

No. 3 - FRANK FOSTER

Today we spotlight the Oldham career of Frank Foster, the granite hard Cumbrian prop forward who joined the club at the end of his playing days after previously giving fine service to Workington, Hull K.R., Bradford and Barrow.

Frank signed for Oldham in January 1972 and finished his playing career in April 1973 in the last match of the 1972-73 season at Dewsbury.



In-between these dates he notched up just about 50 appearances in Oldham's colours, so obviously it was not the longevity of Frank's career with the club that makes him stand out as one of Oldham's great players. It is doubtful, however, if any individual player made such a dramatic and immediate impact on the playing fortunes of the club and certainly none spring to mind in the last 30 years.

When he joined Oldham in 1972 the team had just 6 wins and 1 draw out of 21 league matches played, yet in the remaining 13 matches, 12 were won and the one defeat was by a single point at Warrington.

It is true that the signing of Cliff Hill, the talented Wigan half-back, was also a factor in the revival, but Foster was the man who provided the main spark. In spite of being a fearsome prop-forward, always in the thick of the action, he also possessed the flair and skills that would be a credit to any half-back.

Long passes that missed out several players, kicking for position, gaining valuable yards, popping over vital drop goals, all these came within the Foster web of talent, but he will probably be best remembered for the way he could drag in 2 or 3 defenders and still deliver the short pass to put the likes of Bob Irving, Jim Reynolds or the aforementioned Hill into the clear.

Capped against the Aussies by Gt. Britain in 1967, he also represented Cumberland County on many occasions.

In short Frank Foster came to a floundering Oldham team and gave them back their respectability.

FROM the **BOARDROOM**

CHAIRMAN JAMES QUINN

You will have read in the Press, no doubt, that we have ended

speculation about speedway taking place here at Watersheddings. It could have been a lucrative proposition for the club, but there were many things against it, not least the feelings of our friends and neighbours in the Watersheddings locality.



We felt, as a Board, that it was only right and proper to take their feelings into account. We need all the goodwill we can get in our battle to rid the club of its big debt and we felt it was not the right way to try and make progress, by upsetting people who live on our doorstep.

There was another major factor, too. Less than 12 months ago, this club sold the training pitch to Wiggett Construction for a fairly substantial amount of money and it was brought to our notice that the sale of houses on our former training pitch was faltering somewhat, due to fears by potential buyers that speedway may be set up "next door" in the greyhound stadium sooner rather

Well, I can assure you all that we are not in the business of being unreasonable and uncaring at Oldham Rugby League Club and, having been happy to take the Wiggett money for the sale of our land, we felt we had a moral obligation not to do anything that might jeopardise his major investment on our former site.

I always believe that if you do right by people in this life, then people will do right by you.

To some extent the same applies to our decision to admit unemployed Oldham supporters into our home matches, starting today, for £3. This represents a saying of £2 on normal admission prices.

We are hoping that this will encourage and enable more people to attend which, in turn, will benefit the club, obviously. But we are also trying to help all our fans who are victims of the recession and might be finding it difficult to shell out £5 just at present, especially with Christmas coming

If you are out of work and interested in our offer, please note that you cannot pay the £3 on the day. You have to go to the Souvenir Shop on Monday to Friday and buy a special £3 ticket, on producing proof of your identity and proof of your unemployment.

We hope this will enable some of you to get to the match, which might otherwise be beyond you just at present. We know these are difficult times for a lot of people and we see this as our little contribution.

We all have to stick together and try to help each other these days and that was one of the reasons we readily tried to help Rochdale Hornets, when they asked us if they could borrow our Watersheddings ground, to stage one or two reserve team games.

They pay expenses plus £150, but it is only a nominal fee. The main thing is we are helping our neighbours; we never know when we might want them to help us.

Finally, may I welcome back to the club Ged Byrne, who started his comeback at Carlisle last Sunday after being absent so far this season. Ged is a true professional, a great influence in the dressing room and a vastly-experienced player, whose addition to the squad will be of great value.







BACK PAGES

Today's item, incorporating the PHOTO FEATURE (Courtesy of the "Rugby Leaguer"), is a look back to one of the most controversial and disappointing Oldham games in recent years.

The match was the Challenge Cup semi-final versus Castleford at Central Park on March 22nd, 1986

Oldham had progressed thus far by defeating Carlisle, Warrington and Bradford all at home, in the previous three rounds and such good luck in the draw left many to believe that perhaps it was, at last, Oldham's year to reach Wembley.

However, it was not to be, as dame fortune definitely deserted the "Roughyeds" in what was to prove to be a "Nightmare" semi-final.

In the first few minutes of the game, Oldham prop Wally Jones suffered a broken finger and before half time, young stand-off Glen Liddiard was concussed in a two-man tackle, with hooker Ian

Sanderson suffering a similar fate in the second half. Overall there was little to choose between the sides, as Oldham held a 7-6 lead midway through the second half, courtesy of Glen Liddiard's try in the last minute of the first period, converted by David Hobbs and an earlier Ray Ashton drop goal. Then, with the twin towers looming ever closer, an incident occurred that dramatically changed the course of the

game.

On the last tackle, "Cas" scrum-half Bob Beardmore put up a speculative up-and-under that Oldham full-back David Liddiard seemed to have well covered, but instead of going for the ball on the full, he let it bounce over the line where a cruel deviation took it across in the goal area, into the path of Beardmore, who had followed up the kick. However, the Castleford man was also deceived by the bounce and over-ran the ball and as our photo clearly shows, part of his body is over the dead ball line, as he reaches back to touch down. Nevertheless Referee Campbell awarded the try and the Wembley dream vanished once more as Oldham lost heart and were eventually beaten 18-7.

I remember thinking on the way home that at least things couldn't get any worse as regards the Oldham Wembley jinx, little knowing what was in store four years down the line . . . same place, same round, more controversy, worse disappointment. Remember Paul Lord!!


