



This evenings visitors to Knowsley Road, Oldham are currently 2nd bottom of the Stones Bitter Centenary Championship with six points from their 13 matches. Under coach Andy Goodway the Watersheddings outfit hasn't been afraid to experiment during the season and have given a run out to no less than 29 players. Injuries also haven't helped matters with them finding it very difficult to find a settled line up. Their 3 victories have each been at their Watersheddings home where London 19-8, Workington 30-26 and Castleford 25-20 have each been conquered. St. Helens 18-44, Halifax 4-21, Bradford Bulls 24-30 and Leeds 14-43, however have left Watersheddings with the points. On their travels Oldham have vet to win. They have been beaten at Castleford 22-28, Warrington 8-40, Wigan 12-42, London 14-46, Sheffield Eagles 18-36 and Bradford Bulls 10-14. In the Regal Trophy Oldham travelled to 1st Division Widnes in a tricky 2nd round tie and unfortunately left beaten by 32 points to 8. Andy Goodway is currently attempting to build a squad of players capable of competing with the best for the commencement of Super League and summer rugby. They will play their home matches at Boundary Park, home of Oldham Athletic FC and are currently in negotiations with RFL and Wigan about switching their opening Super League fixture from Central Park to Oldham so they can generate early interest for Super League in the town. Since the end of the last season Paul Atcheson, Ian Gildart, Afi Leuila, Francis Maloney and Rob Myler have joined the Roughyeds whilst Nigel Heslop, Shaun Irwin, Mike Kuiti and Wilson Marsh have departed.

Last season Oldham performed credibly. In the Stones Bitter Championship they finished in 10th position with eleven wins and a draw for a total of 23 points from their 30 matches. In the Regal Trophy Oldham reached the 3rd round were they went down at Widnes 6-20 following a 2nd Round 28 nil home success over Hull KR. In the Challenge Cup with a little luck Oldham could have gone all the way to the final. Eventual winners Wigan ended their interest in the semi final at the Alfred McAlpine Stadium when they won a very exciting game by 48 points to 20. It had until then, been a great cup run, which had seen Bramley beaten at Watersheddings by 70

points to 10 in round 4, Warrington beaten at Wilderspool 17-6 in the 5th round and Huddersfield beaten at home 23-12 in the quarter finals.

Gary Lord

Gary Lord has been playing top Division RL now for over 10 years since he made his debut for Castleford in the 1984-85 season. At 29 years of age he has been one of the most honest, consistent hard working forwards in the game and his opponents hold him in great respect for his ability to take up the football, his eye for a gap, his solid defence and the sheer amount of work he gets through. During his career Oldham are his 4th top side following spells at Castleford, Leeds and Halifax. The highlight to date was whilst he was at Cas when he played full back in the team which won the 1986 Challenge Cup by the narrowest of margins, one point over Hull KR.

Gary played for Castleford from the 1984-85

season until he moved to Headingley for the

1988-89 campaign making 38-14 apps from which he scored 9 tries for the Wheldon Road outfit. Whilst at Leeds he made 37-27 apps, scoring 4 tries between 1988-89 and 1990-91 before he moved to Halifax where he staved until the end of the 1993-94 season, whilst at Fax Gary 77+12 apps and scored 10 tries. Since his more to Oldham he has had a new lease of life. He is seldom spectacular but is one of those players that you only realise his worth when he is missing. Gary has been unfortunate never to have gained representative recognition for his skills and has proven that the £35,000 transfer fee Oldham had to pay for his services was money very well spent. CLASS OF '49

Mention Parr Central School in immediate post-war sporting circles and thoughts inevitably turned to Rugby League, with a glance at the honours board confirming their oval-ball prowess.

he prestigious Daily Dispatch Shield, which was competed for by teams throughout Lancashire and the Waring and Ellison Cups all found their way to the sideboard at the Seath Avenue seat of learning from 1946 onwards.

Despite the absence of the gleaming trophy I am reliably informed by second rower Terry Brunskill that the accompanying photograph is of the Parr 'Cent' team which lifted the Ellison Cup three years later.

The likely lads caught by the camera were back row, left to right: Terry Brunskill, Alec Davies, Johnny Bridge, Eric Ainsworth, Henry Eden, Norman Griffiths, middle row: unknown, Johnny Usher, John Dickinson, Ronnie Ormrod, Gordon Rigby. Front: Jackie Gibson, George Waring.

Almost half a century on it is an interesting exercise to pen a reflective word or two on what fate had in store for the 13 toughtackling strong running squad who became the pride of Parr when bringing home the silverware.

Sad to relate but centre Ormrod has since died, and what is equally certain is that stand off 'Todder and flying winger Davies both sampled senior Rugby League at Knowsley Road as did centre Gibson at Hilton Park, Leigh.

Schoolboy prodigy Dickenson blossomed into a real star turn at Saints in being a member of the Championship winning team of 1953 and, but for a tragic leg injury would have been in the first local side to lift the Challenge Cup against Halifax at Wembley in 1956.



SAINTS IN SUMMER

A first ever cut price family ticket and a savings voucher scheme are the main features of a newly devised St. Helens sales campaign for season passes for the revolutionary 1996 Super League.

Parents purchasing a season pass for the terraces will be eligible to buy a pass for their under 16 children to gain admission for £2 per match, half the

Saints Chief Executive, David Howes, the architect of the new sales drive, said: "The parent and child discount scheme is designed to reward family units of loyal supporters, providing a 25% total saving on turnstile costs."

St. Helens have printed vouchers valued at £10 and £5 towards the total cost of Super League passes.

Howes explained "The vouchers are the ideal Xmas gift, alternatively being used as a weekly or monthly savings scheme. The voucher can add up to or contribute a portion of, the total cost of the season ticket, which represents traditional good value for the dedicated supporter."

A new extended range of benefits are being offered to Saints' season pa holders for the inaugural Super League campaign, which kicks off at Knowsley Road with a mouth watering Good Friday derby clash with arch rivals Wigan.

For the first time, passholders will be eligible for two seat tickets per pass for the 1996 Silk Cut Challenge Cup final at Wembley, should Saints qualify.

The Super League pass gains admission to all first team matches, which will be promoted to double headers by being preceded with under 19

Academy games, plus alliance fixtures currently scheduled for Thursday evenings.

There is also priority purchase for Cup ties and a new 5% discount in the Club Shop at Knowsley Road.

"This is a wider range of rewards for the committed fan, the start of a series of initiatives to capitalise on the opening season of summer rugby," added Howes. Admission prices for the 1996 Super League are £12 Adults seats (season pass £115, saving £17), £9 Junior/OAP seats (season pass £85, saving £14), £7 Adult ground (season pass £65, saving £12) and £4 Junior/OAP ground (season pass £35, saving £9). These are the first price increases for three seasons. The parent child scheme is £65 for the Adult ground pass, plus £22 for the

A REQUEST FROM PROFESSOR JOHN ASHTON, REGIONAL DIRECTOR OF HEALTH IN THE NORTH WEST NHS ORGAN DONOR REGISTER

Very few of us will have a transplant, but if we do, we want to make sure a donor organ will be available at our time of need.

Anyone who receives a new organ is entirely dependent on the generosity of individuals who register as organ Donors or carry the Organ Donor card. Thanks to them, some 3,000 people literally received a "gift of life" last year alone.

Sadly their kindness was not enough. Operations that were in the realms of fantasy 30 years ago, such as kidney transplants, are commonplace today. The demand for new organs is greater than ever. Yet the supply has not kept up. Last year there were still some 5,600 people waiting for transplants.

The NHS urgently needs more people to become organ donors. If we can only recruit ten per cent more donors, we could save up to 500 more lives every year.

The best way to become an organ donor is to join the national computer register. This means that if you die the hospital can find out easily whether you wanted to donate - regardless of whether you were carrying the Organ Donor Card at the time.

You can join the register by ringing Freephone 0800 555 777 and asking for the leaflet 'Life - don't keep it to yourself'. Copies should also be available from GP surgeries, local libraries, Post Offices and Citizens' Advice Bureaux

Professor Ashton agrees with the Department of Health statement, which says that nearly 2 million people have already applied to join the Register but if it is to make the difference we hope for, more people are needed.

RULE CHANGES IN FORCE FROM MONDAY 11 DECEMBER 1995 IN ALL FIRST TEAM, ALLIANCE AND ACADEMY MATCHES

As from Monday 11th December 1995 the following four rule changes will be in force in all First, Alliance and Academy team matches.

- No striking for the ball penalty will be awarded if the marker strikes.
- The ball to be played backwards at all times even when there is no marker. If the attacking player makes a break and is tackled, he can play the ball backwards and turn around to pick up the ball and play on. If the marker dives on the ball he will be penalised for a voluntary tackle as previous rules. A penalty will be awarded if the ball is played forward.
- All scrums will be taken from 20m in from touch and not 10m - the Referee will adjudicate where the 20m mark is until all pitches are remarked. No scrum shall be packed closer than 20m to touch line.
- The scoring team restarts play after any score try, penalty, drop goal.





MYLER'S MISSION

You only have to talk to Saints' Academy coach John Myler for a few minutes to realise how passionate he is about Rugby League. John is forthright, determined and focused, his mind is clear about what he wants to see from his players.

uring a 14 year career with Widnes, Swinton and Leigh, Myler won every medal possible and played at Wembley in the Widnes team that defeated Hull Kingston Rovers in the 1981 Challenge Cup final. I spoke to him this week and asked him about his playing days.

"I started off as a scrum half, which was always my favourite position, then later played at full back before finishing up at loose forward. I had some great years at my home club Widnes when we were christened the Cup Kings. I played alongside some top players like Adams, Elwell, Laughton, Wright and Eric Hughes but I think the player I admired the most was Mike O'Neill, who signed on at the same time as me and still turns out for the Widnes A team."

"In those days we didn't study videos of the opposition or anything like that. We had a terrific team spirit and camaraderie that carried us through. Looking back on my playing days, I'd say by best memory was playing for the GB U24 team against France alongside my brother Tony."

So, I wondered how John had made his way into coaching. "I think it was a natural progression for me to move into coaching. During my playing days I was a thinker and always looking for ways to improve set moves and plays. These days I am a student of the game - a rugby dustbin! Unlike my playing days, I study lots of videos to pick up tips, identify problems or spot weaknesses. Rugby League is like a game of chess - it needs

John had been coaching at Widnes when his brother Tony was the head coach. When Tony resigned following a dispute, John followed suit. He contacted his old playing colleague Eric Hughes to register an interest in the vacant Academy post at Knowsley Road, got invited down for a chat and took the job.

There isn't much spare time in John's week these days. He works as a project engineer for a local chemical company and coaches the St, Helens U15 town team in addition to his duties with Saints Academy team. The work with the town team gives him an ideal opportunity to get a close look at some of the budding local talent. John keeps files and notes on promising young players and is involved in the setting up of a structured scouting network, so hopefully no good 'uns will slip through the net and end up at Wigan! I asked John who we should be watching out for from the current Academy team and what he looks for in player. "I don't want to single out any individual as the squad are at different stages of development and at different ages. I'm looking for attributes like technical awareness, good tackling techniques, ability to off-load in the tackle and the ability to think fast and smart. I also expect to see 100% effort and dedication particularly in training. I always trained as hard as I possibly could. You need to be at the peak of fitness to do yourself justice."

John has some interesting observations on junior rugby. "The sooner the dispute between BARLA and the RFL is sorted out the better. The best young players should be working with professional coaches as soon as possible in order to develop their full potential. The top Aussie clubs, like the Canberra Raiders, have junior teams from 13 years upwards playing in the same style as the first graders. Our schoolkids play far too many matches which can be really bad. For example last season my 11 year old son played 68 games in all - 3 a week. We are also losing too many players between the ages of 13-16 to other interests - we need to keep them playing Rugby League."

"The main purpose of my job at Saints is to get promising young players into good habits and prepare them to step upto the first team. We've got half a dozen who could make it. Whether they will or not is upto them. They have to ask themselves "How ambitious am I? Am I single minded enough? Only time will tell."
