TODAY'S VISITORS

Today we welcome the Roughyeds of Oldham to Tattersfield. One of the founder members of the Northern Union and one of the games first successful clubs. In 1899 they became the first Lancashire club to win the Rugby League Challenge Cup, defeating Hunslet 19-9. Champions in 1909 and 1910, they dominated the early days of Lancashire Cup football.

Class players such as Joe Ferguson, Jim Lomas and Tom Holliday, kept Oldham at the forefront of the game well into the 1920's. Since then Oldham have strived to bring back those heady days, hoping to make that Wembley appearance that has continued to elude them. In the 1950's the Roughyeds once again had a taste of success, when they won three consecutive Lancashire Cups and taking the Championship with a one-point defeat of Hull in 1957.

In the 1960's their great side was dismantled and in 1963 they were relegated to the 2nd Division. After winning the 2nd Division Championship in 1963-64 and almost reaching that much sought after Wembley appearance, losing out to Hull KR after two replays. Oldham have suffered from the yo-yo syndrome in recent years, continuing to produce outstanding young players, who have been snapped up by the bigger clubs in the League.


Oldham returned to the First Division in 1992-93 finishing runners-up to Featherstone Rovers, after two seasons in the Second Division. Oldham started last season under the leadership of Peter Tunks, who had taken over the coaching role in April 1991.

After a poor start to the season and a terrible Christmas period, the Oldham board decided it was time to part company with Tunks. With only four victories in their opening sixteen games and confidence at a low ebb, a disastorous defeat by the Dons at Tattersfield in the Challenge Cup ultimately cost Tunks his job. Staring relegation in the face the board turned to their Australian prop forward Bob Lindner to lead them and with the signing of Glen Liddiard, Oldham survived, finishing fourth from bottom, winning six and drawing one of the remaining ten games.

At the end of the season Lindner decided to return to Australia, so the board turned to ex-Great Britain forward Andy Goodway to take over the reins. The season opened up with Oldham losing their first four games, suffering from the loss of four key forwards. Things turned round for the Roughyeds when they handed the Dons a 44-8 defeat in September, to kick-off their season, they have since won another six and drawn one to lay eighth in the table on 15 points.

Goodway has worked hard with the players, bringing in different training methods and getting the players fitter and believing in themselves. To offset the loss of Lindner, Solomona, McDermott and Goodway himself, he has brought in Gary Lord from Halifax, Paul Davidson from Widnes, Steve Gartland and Kiwi prop John Temu. It as taken time to get things right, but Goodway is slowly building the side up and working in the right direction, making sure the youth and 'A' team continue to produce good players for the first team squad. Goodway is putting to use the vast experience he has gained whilst playing for Wigan and Great Britain, under coaches such as John Monie and Graham Lowe, to bring on the Oldham team.





Darren Abram

First professional club was Warrington and then he moved to Trafford Borough from where he joined Rochdale for £40,000 in 1991. Joined Oldham in February 1993.

David Bradbury

Signed from Leigh Miners after touring New Zealand with the BARLA Under-19 squad. David is a strong running loose forward.

John Clarke

A sturdy little hooker who came straight out of BARLA Youth Rugby last season. John is the only player ever to have won BARLA's Young Player of the Year Award more than once.

Martin Crompton

A £35,000 buy from Wigan early last season, Martin was troubled by injury in the early part of the campaign but came through to play a crucial role in Oldham's team which saw off the threat of relegation. Formerly with Warrington.

Wally Gibson

On his day one of the finest attacking full backs in Rugby League. Wally made his name with the Huddersfield Club, ripping Second Division defences to shreds in his three years at Fartown. Joined Oldham two seasons ago.

Iyan Green

A Wiganer, formerly on St. Helens books, Iyan came to Oldham as a free agent in the Summer of 1993. He played a major role in the Alliance teams remarkable unbeaten record throughout the season.

Scott Ranson

25-year-old St. Helens player and the top try scorer from his former club, Swinton. Signed for Oldham in March 1992.

lan Sherratt

Former Oldham & Lancashire Schoolboy. Left Oldham for Salford and returned in 1991/2. A hard grafting prop-forward who won Oldham's Player of the Season for 1993/4 and also the Players Player of the Season.

Shaun Irwin

Shaun joined Oldham from Castleford in 1992. He is a former member of Mal Reillys Great Britain squad.

Martin Holden

Joined Oldham from Wigan St. Pats in 1993. Can play wing or centre with equal ability.

Mike Kui

A New Zealand International of great repute. Played in Great Britain and France with the New Zealand tourists in 1989. A strong loose forward or second rower. Has played for Rochdale, Swinton and Leeds.

Gary Lord

A newcomer to Oldham this year, Gary started his career with Castleford and moved to Leeds before Oldham signed him from Halifax for £35,000 fixed by tribunal. Gary began life as a full back but now plays in the pack mainly at second row.

Paul Topping

Paul joined Oldham from Leigh in the Summer of 1993 after starting his career as a full back with Swinton. Oldham's top point scorer last season, he is a useful goal kicker who can play equally well at full back, centre or even loose forward.

Craig Booth

Classy goal kicker from Featherstone Rovers who has the distinction of moving to Oldham by paying his own transfer fee. He played a major role in the Alliance teams four trophy success last season.

David Chrimes

One of Oldham's signings from Rochdale Hornets, highly rated by former coach Peter Regan. Previously played for local amateur side Mayfield.

Paul Davidson

Joined Oldham this Summer in a £17,000 deal with Widnes. A Cumbrian who formerly played with Hensingham. Can play either prop or second row.

Craig Richards

Joined Oldham for £25,000 from Bradford Northern a year ago and produced a stunning debut to score two tries against his former club.

Ben Olsen

This Danish born forward made a name for himself with London Crusaders and signed for Oldham in 1992. Ben is the only known Dane to be currently playing professional Rugby League in Great Britain.

Paddy Mitchell

A local boy who joined Oldham three years ago from Saddleworth Rangers. A stand-off or centre, Paddy made a big impression in the successful Alliance team last season.












Where Are They Now?

FORMER Rugby League star Keith Williams wears a different kind of strip these days.

And the former stand-off and full back now plays for one of the most demanding "team managers" around – God.

For Keith – whose sporting skills took him to a succession of Yorkshire Clubs – is now more properly known as "Reverend". And the 58-year-old will be sporting his clerical dog collar when he takes up his new dual role as Vicar of All Saints, Batley, and priest in charge at St. Andrew's, Purwell, next door to the Batley RL Club's Mount Pleasant ground.

The try-scoring exploits of plain Keith Williams are still remembered by fans. He spent 15 years with some of Yorkshire's top Rugby clubs.

And when his darting runs on the field were over he turned to refereeing. But he tackled his greatest challenge in 1983 when, aged 46, he opted for a new strip of clerical grey – and headed for St. John's College, Nottingham, to train as a priest.

"By that time I had done most things in life," said Mr. Williams, who was born in the RL bastion of Castleford. At the age of 15 I played for Castleford Rugby Union Club and by 18 I had been signed by Halifax.

"After eight years with them I moved in succession to Huddersfield, Bradford Northern, Huddersfield again and finally Doncaster, ending my career in 1967. Until 1970 I refereed games for the Leeds and District Referees Society."

While with Halifax in the 1957-8 season he scored eight tries in a derby match against Dewsbury, setting a record which still stands today.

PRESS RELEASE

At a meeting held at Headquarters today the Rugby Football League Board of Directors represented by Mr. M.P. Lindsay, Mr. R. Waudby and Mr. H. Jepson, interviewed Sonny Whakarau following his comments in a weekend newspaper.

In that article Sonny Whakarau was quoted as stating that "there are as many as a dozen, maybe more, players throughout the League on steroids". Whakarau went on to say that the Rugby League were deliberately closing their eyes to the

Sonny Whakarau, who was accompanied by his solicitor, when questioned about these remarks refuted them by stating that he had no knowledge whatsoever of any player in the game taking steroids other than Jamie Bloem. He profusely apologised for his remarks and regretted causing hurt and annoyance to the League. He was also mindful that his careless remarks had cast a slur upon his fellow professionals and he particularly regretted this imputation.

Whakarau also expressed to the Board his desire to withdraw any remark he may have made that suggested that the Rugby League itself was turning a blind eye by inadequate drug testing. On the contrary, he was aware that the vast majority of professional players had been drug tested at some time or another and had all been found negative. Once again, Whakarau regretted giving an earlier implication that drug testing was not of a sufficient standard and indeed congratulated the Board of Directors on taking a firm position on drugs within the sport.

DONCASTER HEALTH NEWS HOW TO BECOME MORE ACTIVE

There is increasing evidence of the association between regular physical activity and the health and quality of life. The National Fitness Survey completed in 1992, showed that regular physical activity throughout adult life will help protect people from heart disease and other related diseases. Regular physical activity has other benefits including improvements in stamina, muscle strength, joint flexibility and body weight. The best way to manage your body weight is to become more active. Regular physical activity at any age can help to strengthen bones thereby reducing the risk of brittle bone disease or osteoporosis. Increasing levels of physical activity can also reduce stress levels and increase feelings of well-being and self esteem.

Despite the evidence in favour of regular physical activity there still seems to be a large percentage of the population who remain inactive. The National Fitness Survey showed that over 7 out of 10 men and 8 out of 10 women did not do enough appropriate physical activity to reduce the incidence of coronary heart disease, e.g. 20 minutes, 3 times a week of moderate to vigorous physical activity.

There seem to be a number of barriers that prevent people from doing more physical activity, the most often quoted barrier for not exercising is "I haven't got the time". Making time for physical activity can be a problem for a lot of people, this can be solved by making it part of a regular routine. To become more active you don't suddenly have to go to the gym or start training for a marathon.

A few simple changes to your lifestyle can help you become more active. Try one or more of the following, building up towards doing an hour in total of physical activity every week.

- * Walk briskly for 10 minutes every day, 6 days a week (fast enough to get you slightly out of breath, eg 3-4 miles per hour is fast enough for most people).
- * Wherever possible walk instead of using the car or bus.
- * Gardening, DIY and housework activities are good for keeping muscles active. Try cycling to work instead of using the car or bus.
- * If you have time, try visiting a leisure facility at lunchtime or going with a friend after work. For more information on physical activity, contact Nigel Young on 0302 320111.

MORE ON OLDHAM

Star Player & Captain - Martin Crompton

Oldham's star man is scrum-half Martin Crompton, who along with loose forward Mike Kuiti, have been the inspiration behind Oldham. Crompton started his professional career at Warrington, signing from Wigan St. Patricks in 1987. Making around 80 appearances for Warrington (including substitute) and scoring 19 tries, Crompton was signed by Wigan in July 1992. After 20 appearances and four tries for Wigan, he moved to the Watersheddings in September 1993, making 21 appearances last season scoring 8 tries and 3 drop goals. This season he has become one of the star performers for the Roughyeds, carrying out Goodway's instructions on the pitch, but also having the freedom to use his own judgement.

Coach - Andy Goodway

Andy Goodway started his career at Oldham, and after spells with Wigan and Leeds, returned to finish his career at the Watersheddings. A product of the Redhill Club, he joined Oldham in 1980, spending five years with the club, gaining Second Division Championship honours. Goodway also followed up Under-24 selection with a try-scoring Test debut at prop against France at Carcassonne in February 1983. He joined Wigan in 1985 after a stint with Australian Winfield Cup side Manly.

Goodway was voted the 1990 First Division Player of the Year and emerged as the countries leading try scoring forward. Making two tours of Australasia in 1984 and 1988, he was overlooked for the 1990 tour of Papua New Guinea and New Zealand having regained his Test place for the 1989 home series against the Kiwi's. Goodway went on to make 23 appearances for Great Britain scoring six tries.

Past Great – Bernard Ganley

Bernard Ganley was Oldham's record breaking goal-kicker and points scorer during a 10 year career between 1951-1961. In 1957-58 Ganley became the first goal kicker to pass the 200 goal barrier, following that up by once again heading the table with 190 in 1958-59. Ganley also created records for goals in a match with 14 v Liverpool City in 1958, in a season with 200 in 1957-58 and in a career with 1365. A career aggregate of 2775 points is another club record. Ganley appeared in five major finals and won three Great Britain caps, all against France.
