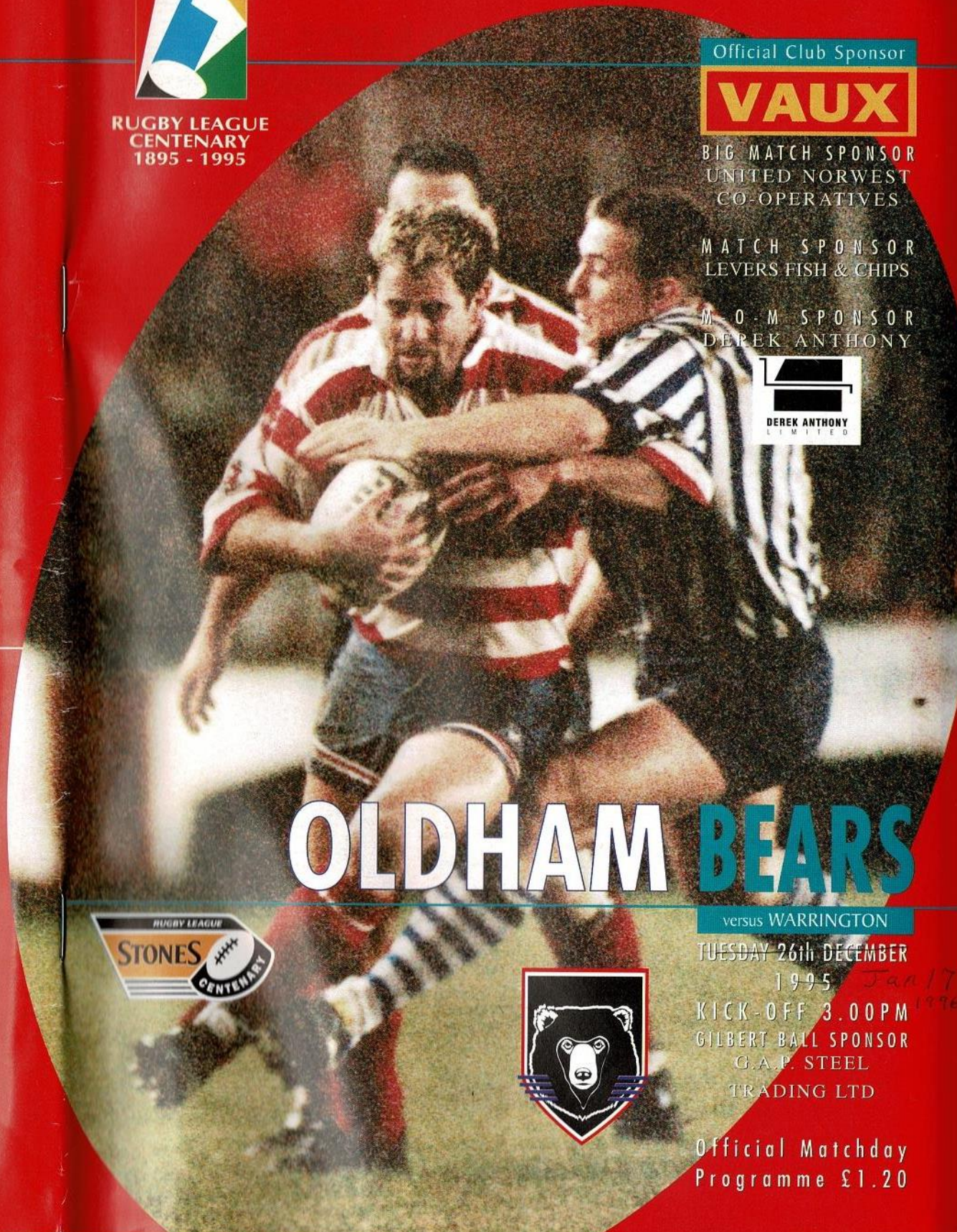
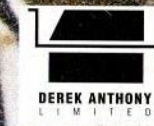

BOARDROOM TALK

BY OLDHAM RLFC CHAIRMAN JIM QUINN



WARRINGTON at home on Boxing Day...it somehow seems hard to comprehend that this type of festive season occasion will no longer figure on Rugby League's new-look calendar. Indeed, 1996 will be a momentous year for our game and particularly so for those clubs like Oldham and Warrington, who will be proudly going to the starting gate for the inaugural Super League season. Oldham are with the world's elite and I cannot stress too much what a privilege it is to be there - given our fight for survival over the last few years - and what a magnificent opportunity it provides for both club and town. Believe me, we are leaving parochialism behind, entering a worldwide stage in a sporting world that is changing by the minute. It is big, vibrant and exciting. And if you doubt that, just ask yourself why those clubs on the outside are falling over themselves to get in. We are there. From the despair of facing total failure head-on a year or two ago, sheer hard work and commitment have earned us a place in Super League. We must grasp that opportunity with both hands, not merely for the present generation of rugby league followers in

the town, but for the children of today who will be the players and supporters of tomorrow. We must do it for them, but we can't do it alone. We must have the backing of the town and we must attract new supporters to add to our hard-core loyalists who have followed us through thick and thin down the years. We are banking on those loyalists sticking with us as we make the changes which we believe are absolutely vital to our success as a Super League club. One of the main things that emerged from the Super League seminar in Los Angeles was the importance of staging sporting events in first-class, modern stadia and providing customers with decent facilities and value for money comforts. That is one of the main reasons why we plan to stage several of our home games in Super League '96 at Boundary Park or Maine Road, Manchester. There is another reason for going to Maine Road. It is vital that we try and tap into the summer sporting interests of the vast thousands of people who live on the Eastern side of Manchester in one of the most densely populated

parts of the region. By giving them a taste of Super League in '96 we may attract their attention and whet their appetite to seek more of the same in '97 when, hopefully, we will be in our new stadium at Westwood. Talking of the new stadium, it was evident when we were in America that most towns and cities regard a modern stadium as vital to the region's growth and development in both commercial and economic terms. The team and the stadium together can provide the spotlight and the attention that makes a town prosperous and I have no doubt that could apply to Oldham so long as local people get behind us in our Super League ambitions. Finally, a warm welcome to Warrington. Best wishes for the festive season and the New Year and a toast for '96 and Super League. **JIM QUINN**

MEMORY MATCH

Don Yates looks back to a match from yesteryear

During the history of our game there have been a number of competitions which have provided fine entertainment before being shelved for a variety of reasons. The Lancashire and Yorkshire Cup competitions were contested for over 80 years before being controversially mothballed in 1993. The County Championship lasted 77 seasons and the BBC2 Floodlit Trophy covered 15 highly successful campaigns. Other competitions such as the Eastern and Western Division Championships and the Third Division title had even shorter lives. One competition which lasted for just a matter of months was the Captain Morgan Trophy. The first match in that tournament was staged on 24th October 1973 and the final on 26th January 1974. This competition was restricted to the 15 first round winners of the County Cup competitions of the 1973-74 season plus the club who had lost their first round Lancashire Cup tie by the narrowest margin. Oldham lost 12-20 at home to Wigan in the Lancashire Cup so their involvement was over before it had even begun. Widnes were the club who suffered the narrowest Lancashire Cup defeat, a 12-11 beating at Salford. Today's visitors to Watersheddings, Warrington, had beaten Leigh 20-15 in the Lancashire Cup and so qualified for the first round. At that stage they faced a difficult trip to Wigan but they were able to win their opening Captain Morgan Trophy tie by 12-4. In the quarter final Warrington entertained Castleford and they won comfortably enough 15-7. Warrington's reward for that success was another difficult away tie at Leeds in the semi-final. At half time in that tie Warrington trailed 11-7 but a tremendous second half revival saw Warrington win through 20-13. Featherstone Rovers provided the opposition to Warrington in that final. They had won 19-4 at Bramley in the Yorkshire

Cup before sailing through to the Captain Morgan final with comfortable home victories over Keighley 27-8, Wakefield Trinity 20-14 and Wokington Town 37-18. Salford was chosen as the venue for the final with the teams in that final lining up as follows:
Featherstone Rovers: Harold Box, Paul Coventry, Mick Smith, Dave Hartley, Graham Bray, Mel Mason, Colin Wood, Les Tonks, Keith Bridges, Billy Harris, Mick Gibbins, Alan Rhodes, and Keith Bell. Substitutes John Newlove and Charlie Stone.
Warrington: Derek Whitehead, Mike Philbin, Derek Noonan, Frank Reynolds, John Bevan, Alan Whittle, Pary Gordon, Dave Chisnall, Kevin Ashcroft, Brian Brady, Bobby Wanbon, Dave Wright and Ian Mather. Substitutes Billy Pickup and Joe Price.
Defences were well on top in this final. Both sides were able to field powerful sets of forwards and these forwards dominated the match which was criticised in many quarters. However no one could doubt the fact that plenty of endeavour and superb defensive play was seen. Although no man of the match was awarded it was generally agreed that Warrington's Bobby Wanbon was the top performer.

Warrington enjoyed the benefit of a strong wind in the first half when Derek Whitehead landed two penalties. Featherstone were unable to benefit from the elements after the interval mainly because of Warrington's superb defensive display. So Warrington won 4-0 and they still hold the trophy by virtue of the fact that the competition was never repeated. Although the Captain Morgan Trophy was a somewhat low key affair, Warrington can be proud of their achievement in lifting what is now one of Rugby League's forgotten competitions.

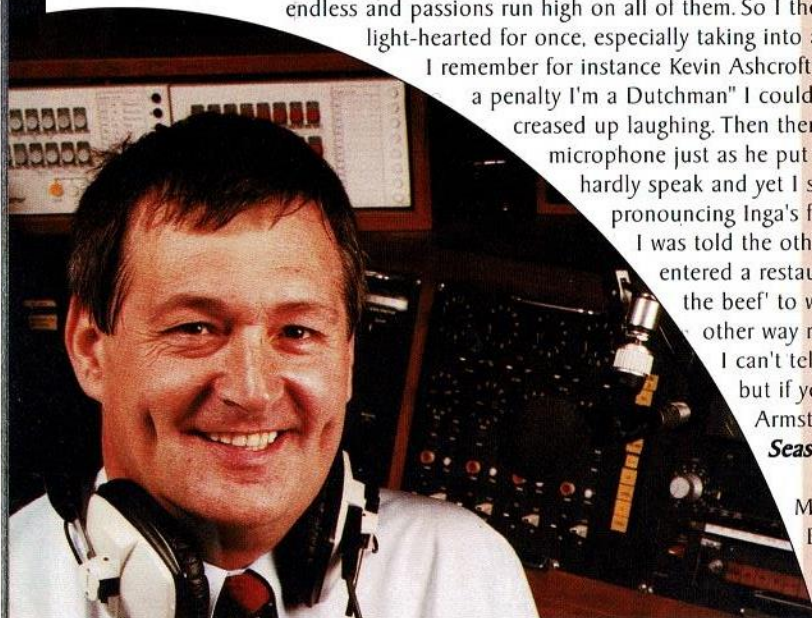

I can't tell you my favourite story of the moment but if you see me and mention the name Neil Armstrong I'll be happy to pass it on.

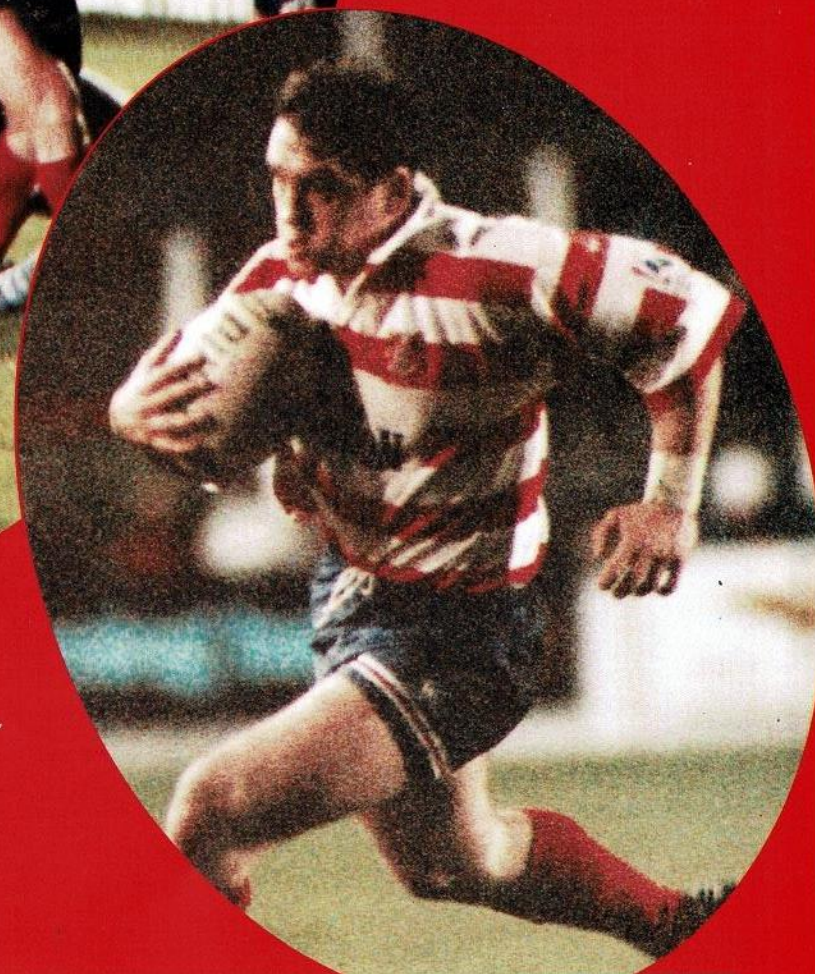
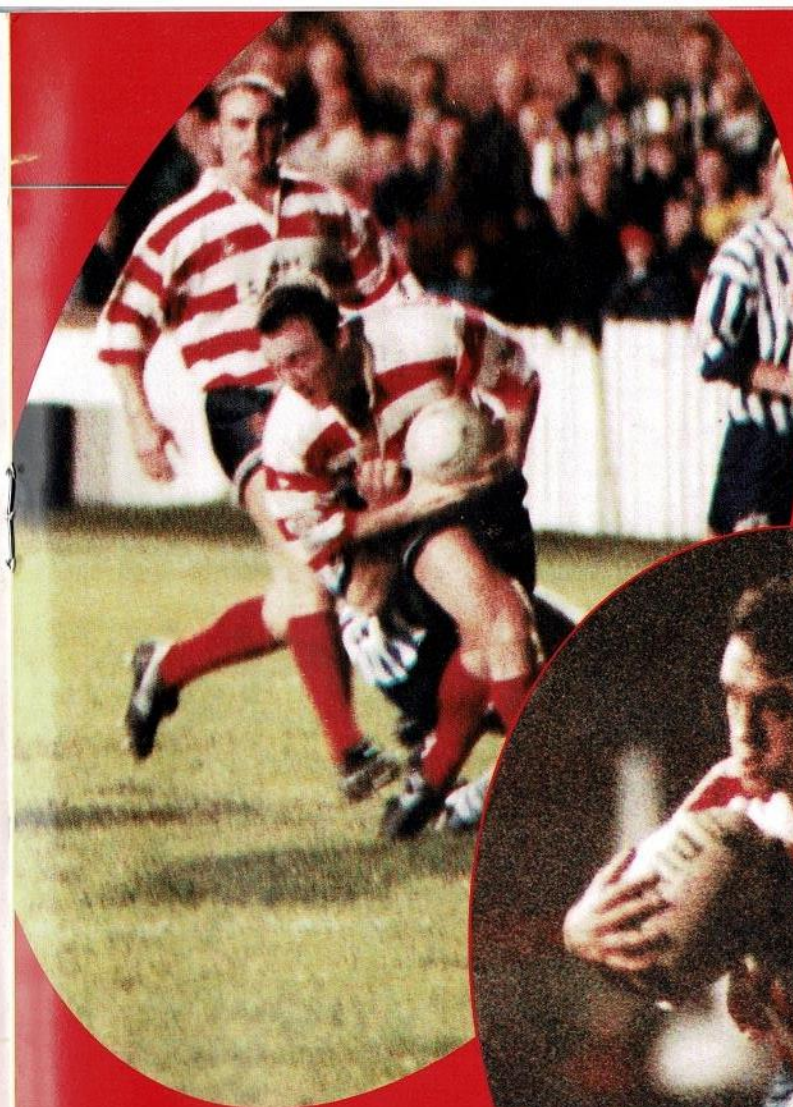



Not many teams go to Castleford and win, so we knew it would be a tough game, and it was. We were our own worse enemy, dropping the ball on second and third drives, giving silly penalties away. Cas scored in the corner from a kick which seemed to be well covered, but the Castleford player got a hand to the ball. 4-0 down, Oldham tried hard to get back into the game but could not hold the ball for a set of six. The forwards were working overtime to try to halt the quick football of Castleford, which saw

them score again but failed with the goal. Oldham did start to control the ball and failed to take the chances they created. A good kick through by Edward saw himself score under the posts for Cowans to goal, which rocked a confident Cas side and brought Oldham to within two points. End to end football flowed with Oldham getting the better chances, but failed to take them. Cas scored through a chip over and gathered to send them in at the corner to make 12-6 the half time score. The second half started brightly for Oldham, putting plenty of pressure on Castleford, but failed to score.

Frustration started to creep into Oldham and gave away penalties which put us under pressure. The sending-off of Mike Neal did not make things any better, as Cas goaled a penalty Oldham rallied and made good breaks but the final pass went to ground. Castleford scored again and converted to make the final score 20-6. With good discipline and sets of six we would have won the game. The forwards worked very hard and tackled more than they should have. Best for Oldham - Cowans, Goldbourne, Olsen, Norman, McIlwaine, McKinney, Edwards, Belle.

QUOTES & HISTORICAL HAPPENINGS

Boxing Day is traditionally regarded as being the biggest day on the British sporting calendar. We usually have the biggest attendances on this day, although the record attendances at most grounds were set for cup-ties at other times of the year. In fact, only two record attendances were set on December 26th. In 1989 a crowd of 8,150 assembled at Spotland to watch Rochdale Hornets beat Oldham 24-12 in a Second Division match. Before that, on December 26th 1949, no fewer than 35,695 spectators crammed into Knowsley Road where St Helens beat Wigan 15-8 in a league match.

It was on this day in 1935 that the highest scoring soccer match in Football League history took place at Prenton Park, Birkenhead where Tranmere Rovers beat Oldham Athletic 13-4. Rovers centre-forward Bunny Bell scored nine of the goals.

Rugby League has also seen some high scoring on this day. In 1911 free scoring winger Albert

Rosenfeld scored eight tries for Huddersfield as they demolished Wakefield Trinity 62-5.

Oldham's biggest Boxing Day victory here at Watersheddings came in 1986 when Salford were beaten 34-18. The biggest home defeat suffered by the Roughyeds on Boxing Day came in 1932 when Swinton won here 23-4.

On this day in 1896 Broughton Rangers were the first of 11 teams who have contested 28 Boxing Day matches here at Watersheddings. Swinton have been the most frequent visitors with eight appearances. Rochdale Hornets have come here seven times, Salford four times and Broughton Rangers twice. Today Warrington will be making their second Boxing Day appearance at Watersheddings and the other six teams who have made single Boxing Day visits to Watersheddings are Workington Town, Widnes, Hull Kingston Rovers, Bradford Northern, Liverpool Stanley and, believe it or not, Australia. The Kangaroos came here in 1908

when Oldham beat them 11-5.

Today is the third occasion that Oldham have met Warrington on Boxing Day. In 1912 Warrington came to Watersheddings where they lost 5-0. Billy Farnsworth scored the Oldham try that afternoon and Joe Ferguson landed a goal. Twelve months later these two clubs met at Wilderspool and once more Oldham won, although it was close at 5-3.

The switch to summer rugby means that this is likely to be Oldham's final Boxing Day match. Let us hope that we bow out with a Christmas cracker.

Apart from the tradition of a delicious noon dinner of roast leftovers, followed by a trip to Watersheddings, Boxing Day has always seemed to me to be a slightly unreal day. Xmas is gone, yet the New Year is still some way away. And this time seems even stranger, with the likelihood that we shan't be here again. Even if the authorities find some way of managing to stretch the "Summer Season" to include Boxing Day - and I would be amazed if some new competition is not invented, with Wigan happening to be draw to play St. Helens in it on December 26, 1996 - we presumably won't be playing up here. So I thought it might be an idea to look forward to some of the possible highlights of the new Super League are:

1966 Bobbie Goulding swinging arm breaks Bradbury's jaw, ref shows Bradbury red card as he is stretchered off. Disciplinary committee bans Bradbury for nine months for unprovoked assault. Oldham cite Goulding, who is found not guilty on the grounds that the film was in black and white.

Paris finish 12th in Super League, Widnes top Division 1. Maurice Lindsay announces Newcastle, Paris & Widnes all to be in expanded Super League, '97 season to be February - September.

1997 Wigan play first eight matches at home - "to keep interest alive during dark nights", says Lindsay. David Stephenson's first match back is v Wigan. Sean Edwards fails random drugs test, found not guilty, doctor had prescribed Ecstasy to slow down ageing process. Paris finish 14th in Super League, Keighley top Division 1. Lindsay announces Keighley facilities unacceptable, so Paris will join Cardiff and Toulouse in expanded Super League, '98 season to be February - October.

1998 Maurice Lindsay knighted. Oldham play first ten matches away - "too cold in spring", says Lindsay. Peter Tunks swaps 10 Wakefield players for 6 from Highfield, 4 from Chorley and 2 from Wagga Wagga. Paris are 16th in Super League, Batley top

Division 1. Wakefield relegated. Lindsay announces Batley facilities not up to scratch, so Paris are reprimed, and Super League to include Bucharest and Rejkavik. '99 season to be February - November.

1999 Sir Maurice Lindsay elevated to House of Lords. Wigan to play all games at home - "they have the widest pitch", says Lindsay. Cold snap disrupts fixtures in March and April - season extended to December. Paris finish 18th in Super League, with Hull top of Division 1. Lord Lindsay announces expanded Super League, with Liechtenstein joining Hull and Paris. Millennium season to be January - November.

2000 Wigan lose first seven matches of season. Lord Lindsay announces: "Far too many fixtures - need mid-season revamp. Forced mergers put through. Hull, Newcastle, Rejkavik form North Europe, Wigan, St. Helens, Leeds form Wigan etc. Tunks swaps Wakefield for Featherstone. East Europe win Super League - formerly Paris, Toulous, Bucharest & Oldham. Happy New Year.

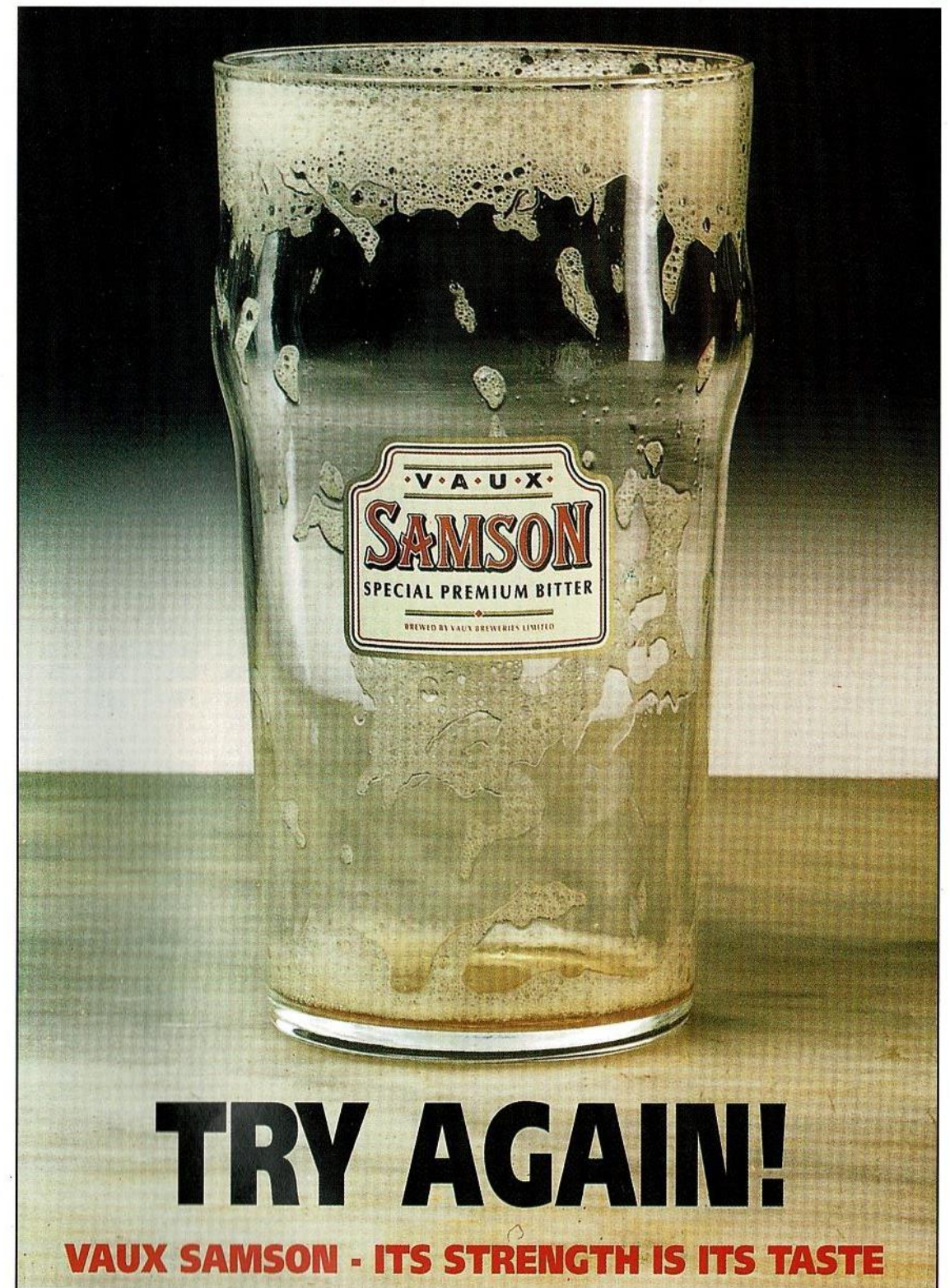

CONFERENCE LEAGUE

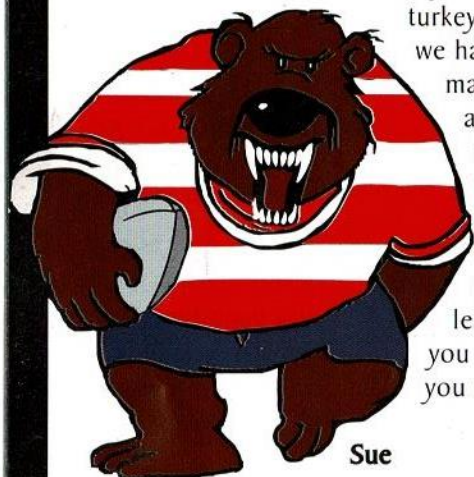

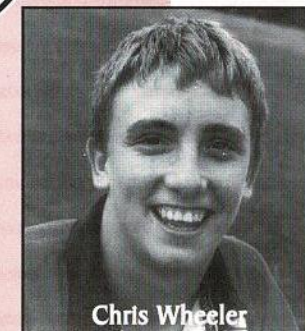
ACADEMY NEWS
