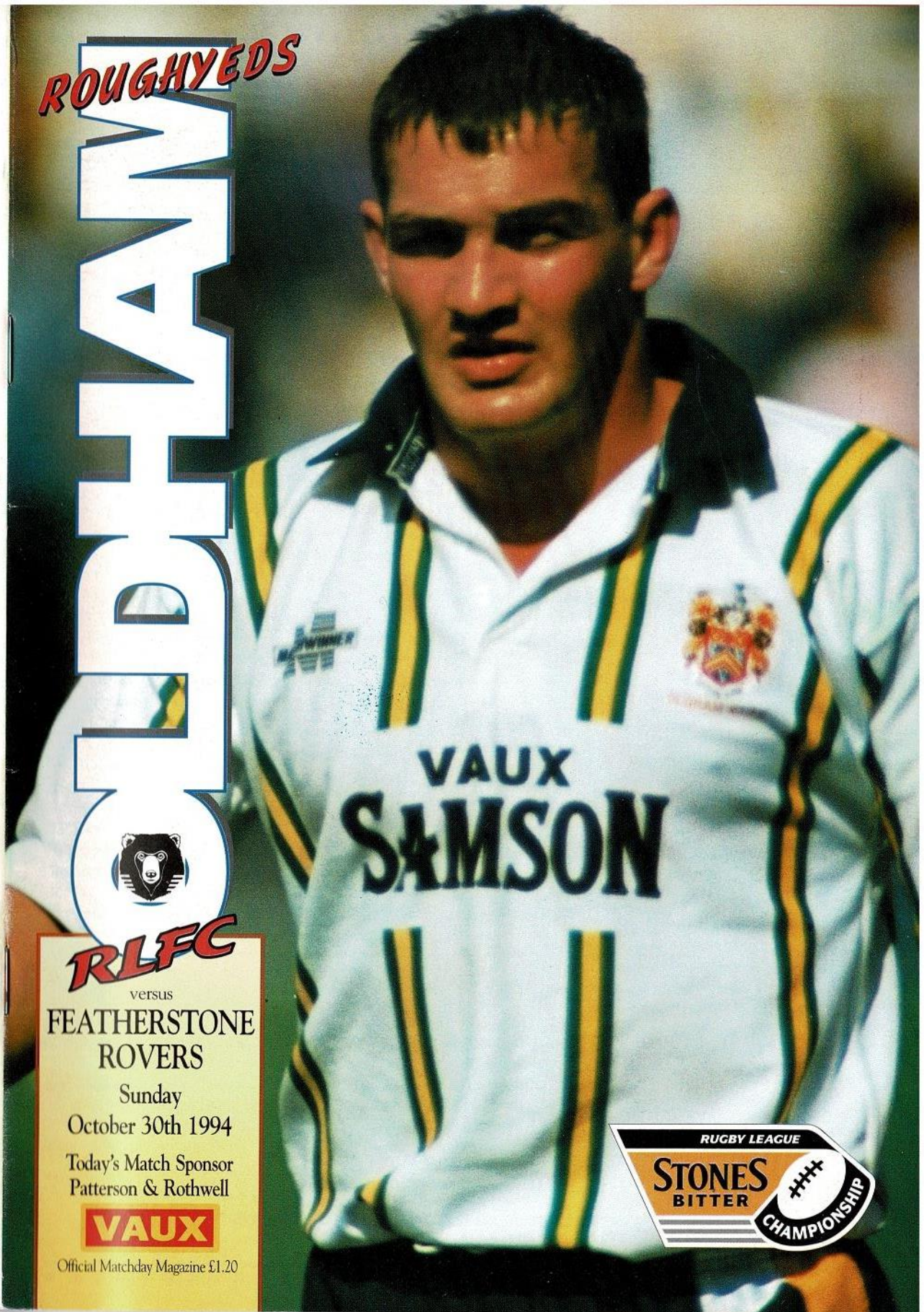

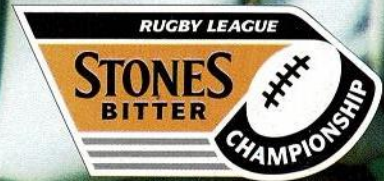

FROM THE BOARDROOM

Rugby League in this country took a giant step forward with the performance of the Great Britain team against Australia at Wembley last weekend in the first of the John Smith's Tests. A crowd of 57,000, a record for a Test match in this country, thrilled to Britain's rearguard action, as did millions more watching on television. Watching two of our former forwards in stirring action for Britain, and wearing the red, white and blue of their country with distinction, I was both delighted and disappointed, delighted that the Oldham club had played some part in the development of Chris Joynt and Barrie McDermott, but disappointed that we were unable to stick hold of them.

Suffice to say that Chris and Barrie did a terrific job for Great Britain and the congratulations of the Oldham club, from boardroom level down to their former friends and teammates in the dressing room, are offered to them, together with sincere best wishes for more success in the remainder of the Ashes series.

The whole of the British team did a marvellous PR exercise and their terrific performance, which earned rave notices throughout the media over the weekend and through to Monday, should have a big impact on the game's pulling power and could help to increase attendances for the rest of the season.

There are two more Tests still to be played, of course, so we should not get too carried away, but it's so far, so good as we look forward to Old Trafford next weekend with quiet confidence and optimism,

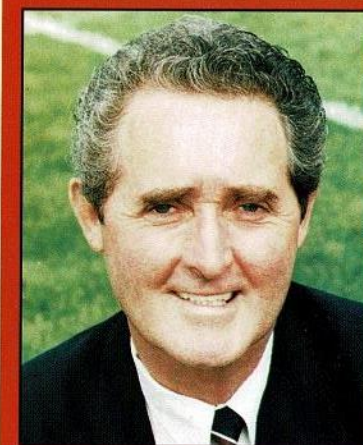
considering how well the players lifted their performance at Wembley on the strength of marvellous preparation by Ellery Hanley and Gary Hetherington.

Hanley answered those who criticised his appointment as Mal Reilly's successor in the best possible way and proved that there is no risk attached to giving a top class player a coaching opportunity, particularly if he has performed with distinction at the highest level, played all over the world and worked under coaches of the calibre of Graham Lowe and John Monie.

Our own Andy Goodway has a similar pedigree and background. Not for one moment did I ever believe we were taking a chance in offering Andy his first senior coaching appointment and we all know what a good job he is doing at Watersheddings. Like Ellery, he has lived at the top level as a player for years and he has worked alongside some of our game's finest coaches. The achievement of Hanley and Hetherington in guiding our national side to a first Test victory was all the more creditable on several counts.

Firstly, Ellery had only a relatively short time to prepare his squad. Secondly, he was taking on a team of world champions whom most people made firm favourites and thirdly he had to cope with the loss of recognised Test stars through injury such as Kelvin Skerrett and Paul Newlove. Then there was the dismissal of Shaun Edwards after 26 minutes.

Britain displayed great pride in performance and a magnificent team spirit which must stand them in



good stead for the remainder of the series. Best of luck, lads!

A measure of the increasing interest locally in Rugby League was reflected in the fact that we took 12 coaches of fans, mostly youngsters, to Wembley and it must have been a great experience for the young ones to watch their British heroes put up such a terrific display in victory and to realise that one of them, Barrie McDermott, was a local lad from their own patch, namely Waterhead.

I fancy more than a few of the young boys on that trip made a secret wish that one day they would emulate Barrie and play for Britain in an Ashes series against the Australians. From little acorns grow etc, etc.

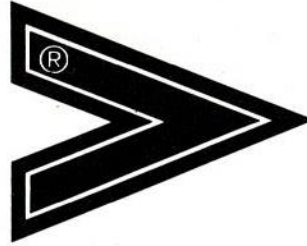

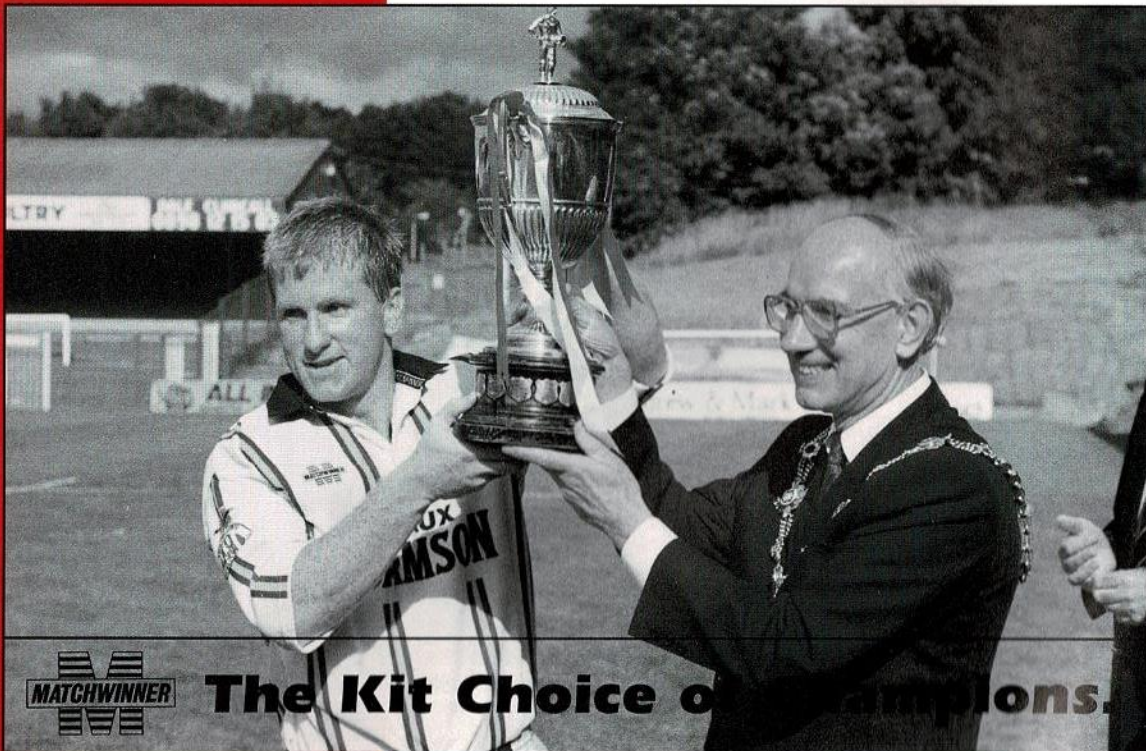

CLOSE UP ON THE ROVERS

Our visitors in detail

CARL GIBSON signed at the start of last season as cover for the injured Andy Currier. Start his pro career at Batley, then moved to Leeds. Moved to full-back when Martin Pearson reverted to stand-off and was a revelation. Carl played 34 games scored 17 tries and was voted Rovers player of the season. 31 year old Carl has played for Great Britain 10 times with 1 game as sub. He played in the 1990 historic Wembley test - full back.

IKRAM BUTT Ikram has a highly individual style, having the ability to emerge into space from seemingly impossible situations. Another Leeds signing 4 years ago, 26 years-old Ikram started 32 games last season and scored 12 tries - winger.

ANDY CURRIER Andy is well known to Widnes fans. He's finally got his Rovers career underway after a horrific knee injury kept him out of the game for an entire season. Rovers' record signing at £150,000.

IVA ROPATI Iva is in his second spell at Rovers. He's also played for Sheffield Eagles and Oldham. He's a Kiwi international and rejoined his old club after last year's tour starting 20 games scoring 14 tries. 26 years-old, Iva scored on his test debut in the 2nd test at Wigan last year - centre.

FREDERIC BANQUET Frederic is a French U21 international. Introduced to Rovers by Danny Divet. His trial period resulted in a full contract for a year whether he stays for another year depends upon his having to do his national service.

MARK NIXON Another member of last year's Kiwi touring party. Mark has been recruited as cover for the injured Martin Pearson but can play at scrum half or centre as well. Mark has played at test level against Australia and PNG. He scored 42 tries during a spell with Rochdale Hornets.

STEVE MOLLOY An inspired signing last year, yet again from Leeds, via Warrington. Steve provides a great deal of Rovers' fire power up front. His absence from the current Great Britain squad is a mystery of Marie Celeste proportions. Steve started 31 games last season and scored 2 tries. 25 year-old - prop.

GRAHAM SOUTHERWOOD Signed for Rovers from Castleford in the middle of last season. Graham started 7 games. This total is likely to be surpassed by a long way, especially with Richard Gunn being absent through injury. 22 year-old - hooker.

LEO CASEY Leo is now in his 4th season at Rovers. A record signing from Oldham in 1990, Leo played 32 games last season, scoring 1 try. Leo possesses a left-handed round the corner pass out of the tackle. 29 years old - prop.

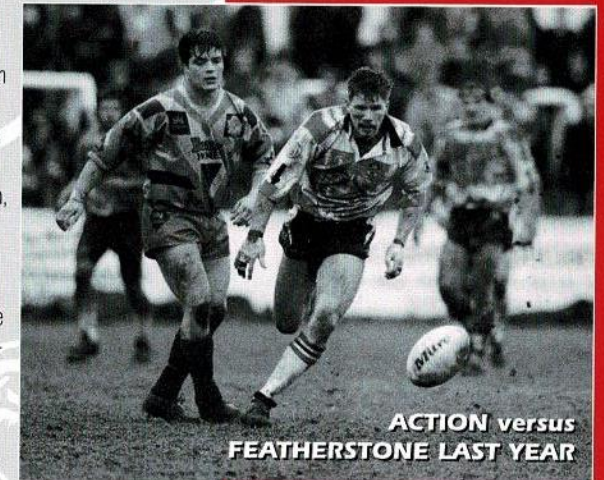
GARY H. PRICE Gary is one half of an all action back row partnership. He originally was destined to leave Wakefield Trinity to go to Oldham. He even appeared on the Roughyed's pre-season team photograph, but came to Rovers instead. Gary started 23 games last season and scored 8 tries.

DANIEL DIVET The other half of the partnership. Wearer of the biggest boots (13s) in living memory at Rovers. Daniel is French, but was brought up in Sydney. Played for Manly Warringah, Carcassonne and Hull F.C. This huge, powerful player has been a big hit at Rovers. Voted Rovers player of the month for September. 27 years of age. French international.

BRENDAN TUUTA Signed from Western Suburbs 4 years ago. Brendan is a Kiwi international and a heroic figure to the Rovers' fans. Brendan started 32 games last season and scored 7 tries. 29 year-old - loose forward.

LYNCHPIN

Since the departure of Deryck Fox to Bradford in September 1992, Rovers have been in the hunt for a big name scrum half. They were reportedly interested in Bobby Goulding before his move to Saints and instead secured the services during the summer of Mark Aston, from Sheffield. As

well as being an excellent organiser and playmaker, Aston has a formidable reputation for points-scoring. A 1986 signing from Selby amateur football, he became the youngest ever man to play and score in every game of the season with his exploits in 1988/89. 307 of his Sheffield career total of 1,370 coming that term. Having recently celebrated his 27th birthday Mark is at the peak of his career but so far only one substitute appearance for Great Britain represents scant reward for his abilities.

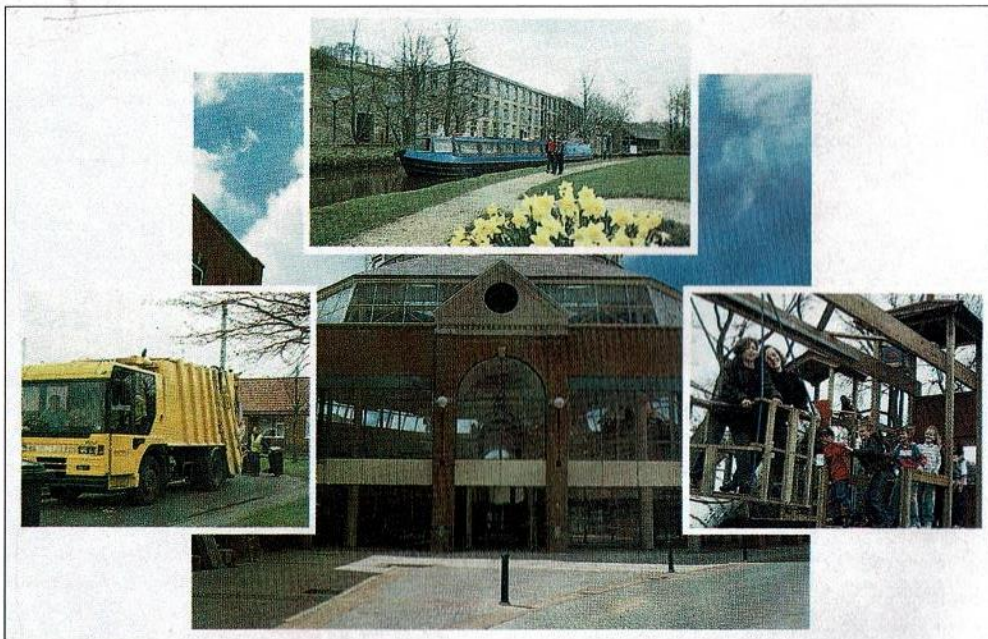

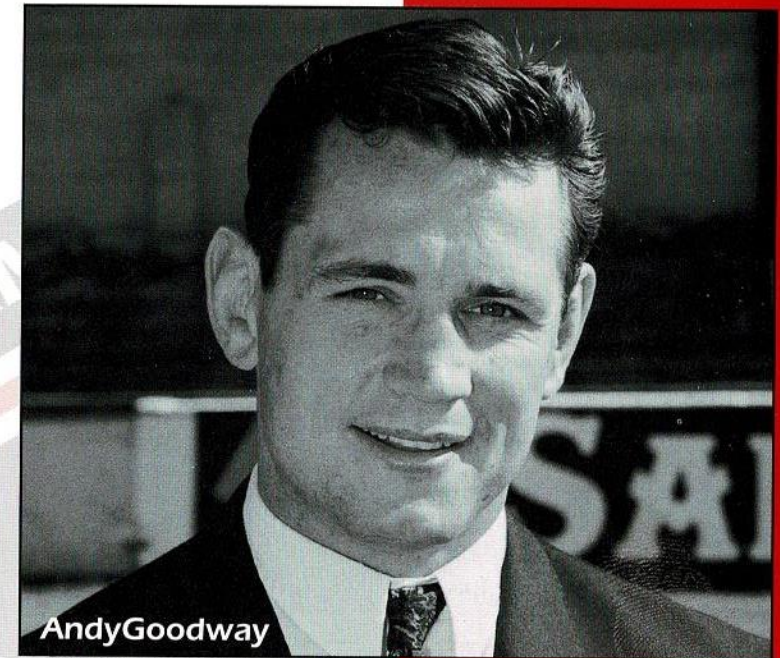

David Ward has been newly appointed and I would like to take this opportunity of wishing him all the very best, it is good to see another British coach back in the 1st Division.

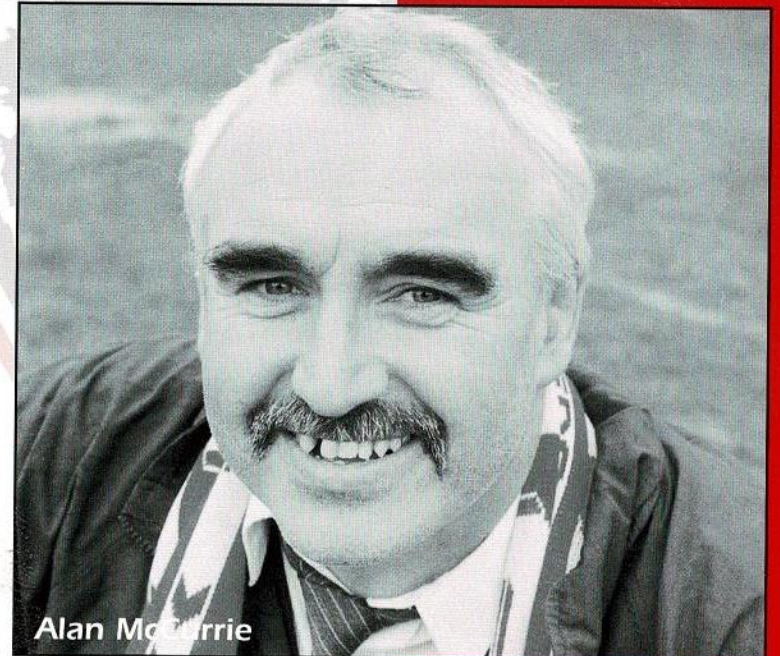

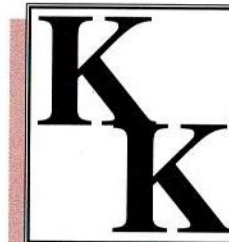

A LOOK AT THE LOCAL AMATEUR RUGBY SCENE

After the good showing by the Oldham town team in the Inter-League Shield, it is expected that Oldham will be well represented in the Lancashire County side for next months County Championship. The Red Rose side entertain Yorkshire at Salford on Wednesday, 9th November and visit Barrow to face Cumbria three weeks later. In between those matches, Yorkshire play Cumbria on Wednesday, 16th November at the new Crown Flatt, Dewsbury. Yorkshire have been County champions during the past two seasons although their success last season was achieved only on points difference. They beat Lancashire 23-2 last year so the home team will be looking for revenge in ten days time. Yesterday four of our local sides were involved in the Burtonwood Brewery Lancashire Cup competition. Victory would have taken them through to the quarter-finals which are scheduled to take place on Saturday, 12th November. St. Annes were

confident of beating Langworthy at home and both Saddleworth and Higginshaw were capable of ending the cup interest of Thatto Heath and St. Bedes respectively but Fitton Hill faced a difficult trip to Leigh Miners. The draw takes place tomorrow so let us hope that it is of local interest. It promises to be an important few weeks for Saddleworth Rangers no matter how they fared in yesterday's cup-tie. Next Saturday they visit Hemel Hempstead who have always finished close to the top of the Premier League table. The following Saturday Champions Woolston Rovers visit Shaw Hall Bank Road although this match could face postponement depending upon yesterday's cup results. Then on Saturday, 19th November Rangers travel to Rochdale for the 'derby' tussle against Mayfield. It is an equally demanding period for St. Annes who face Millom at home next Saturday then travel to East Leeds before returning to Higginshaw Lane on Saturday 19th November for

a tough match against Moldgreen. This Huddersfield team were promoted with Saints last season and both are doing well in the First Division. The corresponding match last season ended in a 20-4 win for Saints. Next Thursday, 3rd November Fitton Hill are staging their annual dinner at Birch Hall, Lees. Guest speaker is the former Liverpool soccer star Tommy Smith. Tickets, priced £15 can be reserved by contacting Malcolm Woodhead on 652-3645. And don't forget that next weekend is the first round of the Standard Cup - Fitton Hill v. Heyside, Hollinwood v. Higginshaw, Saddleworth v. Watersheddings, Shaw v. St. Annes and Waterhead v. RECORD BREAKING SPONSORSHIP KICKS OFF 1994-95 REGAL TROPHY FIRST ROUND DRAW DETAILS

The 1994-95 Regal Trophy kicks off its 28th consecutive year of Imperial Tobacco sponsorship, this season worth a record breaking £410,000, when the draw for the first round takes place next Wednesday, 26th October.

The draw will be broadcast live at 11.30am on BBC Radio Leeds and networked to all local and national Radio and television stations in the Rugby League playing areas throughout the day.

Their visitors will be the three former professional clubs, Blackpool Gladiators, Chorley Borough and Nottingham City, plus the six leading national Conference League teams headed by Champions, Woolston and followed by Hemel Hempstead, Dudley Hill, Leigh Miners, Saddleworth and West Hull. Also included are the five BARLA regional league champions, Hensingham (Cumberland), Mysons (Humberside), Ovenden (Pennine), Queens (Yorkshire) and Thralto Heath (North West Counties) and the two French teams.

The Regal Trophy first round matches have to be played by Sunday, 27th November 1994.

This season the Regal Trophy is worth £410,000, made up of prize money totalling £246,000 with increases in every round and the highest ever first prize of £36,000 awaiting the eventual winner. Once again the prize money is backed up by a contribution to the League's all-important Capital Development fund, this time a record £164,000.
