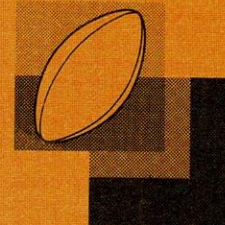

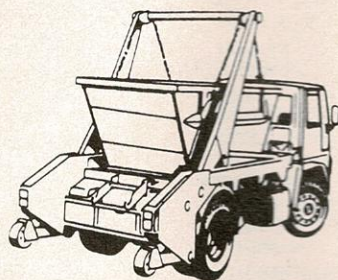

SIMPLY THE BEST

No. 9 - EDGAR BROOKS

It is most appropriate that the ninth person to be featured in the "Simply the Best" series, is one of the club's most well-known hookers, EDGAR BROOKS.

A local lad, Edgar joined Oldham from the Watersheddings amateur club at the start of the 1933-34 season, making his first team debut against Australia on 10th January, 1934.

That was back in the days of proper scrummaging, when a good hooker could make all the difference to a team's fortunes on the field of play and Edgar was right up there with the best of them.

He played for England on three occasions and was also capped by Lancashire, more honours would have come his way but for a troublesome knee injury, which disrupted his career on and off, up until his retirement in 1951 this, allied to the fact that among his contemporaries just before and after the Second World War, were two of the best "Strikers" the Rugby League game has ever seen in the shape of Swinton's Tom Armit and Joe Egan of Wigan.

As mentioned earlier, Edgar continued playing until 1951, giving 18 years excellent service to Oldham R.L.F.C. He was granted a testimonial in 1948 and on 27th April of that year, Oldham played an Empire XIII in Edgar's benefit match.

At the time, Oldham official and ex-player Fred Ashworth had this to say about the Oldham hooker:

"Apart from his outstanding qualities as a hooker, he is a great forward in the loose and a full 80 minute player. Edgar has not had the best of luck during his playing career, his chief misfortune being the knee injury, which kept him out of many representative matches."

A fitting tribute from one great and loyal Oldham forward to another.

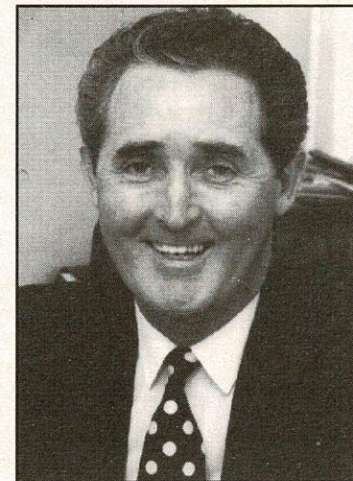

FROM the BOARDROOM

Rugby League interest this week turns to the Silk Cut Challenge Cup again and we will be staging what should be a cracking Second Round tie with Huddersfield.

I would like to dwell for a moment or two, though, on problems faced by clubs such as Oldham, who are ambitious to get out of the Second Division and build a side capable of doing well in the top flight.

The eight-club Second Division was devised to be more competitive and to prepare teams for going up, but as far as revenue is concerned it is a killer. It costs a lot of money to build and maintain a team to win promotion and it will cost even more money to put the finishing touches to it and convert a promotion-winning squad into a successful First Division outfit.

At the very time when all that preparatory work is going on, however, clubs are faced with a situation in which it is extremely difficult to draw the sort of gates that are needed to balance the books.

Toss a disruptive winter into the hat as well and the situation becomes even more difficult. When we returned to action in January, after the freeze, we played Bramley twice within a matter of a few days and, after deductions, the receipts from those TWO games would not meet the wage bill for ONE week.

We have done our homework and it has shown that our break-even figure for attendances would be 3,500. We have had 10 home games so far in the Second Division, only four more to go and we have not reached our target figure even once. Our average crowd is about 2,500 which represents a shortfall of 1,000 fans at every match.

It is against this sort of backdrop that we are trying to build and prepare for promotion. Any team that fails to do so would languish in the Second Division for two seasons or more and would be faced with little alternative but to scrap contracts and face a very bleak future.

The longer you stay in the Second Division, the greater becomes the gap you have to make up if you are ever to get out. It is a vicious circle that is not made any easier by the fact that, once promoted, a club faces a tremendous fight to just stay up and establish itself in the First Division.

I don't pretend to know what the answers are to all these problems, but I think there is a good case for a return to two divisions, the introduction of summer football and the creation of a scheme in which clubs that were promoted were given one season free from the pressures of battling against relegation.

A season's grace would allow a promoted team a bit more time to adjust to the greater demands of the First Division and to build up financially, after all the expenditure that has gone out in getting promotion in the first place.

Everyone talks about the cut-throat pressures of the Winfield Cup but the clubs do not have the problems of promotion and relegation. They can build on a long-term basis and they are not spending short-term money on either getting up or trying to stop up, a policy that often produces the yo-yo syndrome and leads many clubs into a financial crisis.

The Oldham Board realises the squad will have to be strengthened, if and when we realise our promotion aim and, as I told shareholders at the Annual Meeting of the plc last week, we will be launching a share issue in a bid to raise the necessary.

In the meantime, we rely on our loyal support week in and week out. The backing of our hard-core supporters is fantastic and I can assure you it is greatly appreciated both on and off the field.

After last weekend's heavy defeat at Post Office Road, hopefully the team can bounce back today against Huddersfield.

A place in the last eight of Rugby League's greatest competition, awaits today's winners.

Alex Murphy's side proved, on their last visit here, that they are no pushovers, as Richard Russell has been saying this week on Clubcall. "All the pressure is on us, we are favourites to beat Huddersfield. After the result against Featherstone, the players will want to get that out of their system and progress into the next round."

Iva Ropati, once again, was missing from last weekend's defeat but he did watch from the stands. "I was going to take a gamble and play against Featherstone. I'm glad I didn't now, although it was also very painful watching from the stands."

Peter Tunks had no comment to make after last Sunday, but Assistant Coach Eric Fitzsimons was very honest about Oldham's third defeat of the season against Steve Martin's side. "I thought 52-14 was a true reflection of the game, nearly every time they had the ball they put us under pressure. I thought the play the ball was the key area, they were up quick playing it. They moved us back, they always seemed to have room either round the ruck or out wide. They performed very well and we didn't match up to it."

Finally today, what about Summer Rugby? It is a subject Chairman Jim Quinn feels very strongly about. But what about the players we asked Tommy Martyn. "Speaking generally, I think a lot of players would like to play in the summer but, at the end of the day, I think it will be up to the top clubs. I don't think the top players will be too happy because they will lose a lot of money by not being able to play down under in the summer, but you've always got to be looking to improve the game and Summer Rugby could be a step forward."

Next Sunday, it's back to League action here, as we play Carlisle for the fourth time this season. Two weeks ago we completed the "Grand Slam" over Swinton, surely we can make it another one this time against the Cumbrians.

ROGER HALSTEAD looks at PREVIOUS ENCOUNTERS



Huddersfield come to town today for the Second Round of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup, in the knowledge that they were the last team to win at Watersheddings. That was 22nd November last, when the men from Fartown (or is it Leeds Road?) pulled off a shock 17-6 win that temporarily rocked the Oldham club to its foundations.

The teams that day were as follows:

OLDHAM: Tyrer; Ranson, Byrne, Ropati, Gumbs; Gibson, Kerry; Sherratt, Russell, Sheals, Olsen, Tupaea, Jones. Subs: Meadows, Solomona.

HUDDERSFIELD: Laurence; Thomas, Kerr, Hellewell, Chapman; Davis, Flanagan; Fogerty, Huck, Pucill, Naidole, Coulter, Blacker. Subs: Barnet, Fairbank.

The referee was Mr. Colin Steele of Barrow and there was an attendance of 3,183 - one of the best of the season at Watersheddings.

Oldham's points came from a try by Tyrer and a goal by Kerry, while Davis, Thomas and Kerr scored tries for Huddersfield, with Hellewell landing two goals and Flanagan kicking a drop goal.

Oldham were never in the game, as they slipped to their second home League defeat. Both were played in appalling conditions, on a slippery surface and in non-stop rain.

Huddersfield ran the ball with much more confidence and conviction, giving the impression they were the side that was on top of the table.

There is no greater leveller than the sort of weather in which this match was played.

Speedy Oldham backs like Ropati and Gibson became ordinary on a skiddy surface, Ranson hardly touched the ball, Byrne looked badly in need of a few games under his belt and Gumbs tended to slow down and stop when he hit the defensive wall.

Only Tyrer, of the Oldham backs, seemed to know where he was going and even he wasted a gilt-edged chance late in the game, when he turned back inside with an overlap on his left.

Huddersfield led 17-0 and the game was over, Oldham having been overturned by a side that had a greater thirst for victory and capitalised on a huge dose of complacency in the Oldham camp.

The game was a personal triumph for former Oldham scrum-half Neil Flanagan, who had an outstanding game for Huddersfield. There was plenty of self-satisfaction, too, for another former Oldham man, Terry Flanagan, who helped to mastermind the victory alongside Alex Murphy.

Today's rematch should be a cracker. Oldham will surely be determined to avenge that reverse in November, which still rankles at Watersheddings.
