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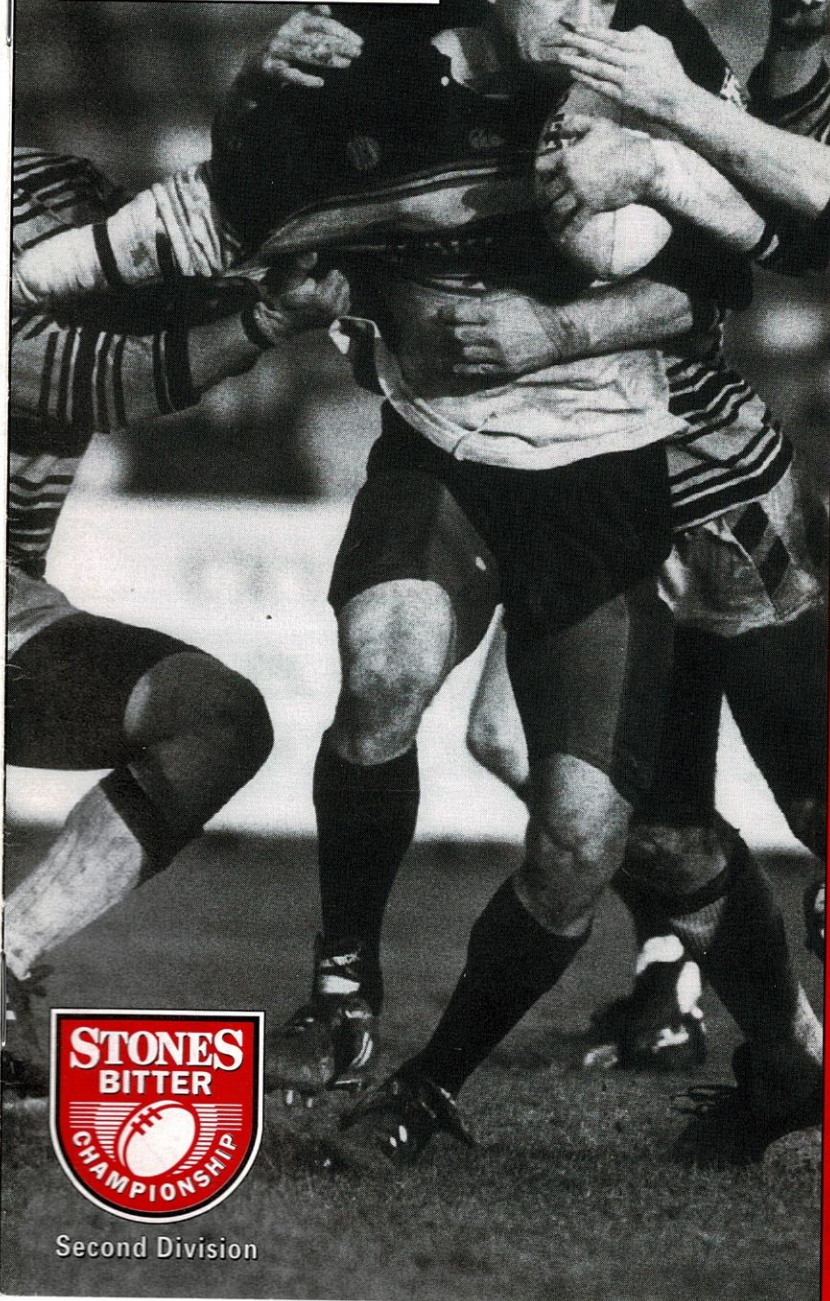

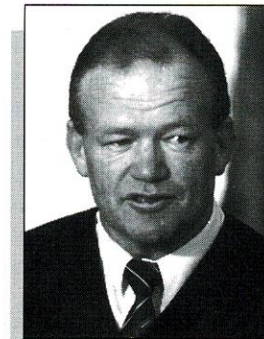

Also, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the supporters for their support, especially on away games. The kitmen, Tony and Steve, great job, Keith Morgan, and Dr Dee. I hope everyone enjoys today's game and we get the result we want.

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**MARK SHEALS:** Rugged, hard-working prop, who joined Oldham in a three-for-one exchange deal with Leigh in the summer of 1992. Tim Street, Keith Newton and Duncan Platt went to Leigh as Oldham boss Peter Tunks finally got the man he had been chasing for over a year.

**SEAN DEVINE:** A 22 year old scrum-half again recruited by Tunks in an exchange deal. This time it was with St Helens as GB under 21 forward Chris Joynt departed with Oldham gaining Devine, £50,000 and back row forward Paul Jones.

**IAN SHERRATT:** Former Oldham and Lancashire Schoolboy. Left Oldham for Salford and returned in the 91/92 season. A hard-grafting prop forward.

**RICHARD RUSSELL:** A local lad who "arrived" at Watersheddings via Wigan. Played with Wigan on the wing in the World Club Championship against Manly, but is now regarded as a hooker, stand-off or loose forward.

**DARREN ABRAM:** First professional club was Warrington before moving on to Trafford Borough, from where he joined Rochdale for 90K in the 1991 season. Earned a reputation at Rochdale as a prolific try scorer and when transfer listed at what many regarded as a bargain price, attracted interest from Salford, Featherstone and Wakefield before joining Oldham in February of this year.

**PAUL JONES:** At 6' 3" and 17 stone, Leigh-based Jones had more than 60 senior games for St Helens, albeit many as substitute. Signed for Oldham with Devine in the Chris Joynt deal.

**BEN OLSEN:** Danish-born forward who made a name for himself with London Crusaders before signing for Oldham in the "swop-shop" summer of 92. Winger Richard Blackman returning 'home' to the Crusaders.

**TINY SOLOMONA:** A Kiwi of Western Samoan origin "Tiny" signed for Oldham from Widnes early in 1992 but did not make his debut until the start of the season because of a groin problem.

**STEVE KERRY:** Former Preston Grasshoppers RU half-back turned pro for Salford for whom he was a prolific goal scorer, topping the RL points scoring lists in 1991/92 when Salford won the Div 1 title. Kerry totalled 427 points.

**SEAN TYRER:** Son of Colin, the former Leigh and Wigan goal-kicking full back. Sean followed in his father's footsteps when he signed at Wigan after winning many BARLA Youth honours.

**DAVID BRADBURY:** Signed from Leigh Miners after touring New Zealand with the BARLA under 19 squad. Strong running loose-forward.

**IVA ROPATI** A member of the famous New Zealand footballing Ropati family. Top try scorer in the country last year.

**SCOTT RANSON:** Twenty-four year old St Helen's player and the top try scorer from his former club, Swinton.

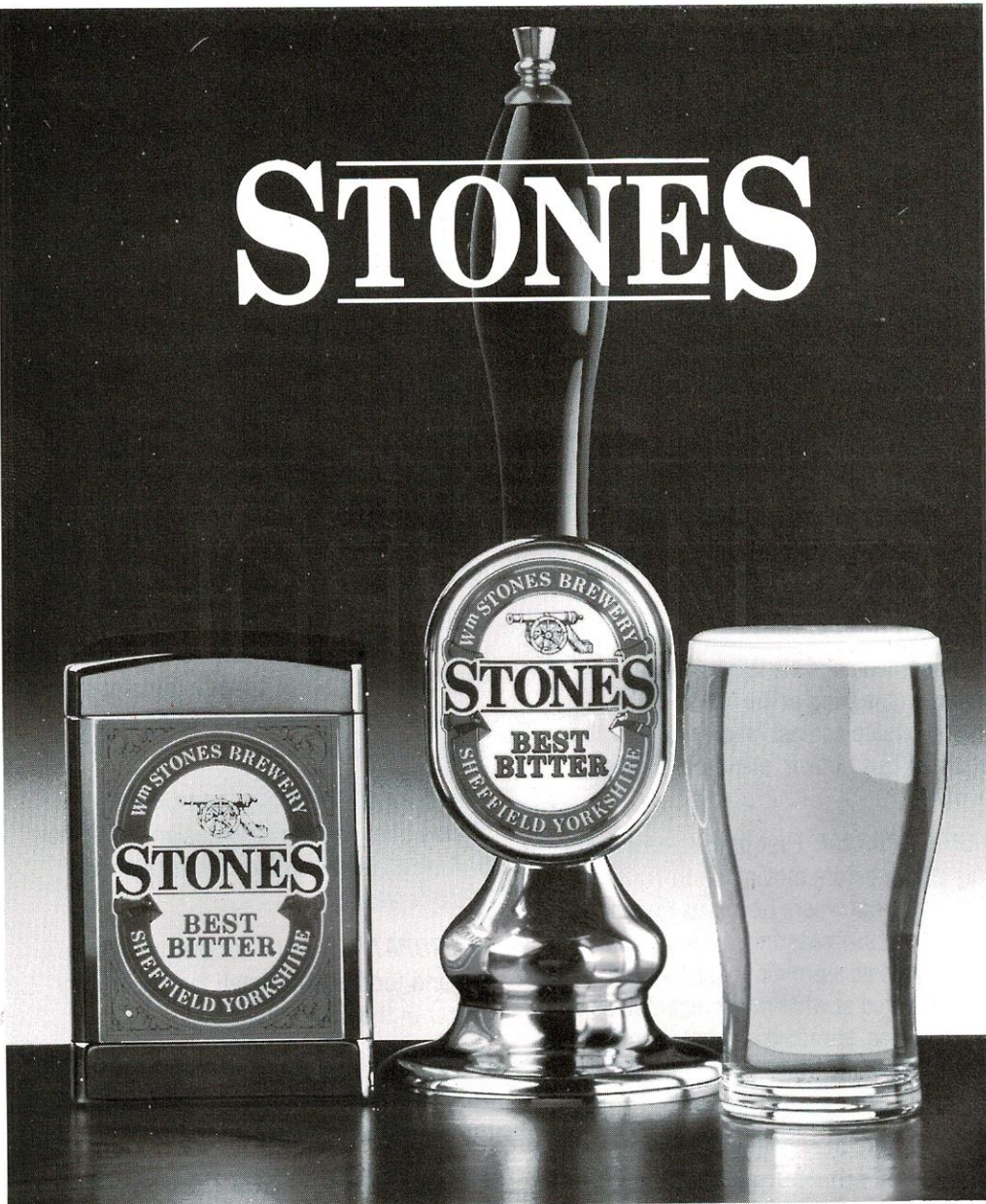
**SHANE TUPAEA:** Ex-New Zealand player signed for Swinton, then Rochdale. A hard tackling defensive second-row forward.
