### SILK CUT CHALLENGE CUP THIRD ROUND DRAW

Pennine League side West Bowling, who produced the shock of the silk Cut Challenge Cup Second Round when they defeated National Conference Premiership side Wigan St Patricks, got an early Christmas present today - an away trip to Second Division promotion hopefuls Carlisle in the third round.

West Bowling were written off as virtual no-hopers when they were drawn away at St Pats but, with scrum-half Terry Pool outstanding, they thoroughly deserved their 13 - 6 victory. Carlisle who have produced their fair share of shocks this season certainly will not be relishing the visit of the Yorkshire amateurs.

Conference First Division sides Eastmoor and Thornhill both knocked out premiership opposition - Eastmoor defeating Leigh Miners and Thornhill beating Hemel Hempstead.

Eastmoor now face a tough task at Second Division table-toppers Hull KR while Thatto Heath must make the short trip to Chorley Chieftans.

The Silk Cut Challenge Cup is now in its 12th season and to mark the occasion there is record prize money of £322,000 with an additional £128,000 being donated to the Rugby Football League's capital development fund.

The ten winners of the ties go into the fourth round draw along with the 11 championship and 11 First Division clubs.

The replay between Egremont and Woolston Rovers will be on Saturday 23rd December 1995, kick-off to be confirmed.

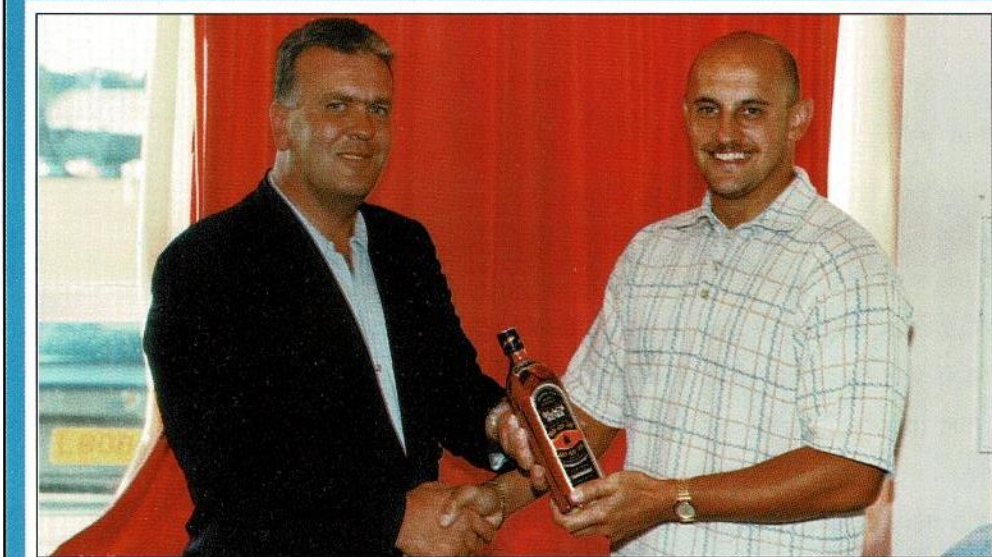

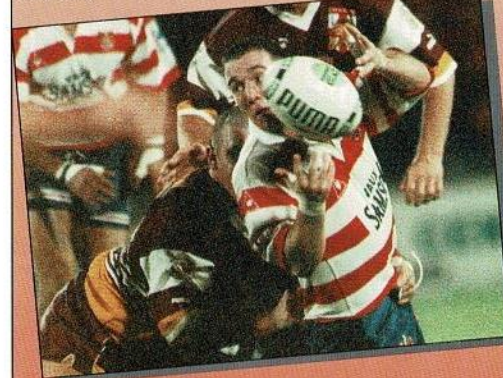
**WALLY GIBSON**

 Powerfully built stand-off and accurate positional kicker. A product of the St John Fisher junior club (Dewsbury) who turned professional with Leeds in 1990. Moved to Featherstone Rovers in 1992 and won Great Britain under-21 recognition whilst at Post Office Road. Transferred to Warrington in May 1994 but did not settle at Wilderspool and so he moved on to Oldham in May 1995 for £50,000. Took over the goal kicking duties at Watersheddings.

**MARTIN CROMPTON**  
 Scrum half, captain and the orchestrator of most of Oldham's attacking play. A former Wigan St. Patricks junior who began his professional career with Warrington. Moved back to Wigan in 1992 when he joined the senior Central Park outfit. Oldham snapped him up for a bargain £35,000 fee in September 1993. A brilliant tactical kicker who represented Ireland in last autumn's

Emerging Nations World Championship.

**STEVE GARTLAND**  
 Talented utility player who has made steady progress settling into Super League rugby. He is a product of the Oldham St. Annes junior club who turned professional with Rochdale Hornets during August 1990. Gartland was a prolific point scorer at Spalland where he notched up what was then a club record 276 points during season 1992/93. He was transferred to Oldham in July 1994 and has developed into a valuable member of the Roughyeds first team squad. Gartland has proved to be equally effective whether at stand-off or at hooker.

**CRAIG RICHARDS**  
 Strong running and enthusiastic forward. A product of the Queensbury amateur club of Bradford who turned professional with Bradford Northern in 1987. Moved to Oldham in September 1993 and has developed into an important member of the Oldham pack.

**CHRIS PARR**  
 Hard working prop. A product of the Wigan St. Patricks junior club who began his professional career with Huddersfield in 1990. Won Great Britain under-21 honours whilst at Fartown. Moved back over the Pennines in 1992 when he joined Swinton. Oldham signed him in October 1993 and he has continued to show good form at Watersheddings.

**IVAN GREEN**  
 Hard working utility forward who is particularly good on defence. A product of Golbourne juniors (Leigh) who turned professional with St Helens in 1988. He was unable to break into the first team at Knowsley Road and so moved to Oldham on a free transfer in August 1993. Can play in any back-row position as well as cover for the hooking spot.

Although he made 139 appearances for Wigan he failed to gain a regular first team spot and so moved over to Wakefield Trinity in 1994. Moved back over the Pennines to Oldham for £45,000 last June. Represented Great Britain at under-21 level during his Central Park days.

**JOE FAIMALO**  
 Hard working second-row forward who is enjoying his best run of form. A product of the Eastern Suburbs club in New Zealand, Faimalo had brief spells with Workington Town, Oldham and then Swinton during the 1991/92 season without impressing. He returned home and enjoyed success with Hawkes Bay which prompted him to return to Oldham in September 1994. His determination and stamina last season made him one of the mainstays of the Roughyded pack.

**GARY LORD**  
 A player well known here at Thrum Hall is Gary Lord. He is a product of Stanley Rangers juniors (Castleford) who joined the Senior Castleford club in 1984. Lord appeared at full-back for Castleford at Wembley in 1986 but he has since developed into a hard working second-row forward. He was transferred to Leeds in 1988 and then on to Halifax in October 1991. He made his debut later that month in a 76 - 8 home victory over Hull KR. In all, Lord made 88 appearances for Halifax and scored 10 tries before moving to Oldham in July 1994 for £35,000. He made his Oldham debut against his former club the following month when Halifax won 40 - 20 at Watersheddings.

**PAUL DAVIDSON**  
 Hard working prop or second-row forward. A product of the Hensingham junior club (Whitehaven) who turned professional with Widnes in 1990. Joined Oldham in July 1994 for £17,000. Has a fine turn of speed which he has been using to good effect in recent matches. Can also play centre.

**HOWARD HILL**  
 Outstanding young back-row forward. Joined Oldham in July 1994 from the Hensingham junior club of Whitehaven. Made steady progress and broke into the first team squad at the beginning of this season. Has given some mature performances and seems certain to win representative honours in future season.

**COACH ANDY GOODWAY**  
 Oldham's coach Andy Goodway is a product of the Redhill amateur club (Castleford) who turned professional with Oldham in 1979. He won Great Britain recognition before transferring to Wigan in 1985. Won every domestic honour with Wigan where he began his coaching career with the academy side during a lengthy playing absence with a broken arm. Spent the 1992/93 season with Leeds before returning to Watersheddings in September 1993. Was assistant coach to Bob Lundner at Watersheddings in 1994 and took over as head coach six months later. Was assistant coach to the England squad who reached the 1995 World Cup Final.

HALIFAX could be excused for developing a complex about Knowsley Road. If anything can go wrong, it will, and there's always plenty to go round. Four weeks after taking a 50-point beating in the league, the Thrum Hallers returned to face the music in the Regal Trophy and the Saints went marching in to the same old tune which left Halifax nursing broken hearts and bones in almost equal measure. Given the pre-game absence of John Schuster, the result wasn't perhaps entirely unexpected, but Steve Simms could have done without adding John Bentley and John Fieldhouse to the list of wounded as Bobby Goulding orchestrated a beating every bit as crushing as those that went before.

It all started well enough with a third-minute try for Mike Umaga, created by Craig Dean and goaled by Asa Amone, but Halifax ought to know by now that this is merely Saints' way of saying Hello. The welcome mat doesn't stay down for long, and the sides were soon level at six-apiece courtesy of a Bobby Goulding penalty plus an Andy Northey try laid on with ominous ease by Apollo Perelini and Dean Busby. Goulding's conversion edged Saints in front at 8-6, at which point Bentley ran full tilt into Perelini and discovered why the Knowsley Road sadists refer to the South Sea Islander as the Terminator. The clash of heads was part and parcel of a hard man's game, but it signalled Christmas in the stands for Bentley with a fractured cheekbone and Amone's equalising penalty shortly afterwards did no more than grant Halifax a reprieve.

Two tries inside three minutes added insult to injury, the first when Amone spilled Goulding's bomb in front of his own posts and Keiron Cunningham put Scott Gibbs over in the corner. Substitute Danny Arnold claimed

the second from Busby's pass and Halifax were looking down both barrels again as Saints took aim on their hapless victims for the second time in a month.

They contented themselves with an injury-time Goulding penalty for a 12-point half time lead, but it was no more than the calm before the storm which broke over the Thrum Hallers in the third quarter as Goulding set about booking Saints place in the semis.

Halifax had already survived Northey's claim for a try when the scrum half sent Cunningham in for his side's forth try and the Thrum Hallers could only brace themselves for what was coming and pray that it wouldn't hurt too much.



Goulding didn't keep them waiting long, launching a cross-kick for his wide receivers and taken on the full by Arnold deep in the Halifax end-zone. Umaga wasn't far away either, but it might as well have been a mile, and the Saints were out of sight in any case at 30-8.

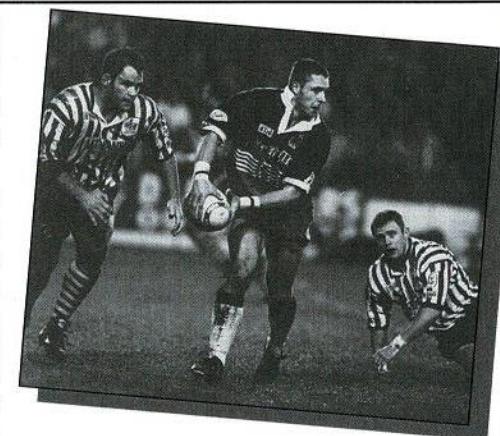
Perelini reinforced the point when he carved his way past Jackson and Umaga for the sixth try that might have carried Halifax into double figures but woke St Helens up at the same time.

The Thrum Hallers' own nightmare resumed within two minutes when Anderson's fumble was snapped up by Northey.

Desperate defence denied the centre 15 yards out, but it was strictly damage limitation stuff, and there was no one left to stop Joey Hayes' sprint from acting halfback for the try that restored the status quo at 42-14 with 10 minutes left for play.

If Steve Simms thought the worst was over, the fates had one last treat in store when Fieldhouse launched himself at the St Helens defence and out of the season with a broken jaw as the welcoming committee, Goulding among them, closed in. Battered and bruised enough already, consolation was all that was left to Halifax now and they claimed a measure of that at least when Parker, Southernwood, Jackson, Umaga, Baldwin, Gillespie and finally Baldwin again cut the margin to 42-18 in the 76th minute.

The final word, though, belonged to Saints as had the game since midway through the first half, and they claimed their just reward when Goulding launched yet another time



bomb into the corner, pursued at a rate of knots too great for any Halifax defender to live with by Hayes.

The Knowsley Road jinx lives on - it seems too much to hope that one of these days it might have a happy ending.

Nigel Wood, Chief Executive

NIGEL Wood, Halifax's first Chief Executive, has now been in the job just over a month - and has spent most of that time becoming acquainted with the many people with an interest in Halifax RLFC, including volunteers, officials, stewards, directors and players - but more importantly, he's spent time listening to supporters, and taking time to hear their complaints as well as their praises.

Here we print a small, typical selection of the letters which have been arriving daily for his attention. If you would like to write to him, telling him what you think we do well or not so well as a club - please write to Nigel Wood, The Pavilion, Thrum Hall, Halifax HX1 4TL. All the letters printed below have been replied to personally.

***I had been hoping to acquire some season tickets for the 1st Superleague season as a Christmas present, but none were available. Why not?***

I understand your frustration. The club is not yet certain precisely when matches will be played during the summer, or indeed, when Sky will require the games they will cover. We are hoping to announce a major consultation exercise early in the New Year in which we can canvass the views of all interested parties on a

number of issues. When some of the existing uncertainties become known we will launch Superleague season tickets, as competitively priced as possible. This will include a brand new Family Season Ticket.

***It took me over 10 minutes to get into the ground last Sunday, even though I have a season ticket. Do you only open some turnstiles when you're expecting a big crowd to save money?***

Quite simply, no. It is the nature of attending professional sport in this country to actually enter the ground as near to kick-off as possible. With only a limited number of turnstiles and operators available extended queues can sometimes occur. This problem is exacerbated when the Club undertakes initiatives to attract new support, such as the recent free child entry schemes. Hopefully in the Superleague season, the playing of Two games back to back will serve to tempt supporters into the ground in a more even flow. In any event, we will look again at recent particular problems to see if it is possible to work things better.

***May I ask why there were no scores or scorers given out at the game against Workington? Also, why not announce substitutions?***

Anyone who has looked out of the window from which our PA announcer views the game will know that his view of the pitch is severely restricted, particularly of the "Scratching Shed" end of the ground. Consequently he depends on a video link from the gantry, and the commentary, to confirm the scorers. During that particular game, a technical fault wiped out the transmission, therefore our PA man was as uncertain of the scorers as you were! Things should be back to normal today. The substitutions are more difficult, as the touchline activity is out of view even to the commentator on the gantry. We are looking, however, at ways to provide this information when the Superleague season begins in March, probably by the use of Radios operating on a different frequency to those of the stewards.
