

SIMPLY THE BEST

No. 1 - R.L.THOMAS

For todays review of one of our former players we go right back to the early days of the "Northern Union" to feature one of the clubs esteemed figures from that era ..R.L. THOMAS.

Richard Llewellyn Thomas was as his name suggests a Welshman, who came to Oldham from the Newport Club in South Wales at the beginning of the 1897-98 season.



"Dicky", as he was commonly known came North with a fine reputation having already gained International Honours in the Union code. After playing as a threequarter in his first few matches, he soon settled down into his accustomed roll as full-back, quicly gaining county recognition by his adopted Lancashire.

His strengths were the possession of a safe pair of hands under the constant stream of high kicks that prevailed in those early days and being a resolute and brave defender whether in a one to one situation, or being faced by the forward "Rushes" that were a major part of the game in those 15-a-side times.

In all "Dicky" Thomas made 363 appearances for Oldham in first class matches making his debut against Morecambe on September 4th, 1897 and concluding his career in the first team against Salford on April 12th, 1909.

Undoubtably one of the highlights of his career was being a member of the Oldham team that was the first Lancashire side to win the R.L. Challenge Cup in 1899, when he kicked a goal in the 19-9 victory over Hunslet at Fallowfield, Manchester.





FROM the **BOARDROOM**

CHAIRMAN JAMES QUINN





In the main the game was dour. The tactics of both sides, and especially those of the British team, were based on safety first methods and kicking for territorial position.

Martin Offiah - potentially the most explosive winger and finisher in world rugby - was largely ignored. The Aussie defence was magnificent. It was difficult to give him a clear run with the ball, but we didn't even try to unleash him with a chip-kick.

What a difference in the World Cup Championship Final between Wigan and Brisbane Broncos. Unlike any Winfield Cup teams, the Broncos are noted for their style and adventure; for their willingness to play football even out of their own 22-metre zone if the opportunity arises.

They produced a brilliant performance at Central Park. They were resilient on defence, yet exciting on attack and produced the sort of game that should, perhaps, set the hallmark for others. If we all tried to emulate the Broncos I don't think we would go far wrong.

The contrast between the games at Wembley and Central Park was remarkable and it set me thinking that everyone associated with Rugby League in this country should take a good, long look at what Broncos have

First of all we have to appreciate that supporters want to be entertained. The entertainment business is now a highly-competitive one and if our great game is to command the attention it deserves, we must provide the fare that spectators want and demand.

The Broncos have shown that a team can defend ruthlessly as well as attack with vision and our young coaches should take a leaf out of the book of the Australian club's coach. Wayne Bennett, always remembering that it is supporters through the turnstiles who pay the wages of coaches and players.

Maybe the administrators could also sit down and see what can be done, if anything, to make The League more expansive. We need to see more threequarter play and a little less emphasis on forward driving. One idea that came to my mind at Wembley — and this is purely a personal one — was to keep the forwards in the scrums longer than they have to, to give half-backs and threequarters more scope and more room to get moving before the back-rowers are out of the pack and taking up defensive positions.

Whatever rules are devised, however, coaches will always devise methods of using them to their own advantage so it is perhaps the attitude and outlook of coaches that we have to address most if we are to get the sort of play that Broncos seem to produce week in and week out.

Here at Oldham we have, in Peter Tunks, a coach who has always strived to get the best of both worlds into his Watersheddings teams — the Australian intensity and the old-fashioned and traditional British flair.

You have only to look at the players whom Peter has signed in recent months to acknowledge that he wants to make Oldham an exciting and potentially-exploive team as well as a defensively secure one. Iva Ropati, Wally Gibson, Steve Kerry, Scott Ranson and Stuart Cocker all come to Watersheddings with reputations as exciting try- scorers, while Hugh Gumbs, who is still only 22, has a lot to offer now that he is settling down and gaining

At Oldham we are trying to give the fans what they want. We owe it to Rugby League, to the Oldham club and to the people of this town — and I know Peter feels the same way.

REGAL TROPHY - FIRST ROUND

St Helens and Wigan are defending the best successive run of Regal Trophy first round victories, neither having been knocked out at this stage since 1981-82.

Barrow inflicted the Saints last first round knockout when they drew 16-16 away and won the replay 17-0.

The last time Wigan lost in the first round was when they went down 19-10 at Leeds.

Wigan are at home to French champions Carcassonne on Saturday, while St Helens entertain Leeds.

London Crusaders have gone the longest without a first round win. They have not progressed since their first season of 1980-81 when, as Fulham, they won 9-3 before a home crowd of 12,583 at Craven Cottage.





CASTLEFORD PEN PICTURES 1992-93

GRAHAM STEADMAN (Full Back) A club record signing who cost £175,000 from Featherstone. Last seasons Man of the Match in the Yorkshire Cup Final, Graham made his second tour with Great Britain in the summer. On tour he established himself as first choice full back during the test series with Australia and New Zealand. A prolific try scorer and goal kicker.

ST JOHN ELLIS (Wing) Another Great Britain international, 'Singe' has moved around that back division in his career at Cas. A £30,000 fee brought him from York and he has never been out of the first team squad since a debut against the 1989 New Zealand tourists.

RICHARD BLACKMORE (Centre) Very highly rated Kiwi in his second season at Cas. Richard has become a New Zealand test regular and back home this summer met with the Great Britain tourists. A strong, powerful runner who suffered from shoulder injuries last term, recovering to be a try scorer at Wembley.

GILES BOOTHROYD (Centre) Back in the first team squad after a couple of years of few opportunities, Giles seems determined to hold his place this time. An Under 21 international who signed from local amateurs Lock Lane.

SIMON MIDDLETON (Wing) A rare Rugby Union convert in the Castleford line up, signing from the Knottingley club. Simon adapted to the change very quickly and has been a regular tryscorer for the club.

TONY SMITH (Stand-off) Signed from local junior football, Tony has lots of promise and already has Under 21 international honours. Although mainly a number 6 he has plenty of experience at scrum half and in the centre.

PETER COYNE (Stand-off) Peter signed up this season from the St. George team, who he represented in the Australian Grand Final. Lots of representative honours in Queensland before moving south to join the "Dragons". The "kicking game" is Peters' forte, a strength that St. George fought hard to keep down under.

MIKE FORD (Scrum half) A 1991 signing from Oldham, Mike moved for a £77,500 fee to solve the clubs scrum half problem. Previous experience at Wigan and Leigh was gained before joining his home-

town team at the Watersheddings in a career that has taken him on tour, in 1988, and two Wembley finals. In good tryscoring form this term as well as his usual creativity.

LEE CROOKS (Prop forward) Club captain and regular goalkicker, Lee was a £150,000 buy from Leeds. Originally with his hometown club Hull, Lee won a string of club and international honours but financial problems saw Hull selling him to Leeds. He never fully settled at Headingley resurrecting his career at Cas and regaining an international place on the last tour.

NEIL ROEBUCK (Hooker) Signed from Bradford as a stand off or looseforward, Neil has made a successful transition to the hooking role. An Under 21 international, Neil started his career in local junior rugby but opted to turn pro with Northern.

KEITH ENGLAND (Prop forward) In his benefit season "Beefy" has given loyal service to his hometown team over ten years. A Great Britain international at Colts, Under 24 and full level, he never gives less than 100% effort. Two Wembley appearances for Cas in 1986 and last year.

DEAN SAMPSON (Prop forward) Very strong young prop who was called up last summer for the Gt Britain tour party on their last leg in New Zealand. Already one of the clubs many Under 21 internationals, the Stanley Rangers ARL product has a big future in the game.

TONY MORRISON (2nd row) A 1992 summer signing from Swinton, Tony has made an immediate impact in the Cas park. The strong running back rower was captain at the Lions but wanted to stay at the higher level after their relegation last term. Started his career with Oldham.

SHAWN IRWIN (2nd row) Another player who has switched position at Cas. Shawn joined the club as a stand-off, moved to centre and then last year had his first run in the pack. Yet another Under 21 international, Shawn went on to win senior test caps but was unlucky when a dislocated shoulder caused him to miss last years Wembley trip.

TAWARA NIKAU (Looseforward) Outstanding Kiwi international who has represented his country at the highest level, in test series, at home and abroad. Previously had spells with Sheffield and York, Castleford beat off competition from England and Australia to secure his contract.

BACK PAGES

It appears that the team will soon (if not already) be once again wearing our traditional red and white hooped shirts, possibly with some slight variation to give them a more up to date appearance.

I personally welcome this move as I consider it important that the club has a recognizable identity, hopefully the change will also incorporate our traditional navy blue shorts.

It does seem that the younger supporters prefer to have a change of shirt from time to time, so if we can come up with slight modifications on our established design from time to time, perhaps the traditionalists, the fashion concious and most of all the club treasurer will all be kept happy.

I have mentioned before in this column that Oldham originally played in amber and black and switched to red and white upon moving to Watersheddings in 1889. The hoops in those days were somewhat thinner than what was to become our established kit from the early 1900's right up to the mid 1970s when an irregular hoop (like Hull) was used, also in this period we switched to white shorts, but we never looked right in this kit and by the early 80's the traditional shirts and shorts were once again the order of the day.

The second or "away" kit, as it is now called was usually blue and white hoops, however, as is illustrated in todays photo, all white shirts were also often used. Indeed the 3 successive Lancs Cup victories in the 1950's saw Oldham wearing the white shirts each time.

Photo Feature (Courtesy of the Oldham Evening Chronicle) It is interesting to note that up until about 10 years ago in Rugby League the home team would always be the side to change strip if there was a colour clash.

This is the case in todays photo taken at Watersheddings on April 6th, 1963 during the 3rd round cup tie against Wigan. The Oldham players round the ball are Trevor Simms, Peter Smethurst and Johnny Noon, In the immediate background are Wigan legends, Eric Ashton and Billy Boston.





The Oldham captain that night, Mike Ford, will be wearing Cas colours today and the extent of the changes that have taken place at Watersheddings are reflected in the fact that, of the players on duty for Oldham



that night, only Tommy Martyn and Richard Russell are still on the books. The teams lined up as follows:

Platt landed four goals for Oldham, whose tries were scored by Round (2), Clark, Martyn and Francis, the latter making his debut and scoring the decisive try in the pavilion corner with only 12 minutes left.

Robin Whitfield was the referee and their was an attendance of 5, 101.

Cas had only 12 men from the 33rd minute when full-back Paul Fletcher was sent off for a high tackle on Tommy Martyn, but Oldham never looked like making the extra man count. They created chances, only to throw them away. Gary Hyde and Paul Lord scored the Oldham tries and Charlie McAlister kicked a goal. For Cas, there were tries for Plange (3), Steadman and Anderson and goals for Crooks (4).




