Today will be a big test and we will find out what our realistic chances of 1st Division rugby will be.


Oldham will not be taking us lightly and nothing less than total commitment will get us a result today.



ALLIANCE NOTES

This week for a change we see how the other side's press sees our performance. We reprint this report courtesy of Halifax Evening Courier.

Dons 'A' 16 v Halifax 'A' 0

HALIFAX failed to come to terms with the heavy conditions at Tattersfield and crashed out of the Alliance Cup at the second hurdle.

Having won six of their last eight games the Thrum Hallers were expected to dispose of the second division Dons and go into the third round draw but little went right for them.

After the recent heavy rain, which had already caused one postponement of the tie, the pitch had been heavily sanded between the 25 yard lines and resembled a set for desert song rather than a rugby field.

The two end areas consisted of ankle deep mud and with wind and rain driving across the pitch conditions were far from ideal.

Playing with the elements Doncaster set about their task with relish against the tentative visitors and were rewarded with a try after only 4 minutes.

Quick passing across the face of the Halifax posts saw Evans take a short pass to go over, Reeves converting. Halifax, at this stage were struggling to get out of their own half and they were not helped in their efforts by often loosing the hall before the 6th tackle.

After 20 minutes however they did briefly threaten when Henry Sharp broke through but he lacked support and was quickly closed down by the Doncaster defence.

Six minutes later another raid broke and Doncaster made a strong break from inside their own 25 and from the position gained inside the Halifax quarter they quickly swung the ball left and former Bradford Northern player Alex Green was on hand to go over by the posts. Reeves again converted to take the score to 12-0.

Halifax continued to be penned inside their own half but again Doncaster scored a long range try with Green slicing through from halfway.

Zelei failed with the conversion but Doncaster already had the game in the bag at 16-0 at half-time.

On the restart Halifax went onto the attack but hurried passes and dropped balls hampered their endeavours and, although the Doncaster 25 was under seige for 20 minutes only once did Fax get near to scoring. Andy Hancock hacked the ball over the line only for a Doncaster boot to kick the ball away as he dived to touch down.

The introduction of Neil James and Carl Grant gave Halifax some penetration for a while but it still failed to produce any points.







TODAY'S VISITOR'S OLDHAM R.L.F.C.

Todays we play hosts to the "Roughyeds" in the 5th Round of the Challenge Cup competition. Oldham were one of the original members of the Northern Union, becoming one of the games first successful clubs. In their first season they tied with Runcorn for the Lancashire section of the championship, following that up by becoming the first Lancashire club to win the Rugby League Challenge Cup with a 19-9 defeat of Hunslet in 1899.

Oldham continued to dominate those early days of Lancashire Cup football, winning the title on 4 occasions between 1907 and 1919, producing some outstanding players who became household names in the area. Jim Lomas and Joe Ferguson were two such players, Lomas joined Oldham from Salford after leading the first Great Britain tour side to Australia in 1910. Ferguson came to Oldham from Cumbria, going on to make a minimum of 634 appearances for the Club between 1899 and 1923. A goal-kicking forward of great repute who made 15 appearances for Lancashire before going on to represent Cumberland on 32 occasions over 17 years including their defeats of the first Kiwis in 1907 and the first Kangaroos in 1908. Ferguson again faced the Aussies in 1911

& 1921, also making 15 appearances in Major Finals for Oldham.

Oldham had become one of the most successful sides in those first thirty years, before going into a period of disappointments, with only a Lancashire Cup victory lifting the gloom in 1933-34, as they failed to reproduce the glory years between 1927-1954.

The middle and latter 1950's once again brought the good times to the Watersheddings, when for 5 years they were once again one of the top Lancashire sides, winning the Championship Final, the Lancashire Cup on three occasions and the Lancashire League twice.

The 1960's saw the break-up of this great side and since then the Oldham faithful have had only brief glimpses of the success they crave for. In 1963-64, 1981-82 and 1987-88 they landed the Second Division Championship. They have also won the Second Division Premiership Final on two occasions, the first being a memorable victory over Featherstone in 1987-88 and the second in 1989-90, when they once again produced a game to remember as they staged a tremendous fightback to defeat Hull KR 30-29.

Oldham have become one of Rugby League's yo-yo sides over the past 30 years being unable to find that air of consistency to remain in the top flight and this season on current form they appear to be heading back to the Second Division, having won only four matches out of their first twenty, so their task now is to turn things around in their remaining ten games.

Oldham's current coach is former Australian prop-forward Peter Tunks, who played for Souths and Canterbury in the Winfield Cup, also making 8 appearances for New South Wales in the State of Origin series. Tunks has also experienced English rugby league, starring for Leeds, Salford and Sheffield before taking over the coaching role at Oldham in April 1991. In the close season Tunks was one of the busiest coaches in the transfer market, with a vast amount of players making moves in and out of the Watersheddings. The reason for this was the need to reconstruct the squad to adapt with the different style and demands of the play in the First Division.

One of Tunks biggest signings is Australian test star Bob Lindner, who has joined Oldham on a two year contract. Lindner with 24 Aussie Caps, 24 State of Origin games and two tours behind him has brought a wealth of experience to the Oldham side and will be looking to help lead them forward and consolidate in the 1st Division.

Another big name signing is former Great Britain and Wigan star Andy Goodway, who returns to his first club Oldham after a disappointing spell with Leeds. Goodway was a product of the Redhill ARL Club, signing for Oldham in the late 1970's, before moving to Wigan in July 1985 after a stint with Manly. Goodway enjoyed alot of success at Wigan completing a domestic set of winners medals in the Wembley victory of 1988. Goodway has also made 23 appearances for Great Britain, making the 1984 tour squad as well as appearing for Yorkshire 4 times in the War of the Roses games.

Tunks has also recently added to his squad with the signature of Glen Liddiard, who replaces injured Kiwi prop Solomona, to fill the problem stand-off position.

Oldham are probably the unluckiest team out of the 15 who have never appeared at Wembley, having reached the penultimate stage six times without being able to realise their ambition. They almost made it in 1964 but after drawing 5-5 with Hull KR, they were winning 17-14 in extra time of the replay when bad light stopped play and they were beaten in the third replay.





DAVE EVANS

Three seasons ago a young player made his debut for Doncaster and was quickly signed by the coaching staff who spotted a player with tremendous potential. The player was Dave Evans, who has now established himself as a regular member of the Dons first team squad.

Evans began playing Rugby League at school when he was eight years old, progressing to play for Normanton A.R.L. Club whilst studying at Staffordshire University and Sheffield University. Evans has been playing student rugby league and has achieved more in a short space of time with the students than some professionals ever get to do. He has played for England Students and Great Britain Students, making the trip to Australia to appear in the 1992 World Cup competition.

Evans feels that he still has alot to learn in the game, but is happy with the way he is currently playing and with the way his career is progressing, hopefully leading to an appearance in the 1st Division, preferably with the Dons.



How mysterious it must seem to the uninitiated that a team can rightly be at the top, as Leeds are, or at the bottom as we are, when the very name of the competition is "Rugby League".

Surely – (a word I detest, but can think of no other to suit) – two divisions is the only answer. This has been tried, but because of opposition from some quarters, it was not allowed a fair run.

Anyone taking an unbiased view of the present League structure must agree that there is no valid reason for maintaining the League as it is now.

The only "excuse" that I can think of is that those in opposition, like the ostrich with its head in the sand, are not prepared to face facts. They like to be at the top at the expense of the "scrubbers" but they are afraid of real competition or frightened by the thoughts of relegation or worse still, of finishing bottom of the Second Division.

We at Doncaster are not, and we are not afraid to accept a challenge.

Some years ago, a tentative move was made to form a club at Sheffield. The time


was ripe last year to form a club at Barnsley. There are many towns in the North that could support a R.L. team, without ventures like Italy and Cardiff – provided they are given a lead.

But to be on a good hiding to nothing does not give them much encouragement, as they would be under the present system.



MEMORY LANE



TREVOR WARING

Twenty-one year old centre threequarter Trevor Waring joined us from Castleford last December and made his first team debut for us at Hunslet on Boxing Day.

Trevor learned his rugby with Castleford's Under-17 side and progressed into their Under-19 side where he gained many amateur honours.

He was chosen for Yorkshire Under-19's and was captain of the Castleford inter-town team for three seasons. Three Yorkshire amateur cup final winners medals also came his way.

He turned professional with the Wheldon Road club in 1963 and made eight first team appearances with them. Last season Trevor made 16 appearances with our first string, scoring three tries and two goals.

His performance, particularly on attack, earned him constant praise from Tattersfield supporters and they took an immediate liking to the 12st., 5ft. 9ins. back.

He opened his account for us with a goal in the game against Hull on December 27 and scored his first try in our colours at Featherstone on January 21.

FRANK SMITH

Centre three-quarter Frank Smith, was a close season signing from Castleford. He joined the Wheldon Road outfit after having a spell with Featherstone Rovers where he gained County honours.

It was while he was with Featherstone that he first came to the selectors notice. After several impressive games he was chosen for the Yorkshire side and later earned himself a place in a World Cup trial game.

Frank was a member of the Featherstone team that beat Hull 15-14 in the 1959 Yorkshire Cup final at Headingly. Although he did not score in the final he finished up by having 16 tries to his credit at the end of the season.


He eventually moved to Castleford where he continued to be a prolific try scorer. He wound up the 1963-64 season by scoring 20 tries.

A school teacher, Frank can play either centre or wing but the Dons think that he can be more beneficial in the centre. He weighs 14st. 10lb. and is 6ft. 3in. tall.
