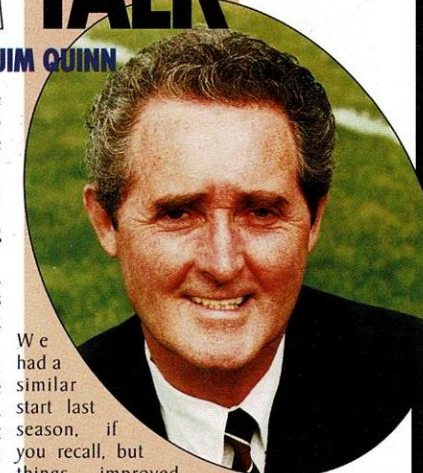

BOARDROOM TALK

BY OLDHAM RLFC CHAIRMAN JIM QUINN



The academy side is going to play an ever increasing role in Oldham's future as we strike out towards Super League. Clubs these days are putting more and more emphasis on their youth policies and Oldham will be no exception.

We have already seen 19 year old Jimmy Cowans and Chris McKinney in the senior side at Warrington and we are gradually ensuring that the average age of our Alliance side is dropping. At Hull the other night, we had Chris McAndrew, an Academy boy, on the bench and two or three other members of the under 19 side there to make up the squad and help out on the night in a backroom role.

Seventeen year olds Paul Deacon, a scrum half from the Wigan area, and winger Joe McNicholas, another 17 year old from Rochdale, have pledged their futures to the club and are coming along nicely in the Academy side.

Three 15 year olds from Royton Tigers have also pledged their futures to Oldham, Mark Powell, Andrew Taplin, Jimmy Bowmer along with another 15 year old Dale Aldred from Leigh.

There are others to come, too. We are constantly in the market place for young talent and although we are not alone we hope that our Academy coach and youth development officer, Brian Gartland, can unearth a few gems, with the help of Alliance team coach Graham Beale and the senior man, Andy Goodway and Alan McCurrie.

Many years ago it was Brian who "discovered" Andy Goodway and first brought him to the Oldham club.

We wouldn't complain if Brian could find

one or two more like Andy. On a more serious note, the youth policy is going to form a major part of our structure. We are prepared to invest in it because if we can find the right quality of youngsters and develop them along sound professional lines, it will be money well spent for securing the clubs future.

One thing that has caught my attention, while watching some Academy games this season, is the size of the boys who represent some of the teams.

St. Helens came here for a pre season friendly and the Oldham lads must have conceded nearly a stone a man in weight. There was a similar story when Halifax played there last week. They were also a massive side and it was their extra strength, size and weight which eventually wore down our boys in the second half.

We also conceded weight when drawing 18-18 at Featherstone in our first game of the season, so the message is loud and clear, as time goes on and our game develops there is going to be increasing importance attached to size. I know the old saying "A good, big 'un will always beat a good little 'un." That's been around along time, but I think it is more true today than it has ever been. You have only to look at the size of first teams to see how the trend is going.

As we put even more importance on weight building and full time training it will become even more necessary for teams to sign up big men, so it naturally follows that, when signing up Academy boys, one must always be conscious of a players size.

Like the fans, we in the boardroom have also been disappointed by a poor start to the season at senior level with four defeats from our first four matches.

We had a similar start last season, if you recall, but things improved and went on to finish tenth in the first division and reach the semi final of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup. Let's hope we quickly get things sorted out for this season and make sure that we don't have an equally bad start when Super League takes off next March.

In welcoming Bradford Bulls to Watersheddings today, there is a special word of welcome to Peter Deakin, the Bulls new marketing executive and their new coach from Australia Brian Smith.

Peter used to play amateur RL here in Oldham, then he became a professional at Watersheddings, having been brought up in the game at my old amateur club, Oldham St Annes.

He is a member of a well known local rugby league family. The Deakins have contributed a great deal to rugby league in this area and we wish Peter every success in his new post at Odsal.

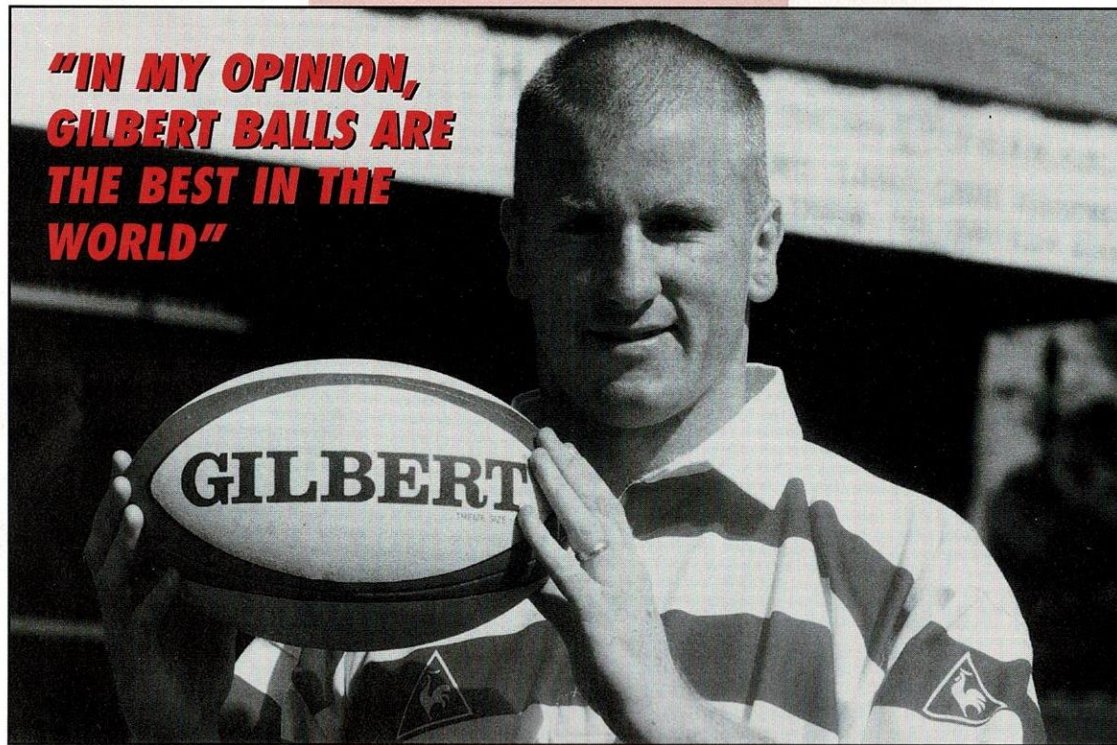

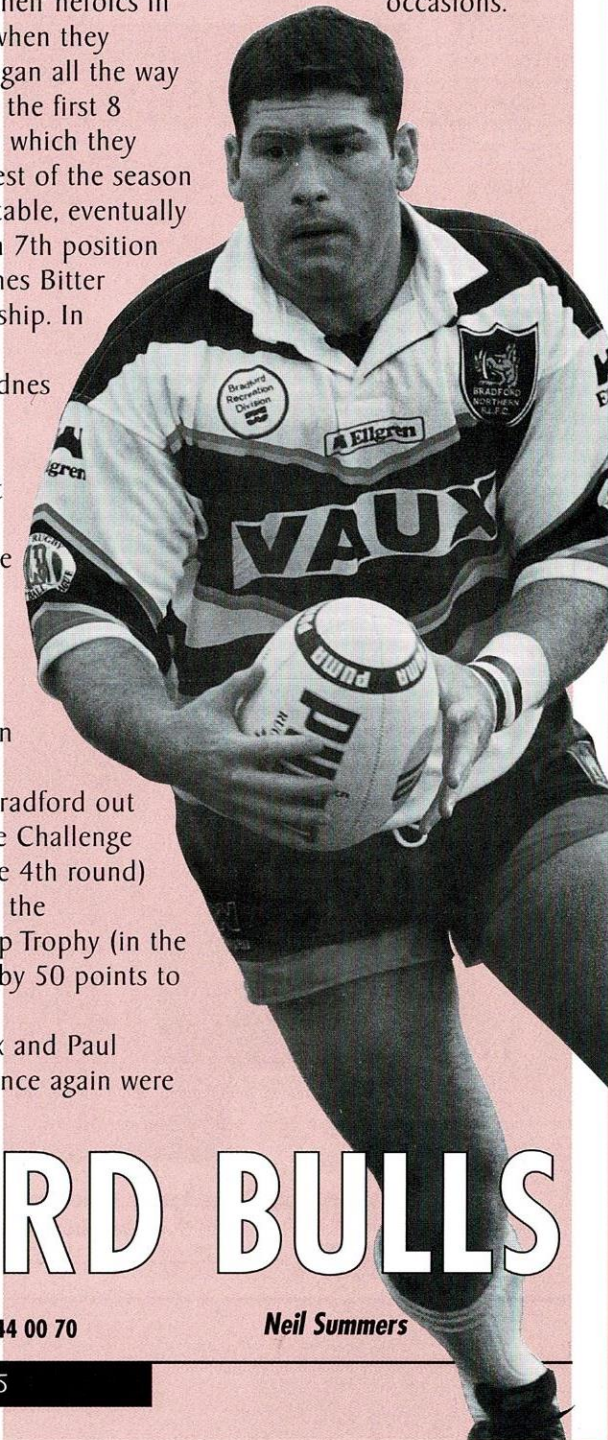
This season sees the dawn of a new era for the Bradford Bulls Rugby League outfit. Gone are Bradford Northern. It is the Bulls who will contest the Centenary season and go on into Super League. Also gone is coach Peter Fox and players Dave Watson (to Sydney Tigers), Trevor Clark, David Heron and Neil Holding (all retired) as the West Yorkshire outfit strive to compete with the Wigan's and Leeds of our game. The close season has been a very exciting time if you are a Bradford supporter. Former Saint Tommy Hodginson, ex-Widnes star Andy Ireland and young Loiner Jonathan Scales have joined the club as has St. John Ellis (For the Centenary season) from Queensland Crushers. However, the best news for the Bull's faithful was the announcement that Peter Fox's replacement was to be non other than Brian Smith from St.George in Australia. Brian is thought to be the most progressive coach in the World by many RL critics and along with his new right hand

man Matthew Elliott may make a significant improvement to the Bulls outfit.

Last season was a very disappointing affair for Bradford Northern following their heroics in 1993/94 when they pushed Wigan all the way apart from the first 8 matches in which they won, the rest of the season was forgettable, eventually finishing in 7th position in the Stones Bitter Championship. In the Regal Trophy Widnes ended Northern's interests at the 4th round stage following wins over St. Esteve (France). Whitehaven and Leeds knocked Bradford out of both the Challenge Cup (in the 4th round) 46-30 and the Premiership Trophy (in the 1st round by 50 points to 30.

Deryck Fox and Paul Newlove once again were

Bradford's main attacking strengths but weaknesses in defence saw them concede 60 points once over 50 points twice over 40 points twice and over 30 points on a further 6 occasions.

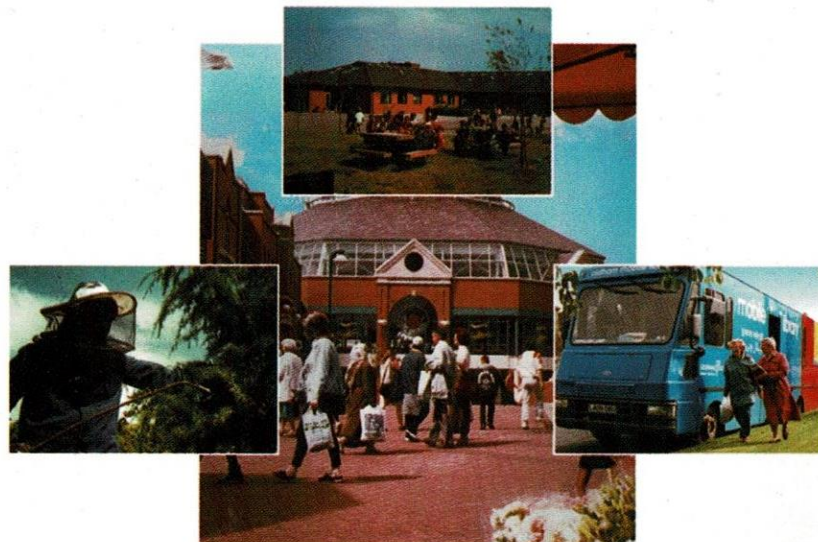

I think we were all on a "downer" after our home defeat by Halifax last Friday night because we realised we had had 75 per cent of the play, yet still finished up on the losing side courtesy of Paul Rowley.

We failed to take our chances and turn our pressure into points and Halifax punished us when Rowley twice broke from acting half-back to score long-range tries.

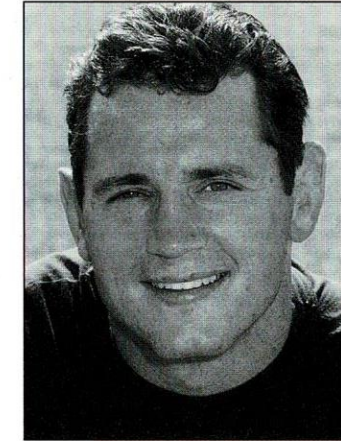
It is fair to say we produced most of the football that was served up for the Sky viewers, but it is equally true to concede that we panicked at times and produced some dumb rugby, with the result that a lot of possession was handed over in the Halifax quarter.

I didn't think Halifax produced much in the way of entertaining football, but I have to admit that their defence was brilliant. Steve Simms has obviously got them well drilled defensively. They were a shining example to everyone of how to defend a lead after they had gone ahead with a lucky try in which Simon Baldwin was played on-side only because a clearing kick by Carl Briggs bounced off Joe Faimalo as he moved in to put the kicker under pressure.

We were desperately unlucky to concede a try like that so early in the game, but we picked ourselves up off the floor and went back at them only to "bomb" a few scoring chances after dominating territorially.

We were still very much in the game when John Schuster kicked his second goal to put Halifax 8-0 in front, but it all began to go wrong when Rowley scuttled away from dummy half to score the first of his two tries against the run of play.

We didn't deserve to be 15-0 down at half-time when considering the balance of play and the amount of ball we had, but credit must go to the Halifax defence. We had a mountain to climb when Rowley



did it on us again to give his side a 21-0 lead and our only reward was the try late on by Darren Abram on a Francis Maloney pass.

We played some good rugby at times, but came away with nothing. And I hate to keep asking the fans to be patient and pointing out that we are going through a building process when I know they want to see us winning matches and picking up league points.

We must learn to play for 80 minutes and not lose concentration at vital times. In this day and age you don't want opponents making breaks from acting half-back and going 40 yards to the line. Rowley cut us to pieces, but some of our players switched off at vital times and he was good enough to spot it and turn it to his advantage. However, you can rest assured that we are working hard behind the scenes to put things right and get our first win of the season as quickly as possible.

You might recall that we had a similar start last season, but things started to come right for us eventually. For much of the season we were in a position to challenge for a top-eight spot and although we fell away at the end and finished tenth we got to the semi-final of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup. Perhaps better times are just around the corner.

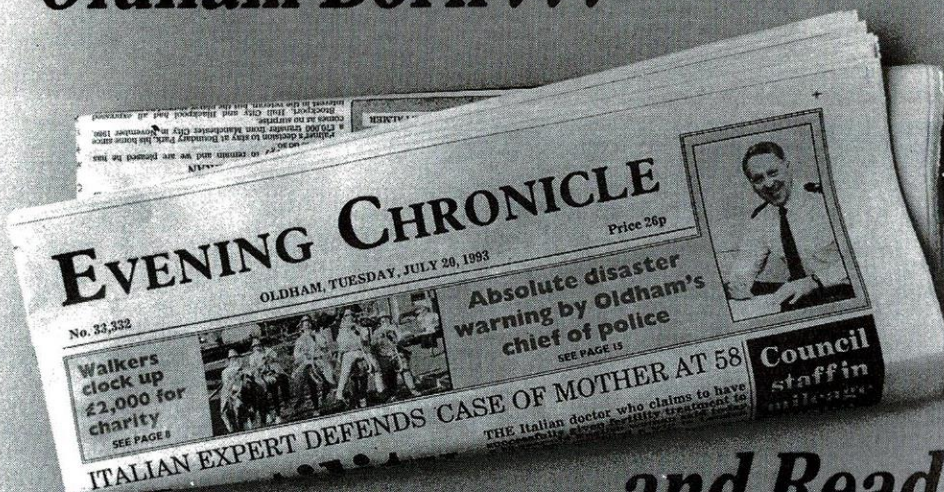

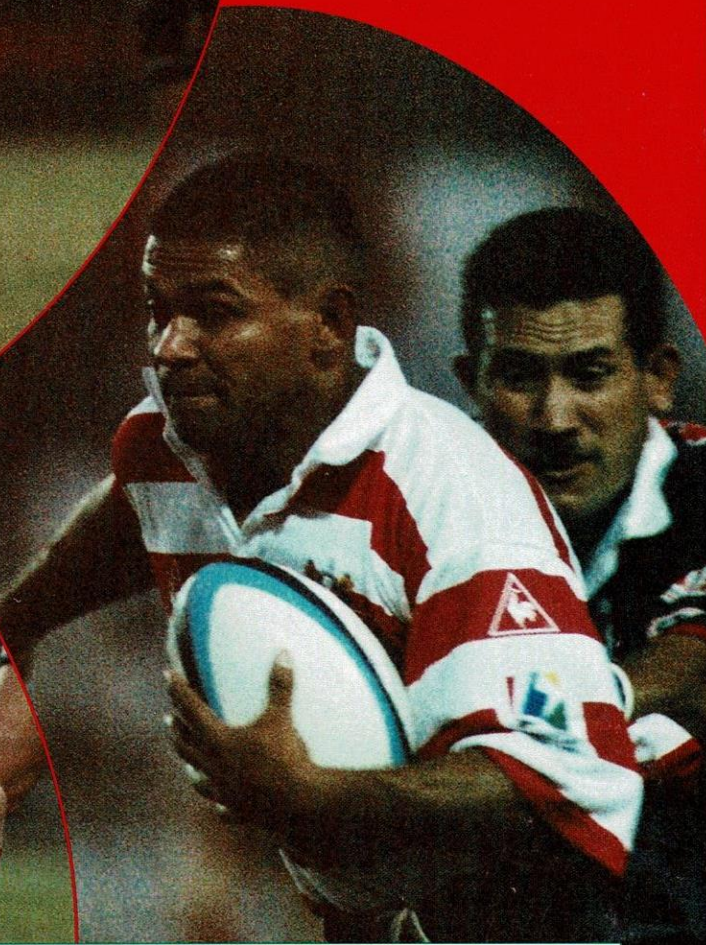
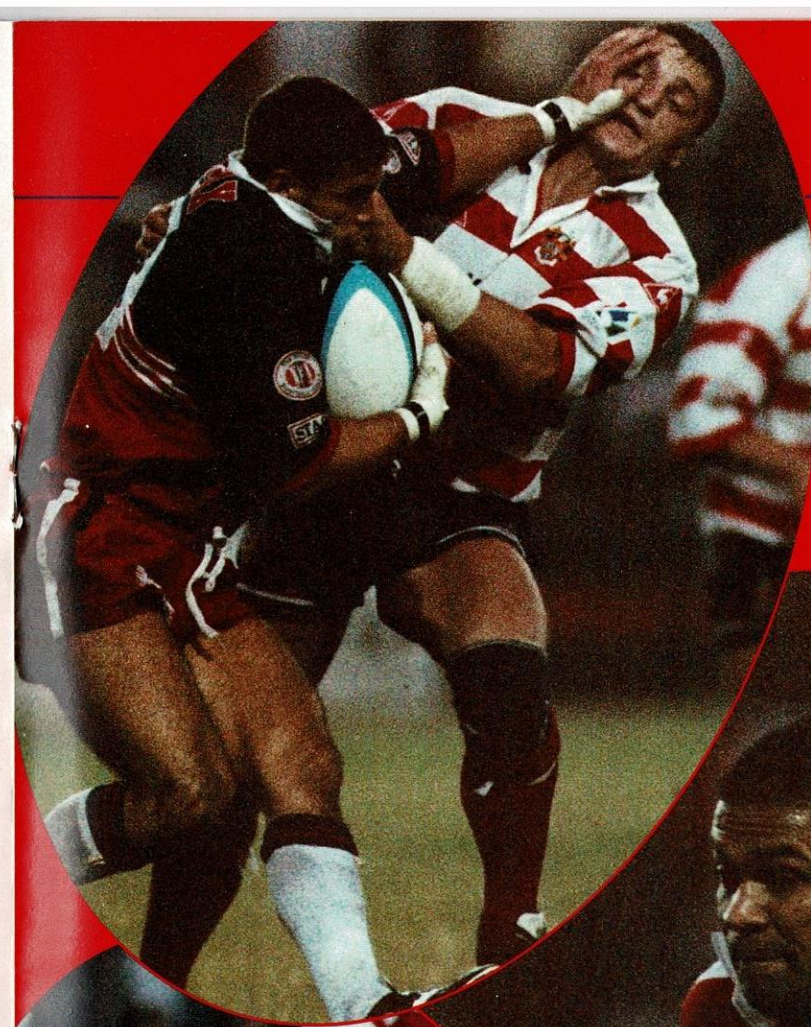

DEVELOPMENT NEWS

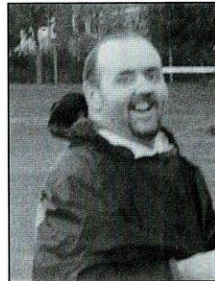

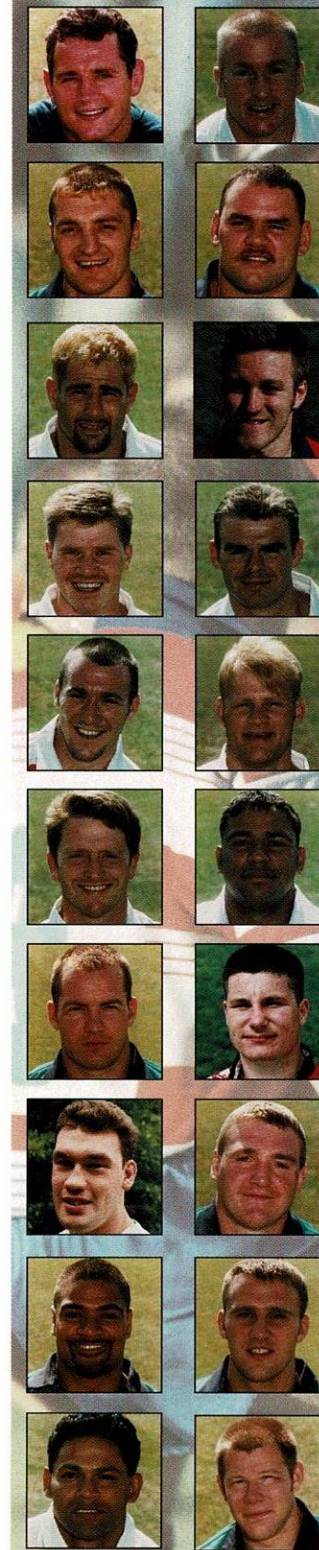
The third squad has been reformed after a twelve month

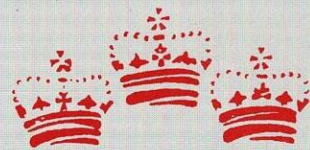

This has not been the best of times to be either an Oldham or an R.L. fan. Although we played some good rugby in parts in both games, there was certainly not a lot of fun being a Goodway supporter on the terraces at the Warrington and Halifax games. And the pathetic cancellation of the Huddersfield centenary celebrations, followed by more drug abuse allegations, not to mention the continuing fall-outs between the RFL and BARLA in England, and between the Murdoch and Packer camps in Australia, is all very depressing. Would Lindsay have bothered to set up his 'investigation' into the Oldham team selection at Warrington had it not been for Steve's strongly-expressed criticisms? I think not. The power of the media! In many ways, though, both sides to the debate have some

right on their side. Steve is arguing that sides should play their best sides at all times to make the centenary season meaningful - which is true. And both the RFL and Sky have to argue that line. On the other hand, we all know that really it is not meaningful, except for Wigan and possibly one or two other clubs whose chance of landing the prize money in the premier league has not already gone out of the window. As far as we are concerned at Oldham, the proof of the pudding will come next October, when we shall know our position at the end of the first Super League season. Until then, we have got to have patience, and faith in Andy Goodway. A look at some of the top sides' team selections so far this season certainly shows the way the game is going. In particular, Leeds, Wigan, St.Helens,

Warrington and Castleford have all got more than a handful of pacey youngsters in their first team squads, and they are already becoming established premier division players. Similar trends have been evident this season in the Winfield Cup, too. Given that, Andy Goodway's avowed policy can be seen to have even more validity. One thing which seems evident already in the new season is that both first and second divisions seem likely to be genuinely competitive - and that can only be good for the game, and, in the long-run, for spectator interest. What is most crucially needed now is more emphasis on, and expertise in marketing what is on offer. Once the centenary season is out of the way, let us hope that the RFL get their act together with the clubs on that.

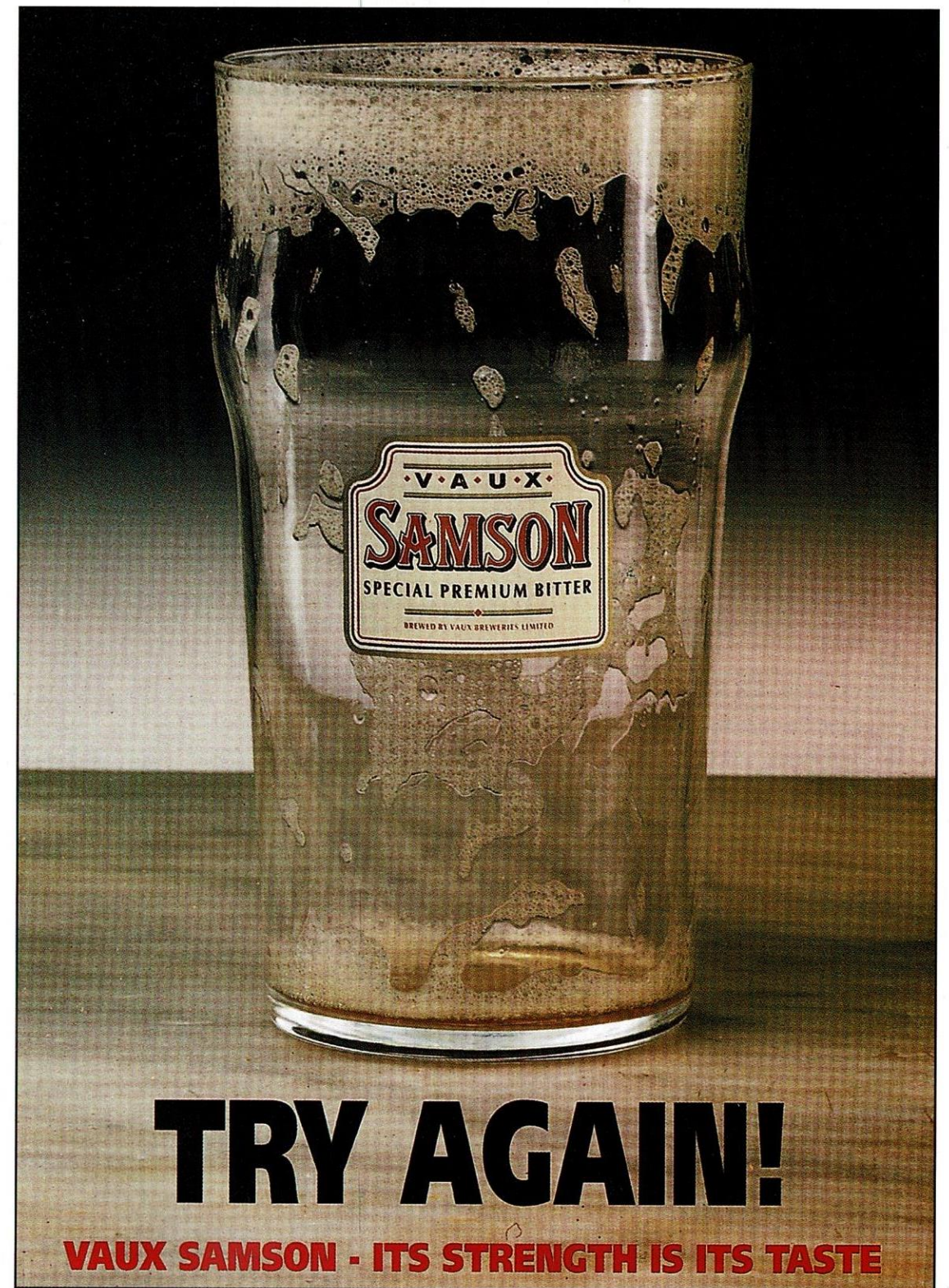

MEMORY MATCH

DON YATES LOOKS BACK AT A MATCH FROM YESTERYEAR

This afternoon's visitors to Watersheddings are Bradford Bulls, the oldest rugby club in Yorkshire and one which has had a chequered history since being formed back in 1863. There have been good times like their five Championship successes and their four trips to Wembley but they have also endured some poor times. Perhaps the most desperate period in the clubs history came in 1963. Bradford ended the 1962-63 season at the bottom of Division Two with just two victories from their 26 league matches. The 1963-64 season began in similar disappointing fashion. Their opening 13 league matches brought just one victory and in late November a 29-0 home defeat against Barrow attracted just 324 spectators. Two weeks later they lost at home to Leigh before on Saturday, 14th December they were to visit Watersheddings. On the Wednesday prior to that fixture Bradford announced that due to a financial crisis they had no option but to disband. At the time it was thought that professional rugby league would never be played in that city again. Of course the club was reborn the following summer after a great deal of hard work by many Bradford rugby enthusiasts. New chairman Joe Phillips promised at the rebirth of the club that 'we will win a major trophy within three years'. That was in July 1964. The 1964-65 season came and went without a major trophy on the Odsal mantelpiece but Northern finished in mid-table and played some attractive rugby which drew some sizable crowds to Odsal. The early weeks of the 1965-66 season saw Bradford win four of their opening five league matches as well as defeat the touring Kiwis. The Yorkshire Cup campaign saw them win 19-2 at Keighley and then defeat Hull KR at Odsal 12-6.

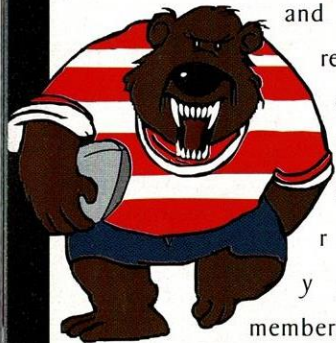
Northern were confident of defeating Huddersfield at home in the semi-final but the Fartowners drew 7-7 at Odsal. The replay took place just 24 hours later when Northern pulled off an unexpected 7-4 victory. Bradford had not won the Yorkshire Cup for 12 years and blocking their path this time were Hunslet who had enjoyed an easier route to the final with home wins against Doncaster 8-2, Hull 9-8 and Castleford 17-10. The final was staged at Headingley and attracted a crowd of 17,522. The teams lined up for that match as follows: Bradford Northern: Jack Scattergood, Lionel Williamson, Ian Brooke, Alan Rhodes, Willie Walker, Dave Stockwell, Tommy Smales, Albert Tonkinson, Denis Morgan, Dave Hill, Gil Ashton, Terry Clawson & John Rae. Hunslet: Billy Langton, Barry Lee, Geoff Shelton, Arthur Renton, Tommy Thompson, Alan Preece, Alan Marchant, Denis Hartley, Bernard Prior, Billy Baldwinson, Bill Ramsey, Geoff Gunney & Fred Ward. Many critics reckoned that the superb Hunslet pack would win the day but it was the Bradford back line which was to prove decisive. In the first half speedy centre Ian Brooke scored a superb 70 yard try which enabled Northern to go in at half-time with a 7-3 lead. After the interval Australian test winger Lionel Williamson crossed for a brace of tries and with Terry Clawson landing four goals, Northern had won the cup 17-8. For the record, Barry Lee and Tommy Thompson scored the Hunslet tries and Billy Langton slotted over a goal. Since then Northern have enjoyed eight major trophy successes including three Yorkshire Cup wins but that 1965 victory over Hunslet, coming as it did just two years after the trauma of 1963 must rank as one of the sweetest moments in the history of this famous club.
