

No. 7 - ALEX GIVVONS

This week we feature the individual who is probably the longest serving person, in various capacities, ever to be associated with Oldham R.L.F.C. ALEX GIVVONS.

Way back on January 17th, 1933, the sports page of the Oldham Chronicle was dominated by two major headlines, the first dealt with the historic telegrams sent by the Australian Cricket Board to the M.C.C. regarding the "Bodyline" tactics used by England captain Douglas Jardine in the Ashes Test Series, accusing England of being "unsportsmanlike". The other and to the local Rugby League folk, far more important news, was he acquisition of a talented young half-back from South Wales, the name of course, Alex Givvons.



Born in Newport on November 2nd, 1911, Alex first came to prominence with the local team Pill Harriers, but so impressive was his form that he was soon wearing the famous black and white colours of the Cross Keys club, where he was tipped for a bright future in the 15-a-side game.

Of course such a rising talent was bound to attract attention from the Northern R.L. clubs and Alex duly signed for Oldham, while still at the tender age of 19.

Tall and agile, fortunately for Oldham, Alex made a natural transition to the loose forward position, in which he graced Oldham's colours for many seasons.

Very alert and fast away from the scrum, Alex was a terror to opposing half-backs, often snuffing out their moves before they could open out the play. This combined with a more than adequate passing and running game led to Alex being capped by Wales (as our picture shows).

Alex left to join Huddersfield in the mid1940's, but after a short and successful spell with the Fartowners he re-signed for Oldham in January, 1948, before the Challenge Cup deadline, at this time he also took over the coaching duties for the "A" team, a post that he held for many seasons.

FROM the **BOARDROOM**

CHAIRMAN JAMES QUINN

It is with the greatest of pleasure that I offer congratulations today, on behalf of the board and the club, to Alex Givvons on completion of 60 years at Watersheddings in virtually every capacity you can think of. Sixty years - just ponder on that for a moment and recall that Alex was only 19 years of age when he travelled north from Newport. South Wales in 1933 to sign on for Oldham. He had played for Cross Keys and for a young man of 19 to

"go North" in those days must have been like moving to another world. Sixty years on and Alex is still with us, playing an absolutely vital role behind the scenes in the bowels of the pavilion.

Apart from a spell of about four seasons in the 1940's, when he moved to Huddersfield, Alex has served this club for a lifetime as player, coach, player-coach, assistant coach, "A" team coach, groundsman, kit man, boot man, dressing room overseer, you name it, Alex has done it. He is still doing a fantastic job for the club, in close liaison with his old pal Joe Buckley, and I would like it to be placed on record how much his devotion to duty and his love of this club is appreciated not only by the directors but, above all, by the players with whom he has worked so closely over

Alex's contribution to this club is unique. He has been part of the furniture and fittings for years. He has been around for such a long time and does his jobs for the club so efficiently and with so much experience that there are times when perhaps we take him for granted. Alex prides himself on making sure that every Oldham team is turned out smartly. He makes sure that boots are in top-class condition, not only for match days but for training too.

When players come here from other clubs, one of the first things they always remark upon is the way their training kit is always laid out for them, clean and laundered, on training nights. It doesn't just happens. It takes a lot of hard work and dedication from a man who has been dedicated to Oldham Rugby for 60 years . . . a truly loyal servant whom I am sure you will congratulate and recognise in the usual way if we can persuade him to make an appearance on the field today.

Like many of you. Alex has seen Watersheddings full to capacity at various times down the years and he must be disappointed now at the relatively small crowds we get, particularly in mid-winter on mid-week evenings.

We could perhaps have expected 5,000 or so if we had played Hornets on Boxing Day as scheduled, but the winter forced a postponement and we ended up a week last Wednesday night with a crowd of only 2,653. It was disappointing in many ways, but look at the gates at the other matches that night - 2,154 for Widnes v. Swinton in the preliminary round of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup, 2,401 for Salford v. Leigh in the First Division, 1,724 for a Third Division derby between Batley and Dewsbury and 1,298 for Keighley v. Doncaster in the Third Division.

YES, BELIEVE IT OR NOT, OUR DERBY CROWD OF 2,653 WAS THE HIGHEST OF THE NIGHT - HIGHER THAN A CUP-TIE INVOLVING WIDNES, A VITAL FIRST DIVISION RELEGATION BATTLE BETWEEN TWO CLOSE FOES AND A THIRD DIVISION GAME INVOLVING NEIGHBOURS.

If there was ever a set of gate figures to support the call for summer rugby that was it. I have been encouraged by the number of people stopping me in the street to agree with me and the number of press men ringing me up to seek my reasons for believing that summer rugby is the way forward for our game. We even had the Sky cameras here last Saturday morning to do a feature on "Boots-n-All". If we keep plugging it often enough, people might start to think seriously about a switch of seasons.

Finally, I can tell you that things are progressing well on the talks we are having with various bodies relative to the redevelopment of the Watersheddings ground. Everthing will hinge on the sale of land and the awarding of grants from various sources, but the board is encouraged by the hard work that is going on behind the scenes and the talks that are taking place with people like Oldham Council, Oldham Owls, local MPs and McColl of Manchester, the North West branch of a firm of international architects and design consultants.

A WATERSHEDDINGS WELCOME TO ROCHDALE

MIKE KUITI: Fresh from two substitute appearances for New Zealand against Great Britain on this year's Lions' Tour, Mike started this season as Assistant Coach and on-field boss. In his second stint at Hornets, Mike has a wealth of experience under his belt after coming over as a young unknown second row forward in 1985. He made his mark with some fierce tackling and devastating running in an all too brief stay. A period at Swinton was followed by International honours and a couple of seasons at Leeds. The last season saw him regain his International place and as such is our only current International player.

BRETT CLARK: Signed last season from near neighbours Oldham, this popular Aussie delighted the Hornets' fans with his style of play. Coach, Stan Gittins sees Brett as the man to make Hornets tick with his vision and passing skills. He has a wealth of experience having played with St. George in the Winfield Cup and with St. Helens before his time at Oldham.

CAVILL HEUGH: Hornets' recent signing from Leeds after a long chase, links up again with his former team mate Mike Kuiti. A powerful, classy second rower or prop who can also slot goals was seen as the ideal man to do a job at Hornets and so the negotiations were allowed to carry on for three months.

DAVID WEBSTER: The signing of the (then) current G.B. Amateur International full back caused a stir when David signed from Wigan St. Maries. Much sought after in his teens, David played for G.B. Students, and England Students in the Student World Cup. David combines strong tackling and a willingness to "hit the ball up" out of defence to make him one of the best young full backs in the Second Division.

MIKE STEWART: Signed from Blackpool Gladiators at the start of the season in a swop deal which also brought his team mate Paul Reynolds to Hornets. Mike is a tall powerfully built centre or winger with a good turn of speed and a strong defence.

PAUL REYNOLDS: Young, nippy centre from Warrington who started his career at top Amateur club Crosfields before moving to Trafford Borough. A good pair of hands and a devastating side step make Paul a good acquisition.

CLIFF ECCLES: Young second rower bought from Trafford at the start of last season. Cliff has played most of his Hornets' career as a prop and has shown an appetite for the hard work associated with that position.

MATT CALLAND: Starting his second season following his signing from Oldham St. Annes, made the step up from A Team player to First Team player at the start of last season after some impressive displays for Kev Lowe's A team. Signed as a centre, Matt turned in some powerful performances on the wing where his no-nonsense approach brought him tries from unlikely situations.

STEVE GARTLAND: To start a first team career playing against two of the finest scrum halves in the world either makes a good player or destroys him. Steve came through this period and in two years has proved to a competent performer. A good defensive player who can also sniff out a try.

BOB MARSDEN: Player of the Season last year and a very popular choice. Bob played all season in the unfamiliar role of prop forward and turned in some sterling performances. A strong and powerful runner who plays well above his weight. In his third season after joining from Oldham.

DARREN ABRAM: Signed partway through the Division campaign from Trafford Borough. Darren quickly became a popular member of Hornets' team. A pacy player with a breath-taking side-step off either foot has seen him beat some of the best full-backs in the game. Hornets' top try scorer for the last two seasons, finishing with 24 last year.

TONY HUMPHRIES: A very popular player with the fans, who has turned in some superb performances. A former Lancashire player in his Warrington days, Tony powers his way through a great deal of work in a match both in attack and defence.

SIMON BAMBER: Has his best ever season in Hornets' colours last term. A strong runner and defender, Simon shows a good turn of pace when in the clear and is very difficult to stop close to the line.

MARTIN KAY: Signed from Oldham St. Annes U-19 team two sea sons ago and features mainly in the A team.



BACK PAGES

Continuing from the "Simply the Best" article earlier in the programme, today's "Back Pages" is also looking back over the 60 year association with Oldham R.L.F.C. of ALEX GIVVONS.

In all Alex played in 6 full Internationals for Wales, making his debut against England on 7th November, 1936. He also twice toured France with the British R.L. XIII. On the first occasion in November 1938 he was accompanied by his Oldham team-mate and fellow Welshman, Norman Pugh.

Between them Givvons and Pugh played for over 25 seasons for Oldham R.L.F.C., will we ever see their like again?

In these modern times of contract payments the loyal clubman is rapidly becoming a thing of the past, so it was refreshing to see Alex up at Carlisle last Sunday, exactly 60 years to the day that he signed for Oldham, still taking an active part in the affairs of the club in his current capacity of "Kit-man".

To appreciate the longevity of Alex's involvement with the club it is worth noting that when he first played in the first team other members of the side were the pack stars from the great 1920's era namely, Jack Read and Fred Ashworth and Alex played scrum-half against the 1933 Australian touring team on 9th September of that year. It is well acknowledged that whether it was on the field of play, coaching, or part of the backroom staff, Alex has always given of his best for Oldham R.L.F.C. and also it speaks well of the

man that he is still held with high regard down in the valleys at Cross Keys and over the pennines at Huddersfield. Finally I'm sure I speak for everyone connected with the club in wishing Alex all the best for the future.

Another one bites the dust! In this rare action shot from the 1930's. Alex can be seen smothering another Hornets attack as Oldham won a tight Lancashire Cup tie 7-5 against todays visitors, on 14th September, 1935 at the Athletic Grounds, Rochdale.





Since the last home game, some 11 days ago - also against Hornets, on Clubcall we've been speaking to Martin Strett, Gary Christie, Tunksy, Mark Sheals and Tiny Solomona.

We also brought "LIVE" coverage from last weekend's game at Gilford Park from the kick-off, indeed, at 2 o'clock until half-time, it was the only place you could find out how Oldham were fairing - unless you were one of the faithful who travelled to the game.



For the second time in a week-and-a-half Oldham and Rochdale Hornets come face to face at Watersheddings today in a Second Division derby clash and Hornets will be hoping for a much closer contest than the 47-22 triumph for the Roughyeds last time out.

Oldham's win a week last Wednesday represented this club's third points-spree victory in eight days following two comprehensive results in home matches against Bramley.



A brilliant spell of rugby in the 20 minutes before half-time set up Oldham for their biggest derby-day total in nearly five years. There was a "silly" spell by the home side in the second half, during which time Hornets scored tries by Karl Marriott, Martin Kay and Colin Whitfield, all improved by Steve Gartland, to restore some pride in the red, white and blue jersey.

Oldham were never in danger of losing. They were inspired by half-backs Steve Kerry and Tommy Martyn, who capitalised on an outstanding display from Ian Sherratt, Richard Russell and Mark Sheals in the front row and continued by Tiny Solomona when he came on as Sherratt's replacement.

The "SS" men were certainly in determined mood for Oldham. They laid down the foundation for victory and halves Kerry and Martyn did the rest, aided and abetted by a tremendous display of attacking rugby from full-back Wally Gibson.

Martyn, Kerry and Gibson were involved crucially in most of the moves that led to Oldham's eight tries, scored by Hugh Gumbs (2), Iva Ropati, Martyn, Russell, Kerry, Gibson and Gary Christie. Kerry landed six goals, while Martyn kicked one goal and one dropped goal, this a magnificent effort from all of 40 yards shortly before he retired with a shoulder injury in the second half.

Rochdale opened their account in the first half with a try by Matt Calland and the others came from Marriott, Kay and Whitfield with Gartland kicking the goals.

Hornets played without Stewart, Reynolds and Webster in the backs and key-man Mike Kuiti in the pack and there will be high hopes that at least some of these players will be back on duty today.

Kuiti, the assistant player-coach, has been missing for several weeks with a knee injury, but he had tentatively pencilled in today's game for the start of his senior comeback and Hornets will be anxious to get this influential player back into action as quickly as possible.

Oldham went to Carlisle last Sunday without Iva Ropati and Tommy Martyn and they, too, will be hoping that these two key backs - one a play-maker, the other a lethal finisher - will also be back on the field today.
