

But no one has suffered more than the players.

select him until he resumes playing, but I am sure that with Kelvin Skerrett and Andy Platt injured Harvey would have been an automatic choice.

The problem with Harvey started at the end of last season when he receive a lucrative offer from Jack Gibson to play for Eastern Suburbs. I was reluctant for him to go because I felt that last season was his first real season in Big League and it was essential to have a summer rest from the rigours of playing front row, and also needed time in the close season to bulk up once again.

Harvey ranted, pointed out that his contract was low, and that he needed the money. At that time the Club was unable to increase his contract so the decision was reluctantly taken to allow him to play a dozen games for Eastern Suburbs in order for him to increase his earnings. Jack Gibson also promised to develop his Front Row Skills.

Harvey returned to England on the Tuesday prior to our first League game with Bradford, and I met him in the presence of his agent on Thursday morning. The Committee had previously agreed to slightly increase his contract. So I was able to give him good news.

Harvey was pleasant, gave me the impression that he was eager to play that weekend, but was adamant that the increase was not quite high enough.

Harvey still has one season of his contract to run, but he had now elevated himself from a young rookie with promise to an established First Teamer playing on the verge of international honours. I do believe that he is by far the best young

prop forward in the game.
Therefore, immediately I returned from the meeting I telephoned Tom Fleet, explained Harvey's request and gave the advice that it should be met. The financial situation at the Club had now altered with the sale of Currier, Holliday, Ashurst, Marsh and the imminent departure of

Eyres, and in fairness to Tom he phoned round the rest of the Committee and they gareed to give Harvey a substantial increase.

This was the Thursday before the start of the season. Harvey trained, worked fit and mixed well the rest of the boys. I told him he was selected at blind side prop. and said see you tomorrow.

That was the last I have seen of him and despite telephoning (he lives with his parents) on numerous occasions and visiting the house half a dozen times. I have not been fortunate enough to speak to him since. Jim and David Hulme have had similar fortunes.

Harvey's father has told me to deal directly with David McKnight, his agent and David has assured the Club that his advice was for Harvey to immediately resume playing for Widnes.

Perhaps Harvey has taken to the backwood, with his gun and fly rod, and is unaware of the situation at the Club. Hopefully then these programme notes will reach him when all else has failed.

If so Harvey your team mates need you, and so does your country!!

WALES IN WORLD CUP

Wales are to compete in the Rugby League Centenary World Cup in the autumn of 1995.

The International Board meeting last June confirmed eight countries to take part in the Centenary World Cup-Great Britain, Australia, New Zealand, France, Papua New Guinea, Tonga, Western Samoa and Fiji.

Britain will now be divided into England and Wales as plans are made to extend the entry to 12 nations.

Mr. Ken Arthurson, Director-General of the International Board, said today: "We are delighted to include Wales in the Centenary World Cup as a side packed with personality and patriotism, reflecting a rich heritage of Rugby League in the Principality dating back to their international debut in 1908."

Rugby Leggue Chief Executive Maurice Lindsay, who has been appointed Centenary World Cup Tournament Director, said today: "We are delighted that Wales have now been accepted and are certain that no only are they worthy participants but also extremely competitive. At this stage Wales have been added to Pool B which includes New Zealand, France, Papua New Guinea and

Bernard Dwyer will almost certainly be knocking on the door for membership to the front rows guild., Saint Bernard (sorry I couldn't resist that one) is a player with that non-stop attitude, and his game has improved tremendously over the last couple of years.

There is a youngster who may overtake them all., Widnes's Stephen McCurrie a talented footballer in the Aussie Testman Kevin Walters mould, The second row is a little less complicated unless you enjoy a good argument, I personally can't see past Wigan's Denis Betts for one spot behind the front row, but who will pack down with Denis, Leeds new signing will fancy his chances even though he has yet to run and tackle in



rano Botica's goalkicking has been the talk of the Rugby League for a few seasons now.

He's even overshadowed Jonathan Davies, who won many a game for Widnes and is doing the same for Warrington.

Frano's accuracy is incredible. It would be interesting to know just what percentage of kicks he has missed. I'll bet it is no more than 10 percent.

Whether they are close in or out on the touchline, it doesn't make the slightest difference to the likeable New Zealander.

But there have been some great kickers in the past—Oldham certainly had one of the best of the lot—Bernard Ganley, who played his rugby in the 50s.

He sent record after record tumbling and you will still find his name in current records.

Undoubtedly Ganley's kicking won many a game and that is probably why the 50s were Oldham's best years. As captain he led them to the Championship with a 15-14 win over Hull in 1956-57. That win denied Hull—with ex-Widnes centre Colin Hutton in their ranks-the chance of a hat-trick of title wins. They had beaten Halifax 10-9 the previous season with Hulton kicking a last minute winner off the touchline, and the following year crushed Workington Town 20-3.

That was in the days of the top four play-off to determine the championship.

but Hull had not finished top of the table—they played 38 games then—in any of their glory years. By contrast Oldham were top in 56-

By contrast Oldham were top in 56-57. The latter of those seasons saw Ganley at his best. He won his three Great Britain caps during that spell and scored 412 points, including 219 goals which was a league record.

Bernard, who won a BA degree at Manchester University, top the record of

the great Jim Sullivan of Wigan, who landed 204 goals.

The following season, he kicked 14 goals against Liverpool City, one of three club records which still stand today. In his career which spanned 1951-61 he collected 1,365 goals and 2,775 points.

Despite being skipper in a superb
Oldham side, which also picked up a
hat-trick of Lancashire Cup wins from
57-59, he managed only three caps. The
fact that he did not win more I believe
was twofold.

If anything he lacked a little pace and there was some excellent competition in the 50s with the likes of Jack Cunliffe (Wigan), Jimmy Ledgard (Leigh), Glyn Moses (St. Helens) and possibly the best of the lot Eric Fraser (Warrington).

On one of his three GB appearance, however, Ganley managed to set a record which still stands—10 goals against France at Central Park in 1957.

It's good to see Oldham back in the top flight. They have certainly been one of Rugby League's yo-yo teams over the years, but Peter Tunks, with his clever dealings in the transfer market, seems to be building a good sayad.

He may have long way to go before Oldham have a side to match that one of the 50s, but they are heading in the right direction.

comfortable in being able to meet existing Player commitments. What we cannot do at this time is use any significant portion of the income to buy international class players.

There are of course top class Aussies Jon Grieve and Rod Howe with us this season and the emphasis is on recruitment of young players. Steve O'Reilly last seasons BARLA player of the year, has been signed along with Jason Hunter, James Briers and Gary Broadbent. The local scouting network has been extended to further pursue junior recruitment. Phil Larder has also been looking at other options and one deal has brought David Ruane back to Naughton Park. It is perhaps worth stressing that despite the departures, given freedom from injury we could field a team containing 10 internationals!

QUESTION: Are you still confident the incorporation will be successful? **ANSWER:** The Committee is

certainly still totally committed to the share issue being the most positive and most practical way forward. We already know the extent of likely investments from the Committee and some associates and were very encouraged by the Members'

response to likely up take on August 5 at the EGM. The reality is that we will only know for sure when all the share applications come in.

QUESTION: Is the Club any better financially placed now that we were being told at

the AGM and EGM meetings? ANSWER: In short yes. We seem to have got ourselves tagged by the media as "crisis club" or "cash strapped". In truth Widnes is recognising it's plight as other Clubs have failed to do and striving to get onto a financially stable basis.

The economies so far achieved plus the transfer income have very considerably reduced the operating deficit for this season. We cannot for one minute pretend we are in the clear but we are in a manageable situation with our creditors and contracts which hitherto would not have been possible. Sponsorship has improved, we have good advisors and a lot of dedicated input. If there are downsides it has been the lower than expected take up of season tickets and the poor attendances for the first two home games, well below last season's average. The Club is of course only ever going to be as good as its support. This is the reality; please help us to keep our gates high during this difficult transitionary period to allow us ALL to build for the future.




BLACK & WHITE SKIPPER DAVID HULME GIVES HIS VIEWS...

Q. With so many players leaving the club for one reason or another during the summer, what effect did it have on you personally?

A. Under Phil Larder's guidance the team reached Wembley and like him I believed the squad was strong enough to maintain a challenge to Wigan in the 93/94 season. With the summer months to develop and to address the team's weaker areas I was looking forward to the new season. Therefore the continual departures of not only players but good friends was very frustrating personally. I could appreciate there were critical financial pressures threatening to destroy the club but how in particular they could sell Andy Currier, in my opinion the game's best attacking centre, was unimaginable. But with the challenge of captain placed upon me I, like the rest of the senior professionals, had to put on a brave face and try to rebuild and rejuvenate the new team structure and the determination shown both by the newcomers and the established players so far this season has gone a long way to healing the frustration.

Q. Has the present situation made your job as captain a lot more difficult or easier?

A. In the first place it is an honour for me to captain the club and, as I say, certainly a challenge considering all of the upheaval. The good thing about new young players coming into the sauad is that they are impressionable and therefore it is essential that they are given auidance and encouragement which in turn produces confidence. I believe that my new role will also improve my game because I can only ask the team for what I give myself, 100% commitment and



enthusiasm, factors which become addictive within a team environment. In the long term my ultimate goal, like so many players, is to coach and so the man management and tactical awareness essential to the captains role will prove vital.

Q. Have the spirited displays by the side surprised you in any way?

A. Not at all. The main nucleus of this side have trained together during the summer and have worked harder than ever before and this has enabled the players to rely on each other and advise on skills to improve each others playing standard. All the players so far have given 100% to Widnes both on the field of play and to the club's marketing policy.

Q. Of the senior professionals that are left, what help have these been to Phil Larder in particular and the side in general?

A. I think Phil realised early in the summer that the senior pro's still at the club had to respond positively in training and eventually on match days otherwise the club would disintegrate. It has been encouraging to witness the senior people helping the others and watch them develop as better players.

Q. How have the young lads from the Alliance squad responded since being thrust into first team action?

A. Under normal circumstances young players should be introduced into the First Division arena under controlled conditions with a nucleus

of experienced players protecting and giving direction. However with the situation at Widnes there has been a major proportion of newcomers coming into the side at the same time, in some cases earlier than might have been anticipated. All of these players have performed well and can be proud of their efforts and though they lack experience, only time can provide that ingredient. Another consideration is that each player's development cycle is different, with forwards usually taking a longer period to develop their skills and positional awareness than backs.

Q. What is the spirit like within the Club at the moment?


A. The spirit in playing and coaching staff is extremely good, with plenty of characters around. I believe that there is a time to totally concentrate during training etc but also just as vital is laughing and enjoying the company of a squad. This element of Rugby League is underplayed with people only realising the significance of it when they have finished playing the game. The only thing essential to any player at Widnes is a thick skin

to withstand any personal observation made about you. For instance Dave Myers' receding hairline, Bobby Goulding's stomach and Alan McCurrie's dress sense and lycra track suit bottoms; the list is endless. Rugby League is a totally professional game but a laughing and confident team is a winning team

Q. Finally, will this season be a case of survival in the First Division or do you think that we can still compete with the top clubs for honours.

A. Regardless of the financial problems or player departures at the club it is time for the excuses to stop and time to get on with the job. When I signed for Widnes back in 1980 I did so for two reasons, one was to play professional rugby for my hometown club and probably more importantly to play in the First Division, to win trophies and League titles. That determination still remains. I have no doubt that there is an element within the club who believe that the survival of Widnes RLFC at any divisional status is the primary concern. I myself believe that Widnes is about success and find it totally unacceptable to consider any other divisional status than the first. The whole concept of the club over the last twenty years has been winning trophies, which is why I play for Widnes RLFC; anything less would make playing pointless.


BIACK AND WHITE


RUGBY

The contract system and transfer tribunals have been big news in Rugby League over the past few weeks and Widnes have been at the forefront of both debates in view of the Harvey Howard and Richard Eyres situations.

There is a strong possibility that over the next five or ten years the European Courts may

rule that transfer fees between clubs are illegal and a breach of a players rights. Basically the argument runs that if you or I want to change jobs then we are free to do so, so why should a professional sportsman be any different? As long as he is out of contract he would be free to sign for whoever he pleased with clubs being unable to demand compensaiton. Any rules brought in by the RFL to limit such freedom of movement would risk being declared illegal as a Restraint of Trade.

As I say, it might not happen for a while yet, but it almost certainly will happen so it is important that we address the issue now and not be caught on the hop like we were when the present contract set-

up was introduced (for similar legal reasons) in the late 1980's. You can bet your bottom dollar that players agents are watching the situation like hawks! And we do need to think about the implications of full freedom of contract. I mean, this last summer Wigan signed two outstanding young players in **Garry Connolly and Nigel** Wright, but at least it cost them £400,000. If they hadn't had to worry about transfer fees, who is to say that they wouldn't also have picked up Paul Newlove, Richard Eyres and Michael Jackson, too!

How then might we limit the effects of a transfer free for all? In Australia the salary cap, designed to limit the amount spent by each club on players wages, simply hasn't had the desired effect of creating parity in the league—the wealthier clubs are simply finding ways to bend the rules and pay their players more.

Perhaps we could introduce a scheme whereby each club

was allowed to field only one 'major' new signing every eighteen months, with the status of all players to be decided at the outset of the season by the club holding their registration. For example if Featherstone had have rated Deryck Fox and Paul Newlove as two of, say, their best five players Bradford would now only be able to field one or other of them at any one time, though they'd be allowed to have both on their books. Italian soccer has a similar framework under which clubs may have an unlimited number of foreign players (to avoid a breach of EEC law) but can only put any three on the park for each match.

All of this might seem a bit involved and somewhat far fetched even, but if Rugby League hides its head in the sand over the next few years then events will overtake us and pretty soon we might have no game left to worry about at all!
