

FROM THE BOARDROOM

BY CHAIRMAN JIM QUINN

A HAPPY New Year to you all! We have had a few ups and downs in 1994, but in general terms the club is moving steadily forward as witnessed by some of our better victories on home soil this season, the appearance of the Alliance side on the top of the first division and the consistent progress being made by our Academy boys.

The one thing that is causing some concern is the fall-off of our crowds. I must make the point that this is not a problem peculiar to Watersheddings. With the odd exception, clubs throughout Rugby League are suffering from lost revenue caused by smaller attendances and I am even more convinced than ever that the answer lies in a change of seasons. The Regal Trophy crowds were particularly disappointing in the early rounds. The second-round figures were the lowest since the Regal

many years ago. So far as the Oldham club is concerned, we had only 2,277 fans for the visit of Hull KR in round two. It was a dreadful day and there was competition from the televised Stoke versus Oldham Athletic game, which was put out live by Granada. Nevertheless, a crowd of little more than 2,000 was a major disappointment. Equally disappointing, after wins against Bradford Northern and Hull KR in our previous two home games.

Trophy competition was introduced

was the attendance of only 3.527 for the visit of Warrington. It was of little consolation to know that there were four first division games on the same day with even fewer fans on the terraces.

Of course, Sunday used to be almost the exclusive domain of Rugby League football. Not any more. More and more soccer games are being played on Sundays - and televised - and now we have the added competition from Sunday shopping.

I am sure the time has come for the Rugby League to think seriously after shifting the season from about the middle of March to the middle of November, thus having a close season of December, January and February when the weather is generally at its worst, the nights are at their darkest and coldest and competition from the commercial side of Christmas is proving more and more difficult to overcome. It isn't merely the demands on time that is affecting attendances: it is the fact that, in these difficult days. people have to cut their coat according to their cloth and the enormous expense of Christmas is taking its toll on sporting attractions. I believe that more people than ever are now coming around to thinking that those who are pushing for a shift in seasons might be on the right lines. Wherever I go in the game, people want to talk to me about summer rugby. I hope the game



gives it the serious consideration it deserves.

A big Watersheddings welcome today to Workington. Cumbria deserves a first division club and the Rugby League needs one. Over the years a great friendship has existed between the peoples of West Cumbria and those of East Lancashire, with Cumbrians too numerous to mention having settled in this area on transferring to Watersheddings from Derwent Park or the Recreation

Of course, we have one of that area's most famous sons. Alan McCurrie. on our coaching staff. Alan will need no telling that Town will be coming down here today, hopefully with good support, in determined mood to pick up vital points in their battle to stay in the top flight.

It is up to the Oldham team to produce the sort of form it is capable of to continue its good home record in our quest to finish in the top eight.




Welcome to Watersheddings for our first game of 1995.



GRASS ROOTS ROUGHYEDS

A LOOK AT THE LOCAL AMATEUR RUGBY SCENE

It is not only the professional clubs who are heavily involved in cup competitions at this time of the year. Take, for instance, Conference Champions Woolston Rovers. Not only have they battled their way through to meet St. Annes in the Lancashire Cup Final, they have faced Rochdale Hornets in the Regal Trophy, beat Eccles in the Challenge Cup and now take on Greetland in round two of that competition.

It is a demanding schedule which is made even tougher for successful local sides who, over the New Year weekend, contest the quarter-finals of the Standard Cup.

Cup holders Higginshaw have been drawn away to Salem Hornets in what is a repeat of the 1930 and 1931 finals. Higginshaw were successful in both those finals, winning 9-0 in 1930 after a 7-7 draw and then lifting the trophy the following year with a 16-3 victory.

Waterhead, who last won the cup in 1986, entertain Seddon Panthers. Two years ago Waterhead won 24-8 at Seddons in a first round tie and they look strong enough to repeat that success this time.

Lancashire Cup finalists St.Annes have been drawn away again, this time to Fitton Hill. These two last met at the semi-final stage two years ago when Saints won 22-10 at Watersheddings. They went on to lift the trophy that year. Can they repeat that success? Saddleworth Rangers face two away cup ties over the holiday weekend. In the Standard Cup they visit Middleton whilst in the Challenge Cup they face a daunting trip up to Millom. They will travel confidently to Middleton but the trip to Millom is fraught with danger. Rangers have lost all three National League matches which they have played up at Millom. The score two years

ago was a convincing 26-8. However when the two sides last met in cup football it was Rangers who triumphed. They beat Millom 8-2 at Shaw Hall Bank Road in the National League Cup three years ago. Loss of home advantage and the fact that Millom are enjoying a good spell of form just now will make it difficult for Rangers. Nevertheless. Saddleworth have a good. experienced line-up and if they display the sort of form which saw off Skirlaugh in the first round then they could be lining up for another crack at professional opposition. The draw for the semi-finals of the Standard Cup will take place early in the New Year. It promises to produce two cracking matches no matter which four clubs progress through.





earned our respect, well done to you



We wish Shane a speedy recovery and better luck in the New Year.


