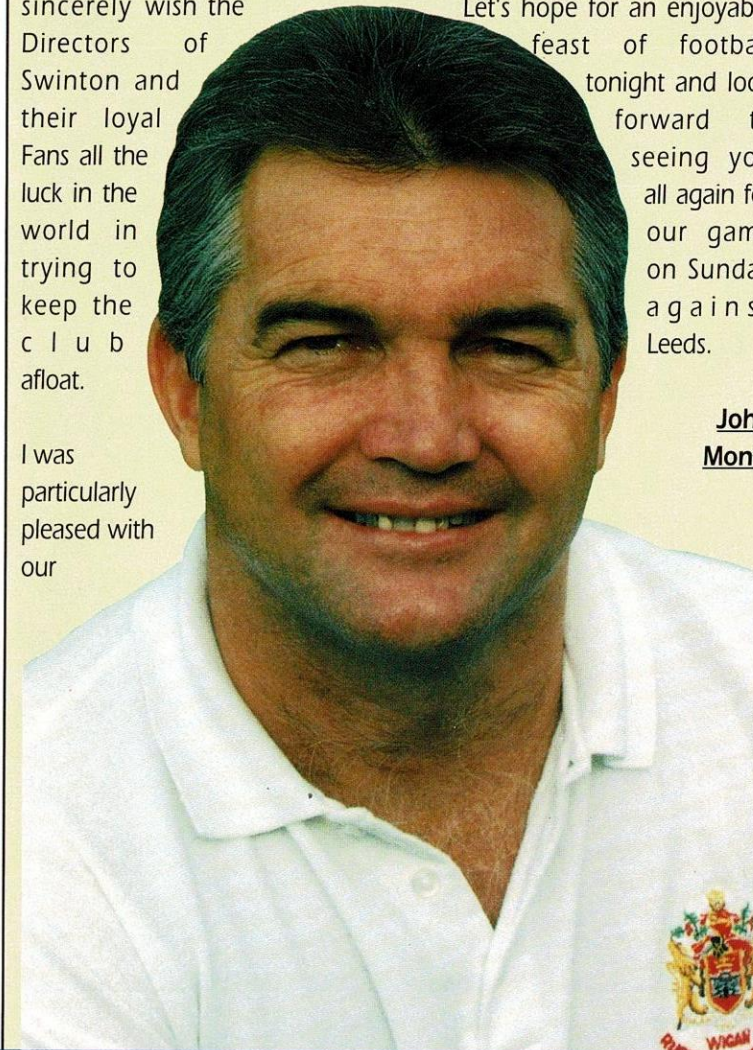

Let's hope for an enjoyable feast of football tonight and look forward to seeing you all again for our game on Sunday against Leeds.

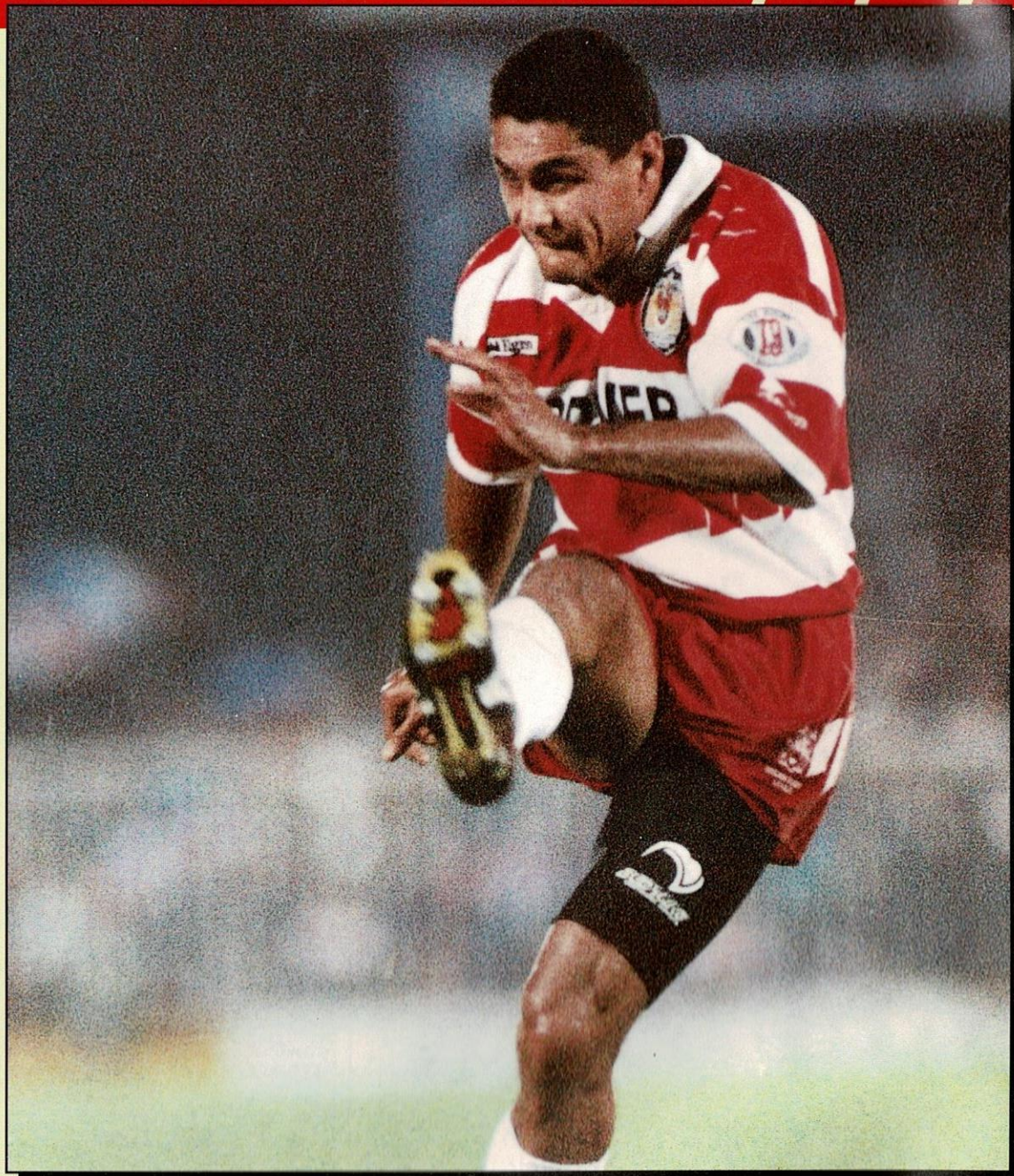

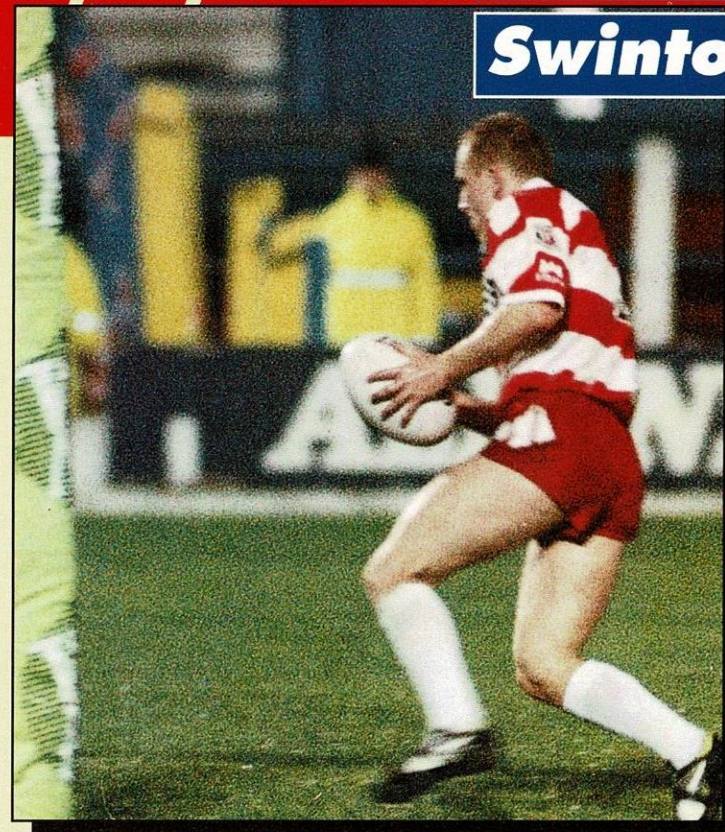
▲ Frano Botica launches another successful conversion.

Martin Offiah gave Great Britain a World Cup scare when he was carried out of this Lancashire Cup semi-final massacre.

The flying Wigan winger suffered a knee injury and there were immediate worries for his Wembley place against the mighty Australians on October 24.

There was no repeat of the hamstring trouble that kept him out earlier this month - but his knee was promptly cased in ice because of tendon damage fears.

The injury was the only blot on a night that belonged to Shaun Edwards.

He turned in a super show, bagging 10 tries to equal Offiah's club record against Leeds last season.

Edwards, the game's deadliest finisher, was magnificent and involved in just about everything.

Poor Swinton, plagued by a cash crisis and forced to play at Bury's Gigg Lane, hardly knew what hit them.

Edwards had done most of the damage by the time the game was just 20 minutes old as Wigan ran up the points at the rate of one a minute.

The loss of Offiah five minutes after the break did nothing to slow down the Wigan machine.

Time and again they ripped through the fragile Swinton defence and almost every time it was Edwards who was there for the touchdown.

Edwards finished one short of the 87 year old League scoring record, but he still enjoyed his 10th the most.

It could easily have been scored by skipper Dean Bell, but with Edwards on hand he elected to give the scrum-half the final touch.

League Spotlight

Tonight's County Cup semi-final throw up some intriguing possibilities. In the Lancashire Cup, Oldham meet the Champions Wigan at Central Park, while at Knowsley Road, the holders St. Helens take on Salford. In his second season as coach at Watersheddings, Peter Tunks has moulded an exciting side that has beaten Warrington and Leigh already in this competition. With little cash to throw about, he has changed the side with swap deals and free transfers so much so that only two players from the side that played a league fixture here at Central Park in 1990 are still at the club.

The 'Roughyeds' have set the early pace in the Second Division and tonight's clash will be a yardstick to their peporredness for the top flight next season should they gain promotion. There is plenty of spirit at the club as was shown in last seasons Premiership Final when Oldham fought Sheffield all the way despite having Keith Newton sent off early in the game.

Several Wigan old boys have moved to Watersheddings recently, Richard Russell, Ged Byrne and Sean Tyrer among them and although Byrne is currently in dispute with the club, the other two seem sure to play.

The side has plenty of pace in the backs and a good pack which helped them to victory over Warrington and provided the platform for the comfortable win over Leigh in the second round despite the side being a man down for much of the contest. Se'e Solomona has moved from Widnes to partner Mark Sheals in the front row although Sheal may be missing tonight due to suspension.

Iva Ropati, last seasons leading try-scorer in the Second Division, has returned from suspension to partner former Huddersfield man Stuart Cocker in the centre. Cocker began his Oldham career with four tries in his first two games and seems sure to notch

many more this season. Scott Ranson is a danger from anywhere on the field and the Wigan defence will have to be at its best to shut out the visitors.

Much has been made of Wigan's failure to reach the final of this competition under John Monie. The furthest he has reached has been two semi-finals in 1989 when Oldham ran out 19 points - 18 winners at Watersheddings and last year when St.Helens were convincing victor's at Knowsley Road.

Following last seasons glories, many have doubted the Central Park sides ability to challenge again for honours this season. A win tonight will put them in the final and give the side a chance to score a point or two on those of little faith. If the 78 points - 0 caning of Swinton is anything to go by the Cherry and Whites are determined to better last seasons achievements.

Oldham are not without hope. One thing that the season has already shown is that on any given day any one side can bear another. Oldham will be well prepared for tonight's game and well able to give Wigan an uncomfortable time.

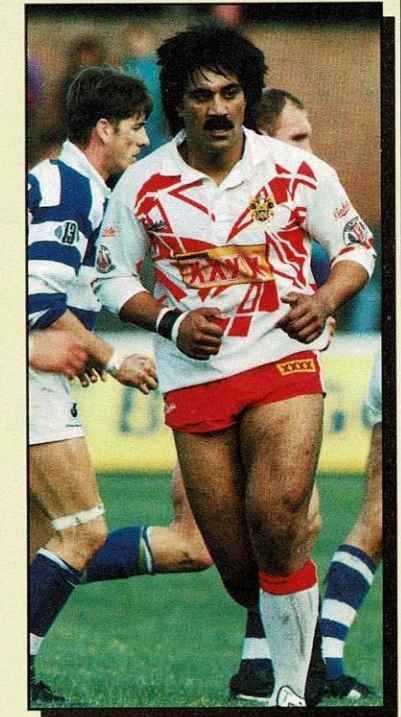
At Knowsley Road, Salford meet St Helens for the second time in a fortnight and will hope to do better than the 48 points - 8 thrashing they received in League football. The Saints were rarely out of second gear in that game as they punished the Red Devils every error with tries.

Saints however, are anxious to hang on to the trophy and will start as favourites to win. They had to fight every inch of the way to get past Widnes in the second round and a possible final showdown with Wigan is a very tempting lure.

Over the other side of the Pennines, there will be much interest at the Don Valley Stadium as Sheffield Eagles are just eighty minutes away from their first County Cup Final. The County Cups

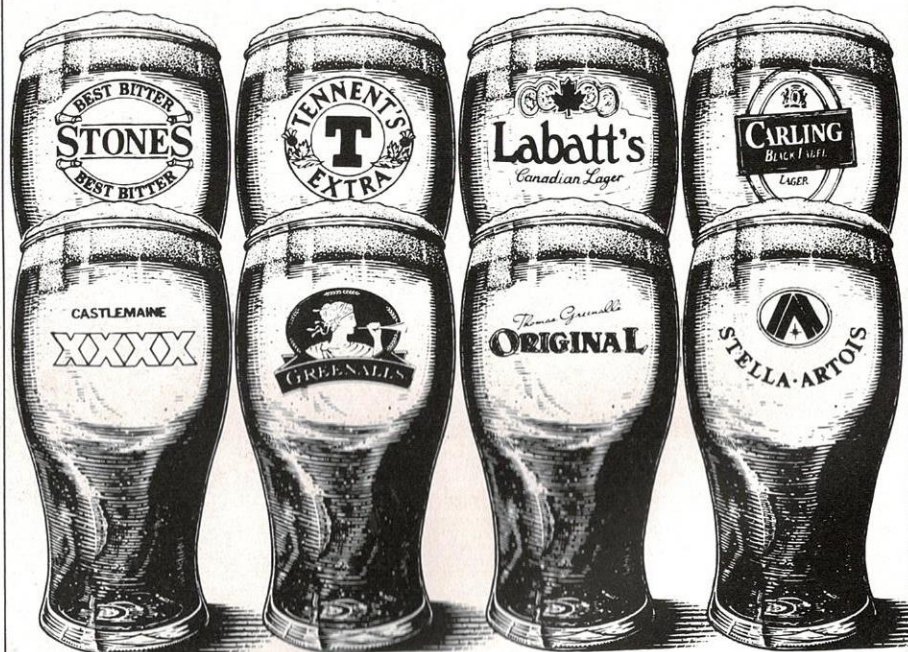
have come in for some criticism but there will be no moaning from the Eagles should they overcome Hull. Having already disposed of Halifax and Bradford, the Eagles will not be overawed by the Humberiders who came to grief in Sheffield in the 1991 Challenge Cup and seem to have lost their early season form.

The other tie takes place at Featherstone Rovers meet Wakefield Trinity. Rovers are adjusting to their new coach and the loss of Deryck Fox while Trinity are struggling for League form. League positions won't mean much in this derby and the game could go either way.

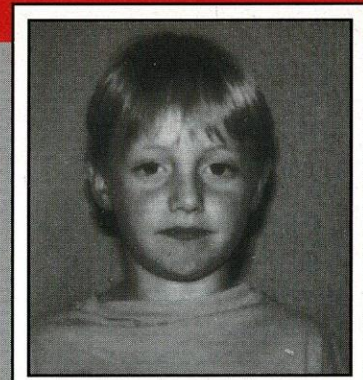

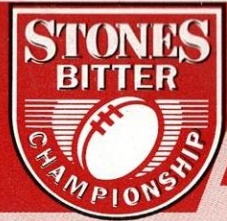

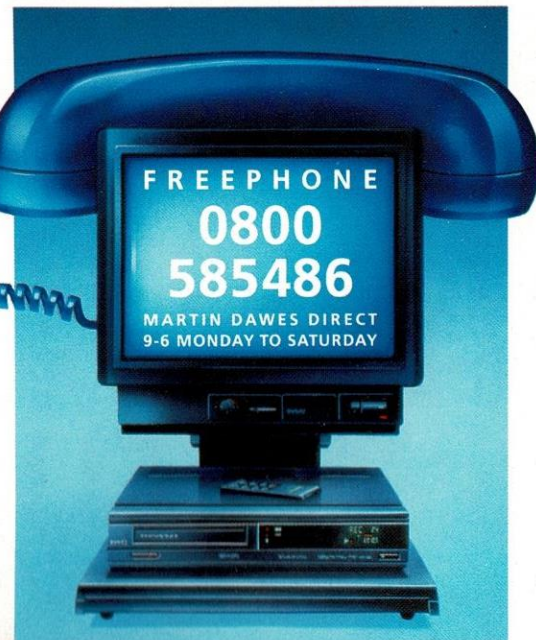

WORLD CUP FINAL FEVER

The 1992 World Cup Final at Wembley Stadium between Gt. Britain and Australia is now less than a month away and excitement is mounting from St. Helens to Sydney, Wollongong to Wigan, and Brisbane to Bradford. In fact as the countdown continues the October 24th showdown is going to be on nearly all RL fans' minds the world over. Already 55,000 tickets have been sold, which beats both the previous Test match best crowds at Old Trafford in 1986 and Wembley in 1990 and hopes are high that the 70,204 record Test match crowd in Sydney nearly 60 years ago will be smashed and even a 78,000 sell out crowd isn't too much of a hope.

AUSSIE WARM UP PROGRAMME

The Australians will play three warm up matches in Great Britain prior to the Final. They requested these games, as by the time of the final, some of their stars won't have played for 6 weeks, so match practice is essential. The teams selected to play them are Huddersfield, Sheffield Eagles and Cumbria. They are hardly the strongest opponents in the UK but the Australians are understood to be more than happy with their warm up programme and whilst many fans are sad that it's not their side playing the World Champions I'm sure that the people of Huddersfield, Sheffield and Cumbria will turn out in their thousands to watch the matches and get behind their sides. For Sheffield in particular, their October 14th showdown will be the first time that the Eagles will have ever faced the Kangaroos.

INJURY BLOWS

For Gt. Britain it has been well known since June that St. Helens centre Paul Loughlin will not be fit for the final with a broken arm but until recently it was originally thought that the Australians will be at full strength. However, in the last few weeks news has filtered

through that both Laurie Daley and Andrew Ettinhausen are both not going to be fit and that captain Mal Meninga has a niggling hamstring injury and although he is expected to be OK to play he will have this more recent injury at the back of his mind. All I hope now is that no further injuries are picked up by either of the two sides so that the best players available can be on show at Wembley.

MAL REILLY'S PLANS

Gt. Britain coach Mal Reilly is expected to name his squad at a press conference at R.L. Headquarters on October 13th. His squad will train together for the first time that afternoon and then watch Sheffield Eagles play Australia the following day at the Don Valley Stadium, following the October 17th weekend of club fixtures intensive and rigorous training will go ahead as will preparation for the match. The players will stay at home on the Monday and Tuesday evenings, then stay together in Leeds on the Wednesday before travelling down to their Wembley hotel in London on the Thursday.

MY BRITISH CHOICE

At full back, although Graham Steadman had a magnificent tour this summer, I would play Jonathan Davies. He too, like Graham, is a magnificent footballer and attacking player but I think his kicking game is far superior to Steadman's and I firmly believe that a strong kicking game is essential for Britain if they are going to win. Jonathan would also be the sides goal kicker.

In the threequarter line I think that the wingers Alan Hunte and Martin Offiah have few competitors for their jerseys and I would play these two. Martin and Alan, who finished top scorers on tour, in my opinion are arguably the best two wingers in the world at this time. In one of the centre positions I'd play Gary Connolly, Saint's ace three quarter. His

form on tour was superb and in my opinion came home as Britain's number one centre. In the other position I'd play either Daryl Powell or John Devereux. Daryl has the brains and the footballing experience and ability whereas John has speed, strength and an excellent defence. Both players are outstanding in their own right and are worthy of a World Cup Final place.

Britain's two half backs also pick themselves. At No.6 and captain I'd play Garry Schofield and at No.7 I'd go for Shaun Edwards. Schofield is Britain's dangerman and is the best stand off in the world where as Edward's lightning pace and backing up is essential at scrum half.

In the front row I'm opting for Kevin Ward and Andy Platt, the two players who the Aussies definitely fear at prop forward and Bernard Dwyer at hooker whose form this season, to date, has been magnificent.

In the back row, I like most critics would have, Denis Betts and Phil Clark at No.11 and 13 respectively as I feel these two are the best backrowers in the game and at No.12 I'd play Widnes' in form 2nd row forward Richard Eyres purely on form. To date this season he has been the best back row forward in the Big League and would therefore get my nod.

My side to face the Aussies would be 1. Davies (Widnes), 2. Hunte (St.Helens), 3. Connelly (St.Helens), 4. Devereux (Widnes), 5. Offiah (Wigan), 6. Schofield (Leeds), 7. Edwards (Wigan), 8. Ward (St.Helens), 9. Dwyer (St.Helens), 10. Platt (Wigan), 11. Betts (Wigan), 12. Eyres (Widnes), 13. Clarke, and if this side is selected I feel Gt. Britain could win.

As the 1971-72 league season got underway, Wigan gave notice that they intended to keep the League Championship Trophy which they had won the previous season.

Leeds were Wigan's first opponents, and they were literally destroyed with an 8 try, 36-2 display from the Riversiders. However Wigan struggled to find any consistency in the early part of the season, and they lost 4 of their next 8 games. Things picked up in October and a sequence began where only 2 of the next 20 matches ended in defeat. Unfortunately the early season defeats had denied Wigan's title aspirations, and 2 more reversals in the last 4 fixtures meant that Wigan had to make do with 4th place.

During the season there were some strong performances and good wins were recorded at Central Park against Leeds 36-2, Bramley 53-3, Hull K.R. 33-10, Hull 48-5, Huddersfield 31-3, Castleford 37-0 and Keighley 36-7. Wigan could not score 30 points away from home, but they did beat Hull K.R. 28-3 at Craven Park in the last game of the season. Wigan's Championship playoff hopes only lasted 2 weeks a round 1 win over Oldham 18-8 at Central Park was countered by a 21-9

defeat by Salford on the same ground. A new competition was introduced to R.L. fans in 1971. It was called 'The John Player Trophy' (now called the Regal Trophy). Wigan's first opponents were 'Ace Amateurs' of Hull, who were beaten 33-9 at Central Park. Round 2 brought an 18-11 win at Hull K.R., to set up a third round tie with Leeds at Headingley. The match was drawn 12 points all, and hopes were high for the replay at Wigan, Leeds were just too good in the rematch sending Wigan tumbling out 5-12.

The BBC 2 Floodlit competition was now well established and Wigan faced Barrow at home in round 1. This was a 2 legged affair and Wigan won both meetings 23-11 and 19-11.

Round 2 brought a visit from Widnes, who were quickly emerging as The Team of the 70's, the Chemics moved into the next round with a 10-15 win.

The Challenge Cup got underway in January and the first round draw saw Wigan travel to the Willows to take on the mighty Salford. Sound teamwork saw the Cherry and Whites book a second round away trip to Wakefield, on the back of a 16-12 win. The Dreadnoughts gave Wigan a very tough game at Belle Vue, and a single point saw Wigan crash 5-6.

The New Zealand tourists were over in 1971, and Wigan's fixture ended in a 10-24 defeat for the home side.

Wigan's only hope of success in a season of near misses, was the Lancashire Cup round 1 saw Wigan win 16-6 at Huytons Alt Park, and the round 2 gave the Riversiders a bye. The semi-final was played at Station Road and Wigan's defence was superb as the team powered to the final 12-2. Widnes were Wigan's final opponents at Knowsley Road. Tries from Bill Francis, Warren Ayres and Eastham coupled with 3 Colin Tyrer goals gave Wigan the Trophy 15-8.

Bill Francis was persuaded to join Wigan for the 1964-65 season, after the Central Park scouts had seen him playing on television. Francis was a Yorkshire born 16 year old playing for an amateur side when Wigan spotted him (luckily for Bill, amateur RL was televised on Sunday afternoons during the early sixties.) For the next 13 years, Bill Francis used all of his many talents as a back, to help Wigan reach 6 major finals. Wigan won 3 of those finals and were also beaten semi-finalist on a further 7 occasions.

He was capped 4 times for Great Britain as well as being capped for Wales 12 times. In a programme interview in the 1976-77 season, Bill stated that his most admired team was St.Helens. Just one year later he was playing for them at Wembley

after an £8,000 transfer.

Bill Francis was a good servant to the Wigan club, and scored 159 tries and 36 goals in his 388 appearances for the Cherry and Whites.

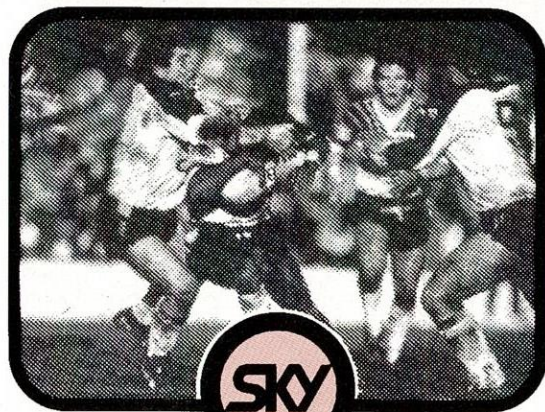

Last Thursday evening, I was tuned into BBC's North West Tonight after the 6 o'clock National News when a rare Rugby League report came on, with video footage of the Saints v Widnes Lancashire Cup tie being shown. The general theme was that the Lancashire Cup may be in its last Season as it causes too much fixture congestion. One speaker thought that the Competition could be played earlier, with the season starting two weeks earlier and friendly Charity Cup games being discontinued. Another thought that the competition may fold because it did not attract the very large sponsorship money. A Lancashire representative was insistent that the Lancashire Cup should continue in its present form.

So many different points of view and ideas! I thought after the programme that if very large sponsors were needed, then large conglomerates needing a clean profile and clean image could be approached, and since 1974 when the old Lancashire County lost great chunks to Merseyside, Greater Manchester, Cheshire and even Cumbria could we not set up other competitions. Widnes and Warrington could fight out every season for the "We burn down the Rain Forests but we are very apologetic Cheshire Cup", St Helens could take on Highfield and regularly win the "German Bundesbank Merseyside Cup", Blackpool Gladiators and Chorley, the only two clubs actually in Lancashire would play for the "Sorry about the oil slick Lancashire Cup", clubs in Greater Manchester would not have a competition because there are too many of them and that would defeat the object of cutting the number of games. I hasten to add these are not the views of Wigan Rugby League Club and we are not meant to be taken seriously. My personal opinion is that the Competition should continue either in its present form or perhaps the very top sides could be seeded and enter in a later round. A Lancashire Cup Final with a 20,000 plus crowd this season could perhaps be an indication to the authorities of what the people on the terraces think.

We read reports in the local press last week that prop Stuart Evans who is still on the books at St Helens had turned out for

Grenoble in a top French Rugby Union game against Toulon. I do not suppose there is any chance of him "turning amateur" and playing for a French Rugby League Club.

How hopes can be raised and then dashed to the ground were graphically illustrated last week with the news of the Wigan v Brisbane Bronco's World Cup Challenge. Wednesday's Ceefax raised the hopes of a game at Central Park the weekend after the World Cup Final and then the reports in the following days papers that the Australian Rugby League were against the game sparked the anticipation.

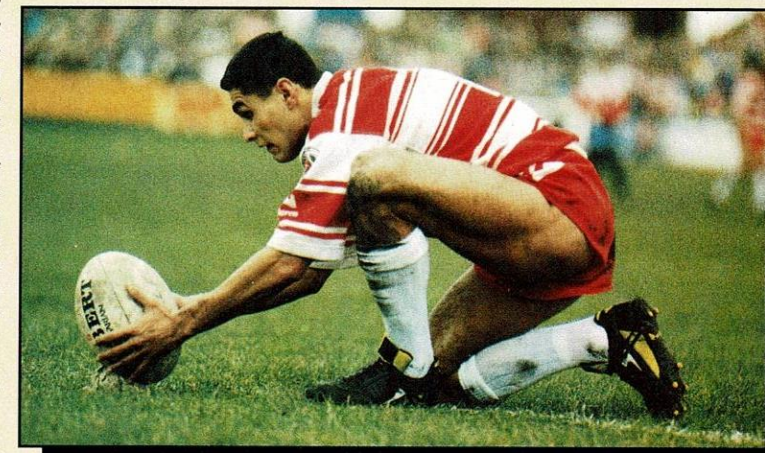
Those of you that were at the Wigan v Manly World Club Challenge will remember what a never to be forgotten event that was.

I notice that the organisers of the World Cup Final were trying to get Tina Turner to perform at the final but as she is on tour in the States, she will not be able to come. Do any of you remember seeing her at the Ritz in Wigan in 1964 when she and husband Ike were a support act to the Rolling Stones?

What do you think of the Regal Trophy Draw? A game against French Champions Carcassonne should be one to savour. In true Michael Caine manner we can say "Wigan have played Carcassonne before in 1946-47, not many people know that!"

Even Ian Morrison's excellent book "Every Wigan game played since 55 BC including all the try scorers since the black death" does not make mention of a game played against Carcassonne. Guess what? Wigan lost! So everyone over the age of about seventy will see this as a revenge match. I'll bet a number of the Wigan team have played in Carcassonne perhaps at schoolboy level, as well as full international. The town with wonderful medieval ramparts (If you saw "Robin Hood, Prince of Thieves," that was shot in Carcassonne) is a hot bed of Rugby League surrounded by miles and miles of vine yards. Not a bit like Whelley or Ince! The whiff of garlic will be evident at Central Park on November 8th. Will the Stones Bitter Championship be replaced by the "Vin de pays Championship?" I doubt it.

In conversation last Saturday with Frano Botica and Steve Hampson. Frano was explaining that he did not really enjoy kicking goals and that the only way to success was constant practice. Steve added that he had watched Frano for hours and hours and had followed instructions on how to kick the Botica way. However, Frano's kicks went unerringly straight while Steve's bent like a banana. Does this tell us that kickers are born and not made? There is no doubt in my mind that Frano is the best kicker in the world but Frano insisted that Grant Fox was No 1.



▲ Frano Botica ... practice makes perfect!

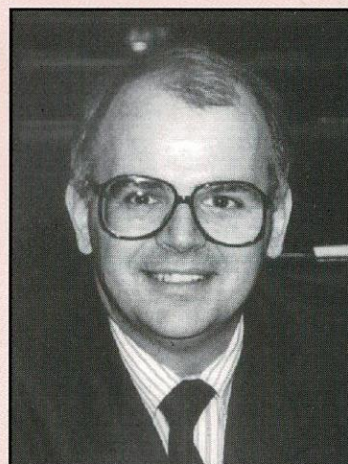

Andy Currier of Widnes needs three tries for a career century of touchdowns for the club. Currier's total of 97 tries have come in 217 appearances, including 12 as substitute.

He holds the joint Widnes match record of five tries against Featherstone Rovers on 25th September 1988. Playing in the centre, he also kicked seven goals for a joint club record 34 points.

Formerly with Halton Hornets Amateurs, Currier made a try scoring debut for Widnes as a substitute in a 28-4 Division One home defeat of Salford on 18th September 1983.

He made his full debut on the wing when Widnes lost 21-4 in a Division One match at Featherstone Rovers on 4th December 1983. In addition to his record five-try feat, Currier has scored four tries in a match once and two other hat-tricks.

His most prolific season was 1990-91 with 23 tries putting him 10th in the try chart - the only time he has finished in the top ten.

Currier has also scored six tries in respective matches as follows: 2 for Lancashire, 1 Great Britain Under-21's and 3 on the 1988 British Lions tour of Australia and New Zealand.

He also scored several tries for Balmain in the Australian Winfield Cup, but they are not included in his records as a British player. He has played in one Test match for Great

Britain without scoring. Currier has also scored more than 200 club and representative goals.

Paul Eastwood of Hull scored his 100th try for the club in their John Smiths Yorkshire Cup Second Round home defeat of Leeds.

Paul Medley the Bradford Northern and former Leeds and Halifax international forward, needs one try for a career century of touchdowns.

Garry Schofield of Leeds needs one try for a career century of touchdowns with the club.

Daryl Powell needs four tries for a career century of touchdowns for Sheffield Eagles and only two for 100 club and representative tries.

STONES BITTER TEAMS OF THE MONTH

Table toppers St.Helens, Oldham and Ryedale-York are the first winners of the Stones Bitter Team of the Month titles for 1992-93.

The Saints are not only sitting at the top of the Stones Bitter Championship table, but are also the new holders of the CIS Insurance Charity Shield, having beaten rivals Wigan at Gateshead in August, and are still making progress to retention of the Lancashire Cup.

Lancashire Cup semi-finalists Oldham are also unbeaten in the Stones Bitter Second Division, being clear leaders with their 100% success rate in the four fixtures during September.

Revitalised Ryedale-York have bounced back from relegation last season to head the Stones Bitter Third Division as the only team with an unbeaten record after the opening four fixtures. The Wasps are also the Division's top points scorers with an average of 42 per game.

Stones Bitter prize cheques will be presented to the September award winners to the value of £500 for St.Helens, £350 for Oldham and £250 for Ryedale-York.

As the World Cup Final draws nearer I find myself ruminating on the game world wide. Rugby League, alas, cannot as yet truly be called a world game. In France it struggles manfully on in the teeth of intense animosity from the higher paid professionals of the "amateur" game. The appearance of a couple of French sides in the Regal Trophy this season is to be profoundly welcomed and let's hope they do really well at say St Helens or Leeds.

In Papua New Guinea clearly there is a real passion for the game, but it is only one small and not very rich country. In South Africa, now that it is no longer the leper of international sport, the Union code seems determined to kill the infant League at birth, as it has before. In the former U.S.S.R. the monumental changes taking place in the whole of society must endanger the growth of the game there. Things look brighter in New Zealand where steady progress is being made, but it is in Oz that the great game really thrives.

Clearly they owe a great deal to us over the decades, but in the last ten years they have taken the game to new heights. When Krilich brought his touring party in 1982 they showed us how far we had slipped behind and how the game could be played. The search was on for ways to start catching up. One of the most obvious short term solutions was to get Aussie players, almost any Aussie players it

seemed for some clubs. It looked as if some club chairmen felt that a Sydney accent, a Bondi beach tan and a pair of boots was all that was needed. Of course there were a lot of good players who came over as well.

This led to the annual flight back for the Cup Final in May for someone who had missed both quarter and semi-finals. Sometimes this did work splendidly, as in the case of John Ferguson in the classic final of 1985. However it also backfired. Remember the abysmal performances of Paul Vautin and Michael O'Connor for St Helens in the wonderful 27-0 final of 1989? (Twenty seven - nil, has a lovely ring to it don't you think?) These were two high class international players but a couple of lads out of the A team might have contributed more (to an admittedly lost cause).

Since Kerry Hemsley returned to join Mark Cannon and Wayne Elvin for the Wembley defeat by Joe Lydon in 1984 we at Wigan have been well served by some outstanding Australians; Brett Kenny, Greg Dowling, Steve "Zip Zip Man" Ella, John Ferguson and of course Gene Miles last season. This is quite a procession for Andrew Farrar to have to follow but he has great talent and experience and is determined to do well. Remember how slowly big Gene began last year before skillfully powering through the second half of the season? So let's give Andrew every chance and encouragement in the

weeks ahead, and watch out for that power running.

With Wembley less than three weeks away, however, it is time to put these thoughts aside and build up our collective loathing for the whinging Oz. The absence of Daly can only help the British cause, but who will be representing us? Are Andy Gregory or Ellery Hanley in contention? Who will be hooker? Will Kevin Ward have one last hurrah? What about Moriarty? How many Wigan men? Let us think positively of the last Wembley test and the second test of the summer. Remember Billy "he's much too small to be an international second row" McGinty charging round that pitch tackling everything in green and gold, and nearly outpacing Newlove for a try, while the giant Sironen was being substituted. Whoever is selected by Malcolm Reilly, even if we disagree personally, must have our genuine support. This means that for that weekend we must put aside all our parochial rivalries, just like the touring fans did Down Under in the summer. Remember rival British Club jerseys hugging in celebration in the stands and singing in unison?

Australia have ruled the roost in Rugby League for too long. That has changed, and it would be a good thing for the game of Rugby League globally if after October 24th some other nation than the Aussies had earned the right to call themselves world champions - the Brits!

Wally is a very exciting full blooded attacking player who in his three seasons with the Fartown club has scored many vital tries. In competition for the No 1 jersey, with Wally will be **Sean Tyrer**. Sean is a very talented and exciting full back with loads of potential and the eye for a gap who readily agreed to join Oldham after failing to break into Wigan's 1st team making only 10 appearances in 4 years. To date this term he has played full back in each of Oldhams games and has performed admirably.

In the No 2 jersey is likely to be **Scott Ranson**, for several years now, previously with Swinton and since last March with Oldham, Scott has been one of Rugby Leagues most prolific try scoring right wings. His speed, swerve and stop are his major assets and is never found wanting in defence.

Stuart Cocker in the centre berth partnering Scott Ranson, joined Oldham in the deal which took **Neil Fienaghen** and **Des Foy** to Huddersfield at the start of this campaign. Stuart is a try poacher

who is very fast and elusive and was a gem of a signing for the Fartown Club during 1990-91 from the Rugby Union world. Three-quarter **Iva Ropati** is likely to be left centre. A member of the famous Ropati family Iva was Rugby Leagues third top try scorer with 33 last season, with 30 of them coming in just 27 appearances for Sheffield Eagles before he joined the 'Roughyeds' in the deal which took **Charlie McAllister** to the Don Valley. Iva is a former Featherstone Rovers star who could well be Oldhams danger man tonight!

On the left wing partnering Ropati will be **Hugh Gumbs**, a recent signing from Bradford Northern. Hugh is an exceptionally strong lad with a fair turn of pace who joined Northern from West Bowling ARLFC after only six games of Rugby League following his Rugby Union background.

Great Britain under 21 international stand off **Tommy Martyn** is a player of very exciting potential. Whether in the three quarters or at half back he is a poacher of tries and can create chances from absolutely nothing and can turn matches in a flash. His father Tommy was the former Leigh, Warrington and Great Britain forward and his uncle Mick set many scoring records as a forward in the 60's.

Steve Warberton can play either stand off or scrum half. He joined Oldham from Woolston ARLFC during 1990-91. This very attractive ball playing half back has poise and class and in his ARL days played for BARLA'S International Open Age Side. Former Saints scrum half **Sean Devine** joined Oldham in the deal that took **Chris Joynt** to Knowsley Road. Sean is a very able half back and an excellent footballer and goal kicker but has had horrific luck with injury following a dislocation and bad break of his ankle in a Challenge Cup tie for Saints v Swinton at Maine Road eighteen months ago.

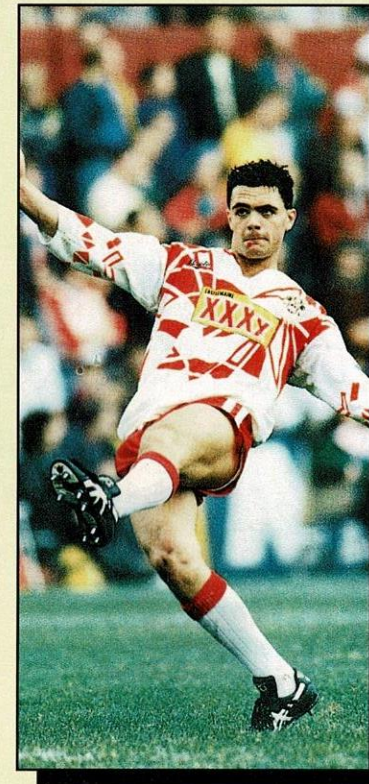
In the front row Oldham have an

embarrassment of riches **Mark Sheals** joined the club during the close season from Leigh in a three for one exchange deal. He is a very big, strong running prop forward with a very high work rate who has become a favourite with the Watersheadings faithful. **Tiny Solomona** is a Kiwi of Western Samoan origin. He joined the 'Roughyeds' in early 1992 from Widnes but has only made his debut this season because of a groin injury. Tiny is now at the peak of his form and was man of the match in the 1st Round win over Warrington. **Ian Sherratt** is in his second spell at the club following a stint at Salford. The former Bradford Northern lad is a very hard working and grafting front rower with a fair turn of pace.

In the No 9 shirt this evening should be one of the finds of last season **Richard Pachniuk** who at 21 years of age is one of the best young hookers in the game. He is a Dewsbury lad with Polish grandparents who is a very clever creative, thinking type of player who is expected to reach the very top. **Ian Bates** is also from Dewsbury and is the nephew of former Great Britain internationals Alan and John Bates. Although only small, Ian is a very clever hooker with the heart of a lion.

Ben Olsen is a Danish born backrow forward who originally made a name for himself playing at London Crusaders. He impressed in his games against Oldham last season and was signed during the close season to strengthen the Oldham squad. **Mark Meadows** joined the "Roughyeds" from Trafford Borough where he was the clubs most talented player. Mark who found it hard at struggling Borough last term, is a strong, fast mobile second rower with an exceptional work rate and should prove as time progresses to be a very shrewd signing. **Paul Jones** was the other player exchanged with Saints for Chris Joynt, along with Sean Devine, at the

start of the season. He is a very tall strong running back row forward who also has a fine pair of hands. Played at Saints for five years Paul, was unable to break into the first team for a sustained period and therefore found 35 of his 52 appearances for the Knowsley Road club were on the subs bench. Loose forward and captain **Richard Russell** is a local Oldham lad. He is no stranger to Central Park as he started his career at Wigan before moving back home. Whilst at Wigan he played most of his rugby on the wing and played in their fine World Cup Championship win over Manly in 1987. Now Richard is a stand off or loose forward who has a fine pair of hands and turn of pace.

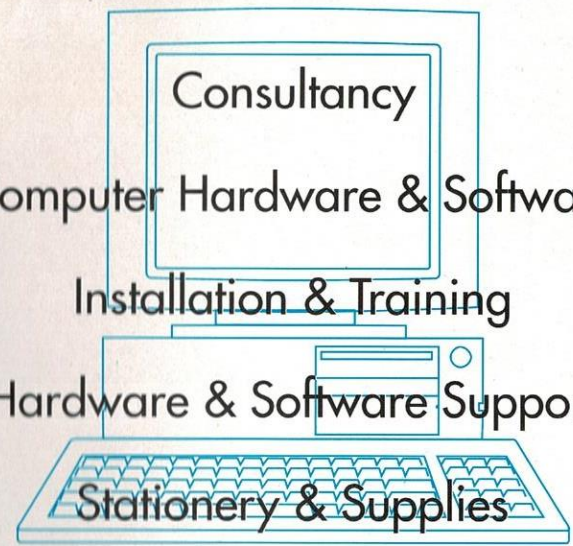
