

Talking

IT IS WITH GREAT PLEASURE that we welcome London Broncos --- Martin Offiah and all --- to Watersheddings today for our penultimate home game in this first summer season of Super League.

The Broncos, under the direction of chairman Barry Maranta and coach Tony Currie, have made a huge impact on Super League and that can only be good for the game as a whole and for Super League's development ambitions.

Their capture last weekend of Offiah in a unique partnership with Bedford RU Club attracted enormous publicity and proved beyond doubt that

the Broncos management intend to do all in their power to establish a topnotch Super League club in the capital

To build a lasting and successful future, our great game has to nationwide, but for that to happen with any serious claims of national credibility we must have a major presence in London.

The potential down there is enormous, not only in terms of a massive population base, but in such spheres as sponsorship, marketing and media interest.

Offiah's signing will be seen as a move which identifies the club with its London base. As a London boy, and a former Union player who is also going to be playing for Bedford, Martin will be marketed as a shining example of what a Londoner can now achieve in League without having to uproot and move to the north. The Broncos are doing a great job for Rugby League in this country and anyone who doubts that has merely to glance at the Super League table to find them riding high with a realistic chance of making the top-four premiership play-

Their televised game against St Helens at The Valley a fortnight ago was a classic by any standards and that was only one of several games this summer in which the Broncos have made Super League's big guns sit up and take note. Our own game at The Valley was fast and furious and highly entertaining. And although we lost 28-22, our fifth successive defeat as injuries began to take their toll, we produced a vastly improved performance which set us up for a run of four wins out of the next five.

A lot of hard work and investment has been put

into the Broncos operation and we wish them well in their determined efforts to promote Super League in London.


Here at Watersheddings, we believe we took an important and positive step on the path of our own club's development last week and we launched our new scheme for apprentices and trainees, run in

conjunction with the Oldham Chamber of Commerce.

Andy Goodway, Alan McCurrie, Andrew Jackson and Brian Gartland are being specially trained to run the scheme, in which our young players will not only work full-time at the club on developing their rugby careers but will also study for NVQ's in sports and recreation.



WITH three games left - two of them at home - we have a chance to consolidate our mid-table position in Super League on the extent of our injury troubles at any one time. and I suppose that's not a bad position to be in considering our small squad and the appalling injuries we have had to

We have competed reasonably well over the course of this first Super League season, but if we have ambitions of moving forward as a club next summer we will have to find more quality and more strength in depth.

We need to be in a position to cope more adequately if we find ourselves in the middle of another injury crisis like the one we have had to contend with over the past few weeks. Injuries have ripped us apart all season. All clubs get them, but in all my career as player and coach I have never come across anything as bad as we have had to endure in the past

Rob Myler was hurt in the second game against Halifax and in the fourth game against Leeds, Afi Leuila broke his leg. Those two long-term injuries were to set the pattern for the rest of the summer. We have had three or four senior men missing on a regular basis and I put down our inconsistency to the fact that we have rarely had a settled team.

Our form has tended to go up and down in cycles, depending

We got three wins and a draw from our first five games, then we lost the next three before travelling to Workington last

Before we slipped to those three defeats by Castleford, St. Helens and Bradford, we were on the verge of pushing for a top-four place.

Indeed, we would have been almost there had we beaten Castleford, whom we were leading 16-4 at half-time and seemingly on our way to our fifth win in six games. Three defeats later, we were down to ninth place with only Leeds, Paris and Workington below us, so that shows how tight this Super League is and how evenly-matched the teams are if you take away the top three, Saints, Wigan and

No matter what happens in the last three games, however, we have done enough to retain our Super League status for next vear and that's the main thing considering that, prior to the season, we were being written off as no-hopers by a lot of people, including the bookies.



Don Yates looks back to a match from yesteryear.

London Broncos visit Watersheddings this afternoon still hopeful of claiming that fourth spot in the Super League table and with it the opportunity of reaching Old Trafford for the Premiership Final. Since their formation 16 years ago as Fulham, the London outfit have reached just one final, that being the Second Division Premiership Final of 1994.

In those days the team played under the name of London Crusaders being based at the Barnet Copthall Stadium. During the 1993-94 season the Crusaders made a determined effort to win promotion but ended the campaign in third spot. Workington Town went up as champions and were accompanied by Doncaster. Crusader's third placing gave them a home guarter-final against Keighley in the Premiership. They won that match with plenty to spare, South African winger Mark Johnson scoring a hat-trick of tries in the 66-12 victory. Workington in the meantime, had an equally comfortable passage, beating Rochdale 50-6. In the semi-finals, Workington registered an expected 19-4 victory over Batley but Crusaders pulled off a brilliant 16-6 win at Doncaster, one of only two home defeats suffered by the Dons throughout the campaign. The final, at Old Trafford, was expected to be a close fought affair. Crusaders had won 13-12 up at Derwent Park in the League campaign whilst the return match in Barnet had ended in a 20-20 draw. The teams for the final were as follows:

The decisive incidents in this match all occurred within the opening fifteen minutes. Workington began well with an early try from Ged Byrne. At that point Crusaders lost hooker Scott Carter who was replaced by Kris Smith. Two minutes later the Londoners were in front, winger Mark Johnson crossing for the first of his tries. John Gallagher's conversion put the Crusaders 6-4 in front. Sadly for them it was to be the only time that they were to lead in this final. Shortly afterwards scrum-half and play maker Mark Riley was injured and that handicap was to prove too much. Town took advantage and by half-time the Cumbrians led 24-6. Crusaders did stage a revival after the interval but Town were able to retain their advantage and lift the Premiership Trophy by 30pts to 22. Stuart Cocker (2). Tony Kay, Des Drummond and Mark Mulligan added to Ged Byrne's early try and Dean Marwood landed three goals for Town. Logan Campbell crossed for the Crusaders with John Gallagher scoring three goals to go alongside Mark Johnson's hat-trick.

The following season the Crusaders became the Broncos and twelve months after that they were 'fast-tracked' into the Super League. They have justified their elevation with a string of impressive performances which have left them on the brink of the play-offs. Can they finish the season with a flourish which will take them back to Old Trafford next month? We shall see.



On this day....

Don Yates recalls this day in history.

It was on this day in 1984, Saturday 11th August, that the British Schoolboys played the final match of their tour of Australia. Leichardt Oval, Balmain was the venue with Australia beating Britain 46-4. Winger Simon Moore scored the British try and included in the British touring party was a certain Paul Topping of Wigan Technical College.

Twenty-two years earlier, on Saturday 11th August 1962, the senior Great Britain outfit were beaten 27-8 by New Zealand in the second test at Carlaw Park, Auckland. It was a disappointing end to that 1962 tour by the Lions. They had won the test series in Australia but then lost both tests against a fine Kiwi side which included such talented players as full-back Jack Fagan, winger Brian Reidy, scrum-half Bill Snowdon, hooker Jock Butterfield and loose-forward Mel Cooke. This day also proved a successful one for the Kiwis in 1990 when, on Saturday 11th August, they defeated Papau New Guinea 18-10 in a World Championship qualifying match at the Lloyd Robson Oval, Port Moresby. With temperatures soaring into the high 30's, New Zealand found difficulty coping with the extreme conditions of heat and humidity. Former Oldham

loose-forward Mike Kuiti was a member of that side who must have been happy to collect the points in front of a ferociously partisan 10,000 crowd.

Staying with New Zealand, it was on this day in 1951 that the French touring team defeated Taranaki 23-7 before a crowd of 6,473 in New Plymouth.

Nearer home, it was on Wednesday, 11th August 1993 that Oldham signed the former Great Britain under 21 utility Shaun Irwin from Castleford. Irwin has made 49 appearances for the Roughyeds, including one appearance at hooker, and has scored 15 tries. He is currently at Hunslet where he moved on loan last May.

Finally, on Saturday 11th August 1956 Oldham put the final touches to their preparations for what proved to be their best ever season. They defeated Rochdale Hornets 34-5 at Watersheddings in the Law Cup charity match before embarking on a campaign which ended with the Lancashire Cup, Lancashire Championship and League Championship trophies joining the Law Cup in the Watersheddings trophy cabinet. Happy days.







I just cannot understand the experts who moan about so called unfair advantages that development area clubs enjoy. 

This afternoon's match is the 20th meeting between Oldham and the Londoners who have visited Watersheddings under the names of Fulham, Crusaders and now Broncos. Of the previous 19 meetings, Oldham have won 12, London have won six and one match has been drawn. As far as League competition is concerned, there have been 15 previous meetings with Oldham winning eight times, London six and one draw. Oldham's biggest two victories against the Londoners came during season 1989-90 when, as Fulham, the Londoners lost at home 40-10 with centre Charlie McAllister grabbing a try and six goals. Three months later Oldham won 52-4 at Watersheddings when another centre John Henderson crossed for four tries. London's biggest win at Watersheddings was their 10-0 success in December 1991 whilst their biggest home win over Oldham came last October when they beat Oldham 46-14 as the Broncos played their first match at the Valley.





NEWS From

Down Under...

RENEWED ATTACKS ON WARRIORS

The Auckland Warriors have come under renewed attack for their aggressive recruitment policy.

Moves on Gold Coast speed merchant Lee Oudenryn have provoked the struggling Chargers into lodging a formal complaint with the Australian Rugby League.

Under Clause 26 of the standard ARL players contract clubs are prevented from approaching any player still under contract without the written permission of his current club.

ARL public affairs manager John Brady said all teams had been warned against breaching that provision in a letter circulated on June 14.

Angry Gold Coast Chief Executive Paul Broughton claimed that Warriors coach John Monie had approached Oudenryn after the Aucklanders played at Carrara Stadium three weeks ago.

Whilst Monie denied personal contact with the winger he admitted that Auckland were "definitely interested" in the man who once beat Martin Offiah in a match race over 100 metres.

He said that Auckland Chief Executive Ian Robson had progressed discussions with Oudenryn during a business trip to Queensland last week.

The anti-poaching provision was agreed at a meeting two years ago

between club chief executives, the players' union and the NSWRL premiership committee before being written into the ARL's bye-laws. But Monie this week called the Gold Coast complaint "ridiculous". He said that every club with ambition was chasing players well before they came out of contract and claimed that ARL-loyal Manly and Sydney City were the pace-setters.

The Gold Coast, limited to a salary cap of only \$1.2 million dollars against around £4 million for most Super League clubs, have been rocked by late season raids on their best talent.

Five-eighth Shane Kenward is believed to have signed with St George and the Dragons are also understood to have been cited in the complaint to the ARL.

The other hot target is former Whitehaven, York, Hull KR, Bradford and Halifax star Dave Watson.

The controversial utility back has been in outstanding form this season and has revelled in the responsibility of the captaincy.

Canterbury are the club trying to woo Watson away from the holiday

strip but Coast officials hope they have countered that threat.

Meanwhile, Brady confirmed that the ARL had the power to disqualify, suspend or fine any person or club breaching its rules.

The Warriors will learn whether or not they face disciplinary action after the next ARL board meeting which is scheduled for August 12.



OVER To You

One of the season's most interesting developments at Watersheddings has been the growth of the youth policy.

Money talks at any level of a professional game, so there will continue to be times when a topclass boy from this area turns pro elsewhere. But never again can Oldham be accused of ignoring local talent or paying little heed to youngsters... not after all the hard work that has gone into the creation of a youth plan at Watersheddings in the past 18 months or two years.

Boys as young as 13 have now pledged their futures to Oldham Bears and while one can advance a good argument that 13 is too young... from the club's point of view AND the youngster's...this is the market place in which a club needs to be active if it is to keep pace with competitors.

With recruitment of youngsters like that, and the same applies to 14,15, 16 and 17 year olds, comes responsibility and it was encouraging to learn recently that the Bears have established an apprenticeship scheme to be run in conjunction with the local Chamber of Commerce.

Andy Goodway, Alan McCurrie, Brian Gartland and Andrew Jackson have gone "back to school" to learn how to become assessors and verifiers. The training costs money initially, but some of the cost will be paid for by the Chamber of Commerce and in the long term it will work out considerably cheaper than having to pay verifiers and assessors to come in from outside.

Those apprentices and trainees who are on the scheme will work full-time at the club on the development of their rugby careers while studying for National Vocational Qualifications (NVQ's) in sports and recreation.

Most professional soccer clubs have similar schemes, but they are comparatively new to Rugby League, although most of the top clubs are now moving in this direction.

The Bears have no intention of being left behind in the rush for young blood and, having taken youngsters on board, they want to give them the best chance of making a living from Rugby League while providing them with an alternative career route as back-up.
