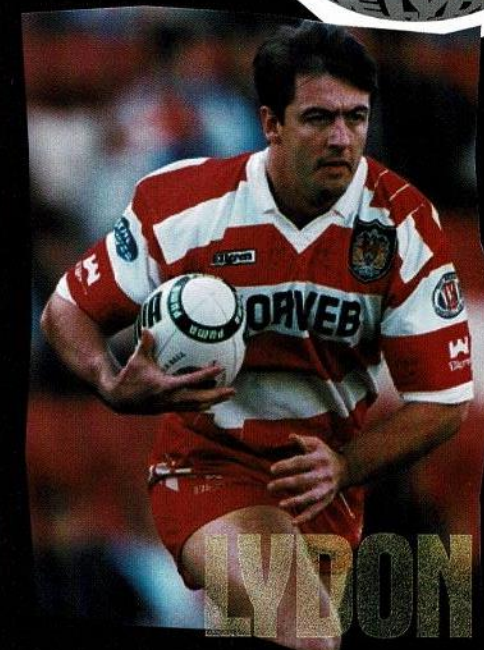
SUPER LEAGUE ROUND UP

The Super League Championship ball is now firmly in St Helens' court following London Broncos draw at Central Park last weekend. With both Wigan and St Helens having home fixtures against sides in the bottom half of the table, the situation should remain the same before next week's big showdown. Saints take on bottom club Workington Town looking to repeat the 62pts-0 win achieved at Derwent Park in Round 1. Wigan will be fired up against Oldham after failing to get to grips with the Broncos' negative tactics and, for once, lacking the tactical nous to hold on to their 18pts-4 lead. The Bears are traditionally tough opponents, particularly at Watersheddings but at Central Park, their last win was way back in 1986. The Hulme brothers face each other for the first time in this weekend's opener at Wilderspool on Friday. In over a decade at Widnes, they shared Rugby League's highs and lows but after the cancellation of their contracts, they finally went their separate ways. Paul made the short trip to Warrington to join a side challenging for a top four place. Under the Dorahy-Murphy ticket, the Wire have endured several close-run things and their match with Leeds could be no exception. David meanwhile moved to Headingley to add much-needed organisation and direction to a Leeds side struggling for consistency at the foot of the table. He joins three other members of the Chemics' 1993 Wembley pack as Harvey Howard, Richie Eyres and Esene Faimalo have all made the same journey across the Pennines. Loiners fans will be hoping that last week's win over Workington will prove to be the beginning of a climb back to respectability and not another false dawn. Bradford Bulls take their six match winning run to Castleford who exploited a tired PSG side

last week to run in a big score. John Joyner will be disappointed at the second half showing and knows only an eighty minute effort will be enough to halt the Bulls charge. Brian Smith's side have cemented their place just behind the leaders and with matches against the two leaders to come at Odsal could well push them into a challenging position. The seventh cavalry in the shape of four Aussies and a South African is on the way to assist PSG just as their extra-curricular activities come to an end. Their involvement in the European Championship finished on Wednesday at Gateshead and with the French Championship season a distant memory, the club is free to concentrate on Super League. The cross-channel trip to the Don Valley will be a difficult one as Sheffield's home record is unblemished unless you count last week's loss to St Helens in Cardiff. The Eagles also have some unfinished business to attend to as they were defeated on an unforgettable opening night in the Charley Stadium. London Broncos begin their run of home matches with a return encounter with Halifax. The Broncos' Northern tour has seen some encouraging results not least wins at Halifax and Leeds and narrow losses at St Helens and Warrington. Fresh in the memory will be last weeks draw with the Champions which should raise the clubs profile another notch or two. A big crowd is hoped for despite the presence of the TV cameras which seem to follow the Broncos around these days. In the First Division, Hull's charge up the table could see them up to third if they win at Wakefield and Huddersfield go down to Salford. Phil Sigsworth has seen his side improve rapidly over the last few weeks, culminating in a fine win at Featherstone. Wins over Salford and Widnes confirm the

side's potential and with games against the Reds and Cougars still to come they could just sneak in. This weekend sees them face a Trinity side that is a far different prospect from that thrashed 52pts-2 in the opening round. Keighley Cougars should return from Dewsbury with the points while Featherstone are at Spotland facing a Rochdale Hornets side that can beat Widnes one week and lose to Whitehaven the next and find themselves bottom of the table. Most interest will be centred on The Willows where Salford entertain Huddersfield. The Giants will be fresh from a weeks break while the Reds were subduing Batley last weekend. Andy Gregory's men are bearing up to the challenge of being the team that everyone wants to beat having lost just once this season. In Round One, they returned from the McAlpine Stadium with a narrow five point victory and things should be just as close this time as the Giants need to win to keep in touch with the leaders. Second Division leaders Hull KR entertain South Wales who are unlikely to concede anything like the 70 points drubbing inflicted upon them in their first game. The steady improvement was shown by last weeks win over Carlisle in front of about 6,000 people in Cardiff. Hunslet struggled to keep up the pressure against Chorley last week and again face an awkward hurdle in Prescott at South Leeds. Third plays fourth at Gigg Lane where Swinton entertain York who have risen up the table on the back of three straight home wins. The Lions own run of four wins was ended by Hull Kr last week and they need to get back to winning ways if they are to stay in the hunt for promotion.

PAUL ATCHESON

Outstanding attacking full back and one of four players in the Oldham Super League squad who have played here at Central Park. A product of Blackbrook juniors (St. Helens) who turned professional with Widnes in 1990. Moved here to Wigan in October 1992 and made his debut the following January in the 19-4 Regal Trophy semi-final victory over Hull. Made 62 appearances for Wigan before transferring to Oldham in June 1995 for £50,000. Whilst at Central Park represented Great Britain at academy and under 21 level and he has also been a member of the Welsh team in various competitions during the past three seasons.

DARREN ABRAM

Prolific try scoring centre who has been Oldham's top try scorer during the past three seasons. A product of Thatto Heath juniors (St. Helens) who won BARLA international honours before turning professional with Warrington in 1985. Had a spell on loan with Swinton before moving to Chorley Borough and then Rochdale Hornets. Oldham signed him in February 1993.

PAUL TOPPING

Utility player who is equally effective whether at centre, stand off or loose forward. Terrific defender. Topping is a product of the Wigan St. Patricks junior club who turned professional with Swinton in 1985. He had a spell on loan at Mansfield before joining Leigh in 1990 and then transferring to Oldham in September 1993. Topping made one appearance for Lancashire in 1991 and was included in the Ireland squad for the Emerging Nations Championship in 1995.

ROB MYLER

Versatile back equally at home either at full back or on the wing. A product of the Widnes St. Maries junior club who turned professional with Warrington in 1989. Had a spell on loan at Salford in 1995. Transferred to Oldham in July 1995 for £50,000.

MARTIN CROMPTON

Serum half captain and the orchestrator of most of Oldham's attacking play. A former Wigan St. Patricks junior who began his professional career with Warrington in 1986. Moved back to Wigan in July 1992 when he joined the senior Central Park outfit. Made his debut in the Charity Shield defeat against St. Helens at Gateshead when he was at scrum half. Also made a number of his 20 Wigan appearances at hooker before he moved to Oldham for a bargain £35,000 fee in September 1993. During his 12 months at Wigan was substitute in Wigan's World Club Challenge defeat against Brisbane Broncos. Represented Ireland in the 1995 Emerging Nations Championship and the 1996 Fijian Nines.

IAN GILDART

Hard working and experienced forward. A product of Wigan Colts who turned professional here at Central Park during October 1986. Made his debut the following January in the 68-0 in the Challenge Cup victory over Workington Town. Went on to make 139 appearances for Wigan including an outing at Wembley in 1990. Also appeared in a Regal Trophy and Premiership Final for Wigan. Represented Great Britain at under 21 level whilst at Central Park. After eight years with Wigan was transferred to Wakefield Trinity in August 1994 and then last August moved on to Oldham for a £45,000 transfer fee.

JOHN CLARKE

Outstanding young hooker. A former East Leeds junior who turned professional with Oldham in May 1993. Clarke toured Australia with the BARLA under 18s in 1993 and further honours came his way two seasons ago when he represented Great Britain under 21s against the Kangaroos. Had an unhappy campaign last season with a twice broken arm but is now back to top form.

GARY LORD

Experienced professional. A former Stanley Rangers junior (Castleford) who joined the senior Castleford club in 1984. He

appeared at full back for Castleford at Wembley in 1986 but has since developed into a hard working second row forward. Lord was transferred to Leeds in 1988 and then on to Halifax in 1991 before joining Oldham in July 1994 for £35,000.

JOE FAIMALO

Hard working second row forward who is enjoying his best run of form. A product of the Eastern Suburbs club in New Zealand, Faimalo had brief spells with Workington Town, Oldham and then Swinton during the 1991-92 season without impressing. He returned home and enjoyed success with Hawkes Bay which prompted him to return to Oldham in September 1994. His determination and stamina since then have made him one of the mainstays of the Roughyed pack.

DAVID BRADBURY

Fiery utility forward who gives 100% in every match. Oldham signed him from Leigh Miners Welfare Juniors in August 1991. A former BARLA under 18 tourist to New Zealand.

HOWARD HILL

Outstanding young back row forward. Joined Oldham in July 1994 from the Hensingham junior club of Whitehaven. Made steady progress and broke into the first team squad at the beginning of last season. Has given some mature performances and was included in the Great Britain under 21 squad for the match against France last January which was unfortunately cancelled. Should eventually gain representative recognition.

PAUL DAVIDSON

Hard working prop or second row forward. A product of the Hensingham junior club (Whitehaven) who turned professional with Widnes in 1990. Joined Oldham in July 1994 for £17,000. Has a fine turn of speed which should benefit him following the switch to summer rugby.

IAN SHERRATT

Experienced prop. A former Lancashire schoolboy representative who played for the Waterhead (Oldham) junior club before turning professional with Bradford Northern in 1982. Transferred to Oldham in 1987 and then moved to Salford in 1989 before returning to Watersheddings in November 1991. Under rated forward who has been unlucky not to gain representative recognition.

ADRIAN BELLE

Powerful, determined winger. Was with the Oldham St. Annes junior club before he turned professional with Rochdale Hornets in 1990. Moved to Watersheddings in October 1993 and has become a regular in the Roughyeds first team squad.

ANDY PATMORE

Big powerful centre with a good defence game. Joined Oldham last February from Canterbury-Bankstown and made his debut on the opening day of the season when the Riversiders won 56-10 at Boundary Park. Visited England in 1986 as a member of the unbeaten junior Kangaroo party. Should be a big asset to Oldham on the dry, firm grounds.

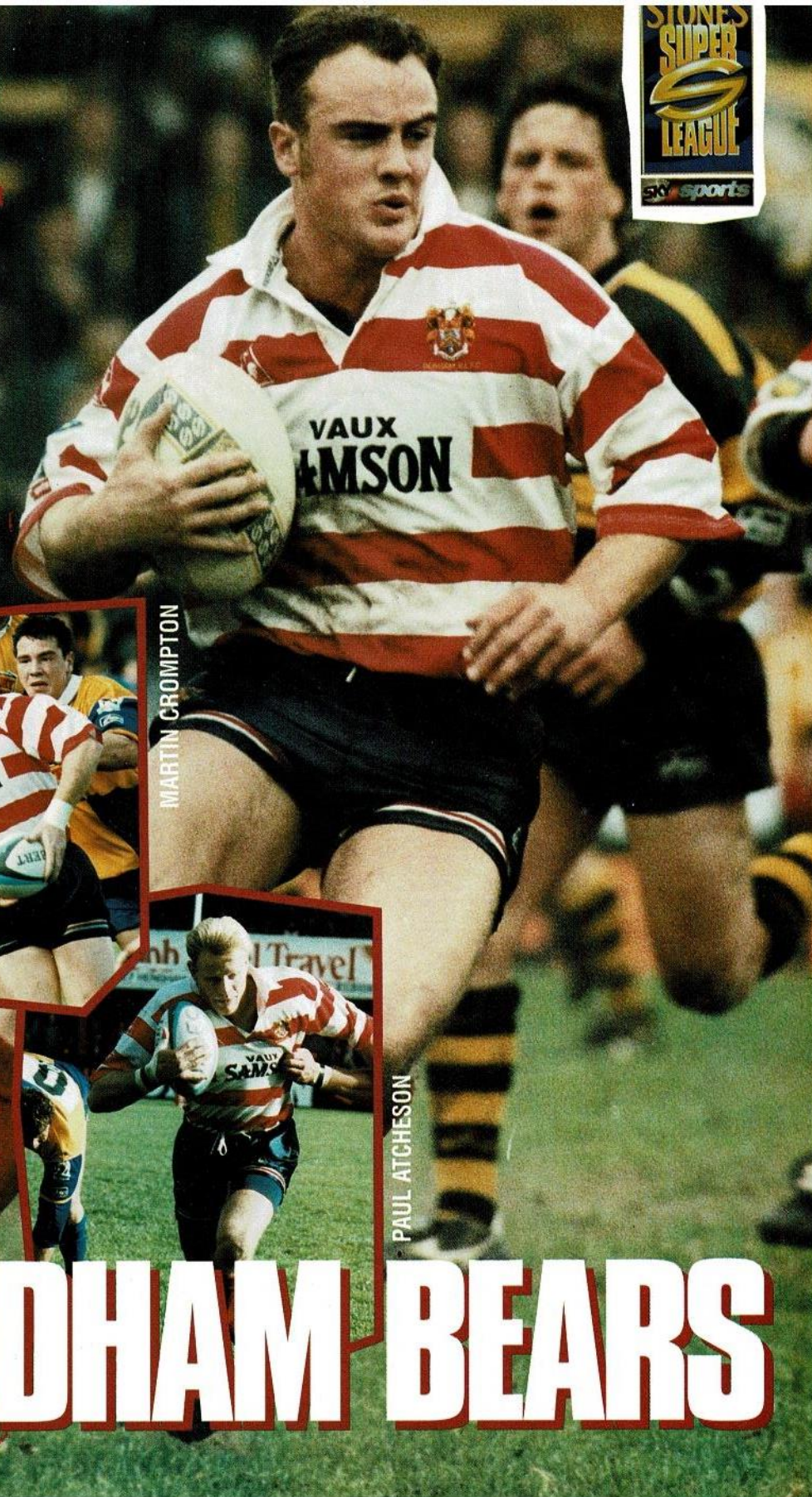
MATT MUNRO

THA' CAN'T PARK THEER

to call it a day and Wigan Rugby League has lost one of its truly best known characters after 25 years of voluntary service to the Club. In his hey day Billy Unsworth was a Rugby League referee and later progressed to touch judge! - but he never discarded his whistle - even in his last role as the Club's mid week car park attendant.

Readers of these columns may have often been shown the red card by 'Low Billy'. It's perhaps inappropriately amusing in preparing this tribute recalling one occasion when an unfortunate accident occurred at the nearby busy junction and the police pushed the damaged vehicle to Wigan's car park awaiting collection.

They were greeted by Billy's familiar call "tha' can't park theer!" That's only one story. But the roles reversed on Billy immediately after his retirement when he took a get away break in his beloved Benidorm where he often utilises his vocal chords as a casual overseas entertainer in Spanish Cabaret Bars. It's accurately reported that Billy was mistaken as an elderly Spanish gent around a hotel pool by an English emigrant. In Spanish she politely asked "Quiere un filla?" Billy replied, "I'm not Spanish, I come from Wigan. I've just retired from Wigan Rugby League."

"Do you know Low Billy?" the lady asked. "I am him," he admitted.

Low and behold it was him, Low Billy.

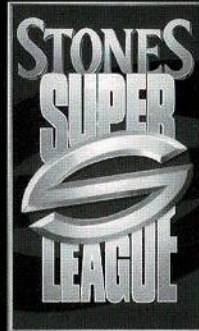

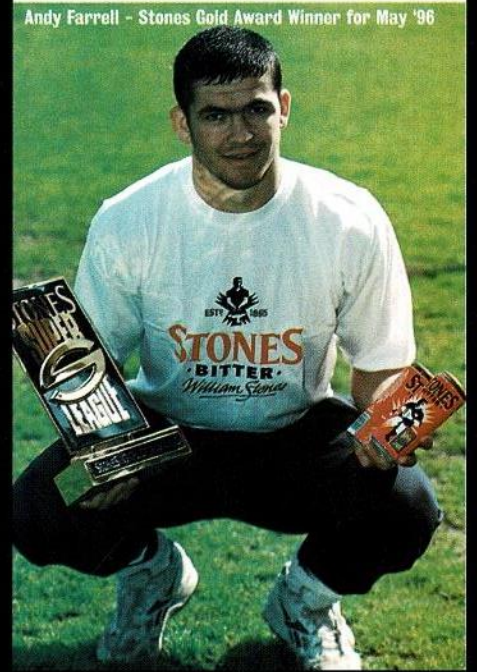

Contenders for May included Keiron Cunningham, Steve Prescott and Steve McNamara.

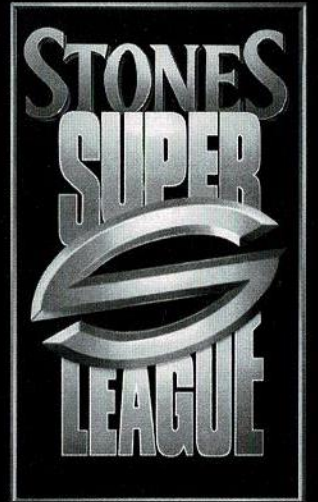

WATCHING FROM THE WHITBREAD

with Geoff Duckworth

Eleven matches gone and another eleven to go. We are past the first flushes of excitement brought on by Super League and eagerly await the last couple of weeks of the season when the first Super League Championship will be decided. There are of course, many who think that Super League 1996 will be sorted out next Friday here at Central Park. When our third home game in a row sees St. Helens as visitors. I suppose that if the unthinkable happened and Wigan do not win the derby match then St. Helens will be in an almost unassailable position so we need to make sure that the ground is full of Wiganers shouting on our team. Last Sunday's result against London Broncos came as rather a shock to the system but was not really a great surprise. The pundits have been warning us that the Broncos would be the team to watch and but for a couple of points in the game against St. Helens and Warrington, they would have been just behind Wigan in Super League. I suppose that Broncos were totally justified in playing the way that they did as the only way that they could possibly have won was to stifle Wigan's flair. A quote from their coach did rather stick in an avid Wigan supporters throat "We came to slow things down. We reckoned that there are twenty scrums in a game. If we took 30 seconds to walk to each scrum that's ten minutes gone, ten minutes when Wigan can't score. Add on time for goal kicks and questioning referee's decisions and that's more time." Just a question to Tony Currie, having lost ten percent of the game, can we have ten percent of our gate money back please? Daryl Powell of Keighley Cougars has mentioned that referees are attempting to slow the game down a little bit, in an apparent effort to cut down the number of high scoring games, by reducing the ten metres or by allowing more laying on at the play the balls. Surely this is not true, there was no evidence of it last Sunday, was there?

This evenings visitors Oldham Bears had a very good win against Warrington last Sunday. We need to be on the look out for Crompton, no stranger to Central Park, and his half back colleague Crook who orchestrated the Bears victory which was made easier by an excellent first half performance which gave them a 26 points to 4 lead at the interval. Warrington did manage to fight back to within six points but Oldham extended their lead to win by eleven points. Crompton, Atcheson and Gildart will want to put on a good show today. There was a very pleasant cameo on Radio 5 Live following

Wigan's victory at Headingley a couple of weeks ago. Listeners were asked to name the best players of the last twenty years as were the presenters. Peter Fox, an excellent summariser on the show ignored the twenty year limit to tell us that the greatest player that he ever knew was his brother Neil whose scoring feats are second to none. We older Wiganers probably beg to differ and one of our favourites was mentioned by Mr Fox as being an outstanding player also, when he described the player by saying that if you put Martin Offiah and Va'aiga Tuigamala together to make one player then you would have a Billy Boston, even our nine year old son was impressed by that description.

I do not really know that much about BARLA other than taking an interest generally and watching the occasional game. What I did notice last week was that the BARLA Great Britain team were beaten by France 'B' by 30 points to 6 in Toulouse. The selection seemed very strange to me. Woolston who are obviously the best amateur side in the country had just one player in the squad at substitute and Wigan St. Patricks who were runners up in National Conference Premier Division had two players in the seventeen. In fact only six of the seventeen players were from the Premier Division while the others came from Division One, Two and the Cumbrian League. Am I missing something or will we soon be seeing Great Britain RFL Internationals from Prescott Chorley and Batley?

I notice that from next season, clubs in Division One of Rugby Unions Courage League will not be producing their own programme. Only one programme will be produced and each side will insert a couple of pages in the middle for the teams and a bit of news. I wonder why the RFUs top clubs have taken this step? I do not suppose that Rita's corner shop or the Rovers Return will be doing much advertising but the big battalions of banks and the like will be clamouring for expensive advertising space. The Aussie Rugby League have this sort of programme but I think that we would like to stick with a little bit of individuality don't you? Last but not least, welcome to Central Park, Russell Smith, where have you been for the last week or so?

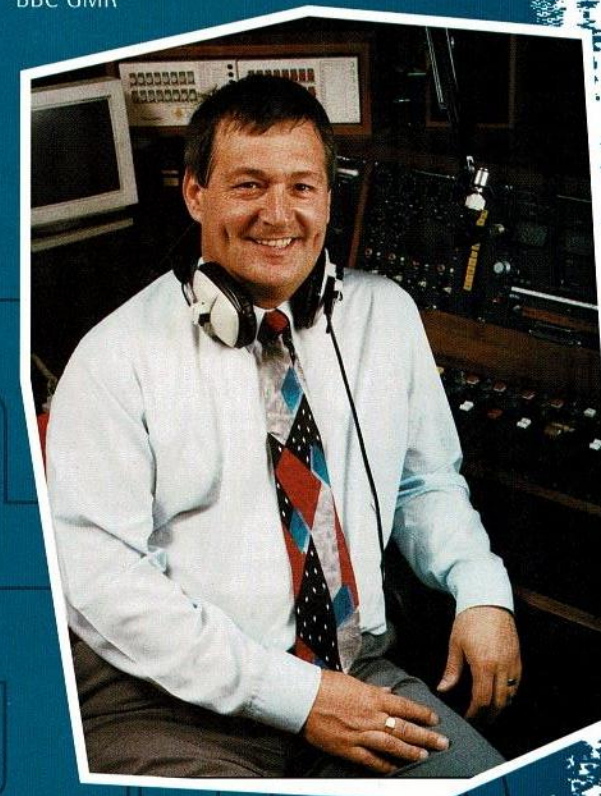
I see Leeds recorded a much needed victory over fellow strugglers Workington. Their plight highlights the fact that no team should ever think it has a God given right to be at the top.

Some good news for Dean is that both

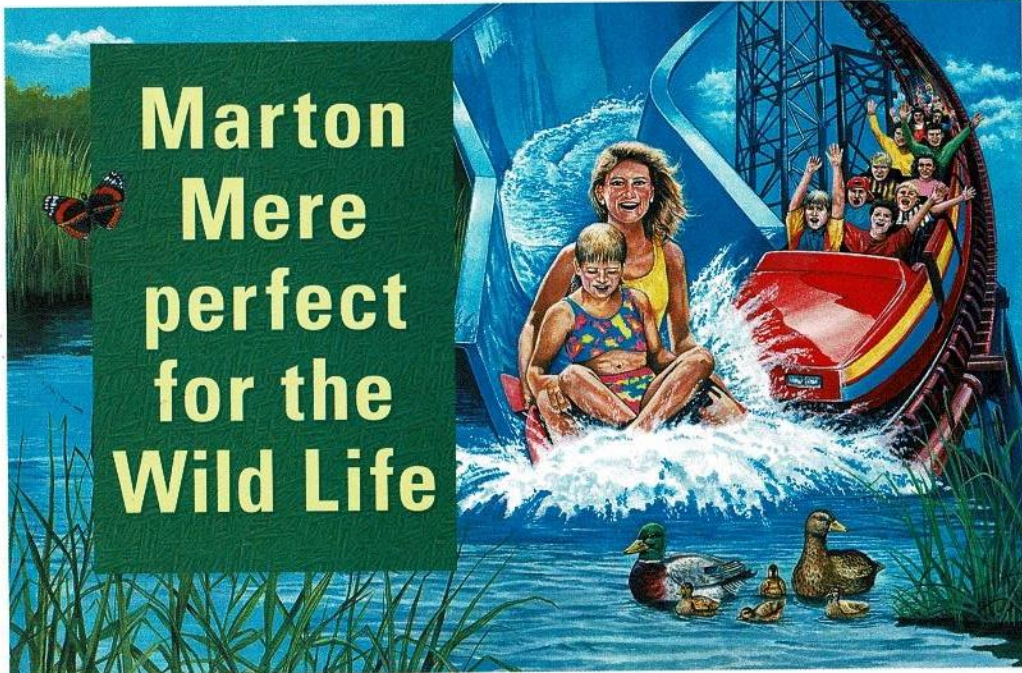

OLDHAM BEARS DID YOU KNOW...

• Founder members of the Northern Union, Oldham have played at Watersheddings since 1889. Plans are now well advanced for the construction of a brand new Stadium close to Oldham Athletic FC's Boundary Park. The Bears record attendance at Watersheddings is the 28,000 attracted to a game against Huddersfield in 1912.

• Oldham's record try scorer and most capped player is Alan Davies. Between 1950 and 1961 he amassed 173 tries for the club and appeared 20 times for Great Britain before moving to Wigan in a £9,000 transfer deal. An uncompromising centre, he was outstanding in the Wigan side which topped the League in 1962. A year later he was a member of the Wigan team defeated by Wakefield Trinity at Wembley.

• In the early days of Rugby League Oldham were one of the game's most successful clubs. Between 1907 and 1912 Oldham reached five successive Championship finals, taking the title in 1911 and 1912. In the same period the side played in two Challenge Cup finals, four Lancashire Cup finals, winning twice and were Lancashire League Champions twice.

• Oldham first won the Challenge Cup in 1899. They became the first club to reach four successive Challenge Cup finals, taking the cup in 1925 and 1927 but were beaten in 1924 (by Wigan) and 1926. Since then Oldham have failed to reach the final and despite having fine teams have never been able to play at Wembley, despite making the semi-final stage several times. Two semi-final defeats at the hands of Wigan in 1991 and 1995.

• Oldham's most remarkable Challenge Cup semi-final came in 1964. A last minute 40 yard drop goal, his first ever, by hooker Ian McIntyre gave Oldham a draw with Hull Kingston Rovers at

Headingley. A midweek evening replay at Swinton produced another tied score after eighty minutes. In extra time Oldham took the lead but failing light gave the referee no alternative other than abandon the game. In the days before floodlights midweek games kicked off as late as daylight allowed to enable fans to finish work and get to the game. The kick-off time had not taken into account the possibility of extra time and darkness prevented the game being completed. At the third time of asking Oldham lost out and Hull KR went to Wembley.

• The Oldham records for goals in a match, goals in a season, goals in a career and points in a career are all held by Bernard Ganley. In 1958 he became the first player to kick 200 goals in a season. Capped three times by Great Britain Ganley was twice the League's leading goal kicker and his total of 219 in 1957-58 has been bettered only once, by David Watkins in 1973. Ganley also shares the League record for scoring the fastest 100 goals from the start of the season, taking just 18 matches.

• During the era of divisional Rugby League (1973 to 1976) Oldham acquired a reputation as a "yo-yo team", having been promoted six times and relegated on five occasions. Oldham have reached three Second Division Premiership finals, winning the trophy in 1988 and 1990.

• In 1984 Oldham's youth policy proved its worth when Ray Ashton, Terry Flanagan, Andy Goodway and Mick Worrall, together with local youngster Des Foy, formerly with Widnes, joined their coach Frank Myler on Great Britain's tour down under. Myler, who was GB coach from 1982 to 1984 had two spells in charge at the Watersheddings between 1981 and 1987.

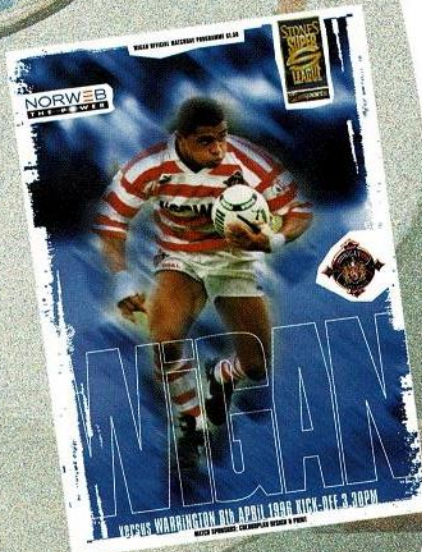

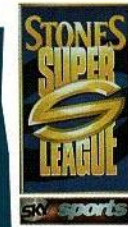

WHAT THE PAPERS SAY

Frank Malley, in the "Daily Express", on the win over Sheffield Eagles: "No one is in greater demand than England captain Andy Farrell, who celebrated his 21st birthday today with another classy display capped by seven goals.

The victory saw Wigan close to within two points of leaders St Helens. But it was also a night on which Wigan seemed determined to display some of the skills picked up from Union rivals Bath.

The first scrum set the tone when a section of the crowd shouted 'Heave' and Wigan responded with a drive which could easily have produced a push-over try." Salford coach Andy Gregory in "Super League Week": "Wigan by contrast are going from strength to strength although it's hard to keep in touch with their fixture list. They play Harlequins next week don't they? I keep getting the blame for their forays into Rugby Union. People tell me if we hadn't stuffed them in the cup they wouldn't need the money."

Joe Lydon, in the "Wigan Evening Post", on his recent haircut: "A lot has been said about the new Lydon crew-cut and, to be honest, it's growing on me! I was stitched up in a way that the entire team was supposed to be having a close shave up top before the Bath game, but like most plans of nature one went through with it and the rest didn't.

Shaun Edwards, in his "Touchdown" column in the "Wigan Evening Post": "Over the last five or six games, our defence has been brilliant. With the exception of the match up at Workington, we've managed to keep the opposition in single figures, an outstanding achievement.

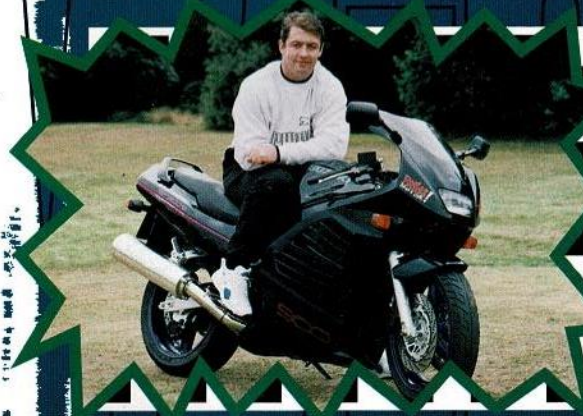
We demonstrated the desire to keep our line intact against Sheffield on Wednesday, rushing back in numbers to pull off some spectacular last ditch tackles which meant a blank scoresheet for the Eagles in the second half.

Although we are proud of this, I must admit that we do have a financial incentive. At the start of the season, I suggested to Jack Robinson that the club give each player a £100 bonus if we could restrict opponents to less than ten points per game. He muttered darkly quite a lot, but eventually agreed assuming, as I did, that fast summer rugby would mean big scorelines.

But Jack stumped up without complaint, and at the end of the season, he may just be glad he did." Christopher Irvine, in "The Times", on Wigan's win at Leeds: "Motivated, committed, enthusiastic - Leeds were all of these, yet they lost to Wigan by a margin that would have sent the teeth grinding among the demanding Rugby League public at Headingley not so very long ago. Smiles at their performance, if not the outcome, showed just how expectations have been lowered in times of trouble.

The most pleasing aspect for Graeme West, the Wigan Coach, was that, in a month when his team could easily have been sidetracked by the two cross-code matches with Bath and the Middlesex Sevens, they won all five Super League games."

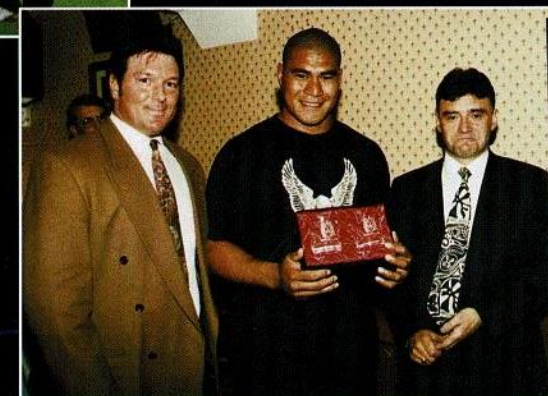

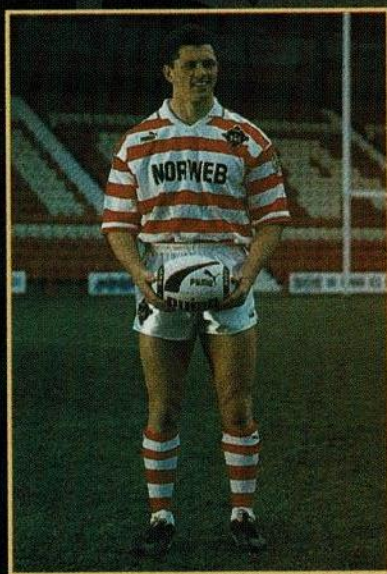

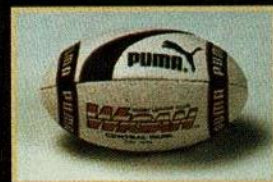
