

The war against the 'enemy' from Oldham is always difficult and today's match will be no exception. Peter Tunks has blended together a useful outfit with some astute signings and, although defeated last week at home to Featherstone, the signs are there that this side could be on the way to Division One, even this early in the season. Speed is an important part of the game and Oldham have plenty with players like Scott Ranson, Hugh Gumbs and dangerman Iva Ropati (surely one of the best bits of dealing ever done to capture him from Sheffield). The loss of Chris Joynt to St Helens was thought might weaken the side, but players brought in have filled the gap quite adequately.

MARK SHEALS: rugged, hard-working prop, who joined Oldham in a three-for-one exchange deal with Leigh in the summer of 1992. Won a Lancashire cap last season, but missed his County debut due to suspension.

SEAN DEVINE: a 22 year-old scrum-half, whom Oldham boss, Peter Tunks also recruited in an exchange deal which took Chris Joynt to St Helens.

MARK MEADOWS: a second row forward who has seen service with Swinton and Trafford Borough when Tunks snapped him up on the eve of the 1992/93 season from the new Blackpool Gladiators club, who took Sean Allen in a straight swap.

HUGH GUMBS: a young winger from Yorkshire, who signed for Bradford Northern when David Hobbs was boss. Had a spell with Batley and then signed for Oldham as a free agent in the summer of 1992.

STUART COCKER: yet another of Tunks' wheeler-dealer signings, Cocker joined Oldham in the deal that took Neil Flanagan and Des Foy to Fartown. A try poacher, well known for his scoring habits.

PAUL JONES: at 6ft 3in and 17 stone, Leighbased Jones had more than 60 appearances for St Helens behind him, albeit many of them as substitute, when he signed for Oldham with Sean Devine in the Chris Joynt deal.

BEN OLSEN: this Danish-born forward made a name for himself with London Crusaders and signed for Oldham in the famous swap-shop summer of 1992.

TINY SOLOMONA: a Kiwi of Western Samoan origin, Tiny signed for Oldham in early 1992 from Widnes, but did not make his debut until the start of the 1992/93 season, due to groin trouble. Has had two groin operations since the turn of the year, but is now playing at the top of his form and

won the Man of the Match award in Oldham's first round Lancashire cup win against Warrington.

DAVID BRADBURY: signed from Leigh Miners after touring New Zealand with the BARLA Under 19 squad. David is a strong-running loose forward.

IVA ROPATI: a member of the famous New Zealand footballing Ropati family, Iva was the top try scorer in the Country this year. A new signing for Oldham and an exciting prospect for the team.

SCOTT RANSON: 24 year-old St Helens player and top try scorer for his former club, Swinton. Signed for Oldham in March 1992.

SHANE TUPAEA: ex New Zealand player. Signed for Swinton then Rochdale. A hard-tackling, defensive second-row forward.

IAN SHERRATT: former Oldham and Lancashire Schoolboy. Left Oldham for Salford and returned last season. A hard grafting prop forward.

RICHARD RUSSELL: a local lad who arrived home at Watersheddings via Wigan. Played for Wigan on the wing in the World Club Championship against Manley, but is now regarded as stand-off or loose forward. Captain of the side, a creative player with a good pair of hands.

BARRIE MCDERMOTT: strong and powerful, despite his twenty years, local lad Barrie is yet another of the BARLA squad to throw in his lot with Oldham. He is a dedicated young professional and has quickly made enough impression to earn a place in the first team squad.

TOMMY MARTYN: a player of exciting potential. He is a stand-off or centre, who can 'sniff' tries out of nothing .. 'poacher' of the Rugby League variety, who can turn a match at a stroke.

WALLY GIBSON: Australian full-back or stand-off, currently on loan from Huddersfield. Very exciting player with a habit of scoring regularly.

Six weeks into the season and only three hundredpercent teams. Take a bow St Helens, Dewsbury and Rydale-York. Saints are certainly leading the style war as the fans flock back to Knowsley Road.

Following Saints, we have a pack of teams who one week look unbeatable only to stupefy the fans the next by presenting them with the unexpected defeat. Take Halifax, stylish destroyers of Leeds one week, taken apart by Salford the next. Hull, victors against Wigan only to be blasted asunder by Warrington, who themselves succumbed to Leeds only a week later. Other than Saints, only Sheffield Eagles seem to have any current form, but beware a Derrick Foxinspired Bradford Northern!

Rydale-York, after a torrid season last time out, are finding the Third Division a good place to get their new team firing on all cylinders. The first team to 200 points, a good away following and fans returning also to Monks Cross in a big way.

One can never discount Dewsbury, up with the chasing bunch all last season, or Batley, but keep an

These last three clubs are highlighted because perhaps, in these times of deepening recession, their possible departure from the ranks will make the RL look a lot closer to home regarding which way the game should be going. Add this to the current struggles of Blackpool - up for sale already - and Nottingham, who sacked their coaching staff after only four games in a cost-cutting exercise and we can see, in the not too distant future, a thirty-club league on the horizon. How's that for expansion?!!!

WINNING RUN

St Helens are now the only team to have won all their matches this season. Their eight victories are made up of five Stones Bitter Championship matches, two Greenalls Lancashire Cup ties and one CIS Insurance Charity shield.

LOSING RUN

Highfield are the only team without a win this season after losing all five matches - four in the Third Division and one Greenalls Lancashire Cup tie.

Our second and final flight across the capital. This is the route given by the Crusaders. A map is a must. From Junction 1-M1 Motorway off M1 — Head through roundabout, under flyover and make for Central London via Edgeware Road (A5). What has Previously been our popular 'Sporting Comment' feature takes up its new home here and becomes 'The Final Word'. As always we hope to publish thought provoking articles from both the world of Rugby League and sport in general.

So, how's your French? When the news broke that, due to the continuing rift between The RFL and Barla, that Two French teams were to be allowed in to the Regal Trophy a fellow Hornet said to me ."You just watch, we'll get one away from home". Well, as the league have decided that both French teams will play their games on English soil, hands up who was surprised when our ball came up out of the bag closely followed by that of XIII Catalan. And blow me down if the other half of this history making event didn't end up in the grateful lap of Uncle Maurice and Sons. O.K., its great for Hornets to play a part in making Rugby League History, but we must remember the reasons why we've got this opportunity in the first place.

The divisions between the professional and amateur game took on a bizarre twist last week when the Student Rugby League severed all ties with BARLA and confirmed a loose affiliation with the RFL. The reasons for the split seem to be that as the student game administers its own affairs and receives funding from Chapeltown Road it seemed pointless to continue paying fees to BARLA for nothing in return. What remains to be

seen is whether or not the amateur game will 'blackleg' student player like their Academy counterparts for their links to the 'professional' body.


