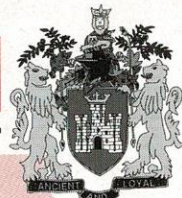

The Wigan Sevens opens the serious season here at Central Park. After the jollity of last week's well attended Graeme West Testimonial, it's down to the serious business of winning trophies.

Once again, there is a strong contingent from East of the Pennines. All the sides are backing up from last year's competition when, of course, the home side won in a tremendous final.

First up, there is the clash between Oldham and Sheffield. Both sides have won the competition in the past few years and could do well again today.

In 1989, The Eagles surprised many by collecting the title at the expense of a strong Widnes side. Two years later, Oldham took the crown, defeating Wakefield in a tremendously exciting final.

The clubs contested the final at the Oldham 7's recently with the home side winning in extra time. A similar contest will get us off to a fine start.

Halifax and Leeds meet in a derby clash in the next match. 'Fax have done a Leeds and spent during the summer to build a team capable of taking the Stones Bitter Championship. The buys are mainly Test men familiar with Malcolm Reilly's style of

coaching. If they fit in quickly 'Fax fans could be cheering a trophy at Thrum Hall in 1994. Today the abbreviated game is ideal for their speed men, Preston, Sharp and former 'Loiner' Bentley.

The bottom half of the draw throws up the intriguing clash between Hunslet and Wakefield. The South Leeds side have rarely done well in this competition and Trinity should be far too strong.

The winners meet the survivors of the clash between Wigan and Salford. The Red Devils sent squads to both the Carlisle and Oldham events in the last few weeks and should be well attuned to the demands of today's tournament. Home fans will be keen to see some of the Wigan club's close season purchases in action for the first time and will be confident of another victory.

Amongst the supporting cast this year is the Ackers Memorial Trophy, competed for by two local schools.

There is also the third Academy Challenge between Leeds and Wigan. Sponsored by Whitbread, the score in this clash stands at one match each with both games being convincing for the victors.

If the weather is fine, we should be in for an excellent afternoons football.

This was accepted and a squad consisting of Paul Atcheson, Mick Cassidy, Martin Crompton, Andrew Farrell, Mike Forshaw, Ian Gildart, Dave Marshall, Barrie Jon Mather, Ian Moffatt and Scott Naylor travelled over to Headingley. The only other side from West of the Pennines should have been Widnes, but when they pulled out at lunchtime Wigan were left as the only Lancashire representatives, and, as was to be expected, received a 'hostile' reception from the Yorkshire supporters.

The fact that Wigan went on to win the competition made the Tykes even more furious!!! In the first round Wakefield were beaten 22-18, the first try of sudden death extra time settling the tie after an 18-18 scoreline at the end of normal time.

## Whitbread sevens competition

1. Games shall be played under the laws of the Rugby Football League EXCEPT:-
  - a) At a kick off following a score, the ball need not travel ten yards forward
  - b) The three tackle rule shall apply.
2. Each side shall consist of seven players and one substitute. Unlimited substitution is permitted, at the touch line, with the consent of the touch judge.
3. The duration of each game before the final will be seven and a half minutes each way with one minute interval. If the scores are level at full time, the teams shall change over and continue playing and the next score shall decide the winning team. Ends will be changed every seven and a half minutes if necessary and there will be no interval during extra time.  
The final tie will be played for ten minutes each way. If the scores are level at full time, similar arrangements to those for previous rounds shall apply, with ends being changed every ten minutes if necessary.
4.
  - a) Time is checked by independent time keepers and the "Klaxon" will sound at the end of each period, regardless of the state of play. Should a player be in the act of scoring a try, but not effecting the touchdown before the "Klaxon", this score is outside the time limit and is invalid.
  - b) Injury time, as indicated by the referee will be allowed
  - c) A penalty awarded within the Klaxon time shall be permitted, to completion, but only if an attempt to kick a penalty goal is elected.
  - d) An attempt to convert a try scored within "Klaxon time" shall be permitted.  
The time keepers will cater for these situations before ending each session.
5. Rugby Football League disciplinary arrangements apply EXCEPT:-
  - a) The "Sin-Bin" rule shall not be implemented.
  - b) A dismissed player will result in the offending team fielding only six players and one substitute for the remainder of the competition.

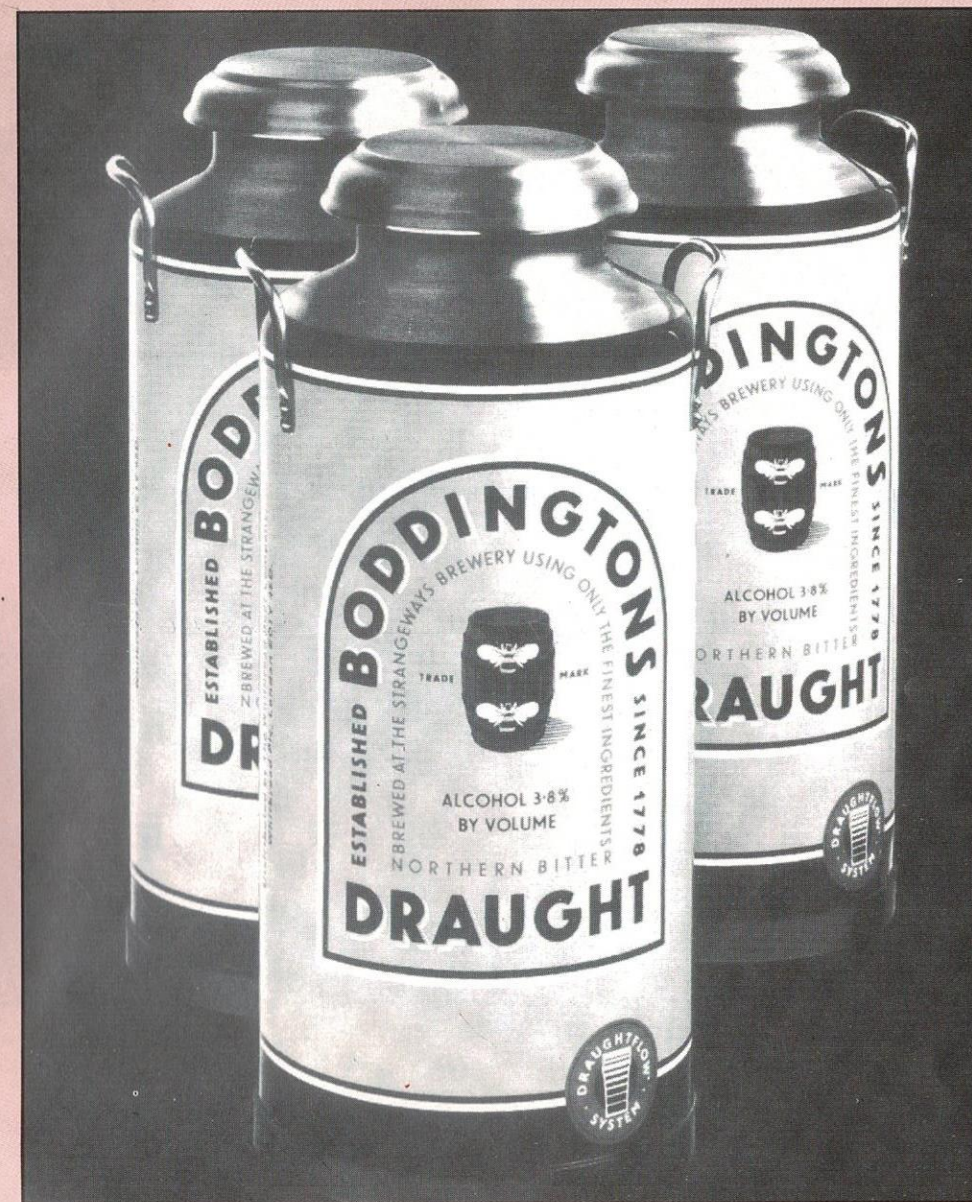
