'TOUHLINER' RECALLS A MAGNIFICENT BATTLE WITH OLDHAM IN THE HALEYON DAYS OF PARKSIDE

The date.... Saturday 7th December 1957; and before an attendance of 10,517 at the Parkside home of Hunslet the following teams opposed each other:-

HUNSLT - LANGTON, SNOWDON, STOCKDILL, WALKER, COLIN, GABBITAS, TALBOT, HATFIELD, SMITH J. PLATT, BOLAND, K. PLATT, SHAW.

OLDHAM - GANLEY, CRACKNELL, NOON, DAVIES, ETTY, NESTOR, PITCHFORD, RAWBOTTOM, KEITH, JACKSON, WINSLADE, LITTLE, TURNER.

REFEREE - Mr. T. N. RAILTON (Wigan).

The game saw a dramatic start to it, so would be witnessed by the dying minutes of the overall eighty minutes. Hunslet's first attack initially saw Talbot held just short of the line - then Shaw. John Platt succeeded where they had failed however, crashing under the posts for a try - Talbot converting to make it 5-0 after just 5 minutes.

Almost from the restart, Walker went in for a seemingly second try, but alas, after falling to a Noon tackle just a yard from the line, he was penalised for not playing the ball correctly before touching down.

It was all Hunslet though, and on 13 minutes, a Talbot - Hatfield - Shaw passing move put Gabbitas over for Talbot to again add the goal for 10-0. Nestor led another Oldham raid, this time a rewarding one - his pass in the tackle to Davies giving the centre a 15 yard run for a try. Although wide out, Ganley hit over a cracking goal - 10-5.

Talbot pulled 2 points back with a nice 'drop' on 23 minutes and just 3 minutes afterwards, Colin raced in at the corner following a scoring break from Walker to make 15-5.

Oldham answered back with a fine Cracknell try on 26 minutes. Nestor, Davies and Pitchford strung together some good handling, before the wingman finished it all off between the sticks. Ganley goaled. Then, minutes from the half time whistle, Keith of Oldham put Davies clear, but the centre couldn't reach out cleanly on Langton's tackle to ground the ball correctly, but a pulsating first forty ended with a Ganley penalty and just a point separating the two sides at 13-12 in Hunslet's favour.

Oldham opened after the break with several torrid attacks, but Hunslet's defence never flinched, and soon it was they who reaped the reward of another score. Rowbottom lost possession in an Oldham attack, and in swooped Colin to pick up and race fully 70 yards to score by the posts. Talbot again kicked the goal.

Oldham attacked once again, this time Pitchford's pass meant for Etty being intercepted by Snowdon, whose 50 yard run was only just denied a try by Ganley's brilliant line saving tackle.

Talbot kicked a further goal to increase Hunslet's lead to 8 points - and with little under a quarter of an hour remaining there was little Hunslet could do wrong - or so it seemed!

But in a terrific late rally, Oldham clinched victory in a dramatic fashion. First, Winslade crashed over from close range - Ganley converting; then just two minutes from time, Noon shook off two cover tackles to score in the corner to level matters, and up stepped Ganley to hit home a magnificent conversion - into the breeze, to seal Hunslet's fate.

A really exciting contest which had kept everyone enthralled throughout had ended at:-

Sean Devine. A 23 year old scrum-half, whom Oldham boss Peter Tunks also recruited in an exchange. This time it was with St Helens, Oldham receiving £50,000, Devine and backrow forward Paul Jones for Great Britain under 21 forward Chris Joynt.

Mark Meadows. A second row forward, who had seen service with Swinton and Trafford Borough when Tunks snapped him up on the eve of the 1992/93 season from the new Blackpool Gladiators Club, who took Sean Allen in a straight swap.

Hugh Gumbs. A young winger from Yorkshire, who signed for Bradford Northern when David Hobbs was boss, had a spell with Batley and then signed for Oldham as a free agent in the summer of 1992. Went to Australia that summer in the students World Cup.

Paul Jones. At 6ft 3in and 17 stone, Leigh based Jones had more than 60 senior appearances for St Helens behind him, albeit many of them as a substitute, when he signed for Oldham with Sean Devine in the Chris Joynt deal.

Ben Olsen. This Danish born forward made a name for himself with London Crusaders and signed for Oldham in the famous swap-shop summer of 1992 with winger Richard Blackman, a Londoner returning "home" to join the Crusaders at Crystal Palace.

Tiny Solomon. A Kiwi of western Samoan origin, "Tiny" signed for Oldham in early 1992 from Widnes, but did not make his debut until the start of the season because of groin trouble. Has had two groin operations since the turn of the year but is playing at the top of his form now and won the man of the match award in Oldham's first round Lancashire Cup win against first division club, Warrington. Has been selected for international duty.

Steve Kerry. Former Preston Grass Hoppers R. U. halfback, turned professional for Salford for whom he was a prolific goal scorer and he topped the R. L. points scoring list in 1990/91 when Salford won the second division championship with 427 points.

Can play equally well at stand-off or scrum-half and was long admired by Oldham coach, Peter Tunks, before he finally got his man in September 1992.

David Bradbury. Signed from Leigh Miners after touring New Zealand with the Barla under 19 squad. David is a strong running loose-forward, who impressed on Oldham's pre-season tour of France. A most promising young player.

Scott Ranson. Twenty four year old St Helen's player and the top try scorer from his former club Swinton. Signed for Oldham in March 1992.

Shane Tupaea. Ex New Zealand player. Signed for Swinton then Rochdale. A hard tackling defensive second-row forward.

Ian Sherratt. Former Oldham & Lancashire schoolboy. Left Oldham for Salford and returned season 1991/92. A hard grafting prop-forward.

Barrie McDermott. Strong and powerful despite his 21 years, local boy Barrie is yet another member of the Barla squad to throw in his lot with Oldham. He is a dedicated young professional and has quickly made enough impression to earn a place on the bench in Oldham's last seasons matches.

Nigel Heslop. Former England R. U. winger who won 10 caps for his country. Signed for Oldham from Orrell R. U. club in February '92 after losing his place in England's five nation cup squad for 1993.

Represented England in the World Cup '91 and was a member of the Grand Slam winning squads.

Darren Abram. First professional club was Warrington and then moved to Trafford Borough from where he joined Rochdale for £40k in '91.

Earned a reputation at Rochdale as a prolific try scorer and when listed for £70k was sought by several clubs including Salford, Featherstone & Wakefield before joining Oldham in February '93.

Paul Fletcher. A first class player who has played successfully with Salford, Hull & Castleford. An excellent fullback and now willing to try to fill the roll of a hooker or scrum-half.

An invaluable player to have on one's books.

Mike Kuiti. A New Zealand international of great repute.

Played in Great Britain & France with the New Zealand tourists in 1989. Selected for the test team eight times, playing in Great Britain, France and New Guinea, but not Australia. A strong loose forward or second rower, at the pinnacle of his career. Has played for Rochdale, Swinton, Leeds and Rochdale again. Has a good eye for making and taking scoring opportunities.

David Jones. A strong finishing winger signed from Wakefield. A Wigan born St Pat's player and as an amateur gained county & international honours. Can quickly establish himself as a firm favourite at Oldham if he continues in his current form.

Bob Lindner. One of Australia's all time greats. Played in 25 state of origin games and in 23 tests for Australia. One of the world's most feared loose forwards. Also successful second row forward. Had previous spells with Castleford. Kangaroos man of the tour in 1990, is looking forward to a successful season with Oldham and helping to keep our rightful place in the 1st division.

Paul Groves. Signed from St Helens in the close season. A hooker of top quality. Played with Salford before going to St Helens and toured in Australia and New Zealand in 1988. Huddersfield ended their three match losing run in the second division to keep alive their promotion dream in a free-scoring encounter.

Hunslet led 6-4 at one stage but they were swept aside by a four-try scoring burst in the last fifteen minutes of the first half.

The Fartowners were cruising at 34-6 twelve minutes into the second half but the visitors stormed back with three late tries to make the score respectable.

Two of Hunslet's tries came from full-back Paul Burrow, who was the most impressive player on the field. He was rock solid in defence and his determined running from deep revealed Hunslet's suspect tackling.

Strong running loose forward Paul Hughes also caught the eye but Huddersfield had an edge upfront, where prop David King and Andy Pucill were outstanding and loose-forward Greg Pearce mesmerised the visiting defence with his ball handling skills.

Pearce gave his side an early 4-0 lead with two well struck penalties but Hunslet went in front when stand-off David Brook got Burrow into his stride straight from the scrum heel and he shrugged off two attempted tackles to score.

Huddersfield were fortunate when winger Richard Francis completely mis-kicked the ball over the tryline following a grubber kick from Brad Davis and Ian Thomas pounced for his 18th try of the season.

That gave the Fartowners the encouragement they needed especially when Hunslet centre Giles Boothroyd dropped a pass with the tryline at his mercy.

Huddersfield used their good fortune well, scoring three tries in just seven minutes before half-time. Towering kicks from Pearce set up scores for King and full-back Jason Laurence, and centre Damieon Pickles grabbed a try after a break by substitute Brian Blacker.

Huddersfield had lost scrum-half Neil Flanagan with a cut nose after 29 minutes but Blacker proved an able deputy and the 24-6 interval lead gave them a valuable cushion.

Within four minutes of the restart, Pearce weaved his way over and then Davis took a return pass from Laurence to cut through.

Poor Hunslet hardly knew what had hit them but they recovered their composure and, with substitutes Peter Seabourne and Eugene Curie working well, they began to expose chinks in the home defence.

Burrow supported a break by Paul Beath to go over and then prop Mark Ellis twice proved unstoppable over ten yards as he grabbed a brace of tries.

In between, Laurence took advantage of a break by the ever impressive King to score his second try of the match.
