



the match ball. As a former St. Anne's


player myself, I am delighted at the relationship we are now building up between Watersheddings and the local amateur clubs generally, not merely the Saints.



Our visitors in detail

GARY CHAMBERS

Joined Warrington in 1989 from Kells A.R.L.C. Now 24 years old he has won under 21 International honours and if his progress continues would well go all the way. Expected to be a dominant force in the Wires pack this season he has over 70 first team games under his belt and would have played many more had it not been for a very bad run of bizarre injuries.

JONATHAN DAVIES

Warrington produced a 'master stroke' in bringing Jonathan the 7 miles up the road from Widnes in July of last year. He quickly became the hero of the fans and rewarded them with 20 tries and 100 goals in his first season. Has settled well into the No 4 jersey and his match winning skills are admired not only by the Wires but by the league as a whole.

GARY SANDERSON

Another player who has suffered more than his fair share of injuries. But is now thankfully completely fit again. Gary now 27 years old has played in almost 200 games since he signed professional from Thatto Heath A.R.L.C. in 1987 and is widely respected for his total committment to the cause.

KELLY SHELFORD

Often regarded as the player who makes Warrington 'tick' he joined the Wires in October 1991 after a brief spell with Whitehaven. A seasoned New Zealand International he is currently playing his best ever rugby at the age of 28.

TUKERE BARLOW

Recently arrived from New Zealand and scored a try in his debut match as hooker. Former Junior Kiwi and Mauri International this 23 year old is hoping to establish a long term career at Warrington.

THE GROWING GAME

Development News Supported by P.Casey and Co and Sportsmatch

As the dust now settles on the Australian Tour of Great Britain and the outbursts about who is to blame for our defeat are calmed, I thought I might take some time to begin to examine positively reasons for our our defeat, but, more importantly, steps to ensure future success I also thought I would discuss this with particular reference to Oldham. The first thing to note is that Rugby League in Queensland and New South Wales is massive and as such attracts participants. It could be compared to Soccer in this country. This fact alone however does not excuse our shortcomings. In Oldham we are beginning to expand the number of schools who are seriously offering Rugby League to their pupils. Whilst the number is

around 25 Junior Schools and 10 Senior Schools it should be

remembered that 60% of junior schools **DO NOT** play Rugby League at any level. I would therefore suggest that my job is to continue to chip away at this figure to open up the game to more people. Once young players have tried the game how many play regular Club Rugby League? St. Annes, Salem, Saddleworth, Shaw, Waterhead, Royton Tigers, and Higginshaw all offer some level of junior Rugby League. The maximum number of players at any one age group would be the Under 9's with six clubs. Given a squad of 20 players at each club that only amounts to 120 players at that age group. My suggestion is that by playing Puma Little League we could aim to have in the region of 12 clubs at Under 9's which even with say 16 players per squad will increase the numbers by over 50%. Once we have these players we have to keep them by ensuring that they have appropriate levels of competition and can progress via "Mod League" to full rules.

If we manage to achieve this increase in participation how do we promote Performance and Excellence? I would suggest that the current system of Town Teams is given greater status and kudos should attract the very top players for regular extra training. We should also continue with Development Squads for those years where no Town Team competition exists. None of what I have described above should be a radical change from what goes on now. It will, however, need all of us to pull in the same direction, which is what happens in most cases. We need to get a set of priorities which we can all agree and I suggest that of paramount importance should always be what is best for the PLAYER.

There may be people who read this who agree or disagree with my thoughts but be assured. I am always trying to positively promote Rugby League and specifically Rugby League in Oldham. We are a traditionally strong area in terms of Youth Rugby but we can, and must improve, and I look forward to working alongside everyone who shares my ambitions. To make Oldham the Top Rugby League Town in this country.







Our average league gate, incidentally, was 4138,
