SEAN DEVINE

A 23 year old scrum-half, whom former Oldham boss Peter Tunks also recruited in an exchange. This time it was with St. Helens, Oldham receiving £50,000, Devine and backrow forward Paul Jones for Great Britain under 21 forward Chris Joynt.

HUGH GUMBS

A young winger from Yorkshire, who signed for Bradford Northern when David Hobbs was boss, Had a spell with Batley and then signed for Oldham as a free agent in the summer of 1992. Went to Australia that summer in the students World Cup.

PAUL JONES

At 6ft 3ins and 17 stone, Leigh based Jones had more than 60 senior appearances for St. Helens behind him, albeit many of them as a substitute, when he signed for Oldham with Sean Divine in the Chris Joynt deal.

BEN OLSEN

This Danish born forward made a name for himself with London Crusaders and signed for Oldham in the famous swop-shop summer of 1992 with winger Richard Blackman, a Londoner returning "home" to join the Crusaders at Crystal Palace.

TINY SOLOMONA

A Kiwi of Western Samoan origin, "Tiny" signed for Oldham in early 1992 from Widnes, but did not make his debut until the start of the season because of groin trouble. Has had two groin operations since the turn of the year but is playing at the top of his form now and won the man of the match award in Oldham's first round Lancashire Cup win against First Division club. DAVID BRADBURY

Signed from Leigh Miners after touring New Zealand with the BARLA under 19 squad. David is a strong running loose-forward, who impressed on Oldham's pre-season

SCOTT RANSON

Twenty four year old St. Helens player and the top try scorer from his former club, Swinton. Signed for Oldham in March 1992.

SHANE TUPAEA

Ex New Zealand player. Signed for Swinton then Rochdale. A hard tackling defensive second row for-

IAN SHERRATT

Former Oldham and Lancashire schoolboy. Left Oldham for Salford and returned season 1991/92. A hard grafting prop-forward

BARRIE McDERMOTT

Strong and powerful despite his 21 years, local boy Barrie is yet another member of the BARLA squad to throw in his lot with Oldham. He is a dedicated young professional and has quickly made enough impression to earn a place on the bench in Oldham's last seasons matches.

NIGEL HESLOP

Former England R.U. winger who won 10 caps for his country. Signed for Oldham from Orrell R.U. club in February 1993 after losing his place in England's Five Nations Cup squad

Represented England in the World Cup 1991 and was a member of two Grand Slam winning squads.

STEVE KERRY

Former Preston Grass Hoppers R.U. half-back, turned professional for Salford for whom he was a prolific goal scorer and he topped the R.L. points scoring list in 1990/91 when Salford won the Second Division Championship with 427 points.

Can play equally well at stand-off or scrum-half and was long admired by former Oldham coach, Peter Tunks, before he finally got his man in September 1992.

DARREN ABRAM

First professional club was Warrington and then moved to Trafford Borough from where he joined Rochdale in 1991

A product of Oldham's early youth policy. Earned a reputation at Rochdale as a prolific try scorer and when listed was sought by several clubs including Salford, Featherstone and Wakefield before joining Oldham in February 1993.

MIKE KUITI

A New Zealand International of great repute.

Played in Great Britain and France with the New Zealand tourists in 1989. Selected for the Test team eight times, playing Great Britain, France and New Guinea, but not Australia. A strong loose forward or second rower, at the pinnacle of his career. Has played for Rochdale, Swinton, Leeds and Rochdale again.

Has a good eye for making and taking scoring opportunities. **DAVID JONES**

A strong finishing winger signed from Wakefield. A Wigan born St Pat's player and as an amateur gained county and international honours. Can quickly establish himself as a firm favourite at Oldham if he continues in his current form.

ANDY GOODWAY

A product of Oldhams early

running and tackling in Oldham's first team in his teens. Chased for some time by Wigan and was finally transferred for a large fee. Soon recompensed Wigan and became an England international. Still capable of filling a first team place and is to assist in coaching the "A" team.

KNOWSLEY ROAD PEOPLE

Kangaroo Capers-Saints' Style!

Over the years Saints have often performed with great distinction against Australian touring sides, with their tally of eight wins, one draw and ten defeats since the first meeting in 1908 comparing favourably with that of other clubs. The complete record, with Saints score first, reads: 1908 9-0, 1910 5-16, 1921 8-16, 1929 18-18, 1933 11-20, 1948 10-8, 1952 26-8. 1956 44-2, 1959 2-15, 1960 15-12, 1963 2-8, 1967 8-4, 1970 37-10, 1972 9-24, 1973 11-7, 1978 4-26, 1982 0-32, 1986 8-32, 1990 4-34.

In addition a combined Saints-Recs team were defeated 15-7 by the Aussies at Knowslev Road in 1937. with North Road based school 'lollipop man' Ernie Large being one of the few survivors of the local squad. That points bonanza of 1956 is the obvious highpoint of Saints' stirring deeds against the mighty Kangaroos, with the touchdowns coming from Steve Llewellyn (2), John Dickinson, Austin Rhodes and every member of the pack, namely Alan Prescott, Frank McCabe, Ab Terry, Nat Silcock, Josh Gaskell and Vint Karalius.

Teenager Rhodes also kicked ten goals, with the Knowsley Road lineup reading: Moses, Llewellyn, Greenall, Finnan, Carlton, Dickinson, Rhodes, Prescott, McCabe, Terry, Silcock, Gaskell, Karalius.

Sadly I have been unable to unearth a photograph of the high-flying side whose feats packed the terraces in a momentous year when Saints first won the Challenge Cup, a time when Knowsley Road on-field affairs were fashioned by legendary coach Jim

Sullivan.

Still strolling down Memory Lane I did manage to chance upon the accompanying pictorial pearl of the Saints' team which faced Australia on September 28 1963, and battled magnificently before losing 8-2, with the home points coming via a penalty goal from Kel Coslett.

Obviously fully psyched up for the showdown with the Kangaroos, the Saint's line-up reads, back row, left to right: Kel Coslett, Keith Northey, Ken Williams, Mick Mooney, Geoff Heaton, Tom Van Vollenhoven, Peter Harvey. Front: Cliff Watson, John Tembey, Bob Dagnall, Dick Huddart, Ray French, Keith Ashcroft.

Remarkably, given the 30 year time scale, seven of the team - ie Coslett, Northey, Williams, Heaton, Harvey, Dagnall and French - still live within the Saintly borough, and it is indeed an interesting exercise to pen a reflective word or two on each and everyone of them.

Pride-of-place must go to Welshman Coslett, who took the professional ticket as a full back from Aberavon in 1962, and went on to make 530 appearances for Saints, in which he kicked 1,639 goals, including 214 in 1971-72 to finish with 452 points, all of which are club records.

Additionally goal king Kel skippered Saints to Wembley success from the loose-forward position against Leeds in 1972 when he won the Lance Todd Trophy and again versus Widnes in the 'Dad's Army' final of 1976 when he demonstrated his versatility by donning the No. 10 shirt

Coslett's fellow countryman Williams had many rousing games in the centre after coming to Knowsley Road from Cardiff, where he was a member of a famous rugby playing family which included his Welsh international threequarter brother Bleddyn.

Nowadays a media mogul, second row forward French was a native of deepest Parr who put pen to paper for Saints in 1961 from St. Helens Rugby Union club from where he gained England selection, and Ray is now a master at Cowley School. Utility backs Northey and Harvey

also cut their oval ball teeth in the 15-a-side code at West Park Grammar School, where both Blackbrook boy Keith and Holy Cross lad Peter graduated to schoolboy representative level before making their Rugby League bantism

Pocket battleship scrum-half Heaton earned two Challenge Cup winner's medals with Saints, first against Leeds in 1972 and then, such was Geoff's loyalty, versus Widnes in 1976, thirteen years after this picture was taken.

Thatto Heath born Dagnall found his way to Knowsley Road via Rochdale Hornets, where he operated in tandem with his inseparable chum and half-back Johnny Fishwick, and the dynamic duo are still very much involved in local building and 13-a-side matters.

Last but most certainly not least comes the incomparable Van Vollenhoven, a South African born wingman whose name is etched indelibly in Knowsley Road folklore following a career spanning more than a decade, in which he notched a record-breaking 392 tries for Saints from all points of the compass.

Tom is now playing a leading role in establishing the Rugby League game in his native land, and always puts out the welcome mat for Saints' stalwarts who might drop in, as Ray French, John Murphy, David Innes, Roy Knowles and Uncle Tom Cobley and all will readily testify.




Today sees the Saints last home game of the season. The two remaining away games are at Bradford Northern and Halifax. The game at Thrum Hall has no bear-

Remember when Leeds called off the Sky TV match here at Knowsley Road because they had Schofield in the Great Britain Test team in France? They also had four players selected for the Great Britain Academy team against the French Academy, Saints also had Chris Joynt in the Test team and John McAttee in the Great Britain Academy

The televised match was due to be played the week before the Saints-Leeds Challenge Cup semi-final. Leeds called for a postponement and then afterwards, quite cynically in the opinion of some, withdrew Holroyd and Cummins from the Academy

Saints' lost the £20,000 televised fee and an attractive gate when interest was at fever

pitch. Sponsors were very unhappy too! leeds made amends in the re-arranged game by blatantly fielding an entire reserve side on Wednesday last. The knock-on effect on the Saints' was that the gate was several thousand down on the usual Leeds fixture. Thousands of supporters stayed away while hundreds demonstrated outside and refused to enter the ground. Very few Leeds fans attended.
