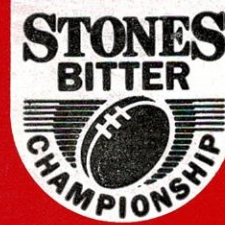

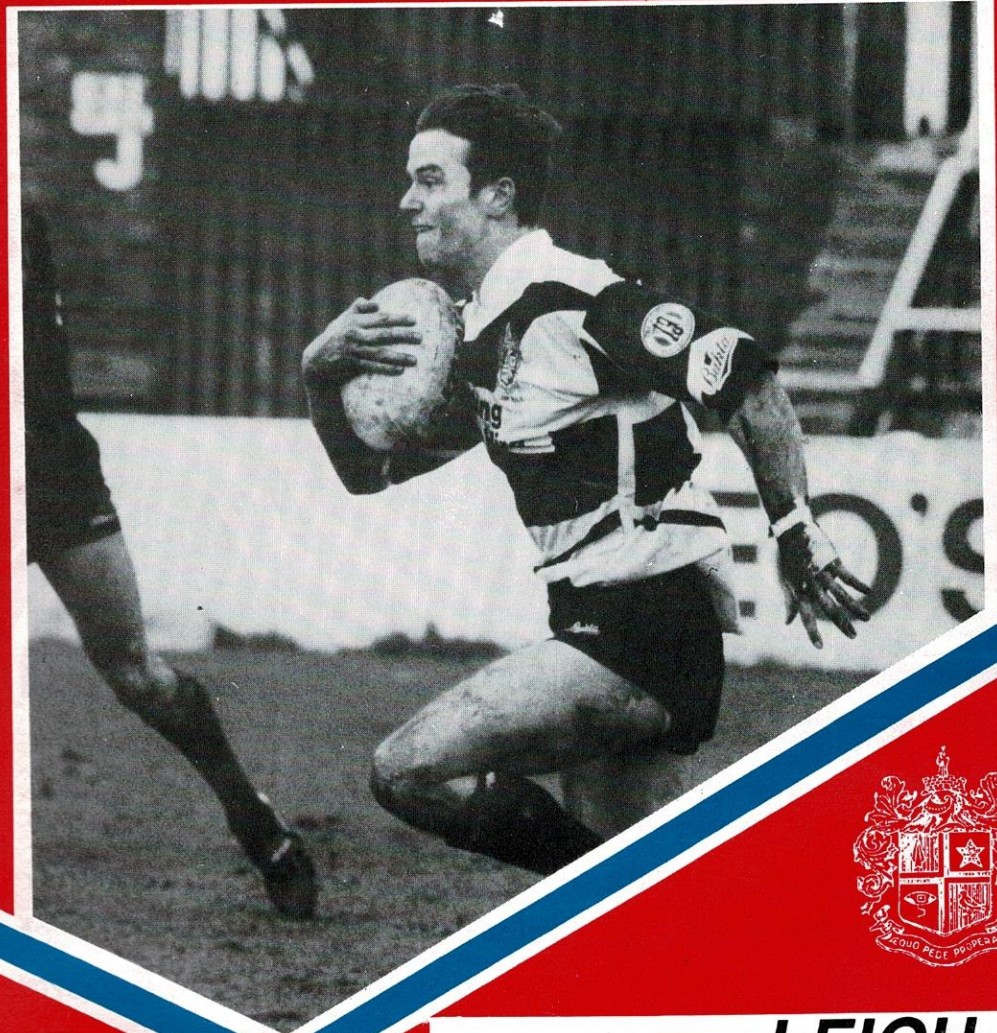

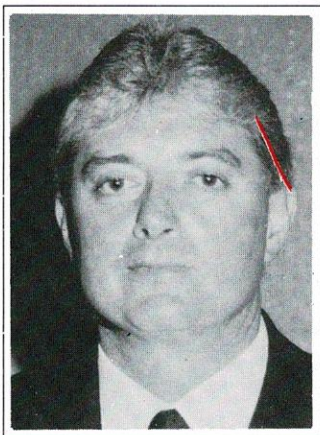
Today we welcome Oldham to Hilton Park for this First Division clash. The game should be an exciting match as the two clubs are not so far apart.

Talking of Hilton Park during this week we have received good news from Horwich R.M.I. that they are going ahead to try and buy the ground. If they are successful they would then lease the ground back to Leigh and we would then share the ground with them.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if we had ground security, not only would we attract players but it would be easier to get sponsorship. With a long lease there would be ground improvements on and off the pitch. Just knowing the ground belongs to Leigh would release the pressure.

Over the Easter period we played two games. On the Friday we travelled to Sheffield and the conditions were bad, the weather windy, raining and cold. The ground was in a very bad state with lots of sand spread over the ground and dirt used to fill the holes.

During this game we received more injuries than all season. Half way through the first half Scott Martin and David Webster had to be taken off with bad ligament strains in their ankles. Then we had Scott Aspinall bad shoulder, Andy Collier suspected broken hand, John Pendlebury and Dean Hanger twisted ankles, all these players had to stay on the field in 'pain' as we could not replace



them. These injuries didn't help our game but on the night Sheffield were far too good for us and must be one of the form teams of the competition. They are certainly the most improved team.

On Monday we played Salford at home and although the result went against us I know every player gave one hundred percent and that's all you can ask from anyone.

With seven new faces in the team the efforts from all the players was first rate. I thought they deserved better than to lose by on point.

TODAY'S OLDHAM OPPOSITION

OLDHAM are the visitors to Hilton Park this afternoon, and will be looking for the win to edge away from the foot of the table. The Roughyeds have had an eventful season, with changes in both playing personnel and coaching staff as the club bid to stabilize their position in the First Division. Oldham were promoted along with Featherstone Rovers last season, but have this far struggled to consolidate as successfully as the Post Office Road side. Oldham are now coached by Australian Test forward Bob Lindner, who replaced his compatriot Peter Tunks. Tunks left the Watersheddings outfit early this year after a shock cup exit at the hands of Second Division high fliers Doncaster. Tunks took charge in April 91 before leading them to promotion and a Premiership Final defeat in 1992.

Bob Lindner will be leading from the front today, as he attempts to steer his side to safety. The world class forward stunned Rugby League by joining Oldham, and in a season of turmoil, Lindner has continued to impress.

30 year old Nigel Heslop has been wearing the number one jersey in recent weeks, and his stability and pace have been a feature of his game since leaving Orrell Rugby Union in February last year. Ex St. Helens star Paul Jones has featured for Oldham on the wing this term, and the pace of the 25 year old Leigh born back has been an asset since joining the Roughyeds in 1992.

Paul Topping will need no introduction to Leigh fans. 'Toppo' joined Oldham on extended loan at the start of the season, and has proved valuable when asked to fit in anywhere by Bob Lindner. He has played in a variety of positions this season, and will no doubt be hoping for a big game against his former club. Classy centre Darren Abram has starred since leaving Rochdale Hornets last year, and the under-rated 26 year old has become a big favourite at Oldham. Former Swinton winger Scott Ranson was the hero on Good Friday as he scored a match winning try against Salford, and will hope that fine form continues today. Ranson ran in 12 tries last term from 24 starts.

Australian stand-off Glenn Liddiard has worked well with fellow half back Martin Crompton this season. 24 year old Crompton sensationally left Wigan this season, and has provided the Roughyeds with a much needed playmaker.

Ian Sherratt has featured at prop recently, and the 28 year old has served the club well since leaving Salford in November 1991. Sherratt scored 2 tries from 18 + 6 appearances last term. Fellow prop Bernie McDermott has impressed this season, and the former Waterhead ARL player has certainly taken his chance. Hooker John Clarke completes the front row.

Another former Swinton player is second rower Shane Tupaea. The 31 year old joined Oldham in 1991, and made 26 + 3 appearances last season.

31 year old second rower or loose forward Mike Kuiti left Rochdale for Oldham this season, and his tremendous all round ability has been an integral part of Oldham's play. Popular utility player Charlie McAllister rejoined Oldham this term after a stint with Sheffield Eagles with whom he played just one game last term. The barnstorming 31 year old always excites the Watersheddings faithful and his unpredictability makes him a dangerous attacker. Former Salford back Steve Kerry joined Oldham in October 1992, and was the Roughyeds top points scorer last term. Kerry scored 7 tries, 82 goals and 3 drop goals to give him 195 points from 24 appearances.

With an Easter Monday defeat against Castleford, Oldham will need no additional incentive to secure two vital points which could help to keep them in the First Division this afternoon.

Oldham's last visit to Hilton Park was for a Lancashire Cup second round tie in September 1992. Two tries by winger Scott Ranson and ten points from the boot of Tommy Martyn proved decisive as Oldham overcame the sending off of former Leigh favourite Mark Sheals. Richard Pachniuk and Sean Tyrer were Oldham's other try scorers in a 26-14 success.

John Costello scored two tries for Leigh and John Woods kicked 3 goals. Only Sean Fanning, Costello and John Pendlebury from the Leigh side which played that evening are likely to be in action this afternoon.

The last League meetings between the sides were in the 1991-92 season when Leigh won both home games, 20-4 and 23-12 and clinched promotion with a 15-14 success on Easter Monday. In the first of the four League games, played in an intense eight-team second division, Oldham won 46-19 at Watersheddings.

The teams last met in the first division in the 1986-87 season. Leigh won 40-12 at Hilton Park and then clinched a league double with a 54-12 success at Watersheddings. Former Oldham scrum-half Mike Ford scored two of Leigh's nine tries that afternoon.

Earlier this season Oldham ran out winners 42-6 with centre Darren Abram scoring four tries and former Leigh full-back Paul Topping kicking five goals. Ranson, Mike Uvih and Iyan Green (two) were the other Oldham try scorers.

Leigh's only reply was a Scott Martin try goaled by Troy Clarke in front of a 3,139 crowd.

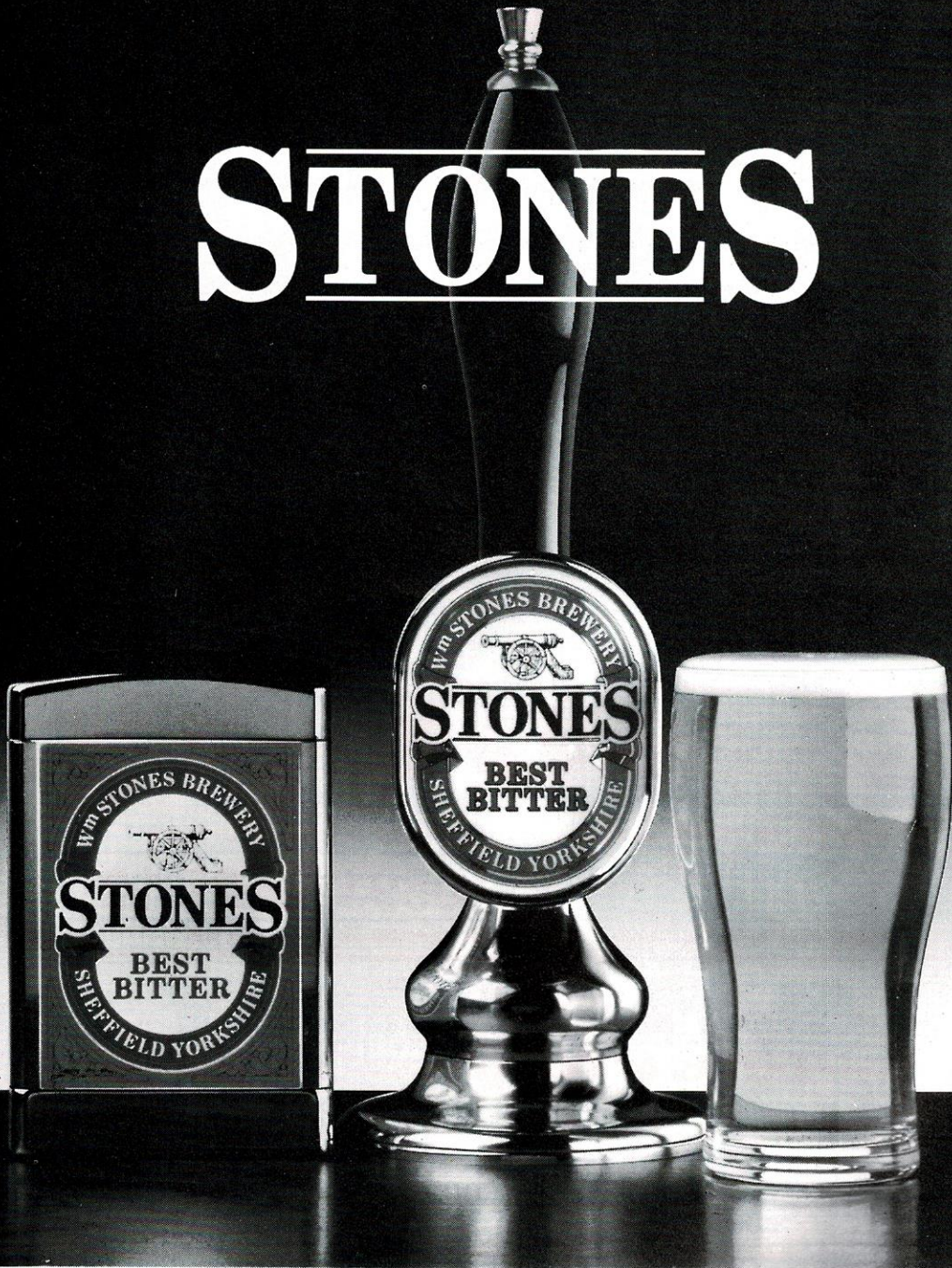

Centre Stage

Talented back row forward Simon Baldwin is already a seasoned campaigner. Just turned 19, he's already got over 40 first grade appearances under his belt since making his debut against Leeds in November 1992.

"My chance came earlier than I thought it would" admits Simon. "I'd begun last season in the Academy side and had played only a couple of Alliance games before being called up."

And what a sensational debut it was with Simon scoring what almost proved the match-winning try. "It was a grubber kick and I managed to get there first" he recalls "But Leeds scored a late try and got away with a 12-12 draw."

A regular try-scorer, Simon picks out an interception 60 metre score in the recent game with Halifax as the highlight so far. "I'd never run so far before" he laughs, "that was a good one, I really enjoyed that."

Despite Leigh's struggles, Simon together with GB Academy team mates Paul Rowley and Scott Martin has enjoyed the season. "We've all learned a lot from it" he says. "The best place to play is in the first division against all the top players."

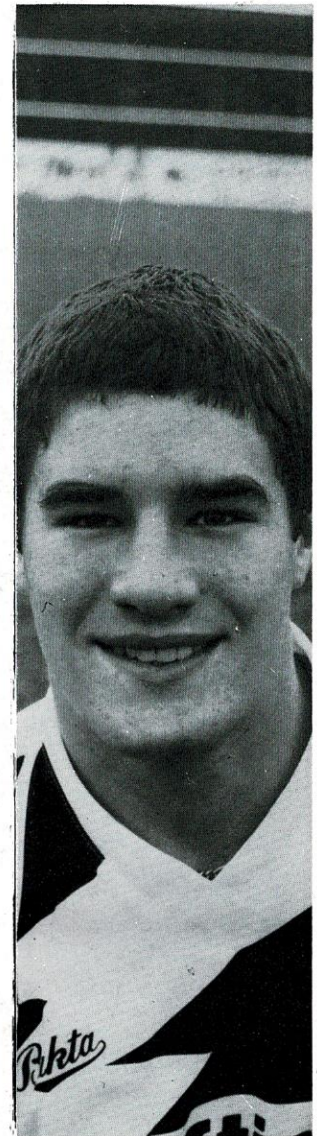
"What we could have done with is another couple of experienced players. John Pendlebury has been superb and has been a tremendous help to all the young lads but he's had a lot on his shoulders. Steve Simms has given all the youngsters a chance and he's a great coach to young players."

"We've got to do our best for the rest of the season, play our best and try to pick up some wins. No-one wants to go into the second division but hopefully if we all buckle down we'll come straight back."

Having come up through Leigh Rangers, Juniors and East Juniors set-ups, Simon is hoping for a place on the GB Academy Tour to Australia alongside lifelong pals Rowley and Martin.

"It would be great if we could all get selected" he says "and it's something to look forward to. The Academy set-up is really professional and it was great when we beat the Junior Kiwis at Wigan. The squad's been together for a couple of years now and there's a great spirit which hopefully we can carry on tour".

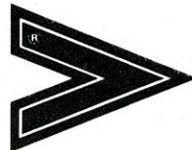

With only a few games remaining this season, its do-or-die for a clutch of clubs in today's Stones Bitter Championship.

One team still in with a shout of the titles destiny are Castleford who have enjoyed a successful first season under the leadership of John Joyner. The emergence of speedsters Simon Middleton and St. John Ellis have helped to finish of the Cas jigsaw, and they will be out to break the hearts of Bradford Northern at Odsal. Since losing to Leigh, Northern have struggled to maintain a grip on the title, and come into the game on the back of successive defeats against Halifax (27-18), and most surprisingly of all, Hull at Odsal (30-32). Castleford though, beat Oldham 28-10 at the Watersheddings, and will need a win to maintain an outside challenge.

Warrington's fading challenge will be exactly that if they slip up again at Featherstone Rovers. Wire, for so long ahead of the chasing pack, were defeated by Wigan 21-14 at Central Park, and with remaining fixtures against Castleford and Sheffield Eagles, will need the win today. Featherstone have enjoyed a relatively successful return to the First Division, and saw off relegation haunted Wakefield Trinity comfortably (42-22) last Monday. Hull K.R. and Wigan need two points today for very different reasons. The two clash at New Craven Park, and the Robins, still favourites for the drop, couldn't have a harder test than Championship chasing Wigan. The Riversiders picked up superb wins over Easter against St. Helens and Warrington, whilst the troubled Humberiders lost against Hull F.C. and Sheffield Eagles.

Form team of the moment must be Sheffield Eagles. The Don Valley side have had a great start to 1994, and a historic win over Wigan highlighted the strength now within the Steel City. Today, Eagles have a tough test at Headingley where Challenge Cup finalists Leeds will be hoping for the sort of form which disposed of Halifax on Easter Monday. Sheffield won 30-28 at New Craven Park against Hull K.R., following on from a 48-4 victory against Leigh on Good Friday.

St. Helens' Premiership ambitions will be tested by Hull F.C. at Knowsley Road. Saints crashed twice against Wigan and Widnes over Easter, but Hull picked up four points following a derby win over Hull K.R. and a stunning 32-30 win over Bradford at Odsal which blew the Championship wide open yet again.

Another side haunted by relegation are Wakefield Trinity, who face Salford - a side still not sure of First Division football next season. Trinity were soundly beaten 42-22 by Featherstone at Post Office Road last Monday, and Salford edged home against Leigh winning 19-18 at Hilton Park.

Widnes reaffirmed their Premiership aspirations with a 20-17 victory over St. Helens on Monday, and face another top eight side in Halifax at Naughton Park. Fax though surrendered a commanding lead at Headingley last week, losing 26-16 to Leeds. It will be a case of master versus pupil as Phil Larder's side clash with Mal Reilly's team, and an absorbing game is promised.

In the Second Division, Batley host Hunslet, Rochdale visit Carlisle and table topping Doncaster guest Dewsbury. Promotion chasing Workington meet lowly Highfield at Houghton Road whilst Alex Murphy's faltering Huddersfield entertain Ryedale York. Bramley brave Cougar Park, Keighley, as the Crusaders of London battle the Lions of Swinton. Whitehaven beat local opposition in Carlisle last week (46-4), and again meet Cumbrians at the Recreation Ground - this time Dennis Ramsdale's Barrow, who lost 26-14 against the other Cumbrian team Workington at Craven Park on Easter Monday.

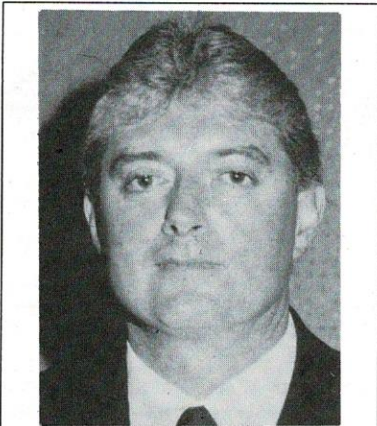

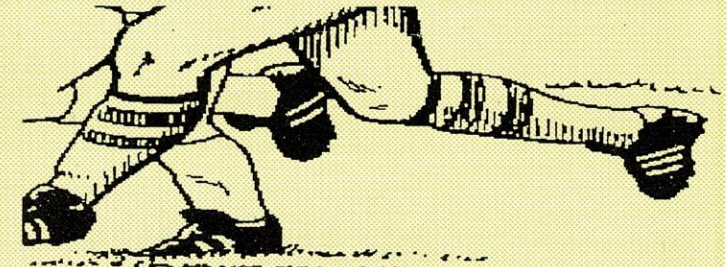

It was heartbreak time again for Leigh's young side as Salford undeservedly pinched a win which should guarantee their first division survival. Hooker Mark Lee's drop-goal just four minutes from time separated the sides after a scrappy game ruined by a strong wind.

Jack compounded his error by knocking on close to his own line in Leigh's next attack but the home side failed to take advantage of possession from the resulting scrum.

Inexperience proved Leigh's undoing in a tight finish and Salford staged a late revival, Lee saving his coaches blushes with his winning kick. Daniel, Mark Meadows and Paul Rowley all enjoyed superb games in a battling team display which saw Leigh boss things for long spells and then again fall to a sucker punch.

It all helped atone for a disastrous Good Friday trip to Sheffield where the Big League's current in-form side ruthlessly exploited an injury-hit Leigh side with nine slick tries.

With Daryl Powell in superb form at stand-off and centres David Fraisse and Richard Price providing the cutting edge to some flowing attacks, Eagles' superb team-work and organisation helped overcome the dreadful weather and a treacherous sanded, rutted pitch.

John Pendlebury, Dave Webster, Scott Martin, Dean Hanger, Scott Aspinall and Andy Collier were all injured in a one-sided contest with Baldwin providing a rare moment of joy for the loyal Leigh following with a slick try in the corner after fine work by Pendlebury and Collier.

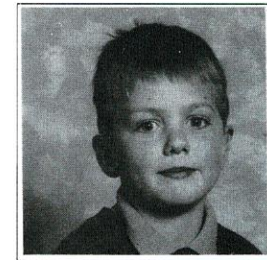
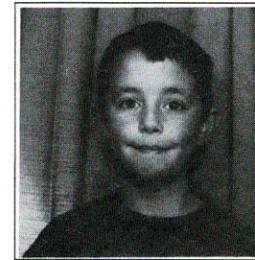

Lifeline for one North West Football Club

Lifeline for one North West Rugby League Club

A dramatic rescue package that guarantees the future of Leigh Rugby League Club for at least fifty years was hailed a marvellous lifeline when it was approved by the Trustees. The scheme is to be explained on Wednesday evening at 8p.m., 6th April to shareholders, supporters and contributors to the fund.

The package also gives a welcome boost to neighbouring Northern Premier League Soccer Club Horwich R.M.I. which will move from its present Grundy Hill ground to share its facilities at Leigh's Hilton Park. The innovative deal which will effectively secure the future of the two clubs who are steeped in the North West sporting traditions will mean that Grundy Hill Estates Ltd. owners of the Horwich ground will sell Grundy Hill to house building company Fairclough Homes North West and buy Hilton Park from the proceeds.

Leigh whose Hilton Park ground has been in administrative receivership for three years and was expected to be sold for development this summer will have a fifty years lease on Hilton Park. The move up the road to Hilton Park will enable Horwich to retain Northern Premier League status. The steeply sloping Grundy Hill would have meant their expulsion after 1996.

A formal offer for Hilton Park has been made to the administrative receivers agents although details of the development proposals will have to be approved by Councils of Bolton and Wigan it is expected that they will be sympathetic to the maintenance and development of Sporting facilities in the region and lend their support to the two sporting clubs.

Says Mick Higgins, Chairman Leigh R.L.C. "I have only ever wanted the best for the Club and I am convinced this is it. Everyone is delighted that the Club has a grasp of this marvellous lifeline and I am confident that elected representatives will be only too anxious to do everything they can to help preserve the two clubs who now face a much brighter future.

Mr. Steven Parkinson, Managing Director of Fairclough Homes North West said that if the package was approved both Clubs and their supporters would look forward to happier times. Perhaps this will be the turning point in their fortunes and lead to much needed success. I certainly hope so, he added.

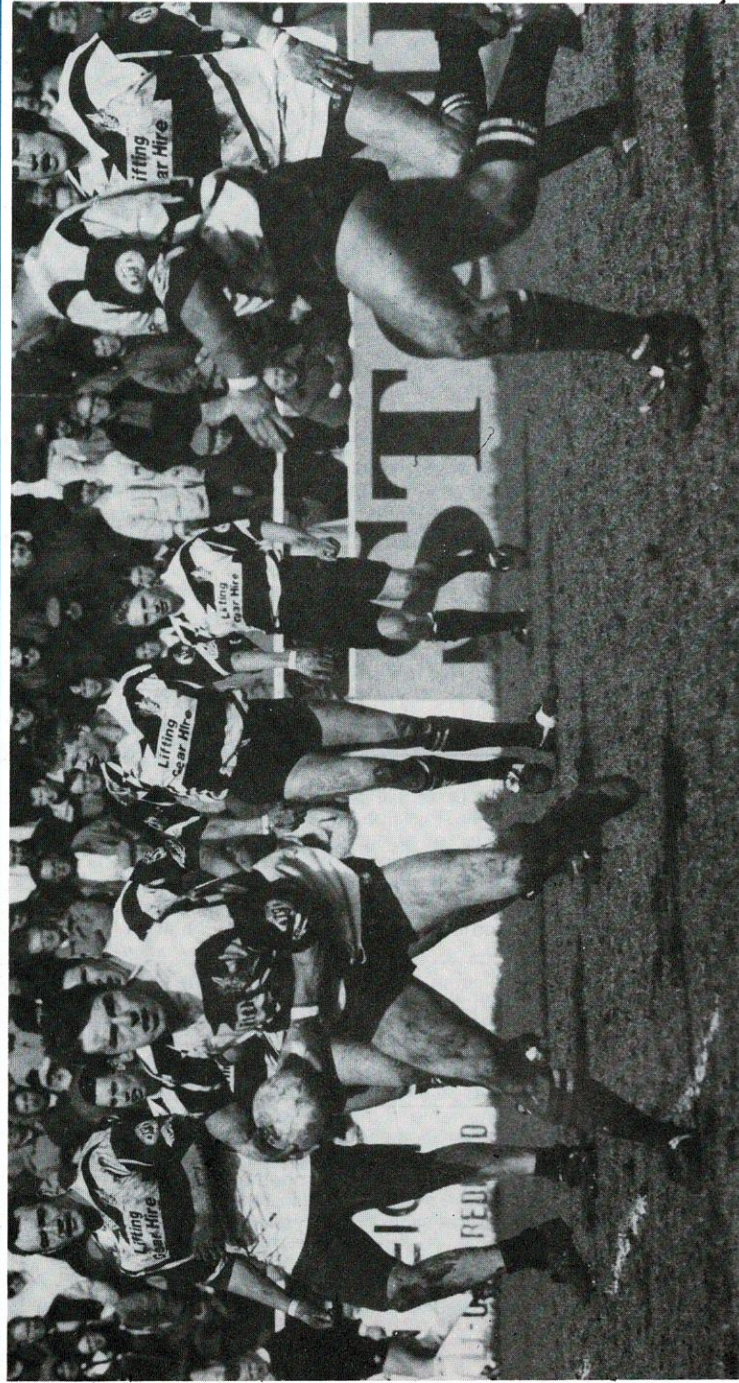
