



Were hoping for a sunny day today for whilst the new Summer Super League has got off to a great start we haven't had any Summer weather yet!

I was always confident that the change from Winter to Summer would give us a much better chance to attract new fans and the 33% overall increase in Super League attendances is very encouraging. Hopefully this trend will continue as new fans appreciate the intensity and skills on the field and the package of entertainment, which I believe is an integral part of the Super League concept.

The decision to take our next home game against St Helens to Cardiff Arms Park has understandably brought a mixed reaction from our fans. I fully understand the concerns, particularly from these who are not able to travel and several have wrote to me this week, but the point I have to emphasis is that it is not Sheffield Eagles who have taken the game to Cardiff. We simply could not stage it here in Sheffield or within our locality and we are contractually bound to play the match on Saturday 8th June at 6.00pm.

The Rugby Football League will now take the responsibility of staging, presenting and promoting the fixture and our club will provide free executive coach transport for all our members and heavily subsidised prices (£6 adults, £3 juniors) for non members.

I am sure those who are able to make it will enjoy the carnival atmosphere of Cardiff Arms Park and hopefully a victory over the Challenge Cup Holders.

The recent exploits of Wigan in winning the Middlesex Sevens and beating Bath Rugby Union team by 82-6 has also given our game a big boost. Of course, Rugby League fans do not need convincing that our game is a 3 fast, skilful and highly intense contact sport, played by extremely fit athletes but it is fair to say that Rugby Union followers throughout the country have not full appreciated this. Well, they do now and there is a little concern amongst even the most ardent Bath supporter that Wigan might even surprise their champion team in the Rugby Union game at Twickenham on Saturday, I don't think Wigan will win because their players will become frustrated and stifled with the number of stoppages and techniques within the game, but whatever the outcome. Rugby League, thanks to Wigan and the new profile of the Superleague has



changed a lot of attitudes and perceptions and probably brought the day of amalgamation a little closure!

It is always a pleasure to welcome the players, fans and officials of Oldham Bears and if past encounters are anything to go by we are in for another tough contest today.

Oldham

Ex-Great Britain international Andy Goodway became Oldham's fifth coach of the 1990s when he took over from Aussie Bob Lindner in May 1994. Andy was also assistant coach to the England squad who reached the World Cup Final last October.

Full-back Paul Atcheson cost the Bears £50,000 when signed from Wigan in May 1995. He has represented Great Britain at Academy and U/21 level and was a member of the Welsh team in the 1995 European and World Championships as well as the inaugural Fiji Nines earlier this year.

Ex-BARLA international, centre Darren Abram, was signed from Rochdale Hornets in February 1993 and has been the Bears top try scorer during the past three seasons. He is also their leading try scorer this season with six to his name so far.

Utility player Paul Topping was a member of Ireland's squad in the Emerging Nations Championship last year. He also represented Lancashire while at Leigh. He joined the Bears from Leigh in September 1993.

Winger Adrian Belle is a product of Oldham junior club, St. Anne's. He turned professional with Rochdale Hornets in 1990 before signing for his home town club in October 1993.

Filling in for the injured Martin Crompton at scrum half could be utility player Steve Gartland. Steve, who also turned professional with Rochdale Hornet in 1990 (from Oldham St. Anne's) joined the Bears in July 1994.

Goal-kicking stand-off Francis Maloney was the Bears leading points scorer last season and is repeating the feat so far this term. Francis is another £50,000 signing for the Bears, this time from Warrington in May 1995. He won Great Britain U/21 honours whilst with Featherstone Rovers.

Great Britain U/21 representative, prop-forward, Ian Gilbert, turned professional with Wigan in 1986 and made 139 appearances for them without gaining a regular first team spot.

He joined Wakefield Trinity in 1994 but after only one season with them he joined the Bears last August for £45,000.

Hooker John Clarke joined the Bears, from East Leeds junior club in May 1993, when he had just returned to Britain from touring Australia with the BARLA U/18s. John also went on to represent Great Britain U/21s against the Aussies.

In the second row could be New Zealander Joe Faimalo who joined Oldham in September 1994 from Hawkes Bay and Australian Matt Munro, signed from Sydney Tigers at the beginning of this season.

BARLA U/18 representative David Bradbury is a utility forward who has been playing at loose-forward. David joined the Bears from Leigh Miners' Welfare in August 1991.

Sheffield have played more League games (14) against Oldham than any other Super League team, plus one cup match (a 2nd round defeat 20-32 at home in 1989) and one glorious Premiership Final in 1992 at Old Trafford.

Oldham won the first five matches between the clubs and it wasn't till September 1991 in the new eight team 2nd Division that Eagles managed to get a point in a 16-16 draw at home.

When they met at watersheddings the following month, Eagles gained their first victory 38-12 with Ropati, Maea and Waddell among the try scorers.

Crasning through hooter, eagles re other Old Traffo celebrated their in the try scorers.

The most significant game, if not the best, between the two clubs was in eagles' second premiership Final at old Trafford. After four incident packed games that season (two won, one lost, one drawn) the two teams were very familiar with each other and there was a Derby atmosphere to the game.

Powell scored after four minutes and had completed his hat-trick by half-time. Oldham, however, came back magnificently in the second half to level the scores at 20-20. Then a Tim Lumb try pushed the game Eagles way and Keith Mumby settled it by crashing through right on the hooter. eagles retired to the other Old Trafford and celebrated their 34-20 victory in

the magnificent cricket pavilion in some style!

Once Oldham returned to the 1st Division in 1993 there have been six more games, all extremely close.

Eagles have taken four to Oldham's two, but the Bears won the last encounter in january after Wigan had stopped Eagles' nine-match winning streak.

On one of the coldest playing days many fans can remember, the Bears won 26-16 and the weather that afternoon suggests their name was well chosen, whilst critics of summer rugby were reduced to silence in the Arctic conditions.


- 1 Promotion of sport at grass roots level

Follow up work should also help to ensure that the children can be channelled into the local amateur clubs.

This is an exciting venture, which now sees the Sheffield Eagles working across all four South Yorkshire Local Authorities and also North Derbyshire. On top of this the coaching scheme has also recently been involved in initiatives in Derby and Leicester, and surely all of this must make the Eagles the most expansive club in SUPER LEAGUE.

High points for me so far, excluding the better than usual start from the Eagles, have been the form, and crowds, of the London Broncos and Paris St. Germain. The low point has to be the demise of the game in Cumbria and east Yorkshire. Some good news this week, unless you live in Hull apparently, is that the two Hull clubs are at least having discussions about merging. In addition to an offer

If the teams can be competitive this will be a major boost for Rugby League and it deserves all our support.

Back on the field, St. Helens remain unbeaten League leaders, but only just, after a late revival saw them win at home against the London Broncos 24-22. Paul Newlove's try moved him clear of team mate Danny Arnold at the top of the try scoring charts. On Friday night Leeds recorded their first away win of the season in paris by 14-40. Although defeated, Paris St. Germain put up a spirited display in front of a crowd of 15,107

Workington Town had another heavy defeat, this time at Castleford by 50-16. 

What's for

A try is worth four points. A try is scored when one team player touches the ball down over the goal line of the opposing team. A conversion is when the ball is kicked straight between the posts, and above the cross bar.

A scrum takes place after a mistake is made or the ball is kicked into touch (out of play). The forwards lock together briefly, the ball is put in from the side - then play resumes.

A KNOCK ON

A knock on is when a player loses control of the ball and it falls to the ground in a forward motion, resulting in a scrum.

A DROP GOAL

A drop goal is executed when a player positions himself anywhere on the field then 'drops' the ball and successfully kicks the ball directly

through the posts and above the crossbar of the opposing team.

THE CHANGE OVER

The change over is exactly that. The ball is handed over to the opposing team when the current team has used up all of their six tackles.

INTERFERENCE OF PLAY

Interference of play occurs when a player directly interferes with the flow of play (at the play of the ball a defending player stops an attacking player from playing the ball).

FORWARD PASS

The ball at all times can only be passed backwards. If the ball is passed forward, a scrum is awarded to the opposing team as for a knock-

OFFSIDE

Offside applies when a player or the entire team advance forward before

the play of the ball by the opposition. There are many forms of offside which can be learnt by watching the game. N.B. The defending team must be in line with the referee. Listen out for shouts of "GET THEM ONSIDE".

A GRUBBER KICK

A grubber kick is when a player drops the ball and kicks it for position before it touches the ground. If the ball hits the ground before being played it will be deemed a knock-on!

A PENALTY

When a penalty is awarded, a team has two options: 1. To take a kick at goal (between

the posts) which is worth an extra 2 points

2. Kick the ball further down the field out of play and then restart equal to where the ball left the field.
