





No. 10 - GEORGE FRATER

It is well known that many great Rugby League players have "Gone North" from the valleys of Wales, not so well known however is the fact that up until the Second World War Oldham signed many players from North of the Border up in Scotland. Today we feature one of the best players ever plundered from the land of the thistle: GEORGE FRATER.



Although born in kelso, it was with the neighbouring team of Melrose that George played his early rugby, soon becoming club captain and being selected to play for the South of Scotland side.

He joined Oldham at the start of the 1896-97 season and soon established himself as one of the regular members of the team.

Renowned as a tireless, grafting forward, some of George's pack colleagues, in those early Northern Union days were: Emanuel Bonser, Harry Broome, Bob Edwards and fellow Scots Jim Moffatt and E. W. Telfer. Together these men made a formidable unit and paved the way for the Challenge Cup success of 1899.

As was then the custom George qualified to play for Lancashire, as the county teams were selected from all the players available in the club teams and he did so on many occasions.

His debut was against Salford on September 12th, 1896 and his last game for the club was the last match of the 1904-05 season, when Oldham clinched the Championship by beating Hull 23-0 at Watersheddings on April 24th, 1905.

In between those dates George clocked up 262 appearances in the first team, scoring six tries and kicking 28 goals.

FROM the BOARDROOM

by CHAIRMAN JAMES QUINN

ONE swallow does not make a summer. Nor does one bad result make a bad season. Those were my immediate thoughts when the hooter sounded at Post Office Road at the end of that 52-14 defeat which we had at Featherstone. We had, after all, just won seven consecutive games in the space of 24 days and perhaps that took more out of us than we realised until we came up against a Rovers team that was clearly much stronger than most of the others in the second division.



We had a few injury problems, too, but we are not going to make excuses. We were well beaten on the day by a good side and I only hope that we got back on the winning path again in the cup-tie against Huddersfield last week. I could not watch the tie because I left for South Africa shortly after our defeat at Featherstone. Basically, I went away on holiday for a couple of weeks, but while I am out there I have made arrangements to meet Jamie Bloem's representative in Johannesburg. We have spoken a couple of times on the telephone and it will be good for both of us to come face to face across the dinner table. South Africa is a developing Rugby League nation and if we can build bridges and make contacts out there then there is no telling what might come out of it in the long term. In the short term we hope to have a good chat about Jamie and see if we can come to any satisfactory arrangements for him to settle with the Oldham club.

Many of you who are keen supporters, but not shareholders, may like to know what went on at our annual meeting in the 'Sheddings Club. To start with, we had with us representatives of Oldham Owls and representatives of McColl of Manchester, the architects and designers who have drawn up the proposed £1.75m scheme to redevelop Watersheddings.

We are delighted to welcome Owls to come and join us at Watersheddings. Their deputation, headed by chairman David Foden, were interested to look at the drawings and plans of the new development, as were the shareholders.

We have now taken things a stage further by meeting the chief officers of Oldham Council. I felt the initial talks were most encouraging. The officers are now to report back to their various committees and departments, after which another meeting will be held. It was also gratifying to learn that members of the government's Heritage Department were due to drop in at Watersheddings this week to take a look at our ground in a whistle-stop tour of the North which was also to take in Wakefield, Featherstone Rovers and Wigan. Perhaps this shows that influential people in high places are beginning to show an interest in Rugby League and all it has to offer.

On the playing side, the board has to find ways and means of strengthening the squad for our anticipated return to the first division. One way, as we revealed to shareholders at the AGM, would be to launch a share issue.

However we do it, we must find a formula to fund some team strengthening otherwise we will be going into the first division on a wing and a prayer and we want to do all in our power to make sure that this time we go up to stay up. The financial situation of the club continues to occupy much time and effort, but if you are a season-ticket holder perhaps you might want to consider giving us a lift by buying now for next season. If you are a seat holder this will guarantee you a seat next season when we will hopefully be in the first division and when seats will be in short supply. Next season's prices are bound to be adjusted, but if you can find a way to book your seat now - and pay the difference later - it will be of enormous benefit to ease our cash-flow problems and it will also ensure that you will not be disappointed.

The board has also been considering a pay-up-front scheme for standing season-ticket holders. By the time you read these notes, details of the scheme might have been released in the local press.

If you CAN help us I can assure you that your efforts will be greatly appreciated.





A WATERSHEDDINGS WELCOME TO CARLISLE

DEREK ARMSTRONG. Signed at the end of last season from Workington as he was playing some of the best rugby of his Hawick R.U. Strong runner who could fill a number of positions once he adjusts to Rugby League.

IAN 'SETH' ARMSTRONG. A lot of responsibility will fall on this tall prop or second rower this season. Made excellent progress last term breaking fully into the first team and showing an appetite for hard work.

GARY CHARLTON. Uncompromising loose-forward or second rower who hits hard and always aims for the gap. Scored five tries in 21 appearances last season.

GEORGE GRAHAM. One of the finds of last season. Former Scottish B Rugby Union prop who took to League like a duck to water. Hard to stop, stocky and fast with a great future.

GARY MURDOCK. Long serving ex-Ellinborough scrum-half who was unlucky to be injured in the Cumbria Cup at

KEVIN PAPE. Carlisle's record try scorer and longest-serving player. Nine tries last season and was pressed into service at stand-off as well as his favoured centre.

PAUL ROBINSON. Big chance for this deceptively fast and elusive prop-second rower to establish a regular first team place this season. Usually beats the first line of defence.

TONY SCOTT. Long serving second rower whose distinctive windmill running style and all enveloping tackling have become a Carlisle trademark.

MALCOLM THOMASON. Tackling machine, hooker and prolific try scorer from close in to the line. Usually tops the tackle count and has been a fine servant to Carlisle since signing from Broughton Red Rose.

TROY CLARKE. Big centre from Canterbury Bankstown Club in Australia who can also play in the second row.

KEVIN FOX. Very useful utility back signed from Salford in a swap deal with Rob Ackerman.

Enjoy the game.





'A' TEAM ROUND UP with COACH JOHN PRINCE

OLDHAM 'A' 42 v. WORKINGTON 'A' 16 Saturday, 13th February, 1992

Playing second placed Workington 'A' who contained many players with First team experience, our weakened side on paper didn't stand a chance against our much bigger and more experienced opponents who inflicted League leaders Salford's second defeat the week before by 31-0.

Our side, which contained two trialist wingers and two subs who had not played Rugby League before, fell behind after only four minutes as the big Workington forwards powered over for an unconverted try to lead 4-0. A heavy defeat seemed on the cards

However our young side, well led by Captain of the day Sean Devine, began to show the same spirit and self-belief that we showed in the two games against Wigan. And when Barrie McDermott powered his way over after 12 minutes for a try converted by Mark Hudspith we were already beginning to look the better side. With Devine and Martin Strett beginning to dictate play we extended the lead after 16 minutes with a good try from trialist winger Dave Gryfiths. A Hudspith goal extended the lead to 12-4 and affer 34 minutes a brilliant pass from Martin Strett sent our other trialist winger, local lad Phill Boucher (ex-Swinton), racing 60 yards to make the score 16-4, Right on half-time Martin Strett continued his progression into Rugby League with a well-worked try to give us an unlikely 20-4 interval lead

Losing the experienced Joe Graziano at half-time was a blow to our light-weight pack. But with youngsters Paddy Mitchell and Craig Mort, who have shown great improvement in recent weeks, we continued to take the game to Workington, and when Player of the Match Barrie McDermott powered his way over for his second try from 50 yards and with a conversion by Martin Strett, after seven minutes of the second half

The shock result of the day was already ours. Five minutes later as Workington were attacking 35 yards out from their own line the experience of Sean Devine told as everyone on the field followed play he strolled to the posts with the best interception try of the season, goaled by Martin Strett to make the score 32-4. The big Workington side began to make their presence felt as we started to become over-confident and with 10 minutes of the game remaining they reduced the arrears to 32-16 with two tries and two goals. We got our act together again and scored two more tries from Gryfiths and Devine plus a goal from Strett to make the final score 42-16 with David Stephenson running Barrie McDermott very close for Man of the Match with a very hard-working display.



Earlier in the season I asked if anyone would like a review of a match or matches from the past history of Oldham RLFC. Such a request has been received from a Mr Heywood of Lees. who would like to know the details of the epic twice drawn Challenge Cup semi-final against Hull K.R. in 1964.

The first game was played at Headingly, Leeds on Saturday April 11th, before a crowd of 28,556.

This was a typical semi-final encounter full of passion and commitment, although as I strain to recall (I was 9 years old at the time) the match had more open rugby than the 5-5 scoreline would suggest. Two major incidents dominated the game. The first was a dreadful eye injury sustained by Oldham loose forward Dave Parker, which badly hampered his game on the day and would rule him out of 2 subsequent matches. The second incident was the dramatic and totally unexpected last minute equalising drop goal from Oldham hooker Len MacIntyre. The Rovers' points came from a try by Blackmore and a goal by Kellett, whilst Peter Smethurst registered the Oldham try.

The first replay was at Swinton on April 15th. The attendance was 27,209.

Late into the game Rovers led by 14-7, due to two tries by Burwell and one each for Major and Blackmore, with one goal from Kellett. Oldham's points had come from a Geoff Sims try

and 2 goals from Frank Dyson. Then 10 minutes from time Trevor Simms scored and Dyson converted to set up a grandstand finish. Once again a last minute goal saved the day for Oldham. This time it was a Dyson penalty that levelled the scores. Extra time was commenced but after Geoff Robinson had scored to put Oldham ahead, the referee abandoned the match due to bad light.

In the 3rd match at Huddersfield, Oldham seemed to have run out of steam and Rovers ran out 12-2 winners thanks to tries from Bunting and Blackmore and 3 goals from Kellett. Dyson scoring Oldham's points with 1 goal. The crowd at Fartown was 32,757, Played on April 20th.
