

e welcome the London Broncos to Watersheddings this evening and in doing so, wish them every success in their efforts to

establish Rugby League as a vibrant force in our nation's capital city.

If the game is to expand to any significant degree outside its native heath, it is essential that a power base is created in London and we now have the best ever chance of seeing

The creation of Super League and the link up with the world famous Brisbane Broncos club in Australia have given the London version of the Broncos an ideal opportunity to "make it happen" in the south east.

Several players from Brisbane will have jetted across the world in the past few days to play for London and I'm sure some of them will be in the side tonight even if they didn't make it in time for last Sunday's televised game between Broncos and Leeds at Brentford. In the days of the old eight club second division we played each other four times and frankly, got to know each other just a little too well, but we haven't played the Broncos for a season or two so it will be especially nice to welcome their "new look" club to Oldham for this evening's game.

Like all matches in this Stones Centenary Championship each team will have four substitutes on the bench and you can wager that both coaches will use all four at some time during the game in order to spread the workload and make maximum use of the resources at their disposal.

I make that point because I think there is a need for everyone connected with the game, including spectators, too fully understand that League has now become a 17 man game. At one time years ago, coaches tended only to

pull players off if they were injured.

They then graduated to withdrawing players if any one was playing particularly badly and, as such, there was some form of stigma attached to a player who was pulled off and replaced if he wasn't injured.

All that has changed. The use of substitutes is a far more sophisticated thing nowadays. Injuries and poor form play a part, of course, but tactics now come into the equation. A coach will be weighing up how a game is going, what he can do to take advantage of something he sees as a weakness in the opposition or how he might shift the make up of his team to counter a change of tactics by the opposition.

He will also want to take off a player for a breather if he thinks the player is "blowing" a bit. This applies particularly to forwards. He might also want to withdraw a player if he is running hot and looks like getting into a spot of bother with the referee or touch judges. You can understand players perhaps being a little disgruntled in the heat of a game if they are taken off when they believe they are playing as well as everyone else, but there are many, many reasons why substitutions are made these days and no one can take the field But the chance of picking up that extra expecting to be necessarily still there at the end of the game.

The increase in the number of substitutes from two to four has given the coach even more scope to perm his options and I'm sure it won't be long before everyone in the game accepts that League is now played by 17 men. After all, the full 17 get paid, whether they take the field or not, so why not make us of all 17 so long as it is to the overall benefit of the

Turning to the Barrie McDermott case, I can confirm that we have written to the Rugby

for the tribunal to reconvene and take another look at

what has happened to Barrie's career in the past 14 months. By order of the tribunal we picked up

£60,000 for Barrie from Wigan in the shape of an initial £40,000, plus another £20,000 when he won his first Great Britain cap. We were also going to receive £20,000 after he had played 30 matches for Wigan and another £20,000 after 60 matches.

£40,000 on the number of games played has now gone following Barrie's move to Leeds for a reported £100,000. It means that, although Barrie played only 13 senior games. Wigan have made a profit of £40,000 on him and we have lost out on the possible pick up of another £40,000.


There was nothing in the tribunal rulling to cater for any percentage to Oldham if ever he left Central Park, so there you have the reasons why we feel that we have lost out once again. We are hoping the Rugby League will be sympathetic to what we have to say.



E go into the lion's den on Sunday to play Wigan at Central Park so I popped down there last Wednesday to take a look at the champions in their game against Castleford. They won 40-8 and they were

phenomenal. Castleford played well, they really did. They would have beaten most premiership sides with that performance but they were still miles behind Wigan as the score would suggest. Frankly, I don't see any club catching up with them in the foreseeable future or matching their power base. They are so far ahead it's frightening, but I think people must realise that this is no quick fix. Wigan put their strategy in place many years ago and they have slowly gone from strength to strength, improving all the time and, nine times out of ten, if not ten out of ten, making right decisions along the way.

They are out on their own...and next in the pecking order come three or four teams with little to choose between them. St Helens are in that group and on the night Wigan were destroying Castleford, Saints were putting 60 points past Sheffield Eagles.

Despite our disappointing start to the season I am absolutely sure that we can be very competitive against most of the teams that will figure in Super League. At present, things have not been going our way, but I am sure you will see a big difference in our performances once we get that elusive first win under our belts

We all agree that we played badly against Bradford Bulls, yet there were only six points in it at the end. What would we have done if we had played well?

We were all on a bit of a "downer" after the game, but we had a very straight-talking and constructive team meeting the following night and several points were aired and agreed upon. Everyone seemed much happier and more relaxed by Tuesday night when we put the Bradford game well and truly behind us and started to focus on



our opponents this evening, London Broncos. I had to pen these notes before London played Leeds last Sunday, but they were expected to give a good account of themselves in front of the Sky TV cameras at Brentford soccer ground and I know that, whatever the result, they will come to Watersheddings tonight fully prepared and eager to do well.

Building on the success of the Quantum Schools Cups which have involved 3000 players over the past 2 years, a school league has been formed to play a short season in September and October. There is no doubt that playing for School still holds an

The real impact will be that between now and November almost 1000 senior school players will play rugby league matches. All the schools matches will be publicised so try to get out and see some of our young players.

QUOTES & HISTORICAL HAPPENINGS

It was on this day in 1933 that the City of London saw its first ever competitive Rugby League club match. White City Stadium was the setting for the London Highfield v Wakefield Trinity Northern Rugby League fixture. The London side scored two tries through Jimmy Walker and Joe Gordon but Trinity had the last laugh winning 9-8 thanks mainly to the efforts of Ernie Pollard who scored all Trinity's points with a try and three goals. Exactly twelve months later the Italian actress Sophia Loren was born which must make her just over thirty years of age! It was on this day in 1975 that a crowd of 63,047 attended Sydney Cricket Ground for the historic Australian Grand Final between Eastern Suburbs and St. George. Easts won 38-0 to record the biggest winning margin in a grand final. It was on this day in 1987 that Swinton forced a 32-32 draw at Hunslet in a First Division match to equal the highest ever scoring draw. It was on this day in 1987 that the first organised motor cycle race took place. Eight riders were involved in the 476 mile race from Paris to Nantes and back. The winner was M. Chevalier on a Michelin-Dion who covered the distance at an average speed of just under 23mph. And it was on this day in 1993 that Oldham signed Andy Goodway from Leeds. He was signed merely as a player but towards the end of that 1993-94 season he as appointed assistant player coach to Bob Lindner. Goodway took over as head coach at the beginning of last season and he is now regarded as one of the best young coaches in the game, hence being involved in coaching the England squad for the forthcoming World Championship competition.

see that the Rugby Union chaps in England at least are going to enjoy another year of not paying tax on their earnings from playing the game. Their Twickenham bosses have agreed to go officially professional - but not this season. What a farce! I know as a fact of a fifth division side in the Midlands whose players were on £70 a man when playing a 'friendly' against a side from the North West two weeks ago. And I thought I had read that Mike Catt (the South African who is being groomed to take over at stand off from that national ex-hero, Rob Andrew) has proudly proclaimed himself to be 'England's' first full-time professional R.U. player. There is currently much speculation about the likely effects on our game of the world-wide revolution in the fifteen-a-side code. One will undoubtedly be a reduction in the number of their players changing codes - for example, the New Zealand winger Lomu would surely have been playing

R.L. now had it not been for the ability of his R.U. paymasters to match the significant offers he reputedly received from both English and Winfield Cup R.L. sides. There will be an openly free market - and in general, the clubs with the biggest financial clout will get the best players, whichever the code. And almost certainly, there will be some movement the other way. In the short term, such current R.L. players as Davies, Tait and Moriarty seem very likely to seek places in the new R.U. set-up when they are contractually free to do so and why shouldn't they? I wouldn't necessarily assume that they are going to go 'back home', though. I have already heard a story that the Newcastle United boss' takeover of Newcastle-Gosforth R.U. club will not be the only one, and that two well-known sides based in the Manchester borough of Trafford, have already had equivalent talks, and have their eyes, and their potentially very large bank balances, on one or two big-name ex-R.U. pros

currently playing in the North West. Of greater concern, I believe, is the role of the T.V. moguls. It is difficult to believe that the R.U. will ever generate the cash necessary to pay their players the sort of money that will satisfy them without major T.V. contracts. And the piper ultimately plays the tune. We have to accept that R.U. has currently at least, a greater world wide profile than we do. So won't Murdoch want to invest there? And if so, will he also persist with the R.L.? How firm are our contracts with his set-up? There couldn't be a more important time for R.L. expansion to be pressed ahead, nor a worse time for rows with the fledgling S. African side to be allowed to fester. What did Wigan offer for Barry McDermott when they went to the transfer tribunal when they bought his services from us? And what did they value him at, 13 first team appearances later? As Jim Quinn said, the whole system is demonstrably shown to be a



DON YATES LOOKS BACK AT A MATCH FROM YESTERYEAR momentous occasion were as follows:

Keeping the Rugby League flag flying down in London has always been a difficult task. Prior to the formation of Fulham fifteen years ago there were three unsuccessful attempts to establish the game in our capital city.

In 1933 London Highfield spent one season of their nomadic life playing out of the White City Stadium, Shepherds Bush. Two years later London had the luxury of two clubs when Acton & Willesden and Streatham & Mitcham entered the league. Unfortunately Acton & Willesden lasted just one season and Streatham & Mitcham two. The dream of a successful London club seemed to have died with these three clubs so it was a major surprise when, in June 1980, it was announced that a club based at the Fulham soccer ground would contest the 1980-81 season. Recruitment began with Reg Bowden, the experienced Widnes scrum-half, who was appointed player-coach. He assembled a talented and experienced squad which included five other former Widnes colleagues amongst his squad of 17 professionals. When the fixtures were released it was seen that the Rugby Football League had played their part by giving Fulham a home match with which to start their season. What's more, their opponents would be Wigan, relegated from the First Division during the previous season but still a glamour outfit with a capable playing staff. The media attention given to that first match on Sunday, 14th September 1980 guaranteed a big gate but there were serious doubts about the playing strength of Fulham whose squad had only

rained together for a matter of nine weeks before

this inaugural match. The teams for this

Substitutes: Les Bolton & Billy Melling. The attendance was 9,554, most of whom appeared to enjoy what for them was a new experience. Iain MacCorouodale scored the first points with an early penalty and Welsh Rugby Union recruit Adrian Cambriani scored the first try. Fulham, swept along by the momentous occasion and the enthusiastic crowd, went on to record a memorable 24-5 victory. For the record, Adrian Cambriani (2), Neil Tuffs (2) and Dave Allen scored tries with Jain MacCorquodale (4) and Dave Eckersley (drop) adding goals. Bernard Coyle scored a consolation try for Wigan and George Fairbairn landed their goal. It proved a successful opening season for Fulham who gained promotion and played before average home gates of over 7,000. Since then the club has

had its share of triumphs, disappointments, changes of both venues and names but still they PLUS continue to keep the game alive in London. 


