

# SIMPLY THE BEST

#### No. 5 - FRANK PITCHFORD

Today the featured player in our "Simply the Best" spot, is the genial scrum half from the 1950's, namely, FRANK PITCHFORD.

Frank came to Oldham from the St. Joseph's amateur club in his home town of Leigh, with Salford and Swinton also interested, Oldham did well to secure his services and he signed in time for the start of the 1952-53 season making his debut in the senior side in the match at Liverpool on Boxing Day, 1952.



Although on the field Frank appeared to be quite a diminutive figure, what he lacked in height and weight, he more than made up for with pace and ingenuity.

Always alert to gaps in the defence of the opposition, he was most dangerous when taking the ball direct from the scrum close to the opponents' try-line, where any slackness would be punished by another Pitchford try for the "Roughyeds".

A County and International player, Frank toured Australia and New Zealand in 1958.

In all he gave Oldham 10 years outstanding service before moving on to Wigan in 1962. In his time at Watersheddings he notched up over 300 senior appearances, scoring over 100 tries along the way.

Always ready to acknowledge the part played in his Rugby development by the likes of Frank Stirrup and Bryn Goldswain, Frank Pitchford, who sadly died last year, remains one of the finest scrum halves ever to play for Oldham RLFC.

# FROM the **BOARDROOM**

CHAIRMAN JAMES QUINN

I THINK we can look forward to one of our best crowds of the season and one of the best matches too. There is always something special about a derby between Oldham and Rochdale Hornets on Boxing Day and today will be no exception, because both clubs are striving hard to win promotion to the First Division.



The eight-club Second Division is more competitive than ever and at this half-way stage of the season, we are not even sure whether two clubs, three clubs or even four clubs will be

We think the most likely outcome of the crucial RL Council meeting next month will be a system of one down and three up, but we cannot rely on that. It could still be only two up and clubs like ourselves and Featherstone would ignore, at our peril, the challenge from Rochdale, Huddersfield or even London Crusaders.

It is going to be a crucial battle right to the end as we look forward to a New Year - a year that will be very important for Rugby League and for the Oldham club - I would like to remind all our fans how much we appreciate their support and how much we rely on their backing in so many ways.

We will need that support more than ever over the course of the next four or five months, as we bid for promotion, the aim for the championship and set out our style to finish off at Old Trafford in mid-May.

We haven't even included the Silk Cut Challenge Cup in that, so you can see there is a lot to look forward to and a lot of challenges in which the players will welcome your loyal support. I have said it before, but I want to stress again: big vocal support at any match can make a big difference to how the players feel and respond.

Weather and training facilities also make a difference. It is difficult to recall one training session since early Autumn, which has not been carried out in a downpour and eventually that sort of weather is bound to put something of a damper on things.

Our indoor facilities are very limited and we have been unable to use the centre of the dog track because it would have to be floodlit and it would be silly to invest money into a project like that when it is currently up for

The dog -track lights only floodlight the track - not the area in the middle - and they would be no use at all for training purposes in the middle.

The training pitch had to go to ease our difficult financial position, so it has not been an easy time for coaching staff and players these last few months.

To try and make things a little easier, we have made arrangements for the first team squad to use indoor facilities at a local school on Wednesday nights for the rest of the winter and we hope this will be of some benefit to coaching staff and players.

In short, a lot of people are working very hard at Watersheddings to keep the club afloat in a difficult period and I want to say what a tremendous lead is being set by members of the Supporters' Club.

They are doing an amazing job behind the scenes and at the time of writing, they had promised to make a contribution out of their funds to our cash-flow problem. We will also be meeting them soon to try and find a way of easing our overall money problem with a contribution from the Souvenir Shop.

Today's game, of course, is the last of 1992 at Watersheddings and as we look forward to '93, I hope we can look forward to better times for our club and the creation of a formula that will enable us to pull clear of our current cash difficulties and establish a base from which we can move on to bigger and better things.

Good luck to you all in '93 - and may Oldham R.L. Club enjoy the good fortune it deserves.







Coach: STAN GITTINS: Grade One Coaching Certificate holder, who has served under some of the best Coaches in the game. Spells in charge at Blackpool Borough, Springfield Borough and Chorley were followed by a period as A-team coach at Leigh. Stan started his career as a player in 1967 with Batley before moving to Swinton in 1971. His playing days ended after two serious shoulder injuries in 1973. He gained Great Britain U-24 honours in 1969-70. A quiet man, one of the new generation of young coaches.

MIKE KUITI: Fresh from two substitute appearances for New Zealand against Great Britain on this year's Lions' Tour, Mike started this season as Assistant Coach and on-field boss. In his second stint at Hornets, Mike has a wealth of experience under his belt after coming over as a young unknown second row forward in 1985. He made his mark with some fierce tackling and devastating running in an all too brief stay. A period at Swinton was followed by International honours and a couple of seasons at Leeds. The last season saw him regain his International place and as such is our only current International player.

BRETT CLARK: Signed last season from near neighbours Oldham, this popular Aussie delighted the Hornets' fans with his style of play. Coach, Stan Gittins sees Brett as the man to make Hornets tick with his vision and passing skills. He has a wealth of experience having played with St. George in the Winfield Cup and with St. Helens before his time at Oldham.

**CAVILL HEUGH:** Hornets' recent signing from Leeds after a long chase, links up again with his former team mate Mike Kuiti. A powerful, classy second rower or prop who can also slot goals was seen as the ideal man to do a job at Hornets and so the negotiations were allowed to carry on for three months.

**DAVID WEBSTER:** The signing of the (then) current G.B. Amateur International full back caused a stir when David signed from Wigan St. Maries. Much sought after in his teens, David played for G.B. Students, and England Students in the Student World Cup. David combines strong tackling and a willingness to "hit the ball up" out of defence to make him one of the best young full backs in the Second Division.

**MIKE STEWART:** Signed from Blackpool Gladiators at the start of the season in a swop deal which also brought his team mate Paul Reynolds to Hornets. Mike is a tall powerfully built centre or winger with a good turn of speed and a strong defence.

PAUL REYNOLDS: Young, nippy centre from Warrington who

started his career at top Amateur club Crosfields before moving to Trafford Borough. A good pair of hands and a devastating side step make Paul a good acquisition.

**CLIFF ECCLES:** Young second rower bought from Trafford at the start of last season. Cliff has played most of his Hornets' career as a prop and has shown an appetite for the hard work associated with that position.

**MATT CALLAND:** Starting his second season following his signing from Oldham St. Annes, made the step up from A Team player to First Team player at the start of last season after some impressive displays for Kev Lowe's A team. Signed as a centre, Matt turned in some powerful performances on the wing where his no-nonsense approach brought him tries from unlikely situations.

**STEVE GARTLAND:** To start a first team career playing against two of the finest scrum halves in the world either makes a good player or destroys him. Steve came through this period and in two years has proved to a competent performer. A good defensive player who can also sniff out a try.

**BOB MARSDEN:** Player of the Season last year and a very popular choice, Bob played all season in the unfamiliar role of prop forward and turned in some sterling performances. A strong and powerful runner who plays well above his weight. In his third season after joining from Oldham.

**DARREN ABRAM:** Signed partway through the Division campaign from Trafford Borough, Darren quickly became a popular member of Hornets' team. A pacy player with a breath-taking side-step off either foot has seen him beat some of the best full-backs in the game. Hornets' top try scorer for the last two seasons, finishing with 24 last year.

**TONY HUMPHRIES:** A very popular player with the fans, who has turned in some superb performances. A former Lancashire player in his Warrington days, Tony powers his way through a great deal of work in a match both in attack and defence.

**SIMON BAMBER:** Has his best ever season in Hornets' colours last term. A strong runner and defender, Simon shows a good turn of pace when in the clear and is very difficult to stop close to the line.

**MARTIN KAY:** Signed from Oldham St. Annes U-19 team two seasons ago and features mainly in the A team.

**MARTIN HALL:** A busy little player with a surprising turn of speed, good in defence and around the ruck.



However, when I accepted this position of a team coach I knew that it was more of a role of supporting the 1st Team and building up side of young players who would make the very hard adjustment from amateur rugby to professional and more importantly progress from the 'A' Team to the 1st Team as quickly as possible and I suppose that, how many of these players we produce is more important than winning.

What I can say is that I feel we are now in a much stronger position now than we were at the start of the season. Our young players have responded well to having to be thrown in at the deep end and have all gained from the experience. Regarding 1993 I feel this year will be a very exciting year for the club all round, as we continue to build our playing strength.

Already we have two or three very exciting youngsters who have agreed to join Oldham in the near future and we are constantly on the outlook for the right kind of player we need to build a successful club.

Yes, I feel 1993 will be a very interesting one that we will go from strength to strength, and on that footnote I would like to wish everyone associated with the club a very Happy and Prosperous New Year

# BACK PAGES

Although Oldham's record score was achieved by way of the 67-6 victory over Liverpool City in April 1959, this also being the match when Bernard Ganley kicked his record 14 goals. In the 66-7 victory over Blackpool on March 28th, 1982, Oldham actually scored 16 tries, but the usually reliable Mick Parrish could only manage 9 goals.

Oldham played a French touring team from Villeneuve on September 17th, 1934. The result was a victory for Oldham by 26-25 thanks to a last minute drop goal from full back Tommy Rees.

For the first tour to Australia in 1910 Oldham had four players selected to go, however, Joe Ferguson and George Tyson declined the invitation for business reasons and Tom Helm was injured on the journey and didn't play in any of the games. The fourth player was A. E.

(Bert) Avery who played in 11 of the matches scoring seven tries and proved to be one of the successes of the tour.

Today's photo shows an Oldham line up from January 1948 playing in uncharacteristic thin red and white hoops and white shorts for the visit of Wakefield Trinity.

# PREVIOUS ENCOUNTERS

If today's game is half as thrilling and competitive as that when the teams met at Spotland on October 11th, Rugby League fans will be in for a Boxing Day treat.

The record book shows that Oldham won 21-20. There were only two minutes left when Steve Gartland scored the try that put Hornets only a

goalkick away from victory, but Oldham fans certainly had a few anxious seconds to endure before the hooter brought them respite.

Indeed, it took a try-saving cover tackle by Steve Kerry on Dave Webster to stop Hornets snatching it, but Oldham had only themselves to blame for allowing the home side to come back into contention so ferociously because Stuart cocker and Wally Gibson scored early tries to put the visitors firmly in control.

Hornets also suffered a blow when ace schemer Mike Kuiti had to leave the field early on with a recurrence of knee trouble, but they forced their way back into the game with a crash-over try by Mat Calland direct from a tap penalty.

This was awful defence by Oldham, who once more relied a lot on a Steve Kerry drop goal which, ultimately, proved the difference between the sides.

Kerry had a magnificent match in his third outing for his new club and had a lot to do with the fact that the backs probably produced their best display of free-range running of the season.

Two-try Gibson and his fellow centre Iva Ropati cut the Hornets defence to ribbons on numerous occasions, but Hornets refused to lie down and were unlucky just before half time when Webster came into the line from full-back and squeezed over in the corner only to ground the ball on the line in touch-in-goal.

Oldham did not breath more easily until late in the game when Gibson scored his second try after superb work by Kerry and Ropati, but back came Hornets to set up that nerve-tingling last two minutes.


