


LEN GARBETT LOOKS BACK

A SHOCK 20-22 home defeat to Featherstone Rovers opened the 1989/90 season, with Australian full-back, Steve Larder, and former Rovers player, Graham Steadman (stand-off) (2g) making their debuts, 3rd September 1989. One week later two more debutants were in a side which won 26-24 at St. Helens - Darren Price (sub) and Andy Clarke (loose-forward) who was sent off. Another week later saw a 44-0 win at Hunslet in the 1st Round of The Yorkshire Cup with Australian Gary French (scrum-half) (t) playing his first match. Further debutants were Tony Smith (sub) V. Hull K.R. (h) 27/9/1989 in a 28-12 Round 2 Yorkshire Cup win: St. John Ellis (wing) (4g) and Paul Whitehead (sub) V. New Zealand, Tuesday, 3/10/1989, losing 20-22: Ian Bragger (centre) V. Wakefield Trinity (a) 12/11/1989: Neil Roebuck (loose-forward) V. Leeds (a) 26/12/1989: Australian Jeff Hardy (stand-off) and Lee Crooks (field-side prop) V. St. Helens (a) 14/1/1990. Making their last 1st Team appearances for Castleford were Dean Blankley (scrum-half) V. St. Helens (a) 10/9/1989 (4 + 1 sub app. no pts): Mark Gibson (full-back) V. New Zealand (11 + 1 sub app. 1 try - 4 pts): Paul Crabtree (2nd row) V. Sheffield Eagles (h) 15/10/1989 (10 + 7 sub apps. 1 try - 4pts): Phil Mirfin (2nd row) V. Wigan (a) 29/10/1989 (3 + 7 sub apps. 5 tries -20 pts): Tony Marchant (sub) V. Widnes (a) 25/11/1989 (254 + 5 sub apps. 98 tries - 374 pts): Chris Chapman (wing) (57 + 3 sub apps. 26 tries - 104 pts) and Roy Southernwood (scrum-half) (38 + 20 sub apps. 9 tries - 36 pts) V. Widnes (h) 20/1/1990: Kenny Hill (sub) V. Wigan (h) 28/3/1990 (17 + 4 sub apps. 1 try -4 pts) and Kevin Ward (sub) V. Leeds (a) 22/4/1990 (301 + 12 sub apps. 74 tries - 249 pts). An 18-18 draw at Featherstone in the Semi-Final of The Yorkshire Cup, resulted in a 26-28 home defeat in the replay, after a 28-12 home win over Hull K.R. in the 2nd Round. Wins were recorded in the first two rounds of the Regal Trophy - 42-18 at Chorley Borough, and 62-2 win at Whitehaven St. John Ellis scoring 5 tries, only to lose 10-24 to Wigan in

the semi-final at Headingley. Cas went out of the Challenge Cup in a 39-12 Preliminary Round defeat at St. Helens, despite newcomers Lee Crooks and Jeff Hardy. 26 League matches brought 16 wins and 10 defeats, scoring 703 points, conceding 448, finishing 7th out of 14, which meant a trip to Leeds in the Premiership Play-Offs, Round 1, Leeds winning 24-18 (Kevin Ward's last match). Six days previous Monday 16th April, Leeds had been beaten 38-18 at Wheldon Road, Lee Crooks kicking 7 goals.

Overall 36 players were used to play 37 matches, Steve Larder playing in 35 of them. Graham Steadman was the leading points scorer with 220 pts from 17 tries, 75 goals and 2 drop-goals, and was also top goalkicker. Steve Larder was top try scorer with 29 tries. 174 tries, 151 goals and 3 drop-goals were scored for a total of 1001 points. The remaining 76 goals were scored by Martin Ketteridge (42) Lee Crooks (14) Steve Larder (10) St. John Ellis (9) and Gary French (1). In The British Coal Tests V. France, Kevin Bearmore (hooker) played in the 8-4 win at Perpignan 18/3/1990, and in the 2nd Test at Leeds 7/4/1990, Graham Steadman (stand-off) (3g), Kevin Beardmore (hooker) Keith England (blindside-prop) and Shaun Irwin (sub) France won 25-18. England, Irwin and Steadman were in the 1990 Gt. Britain side touring Papua New Guinea and New Zealand, England playing in both Tests against Papua New Guinea, and all three Tests against New Zealand. Graham Steadman (stand-off) (2t 4g) and Kevin Beardmore (hooker) were in a Yorkshire side which beat Lancashire 56-12 at Wigan 20/9/1989. The Gt. Britain Under 21 side included Shaun Irwin (Capt.) (centre), Grant Anderson (stand-off), Graham Southernwood (hooker) and Neil Roebuck (sub). Transferred were John Kear (Bramley), Kenny Hill (Doncaster), Brian Juliff and John Blackburn (Rochdale Hornets).

LAST season we completed a fairly comfortable double over Oldham although we had to overcome a dogged display from the home team before the points were safe at the Watersheddings. At Cas we completely dominated the first 30 minutes with Graham Steadman in great form, and with a 26-2 lead a really big score looked on the cards. At this point however Oldham's then player coach Bob Lindner brought himself on from the subs. bench and turned his sides fortunes around Lindner may have felt that he had something to prove to Castleford, having had to end his second stint when playing at Wheldon Road somewhat prematurely. Actually he didn't but he set a tremendous lead to his side on both attack and defence and although in fairness we never looked like losing we were eventually restricted to a 34-16 win. Oldhams leading try scorer last term, Darren Abram crossed once for the visitors and added a couple of goals for good measure.

Despite the fact that by April, Spring should have arrived we travelled to face Oldham on a bitterly cold snowy evening. Again we took an early and clear lead with tries from former "Roughyeds" Tony Morrison and Richard Russell and a comfortable victory looked on the cards. However from thereoin the home side made us work very hard before completing a 28-10 victory. Again the outstanding Bob Lindner did well for Oldham whilst both scrum halves, Mike Ford, back on his old stamping ground, and Martin Crompton, shone with enterprising displays.

In the previous two terms, Oldham were in the second division although we had a clash in the Regal Trophy, a tie we won in a high scoring encounter. In 1990/91 honours were even with home advantage proving decisive. An early season fixture at the Watersheddings saw us fall 22-28 with Bradford Northern's new signing Paul Round crossing twice in a lively display for one of his many former clubs. Ironically in a season when they were relegated Oldham were to win three of their first four home fixtures,

these against Leeds, Cas and Warrington! Revenge was gained in our home fixture when winger David Plange was the star of our 28-10 victory crossing for a hat-trick of tries. Our former centre star Gary Hyde had his moment of glory when he scored on his return to Wheldon Road.

Two years previously we again shared the points, reflecting how our fortunes changed so dramatically that term. The firsthalf saw us string together a long unbeaten run but Oldham gave us one of our toughest tests in that spell. The 22-19 victory took us to the top of the table but we gave a patchy performance and found it hard to shake off a determined display from the visitors. John Joyner gave a top class display for Cas whilst Oldham's hooker, Andy Ruane played a big part in keeping his side in the game. By the time of the return game our fortunes had slipped dramatically and although Oldham were virtually doomed to relegation they beat us easily 34-18. Aussie loose-forward and captain, John Cogger was Oldham's inspiration but his entire side played well with only props Martin Ketteridge and Keith England showing any sort of form in our line-

WELCOME to Oldham for this evening's rearranged fixture. Under Andy Goodway Oldham are having a good season and although a gap has opened up between the top 7 in the table and the rest, they are tucked in nicely in eighth place and look a good bet for a play-off place. Goodway is a former Castleford junior but never played for the club, opting to sign professional with Oldham. He went on to have a fine playing career at

Wigan but after a spell at Leeds returned to his first club. With Bob Lindner leaving Oldham at the end of last term a vacancy opened up and Goodway was handed the coaching position at the Watersheddings and clearly is making his mark.

His side are in a steady run of form and having beaten our conquerers Warrington in the cup were expected to progress to the semi's by defeating Huddersfield three days ago. They will however have been disappointed by a narrow home defeat at the hands of Wakefield in their last 1st Division outing.

A couple of our former players are in the opposition ranks - in centre Shaun Irwin and in the pack Gary Lord. Shaun has had injury problems recently and looks likely to

be out for a while but generally the move to Oldham looks to have been a good one for him. From making his Cas debut as a sixteen year old Shaun always looked likely to do well and he did go on to gain GB honours. However injuries and what was perhaps an unwise positional change hindered his progress here and the exchange which took him to Oldham and brought Richard Russell to Cas looks to have

been a good deal all round. Gary


Lord was another who made his mark as a young player with us, most notably when he was given the full back role in our 1986 Wembley win. He never really cemented his place though and when Mal Reilly took over as Leeds coach Gary was his first

signing. He eventually changed positions and switched into the forwards and a further move to Halifax gave him a regular slot in the Thrum Hall pack. Gary always seems to have a strong game when facing us and we can expect no quarter today.

Turning to Shaun and Gary's team mates Oldham have done a series of good deals to get some experience together and have some top young talent coming through. Australian Wally Gibson played originally at Huddersfield, the speedy full back

posing a big threat when attacking from the back. Former Swinton man Scott Ranson is a lively winger who will probably partner Steve Gartland, a signing from Rochdale but who originated from Oldham St. Annes ARL. Paul Topping was reportedly a player that we showed some interest in when he was at Leigh. After a spell out of the game he joined up with Oldham and has shown great versatility in their back line. His wing partner will probably be Adrian Belle, another former Rochdale player. Kiwi Wilson Marsh seems to have secured the stand off spot, as well as the goal kicking role whilst scrum half is in the very capable hands of Martin Crompton. A capture from Wigan, Crompton originally made his mark with Warrington and is

always a dangerous opponent. The Oldham forwards are a mixture of home and New Zealand products although one of those Kiwis, the experienced Mike Kuiti, has been in the league for some time with Leeds and Rochdale. His compatriots Joe Faimalo and Jason Temu are newer recruits but have slotted in well. From closer to home Paul Norman and former Widnes man Paul Davidson compete for pack spots alongside Gary Lord whilst former Queens Park amateur Dave Stephenson has held the hooking role in recent weeks.

like daisies in the lawn.


Poor old Doncaster look like becoming an annexe of Sheffield Eagles.

I was selighted - except for one certain afternoon - to see Dony doing so well, but my, how the bubble has burst.


How ironic it is that after stumbling through endless financial crises when they were the laughing stock of Rugby League, that they should go under when things at last came right on the field. Sport is cruel.

Oldham have ideas on spending umpteen millions on improvements at The Watersheddings to bring the ground and its facilities right up among the top flight in RL.


I wish them every success in their ambitions . . . as long as they manage to make the place an overcoat or two warmer.





"It's difficult to compare things with Australia but there are some good young blokes here at the club with a number who could do really well. If the club can keep them all together then the future looks good."


Another endorsement for some of our emerging youngsters but obviously there remains the need for players of Tony's experience and calibre to help in bringing them through.
