Welcome today to Oldham RLFC and their supporters.

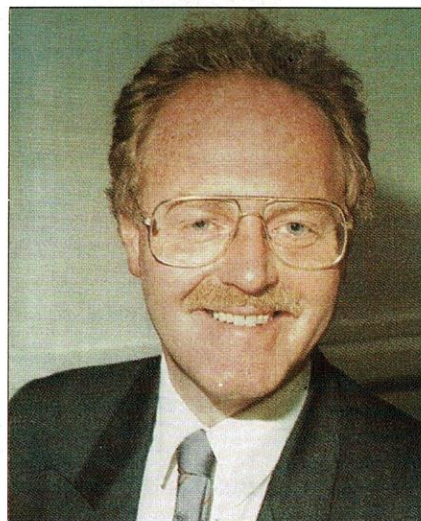

# At Our -

## OLDHAM - *Roughyeds*

Oldham arrive here at Odsal for their first league visit since March 1991 looking for a league victory after dropping into the relegation zone. Since that visit their team has seen much change, coach Peter Tunks even changing the personnel who were successful in gaining promotion from the second division last term.

Full back WALLY GIBSON joined the club after a successful spell with the nearby Huddersfield club. The Australian is an exciting elusive attacking player but perhaps his defensive limitation have prevented him from reaching the very top, as can be seen by his use in a variety of different positions including scrum half in recent weeks. PAUL TOPPING has long been a very reliable full back both Swinton and Leigh but has gained much acclaim for his displays for Oldham this season. Another former Swinton player is wingman SCOTT RANSON, he scored 12 tries in 24 appearances for Oldham last season. Former Wakefield flyer DAVID JONES, signed in exchange for centre Gary Christie, and Ranson are keeping out former Northern player HUGH GUMBS who is only able to gain selection in the Alliance side.

Another player who made his name with a West Yorkshire club is centre SHAUN IRWIN. Signed from Castleford at the start of the season Irwin is a product of the Redhill club he gained four Under-21 caps whilst with Castleford. His regular partner is DARREN ABRAM who moved over from neighbours Rochdale Hornets just under 12 months ago.

Although he only scored seven tries last season, with only three of those being for Oldham, he scored 37 tries in the preceding two seasons with Rochdale and Trafford Borough. Signed the day before Abram was former Orrell rugby union club winger NIGEL HESLOP. He represented England between 1990 and 1992 making his debut against Argentina and his final international appearance being against Wales. In recent games he has switched between centre, full back and wing. Coach Peter Tunks has also been using various

permutation of players at half back. Former Wigan and Warrington player MARTIN CROMPTON looks set to take over as the regular scrum half with his likely partner being STEVE KERRY. Kerry was signed from the Salford club where he played alongside his current coach Peter Tunks. Topping, Gibson and Martin Strett are others who have played at half back in recent games with strett now out of the permutations following his recent move to Rochdale Hornets in exchange for winger ADRIAN BELL and forward DAVE CHRIMES. In recent weeks Oldham have been reported to be interested in Cardiff winger Nigel Walker and Australian back GLENN LIDDIARD. If signed Liddiard would be in his second spell at the Watersheddings after appearing in the 1985-86 season alongside his brother David who is now playing for Hull K.R.

After losing New Zealand international Se'e Solomona, initially with a broken arm and subsequently to Auckland Warriors Oldham have found themselves with little experience in the front row. BARRIE McDERMOTT has filled the vacancy recently, he was signed from local club Waterhead. Another product of the Waterhead club is IAN SHERRATT, a player who started his professional career under Peter Fox here at Odsal around a decade ago and who is now in his second spell with Oldham after also playing for Salford. He gained the respect of Tunks whilst at the Willow and is reported to be in good form this season. Hooker is JOHN CLARKE who was a member of the BARLA tourist squad to Australia during the summer, he was signed from the East Leeds club and has kept out the vastly experienced former St. Helens player PAUL GROVES.

The second row brings together a pair of former Leeds players, New Zealander MIKE KUITI played for the Headingley club between January 1990 and September 1991. He joined Leeds after making an impact on the 1989 tour but was one of the first departures after the arrival of coach Doug Laughton, leaving

to join Rochdale Hornets. The other is ANDY GOODWAY, recently reported to be a contender for the vacant coaching position at Hunslet, who gained fame with the Wigan club in the late eighties and early nineties before joining Leeds last season. He returned to Oldham, his original club, during the summer. Two other New Zealanders who may also gain selection today are CHARLIE McALISTER and SHANE TUPAEA. The latter appeared for Swinton before joining Oldham whilst McAlister is another player in a second period of service with the Oldham club who he originally joined in 1988 from the Bradford and Bingley rugby union club.

Loose forward is the experienced Australian BOB LINDNER. His signing came as something of a surprise to most followers of the game, the former West player appeared in last seasons World Cup Final. Former Northern player CRAIG RICHARDS made a sensational start to his Oldham career scoring twice on his debut against his former teammates. Like Gumbs he has also found first team selection to be elusive in recent weeks with Tunks more likely to call on former St. Helens player IYAN GREEN or the former Leigh miners player DAVE BRADBURY. Forwards Mark Meadows and Ben Olsen have both left for Leigh in recent weeks restricting the choice for Tunks in the forward positions.

Oldham have joined the ranks of clubs with an Academy side this season and once again I shall try and use my crystal ball to predict a bright future for one of their rising stars. This weeks selection is ALF GOLBOURNE, the younger brother of Featherstone's Alex Golbourne. He was another BARLA tourist during the summer and has already progressed from the Academy ranks to the Alliance side.

## SPOTLIGHT

Peter Tunks started his coaching career in earnest with the Watersheddings club in April 1991 leading them to the Second Division Championship last season. Whilst his first season in charge saw a disappointing final league position of third he led the team to a Divisional Premiership Final against Sheffield Eagles, losing out 34-20 with a certain K. Mumby scoring a Sheffield try.

From the fifteen on duty that day only Scott Ranson, Shane Tupaea and Ian Sherratt remain with the club, indicating the ability and willingness of Tunks to use the transfer market usually with exchange deals to try to enhance the club's playing strengths.

Tunks played for three English clubs, Sheffield, Salford and Leeds who he joined for one season in 1987 from the Canterbury club.

# It's an Oval World

Before you say anything, I know the New Year is supposed to be a time for looking forward. Well, I'm different. Not being the courageous type I've never cared for the uncertainty of the future and rather pandered to my retrospective nature by preferring the things I can trust, solid things, like memories for instance. Since my involvement with Northern is largely confined to memories these days, I make scant apology for possibly boring you with some of my notable ones. Look, can I help it if self-indulgence happens to be one of my favourite pastimes? Be positive, maybe it will jog a few memories of your own. Then again you can always turn the page.

I ought to say first that accuracy can't be guaranteed in these recollections. Events become muddled and congealed as time, like blood, runs at an altogether different pace through young bodies. But, after all these are my memories and a little licence here and there is all part of their appeal.

I don't actually recall my first Northern match. It was during the re-formation season of 1964 and a couple of things from those early days stick. Well do I remember everyone's surprise at a win over Wakefield, though whether that surprise stemmed from the fact it was a win or that it was a win by the unusual score of 3 points to nil, escapes me, along with the game itself.

Then there was the day my Dad and I arrived late for the Whitehaven game and became quite excited at the rare sight of our team - the ones in white with coloured bands around their chests - throwing the ball about and scoring with consummate ease. It certainly appeared as if this would be a performance to treasure until some long suffering soul could stand our misplaced elation no more and informed us that there was a clash of colours and Northern were in red today. Reality was never crueler.

Do you remember the 'long walk' up the Odsal slope from the pitch to the dressing rooms? I don't recall how long it is now since it disappeared, but I do know I miss it, allowing for the fact that things had to change. What a place for kid's initiation to rugby league. A veritable Mount Olympus, filled with heroes and villains, still muddled from the toils of battle and all within touching distance. Northern never seemed to lose in those days. Mind you, the fact that I only waited to see the players up the slope if we'd won might have something to do with that selective reminiscence.

The two memories of the avenue of honour or the gauntlet of shame, depending on circumstances, are both from my early days. Firstly there was Errol Stock's last match before returning to Australia. It was a sad occasion for me, since I didn't see why he had to leave at all, but it appeared to me that hundreds of people were prepared to swallow their disappointment to line the slope and wish Errol well. He was the last player up from the pitch that evening and he looked as if he was pleased with his send-off. If you were so pleased why didn't you ever return, Errol?

Anyhow, speaking of send-offs brings me to by other memory of the famous 'walk' it was the first time I remember seeing a player sent from the field. The

match was the cup-tie with Wakefield and Gert Coetzer was the miscreant. In stark contrast with the Errol Stock occasion, this time the slope was singularly devoid of well-wishers. I would willingly have accompanied Gert on his lonely trek, kicking his shins all the way, but my Dad, wiser, and anyway not one keen on involvement with the authorities, forbade me leave his side. So Gert got off scot-free, in my eyes at least, with tripping Ian Brooke, who would otherwise have scored, won the tie and set Northern on the road to Wembley. Little wonder in our household, Gert Coetzer was about as popular as Salman Rushdie is nowadays, in Tahrán.

Still on the subject of the Cup, the next season saw the big mid-week tie with mighty Wigan. I was a bit taken with Billy Boston in those days and was thoroughly excited about the whole thing. Funnily enough, now I can't even recall if Boston played. What I do remember is a vast crowd and a spectacular overhead pass out of a tackle by Brian McTigue to keep a Wigan move alive. It summed up the evening. Northern trying hard, only to find Wigan able to call on something extra. Things don't change much do they?

On a happier Cup-tie note there was the semi-final at Headingley in 1973, against Dewsbury. I owe my memories of the afternoon to the thickness of my skull. As I said, things don't change much. Anyway, when David Treasure raced away for his second try and Wembley became a certainty, I leapt in the air, head first into the floodlight pylon. There were a damned sight more stars around than the thirteen on the field, I can tell you. Just think, if it happened today, I'd probably be able to sue Leeds into the bargain and make for a totally satisfactory afternoon.

Then there was the time Wally Lewis was supposed to be coming to Odsal. Remember that? Nobody really believed it of course, but we were all just a bit excited all the same. That Friday we went shopping in Morrisons on Mayo Avenue. There we met Brian, a chap who stood with my Dad and a few others at the Rooley Lane end, on his knees, arms outstretched, bowing and shouting, 'Wally Lewis' across the Queensland bananas. Okay, acceptable behaviour in downtown Brisbane, but guaranteed to attract attention in Bradford on a Friday night. Two years later Brian still did this whenever he saw us in Morrrys, but he was like that, oblivious to what others might think.

Where do I stop, the memories roll on. Hugging a similarly jubilant, total stranger as we danced with care-free abandon in the Wilderspool mud after that 1975 Players Final win; Hanley's try in the semi-final almost but not quite making up for the defeat; Berwyn Jone's try against Wakefield in the Cup match that had to be played at Headingley; Brian Hogan and Kel Earl showing the termerity to laugh behind the posts at Wheldon Road during one of the buckettings we seem to get there; Fordy's late, late winner against Castleford when he went up the new terracing side. Okay, okay, I know it's got to stop...

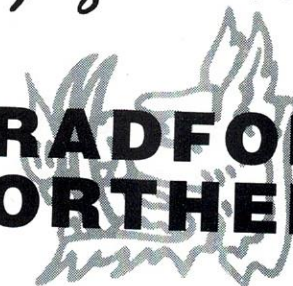

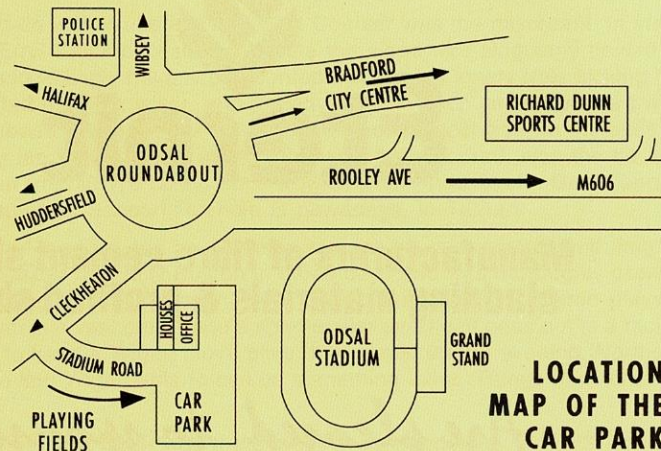


## CAR PARKING FOR FUTURE FIXTURES

# T & A BLOID TALK

with Brian Smith

There's surely not a ground anywhere that has been the butt of so many jokes, or taken as much criticism as Odsal. And there can't be another club that has had its fate influenced so much by the sheer uniqueness of its playing venue.

Remember the bad winter of 1978-79, for example? and I remember it clearly because I was on strike for several weeks, freezing on a picket line in the provincial newspaper dispute.

Because of snow and frost, Odsal couldn't stage a game from mid-December to early March. Consequently, Northern ended up playing their last 15 league games (eight of them at home) in a spell of 48 days! In between they also battled their way through to the Challenge Cup semi-final including a replay at Hull, and they then still reached the Premiership final against all the odds.

Odsal's never been the same to me since they knocked down the 'old stand' in the mid-eighties and there have been times when I've felt they should bomb the place. But the sight of the terracing being so well populated for recent games against Halifax and Castleford has been a wonderful reminder of the great days of big crowds, when all that mattered was how many could get in.

Whatever the criticisms of Odsal, that magnificent sweep of terracing, so reminiscent of Fartown in its heyday, offers some of the best viewing anywhere. And the fact that recent games have been staged in defiance of the weather, with the help of pitch covers and tremendous work from the groundstaff, has been a big bonus for the club.

So let's hear it for Odsal for a change. Just wait while they're pulling the sliding roof on!!

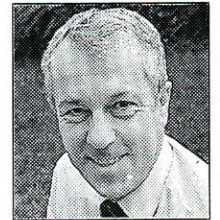

# The Peter Fox Diary



Written in 1987 by Simon Howard of Kirkby Lonsdale, then aged 13

*Just to change to format slightly...*

Over the next few programmes we are featuring an interview that appeared in "Open Rugby" magazine in December 1992. The interview was conducted by Neil Hanson. Reproduced by kind permission by Open Rugby.

**STRONG-willed, full of self-belief, PETER FOX is one of Rugby League's most charismatic characters. He's also a very successful coach - the oldest in the RFL, with a wealth of experience. He's coached Great Britain and Yorkshire, and is now back at Odsal leading Bradford Northern.**

**O.R.** The Leeds and Great Britain jobs are probably the two occasions when you could say you were kicked in the teeth. Are you still angry?

**FOX:** No. I'm not angry. The year before I took the Leeds job, they had thirteen foreign players. The year I took over they left me with two and all the kids that they'd kicked out, the Rayne twins, Kevin Dick, Heron, Neil Hague and Dickinson came back. We got to three semi-finals and should have got to Wembley. We were robbed, as everybody knows, by a try that wasn't a try and a referee that cowed out on the day. We were in the top eight the day I was sacked, exactly the same position we'd been in the year before.

And Leeds wouldn't buy me the players I wanted. We had Jonathan Davies up at Headingley - he could have played for Leeds, but they wouldn't put the money down - the £100,000 it was going to cost them. I was told by Joe Warham that it would break the bank. I suggested three Rugby Union players if they wanted to put Leeds on the map - Jonathan Davies, Kirwan, The New Zealand winger, who's still being mentioned in circles even today, and Gavin Hastings, the Scottish full-back. That was in 1986. I did ask them to sign one player for me then as well - Deryck Fox. They've been for him twice since but they wouldn't sign him for me! Can you imagine what a revelation we'd have been if we'd signed those four players in 1986? It's in the past, but if I am angry about anything it's that they sacked me without bringing the players in that I know could have done the job for Leeds.

The Great Britain job - I didn't pick any player in the side, the eight selectors picked the team and I had to put them on the field. But I was promised the job of coaching Great Britain on tour in 1979. They told me the criteria was not to win the series necessarily, as long as we performed well and don't forget we hadn't won a series since 1970. We lost the 2-1 and I have a letter to this day from David Oxley to say that both managers wanted me unreservedly to be the coach. But the people in power didn't want me, so fine. I've never had another chance. But all I can say is when I've had the opportunity to select my own team - for Yorkshire - I'm unbeaten in seven games.

They've also refused to let my Yorkshire team or the Lancashire side play the Australians. That's ridiculous. They play the three State of Origin matches and then select from them the men to represent Australia. We talk about wanting increased competition at the top, but they say they don't want our international players exposed against this opposition regularly. Cumbria can play them but we can't. Maybe Great Britain wouldn't like Peter Fox to do with Yorkshire what Great Britain haven't been able to do?

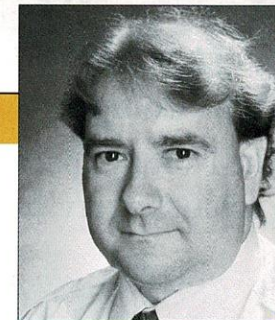

From Where I Sit **by Martin Bass**

In 1982 The Australian tourists came to our shores, and handed out hidings to all and sundry. Their play was fast, hard and skilful. They cruised through this country amassing 423 points (A try then only counted as three points). Large crowds turned out at every game to witness their awesome performances. The press not surprisingly labelled this all conquering team the invincibles.

On the test front the British management just didn't know what to do. In the three match ashes series 30 players were used. This Australian team which included such legends as Stirling, Meninga, Price and Kenny had dramatically demonstrated to all concerned about the game in this country just how far we had fallen behind. The writing was on the wall a few years earlier in 1979 when the British Lions captained by Doug Laughton had been walloped three - nil while on tour. In 1979 the Brits refused to take note of what was happening in Australia. Using such illusions as 'the Aussies may be fitter but we are more skilful' and 'how will the Aussies cope on the cold, muddy pitches of the North of England'. Well the Kangaroos coped admirably and in doing so finally killed off this ostrich type head-in-the-sand outlook then so prevalent within our domestic game.

Gradually the message got through that drastic changes had to be made on the playing front to save the game in Britain. Fitness and strength levels rose, careful dieting was introduced. The standard of coaching and player conditioning rose beyond recognition. Now over a decade later we can compete and even beat the mighty Australians. Although we shall have to wait until next seasons Kangaroos tour if we can wrestle the ashes from the green and golds.

Now in 1994 rugby league finds itself struggling again! This time the problem is not a matter for coaches and players to straighten out but for the games administrators, who must act now or this sport will never progress beyond its Northern Homeland. Which would result in consequences for darker than the humiliation by the Aussies a decade ago.

Earlier this season our sport was the victim of some outrageous attacks from the media. These insults which have been completely unprovoked have come from the Rugby Union scripes at various national newspapers. These insults range from the appalling comments by Michael Heard of the Evening Standard who claims rugby league is 'Played by ape-like creatures watched by gloomy

men in cloth caps' to the more subtle veiled insults of various rugby union hacks at the so called quality papers, who somehow manage to fit in the comments like 'RL is not played in as many countries' or 'RL is just a Northern game' into any reference made to our great sport. The ultimate snub or insulting gesture by the media was the BBC and ITV at the traditionally end of year sporting awards. On the one hand we had the BBC giving RL less than a minute of air time, while RU had a full ten minutes of the show plus the accolade of the English RU team being awarded the previously covert title of 'Team of the Year' (They had managed to win four out of six matches in the year and conceded as many tries as they had scored!). Wigan and Great Britain RL achievements together with the success of Britains athletes and Englands Ladies cricket team were unrewarded. The ITV fared no better by awarding their team prize to Manchester United who admittedly had won a championship - but nothing else. ITV forgot about our sport but did manage to nominate the English RU seven-a-side team for winning the RU7's World Cup. Which isn't even a proper sport, a mere form of tig-and-pass.

Rugby League deserves better. Fortunately there is a RL parliamentary group headed by Wakefield MP Mr. D. Hinchcliffe who defends our cause laudably in the House of Commons. What's also needed is action from us supporters. If all 'Leagueies' wrote to the television companies demanding a better deal for RL, they would have to take note. Also a letter to the various editors, who unfortunately hide away in London should do the trick.

As we did on the playing front in 1982 we must address this problem. The inadequacy of the national sporting media must be tackled head-on. The days of 'running scared' of the Rugby Union should be over, like our forefathers nearly one hundred years ago at the George Hotel we must stand-up and be counted.
