report from the dugout with George Fairbairn - Coach



The visit of Oldham to Craven Park this afternoon gives us the opportunity to put right one or two of the things which went so wrong at Post Office Road, Featherstone, last Sunday afternoon.

Coming hard on the heels of such a fine performance as the team had put up the previous weekend against St. Helens, both the defeat and the manner of it were of great concern both to me and the rest of the coaching staff.

Basically, it means that we will have to do much better, otherwise that fine win over the Saints will count for nothing; and that means that the hard work starts all over again against Oldham this afternoon.

I spent some time with Oldham coach, Peter Tunks, on a course for coaches during the summer, and came away with a heathly respect for the man's determination and knowledge of the game. He had to run the gauntlet of criticism for the number of established players he shipped out of Oldham, but the men he brought in proved to be well up to the task of taking the club out of the Second Division, and they now have the chance to perform in the top flight.

To help them do this, Peter has brought over Australian top-line forward, Bob Lindner, who is in line for his Oldham debut this afternoon. Lindner has proved his quality in Test and State of Origin football over the years, and there's little wonder that the club are expecting big things from him.

This afternoon, Hull Kingston Robvers will have to prove themselves all over again; to themselves, to you, the supporters and to me as coach, because one or two of the performances at Featherstone failed to come up to expectations and we just cannot afford to perform at much less than 100 percent if we are to hold our heads up in a First Division which is as competitive as this one.

On a brighter note, it's a pleasure once again to be able to acknowledege the fruits of the quite astonishing amount of work which has gone on behind the scenes here at Craven Park, in order to raise the cash with which to sign a whole crop of promising local youngsters during the summer.

During the past couple of weeks we have been able to welcome two more new young professionals to the club in scrum half Chris Batty and centre Carl Bateman. Both these lads are currently playing with our Academy side, but are confidently expected to make the grade. Both are ambitious, well motivated, and keen to do well for the club, and we wish tham all the very best for the future with Hull Kingston Rovers.



FRAMING THE FUTURE.

The Rugby League and major sponsor Stones Bitter are co-funding a £25,000 in-depth survey of the game, entitled "Framing the Future". Researchers are currently undertaking fact finding visits to each of the 32 professional clubs and canvassing the personal views of top officials.

The intensive feedback programme has been commissioned by the League's Board of Directors as a follow-up to Chief Executive Maurice Lindsay's thought provoking policy document "The State of the Game."

Mr. Lindsay explained: "The game of Rugby League is determined to go forward in an aggressive and business like manner. It is essential that Rugby League Headquarters has thorough inside knowledge of it's member clubs activities and ambitions."

"An accurate and complete picture of the game's finances and facilities will help shape the 13-a-side code's future, enabling standards to be set and achieved."

"The new catchphrase for the game's administration at central and club level is 'We're

doing the business. "

"The survey is being undertaken in conjunction with Stones Bitter, who are entering their eighth season of sponsoring of the Championship and Premiership, emphasising their deep interest in the well being of the sport."

"The current economic climate has demanded that sporting dreams now be tempered by financial realism."

"Rugby League has accepted the challenge to take a self look, to identify the problems that need resolving in order to build for a better future befitting the forthcoming Centenary celebrations."

Mr Paul Hughes, Sponsorship Director, Bass Brewers, said: "Stones Bitter's support for the game of Rugby League is unparalleled in the U.K. and we are delighted to be involved in a project to develop and shape the sport for the future. The partnership we have formed with the Rugby League in the course of our association can only benefit from the attention all parties are paying to this important step."

The survey is being carried out by Yorkshire based Global Sports Marketing, accompanied by League Officials.





Steve Hadi, who looked dangerous all the game, got his try when the trialist centre kicked a loose Bramley pass into the open, kicked again for the line, and Hadi just beat the dead ball line by inches with a last gasp dive.







The first match of Rovers' campaign to reach Division One status saw them entertain a big, uncompromising, well drilled Halifax outfit.

The Rovers' side were looking to find the right combination in their first outing, but due to injuries and holiday commitments, found themselves stretched.

Rovers started well and found themselves 6-0 in the lead with a Sam Whitaker try and goal. But after 20 minutes with the lack of team continuity and the red hot weather conditions, Rovers began to make some out-of-character errors. From a 6-0 lead, Rovers found themselves behind at the interval by 12-6.

After the break an interception try by the Halifax winger and conversion saw Rovers fall behind further at 18-6. Then a fine run and pass from Rovers' Bryan Rymer saw Sam Whitaker score his second try and goal keeping Rovers in touch at 18-12. But Halifax soon stretched their lead further to 24-12.

Rovers again bounced back with a typical hookers' try from Chris Ford who barged over from near the line, converted again by sam Whitaker, making the scoreline 24-18.

Rovers could have snatched a draw but for the referee judging a forward pass when a Rovers player was going under the sticks to score. Lady Luck again deserted Rovers when Halifax broke away in the dying seconds to make the final score 28-18.

The only bright spot of the day came from the good performances by Carl Feeney, Bryan Rymer and Sam Whitaker.





rugby league focus

RUGBY LEAGUE IN DENMARK.

Rugby League took its first tentative steps into Denmark this Summer.

The action took place at the HK Faeregarden Summer Camp in Juelsminde, and followed extensive work by Freedy Black MEP and Terry Wynn MEP of the European Parliament All Party Rugby League Group.

Organised by the Rugby Football League's Development Executive, Tom O'Donovan, the week long course was staffed by David Ellis and Francky Beguec from the French club, Cobeil. David has been coaching Cobeil and the French army team for the past year.

HK is a major Trade Union in Denmark who organise Summer Camps for several hundred young people every year.

The objective of this British Rugby League initiative was to give basic introduction in Rugby League Football to the youngsters attending, and also to provide a sound basic coach education to the staff of the camp.

Following discussions with camp staff, the week got off to a great start with the following six people qualifying through the British Rugby League Coaching Scheme's Level 1 Course:-

Lene Knudsen , Mona Larsen

Dan Rasmussen , Bjarne Hansen

Henrik Jorgensen , Leif Rosenmejer

The rest of the week saw David, Francky and the newly qualified coaches introducing youngsters to the game, culminating in sessions of Mini-League.

David Ellis said, "Rugby League was a great Success on the camp, the youngsters were very exited about the game once they got going. Meanwhile the adults were very enthusiastic, everyone wanted more Rugby League."

BRITISH DEPUTATION TO SOUTH AFRICA.

The legendary Nelson Mandela has personally pledged his support for the development of Rugby League in the black townships of South Africa during a meeting with a newly returned four-man deputation of British League officials in Johannesburg.

The President of the ANC interrupted his 90minute visit to the deprived township of Alexandra to discuss the introduction of the 13-a-side code with the British party, headed by Rugby League Chief Executive Maurice Lindsay.

The Chapeltown Road chief outlined the British League's newly formulated initiative to provide a specialist development officer for the black city areas, supported by the provision of grant aid, television and videos, pitches and playing equipment, plus visits by fully qualified British coaching staff.

STONES BITTER PRIZES - 1993-94

The New Stones Bitter champions will receive a record prize cheque for £56,000, an annual increase of £10,000, as the main feature of the 1993-94 Stones Bitter £335,000 sponsorship campaign

The winners of the re-formed 16 club Stones Bitter Second Division will earn £28,000, while the victor's in the end-of-season Stones Bitter Premiership and Second Division Premiership Finals will be presented with £22,000 and £12,500 respectively.

This is the eighth season of Stones Bitter's Sponsorship of the Championship and Premiership, the second of a current four year £1.8 million deal. Of the 1993 sponsorship of £335,000, 50 % will be handed over in prizes to the title winners and runners-up, the remaining half being invested in the League's Capital Development Fund.

Chief Executive Maurice Lindsay said: "The record prize sums reflect the stature of the nine-month long Stones Bitter Championship and Second Division campaign, the most demanding tournaments on the rugby League world calendar. The prize fund has been swelled by an additional £33,000, made up of an annual increase of £17,500, plus the £15,500 previously allocated to the now defunct Third Division."

RUGBY LEAGUE ARMY APPRENTICES COLLEGE CHEPSTOW.

The College is organised into four Squadrons, three of which are made up of Apprentices whose average age is 16 years.

Each Squadron consists of about 270 personnel, including Officers, NCO's and Apprentices.

Following discussions between the Rugby Football League's Development Executive, Tom O'Donovan and Major Martin Morris, the following programme for the introduction of the game has been agreed:-

1.) Establishment of one Apprentice Team. 2.) Establishment of one Senior Team.

Both teams plan to play fixtures at weekends in the Welsh League formed last season and midweek in the Student Rugby League. A coach education programme will be put in place, beginning with a British Rugby League Coaching Scheme Level 1 Course to be staged in the Autumn, with a Level 2 in the summer of 1994.

Major Morris said, "I am confident that the apprentices will take to Rugby League enthusiastically, I expect many will come from Rugby League backgrounds and will be keen to continue playing the game."

The possibility of organising an Army representative side would be explored by Major Morris, making inter-service Rugby League fixtures versus the RAF 'Blue Bombers' an exiting prospect for the 1993-94 season.
