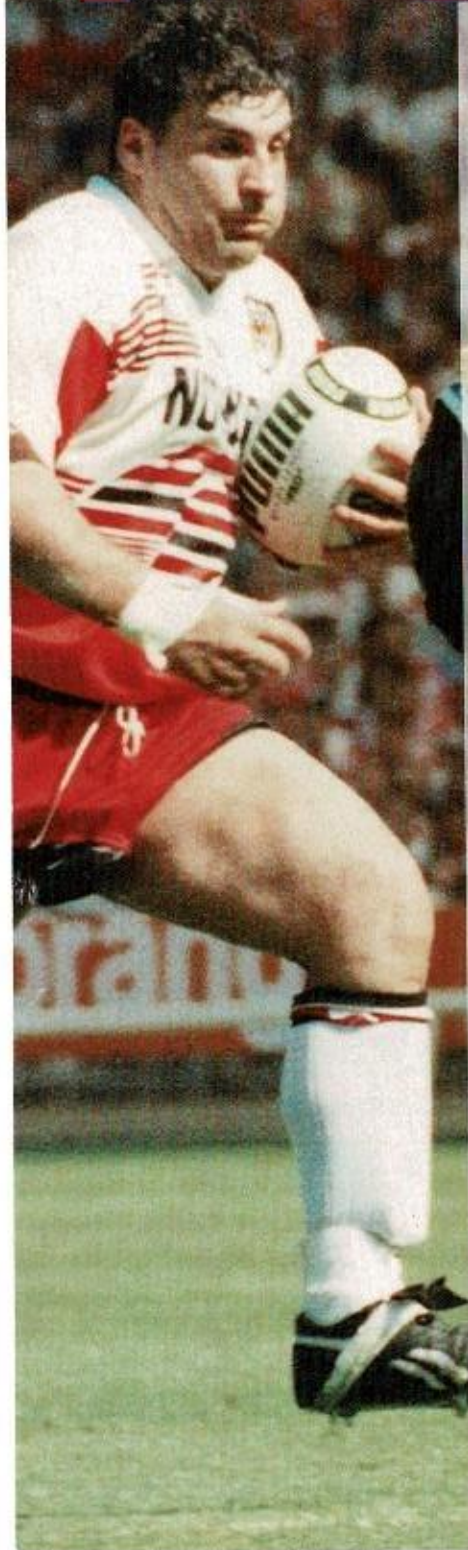


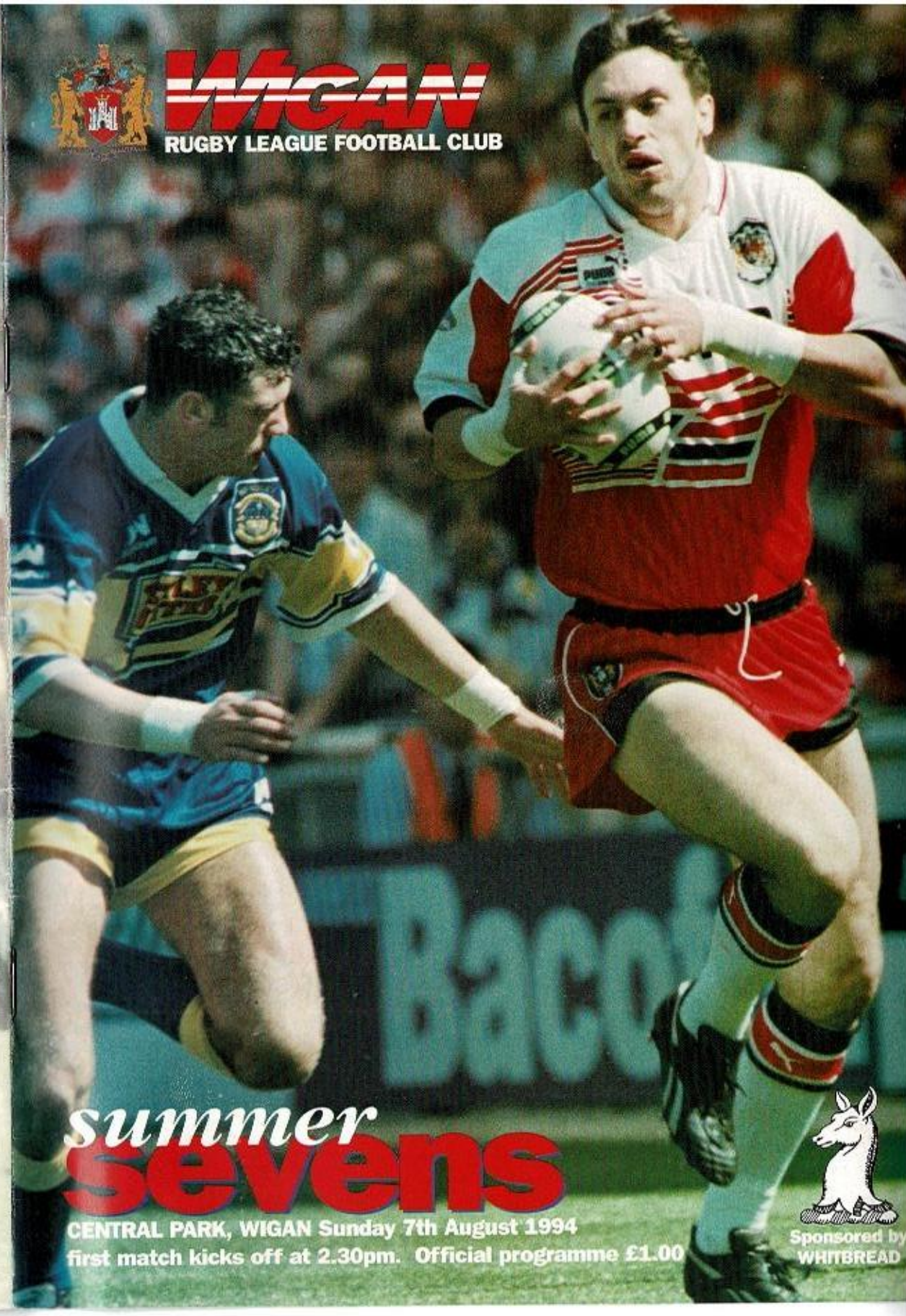

Welcome to Central park

Chris Wilson looks at seven a side Rugby League

Central Park opens its doors to the 1994-95 season by hosting the annual Wigan Summer Sevens. The season before us is the most fascinating for some time with the highlight being the visit of the Kangaroos in October. The big question is whether Great Britain can wrest the Ashes from the Australians this time. Having won one Test in each of the past three Ashes series, all fans in this country will be hoping that Mal Reilly's men can go one better and claim a richly deserved triumph. Domestically, Wigan will begin as favourites for everything again but, after winning the title on points difference only during the last two seasons, will face even tougher opposition this time. St. Helens, Warrington, Castleford and Leeds will all entertain dreams of Championship glory in April but only the most consistent will prevail.

Sevens football is not a new thing. The competition here at Wigan was first played in 1923, again in 1949 and became a regular feature of the calendar in 1959. The competition was suspended in 1972 due to problems with sponsorship and television but since then, healthy crowds have seen fast, open football with plenty of flashy handling and running. This type of football is enjoyed all over the world and not least in Australia where capacity crowds gather at the Sydney Football Stadium to enjoy three days of competition in the World Sevens held each February. Wigan were great ambassadors for the British game when they accepted (albeit with a clamour of annoyance from other clubs) an invitation to compete in 1992 and duly carried

off the title. The following year both Wigan and Wales were pulled out at the last minute as Britain failed to go to what was swiftly becoming a world party. The 1992 competition had seen teams from France, Russia, America, Fiji, Papua New Guinea and New Zealand take part. In 1993, those countries again sent representatives and were joined by South Africa and Western Samoa. The media was disappointed by the lack of British involvement as it reflected badly on the game over here. A Great Britain side was cobbled together despite the complaints of clubs asked to contribute players and competed well in the 1994 Tournament, winning the Plate competition. Tonga and Japan also competed for the first time with the Japanese going down to Great Britain on the final day of competition. One thing is clear and that is that the RFL ought to get behind the event. Without it, the game would lose a heaven-sent opportunity for countries to compete on a relatively even footing and get a taste for the game. Arguably, without the Australian RL's initiative in opening the Sevens up to the world in 1992, the 1995 World Cup would not be able to boast the attractions of Fiji, Tonga, South Africa and Western Samoa. It seems that the 1995 tournament will be seeing a British presence but no plans as to how the squad will be selected have been announced. A method put forward by John Monie in 1993 to select 10 clubs at the beginning of the season from which one player would be taken to make up a British squad seems to be a fair one and, given enough warning,

only the most churlish of club Directors could complain. Sevens is not the only truncated form of rugby league ever tried. In 1928, Eastern Suburbs and South Sydney played a nine-a-side exhibition game at the Sydney Showground. Despite critical acclaim, the experiment was not repeated. In more recent times, the RFL put together a nine-a-side tournament with sponsorship by British Coal for the 1987-88 season. Featuring the top six sides from the previous season's Championship table and the touring Papua New Guinea and Auckland sides, the competition was covered by BBC TV's Sportsnight programme and drew a crowd of 6,529. The programme notes make interesting reading. British Coal's Director of Sales is quoted as saying "Rugby League is an exciting, robust sport with a healthy future - and that reflects the prospects for the British Coal industry." There is little that needs to be added about the 'future' of the coal industry but suffice it to say that the Nines tournament was quietly dropped after the 1988-89 season. This afternoon's entertainment features eight squads competing for the major prize as well as the Academy Challenge between Wigan and Leeds and the Ackers trophy contested between two local schools. Leeds have been invited to nearly all of the Wigan Summer Sevens over the years, winning the trophy on three occasions. They nearly made it four last year as Paul Cook collected his sixth try of the tournament in the final seconds. From the restart, Wigan's man of the tournament Barrie-Jon Mather crossed for his sixth try to tie the scores. Botica's conversion sealed the win. Yorkshire are again well represented

with teams from Hunslet, Dewsbury and Wakefield as well as Leeds while Oldham and Salford join Wigan with the Red Rose challenge. The London Broncos are a welcome addition and make their debut in the competition. Sevens football provides the players with a chance to run with the ball in a relaxed yet competitive atmosphere. New signings can make their bow with little pressure and plenty of opportunity to shine. Wigan could field Wright and Tuigamala in their squad. Both have a bit to prove this season. Inga did well in his limited opportunities last year but 1994-95 will be the acid test. Nigel Wright was hit by injuries and was never able to show why Wigan snapped him up from Wakefield. Given a free run, he will be a great asset this year. Robinson, Botica and some of the young guns are likely to make up the home squad. Leeds can call on Cook, Scales, Tait and Holroyd from last year's squad and will be challenging once again for the trophy. Despite continuing to lose their young talent to other clubs, Trinity are likely to have a young squad bolstered by the experience of Andy Mason and Gary Christie while the Red Devils of Salford could boast Sam Panapa, Jason Critchley and Scott Naylor. David Jones, Wally Gibson and Nigel Heslop could reappear this year for Oldham. Hunslet, Dewsbury and London are representing the Second Division this afternoon but in this type of football, the distinction between the divisions is not as marked as in the full scale version. There should be tries aplenty this afternoon and enough fast, running football to whet the appetite for the coming campaign. So sit back, relax and enjoy the spectacle!

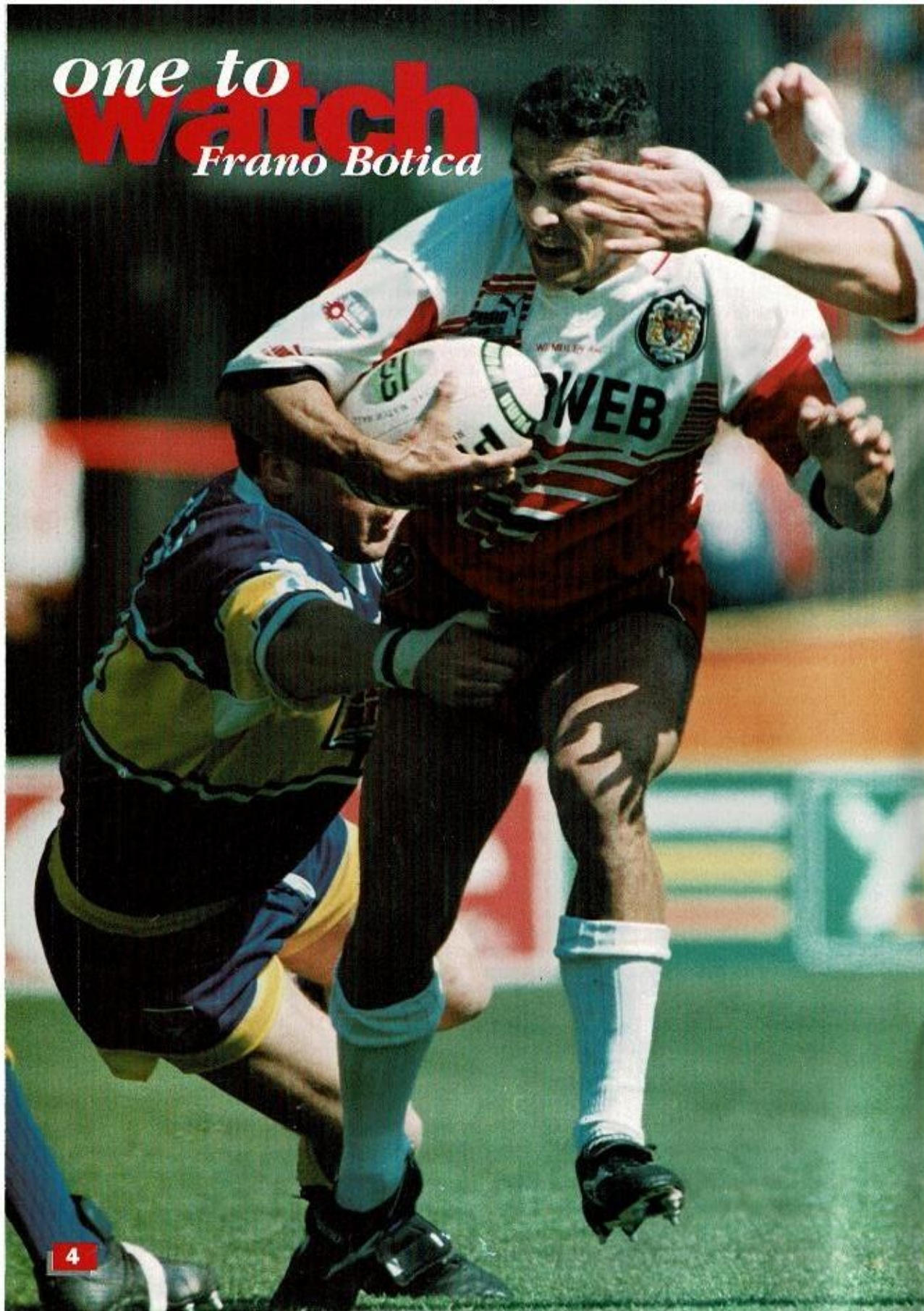

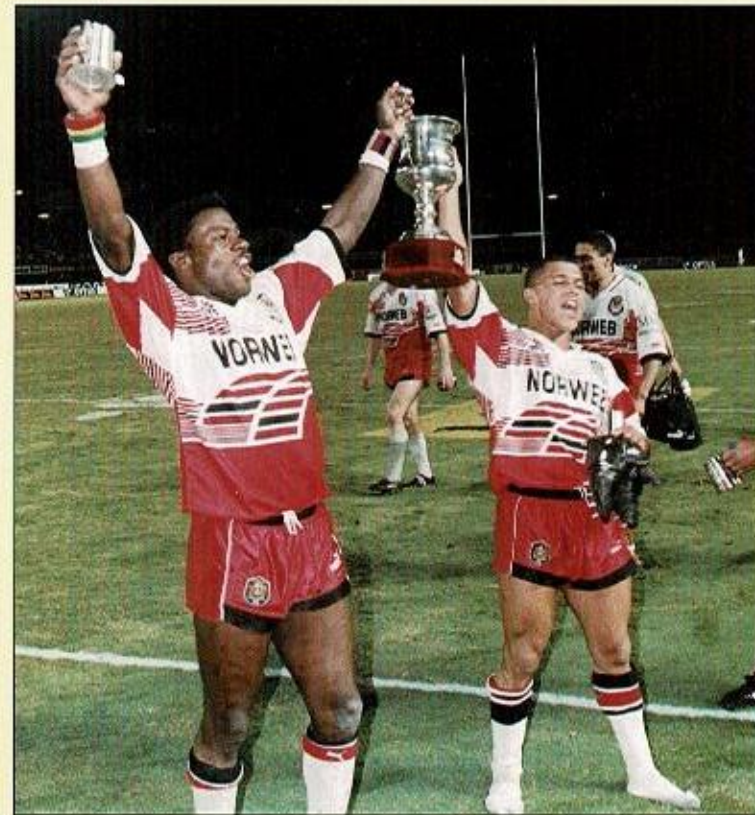
on the grapevine

Alliance update

Before moving up to the first team coaching position Graeme West led the Alliance side through a transitional season which was very successful considering the amount of exceptionally young players introduced to the team. Second place in the Youngers' Alliance Division One was an extremely creditable position, with highlights in the league campaign being a 42-12 win at The Boulevard, a 27-21 victory at St. Helens, and an 18-6 late season win at Castleford when fielding a very inexperienced side, plus a "double" over eventual Championship winners Warrington. Despite a gallant effort in the Youngers' Alliance Challenge Cup they went out of the competition at Featherstone, beaten in somewhat

controversial circumstances by a much bigger and more powerful home outfit.

Darren Williams finished top of the tries with 27, whilst Andy Craig scored most points with 182 from 67 goals and 12 tries. Andy Johnson appeared in all 31 games, with Craig Murdock playing in 30 and Simon Haughton in 29. Once again the majority of matches took place on Friday nights, with notable exceptions being made when the first team fixtures were scheduled for Sky transmission.

When the Supporters' Association made their selection of the 1993-94 Alliance Player of the Year it was impossible to differentiate between Andy Craig and Simon Haughton, so for the first time ever the award was

shared, with each player receiving a trophy from the Association and a watch from the sponsors, Goldsmiths' Jewellers of Market Place.

The new season's Alliance fixtures begin on Friday 19th August with a home game against Featherstone, and after six marvellous years Graeme West hands over the reigns to new coach John Pendlebury, who now has the job of developing the young talent at Central Park and bringing them through to first team rugby, just as Westy did with such players as Phil Clarke, Jason Robinson, Denis Betts, Andy Farrell, Mick Cassidy, Barrie-Jon Mather, Paul Atcheson, Ian Gildart and Bobby Goulding.

the **rules** *of the Whitbread Sevens*

1. Games shall be played under the laws of the Rugby Football League EXCEPT:-
 - a) At a kick off following a score, the ball need not travel ten yards forward.
 - b) The three tackle rule shall apply.
2. Each side shall consist of seven players and one substitute. Unlimited substitution is permitted, at the touch line, with the consent of the touch judge.
3. The duration of each game before the final will be seven and a half minutes each way with one minute interval. If the scores are level at full time, the teams shall change over and continue playing and the next score shall decide the winning team. Ends will be changed every seven and a half minutes if necessary and there will be no interval during extra time. The final tie will be played for ten minutes each way. If the scores are level at full time, similar arrangements to those for previous rounds shall apply, with ends being changed every ten minutes if necessary.
4.
 - a) Time is checked by independent time keepers and the "Klaxon" will sound at the end of each period, regardless of the state of play. Should a player be in the act of scoring a try, but not effecting the touchdown before the "Klaxon", this score is outside the time limit and is invalid.
 - b) Injury time, as indicated by the referee will be allowed.
 - c) A penalty awarded within the "Klaxon" time shall be permitted, to completion, but only if an attempt to kick a penalty goal is elected.
 - d) An attempt to convert a try scored within "Klaxon" time shall be permitted. The time keepers will cater for these situations before ending each session.
5. Rugby Football League disciplinary arrangements apply EXCEPT:-
 - a) The "Sin-Bin" rule shall not be implemented.
 - b) A dismissed player will result in the offending team fielding only six players and one substitute for the remainder of the competition.

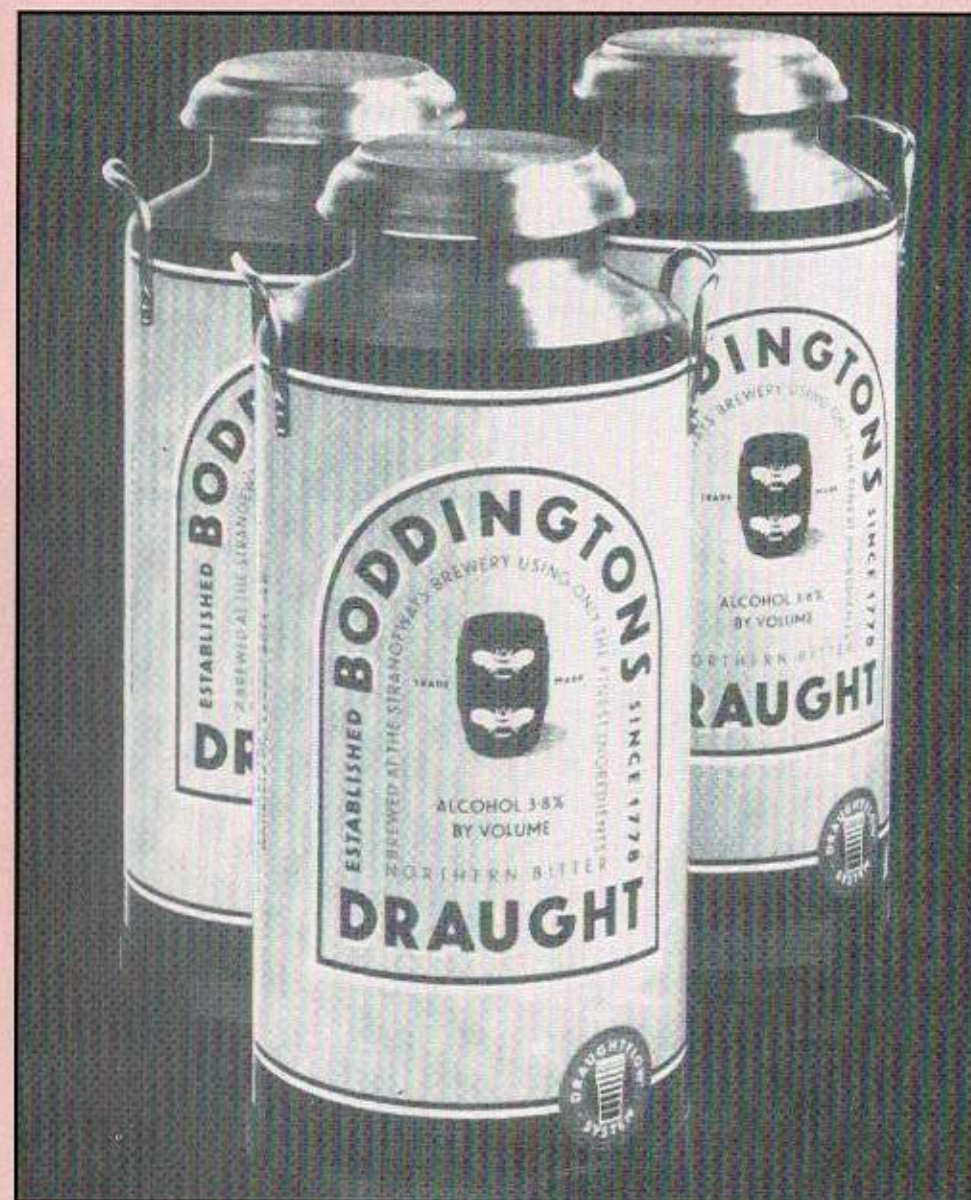
