Talking

AS we come to the end of the first Super League season, it is appropriate to look back over the course of the past few months and to look ahead to next year and beyond.

This has certainly been an eventful time both for Super League as a whole and the Oldham club in particular. Both at League level and more locally, we have passed through a massive learning curve which can only benefit the game as a whole in 1997. One of the main things we have learned is that supporters require a consistent time-table of venues, kick-off times etc and we will certainly do our best to provide this next year.

I think most people in the game will agree that the standard of Rugby League is higher than ever. The net result of full-time professionalism, superb playing

conditions in summer and Super League is the development of a sport that is now soaring to new heights on the field of play.

Anyone who went to Warrington last Friday night for our game at Wilderspool and then watched Sky TV presentation of the London-Wigan and the St Helens v Sheffield matches got a feast of fabulous football and the highest levels of sporting entertainment.

More quality players are needed because Super League is going to go better and better and will ultimately become a very

exclusive organisation for the elite of our game both here and in Europe.

I think it will be extremely difficult to get in as the years go by, so for a club like ours it is imperative that we do all in our power to retain our status while we have it.

So far, so good. We were given a slim chance of competing in Super League by many people. A lot of pundits said we would be battling against relegation, but we will finish comfortably outside the danger zone and it is only a few weeks ago since we had a realistic chance of ending up in the top six with an outside chance of taking fourth place.

We completed doubles over Halifax and Leeds - no mean feat - but there were occasions also when we let ourselves down, none more so than in the home defeat by Workington after we had led comfortably at half-time.

The size of our squad was questioned as injuries began to pile up. We have certainly had far more

than our share of injuries and one can only hope we will have better fortune next summer.

The game is going faster and faster, tougher and tougher, but players throughout Super League are enjoying being full-time professionals and this is reflected in the high-quality performances we are seeing week in and week out.

The one disappointing factor of the season has been in attendance figures. Frankly, crowds have been disappointingly low, but perhaps factors other than rugby have had a detrimental effect.

Locally, we have had to battle against uncertainty, particularly concerning the Watersheddings ground, the proposed new stadium and where we will be playing next year, if not here.

We can't predict what the future holds because

several parties are involved, but hopefully we will be able to offer better facilities next season and a more consistent time-table of matches and events which, in turn, should help us to pull in better support.

What a magnificent achievement it would be for the club, and what a great bonus for this town of ours, if we could establish ourselves as long-term and highly-successful members of Super League, thus projecting the town across the country, across parts of Europe and around the world, via


the Sky TV and News Corporation organisations. The Academy side is coming along nicely and it is already apparent to senior members of our coaching staff that several members of the side have an excellent chance of going a long way in the game. The Alliance side has probably suffered the most from our appaling luck with injuries, but still faces two trips to Humberside, following Friday's game at Salford, and one point should be enough to ensure Alliance Championship safety.

At Super League level, quality is the name of the game. There are fascinating prospects for Super League over the course of the next few years and if we all pull together to take our club forward I see no reason why Oldham Bears cannot be part of it. Thanks for your support during the season. I'm sure we can rely on it during the winter and I look forward to seeing you all again when we start up again with the Silk Cut Challenge Cup in the early part of February.

Memory Lane

After virtually twelve months continuous rugby, both Oldham and Sheffield will be looking forward to a refreshing break after today's final match of the 1996 season. Neither club will be involved in the Premiership play-off although that competition has happy memories for both the Roughyeds and the Eagles.

Indeed these two clubs met at Old Trafford in the Divisional play-off just four years ago. At the end of that 1991-92 season Sheffield lifted the Second Division Championship and with it promotion to the top flight whilst Oldham just missed going up, ending the campaign in third slot.

In the Divisional play-off quarter-finals Sheffield defeated a Keighley side playing their third game in five days by 72-14. Former Oldham favourite Charlie McAllister scored a hat-trick of tries in that game. Oldham defeated Dewsbury 36-18 at that stage whilst the other two quarter-finals ended in controversial fashion. London Crusaders beat Huddersfield 14-4 and then overcame an appeal lodged by the Fartowners who claimed that the Londoners had fielded more that their quota of overseas players. The League ruled that London would never pull a stroke like that!! The big shock of the quarter-finals was Batley's 15-6 win at Leigh. Four players were sent off in that match including Paul Topping. Obviously a case of mistaken identity.

The semi-finals saw Batley almost pull off another surprise before losing 36-22 at Sheffield whilst Oldham beat an Australian XIII - sorry London 22-14. The final at Old Trafford was expected to be a close affair and that proved to be the case. The teams for the final were as follows:

Unfortunately for Oldham Daryll Powell was in unstoppable form for the Eagles, especially in the opening 30 minutes. He scored two tries in the first quarter to put the Eagles 12-4 in front, Duncan Platt having scored a try for Oldham. At that point Powell was the victim of a high tackle from Ian Sherratt who was sent off for his part in the incident. Before half-time Powell had scored again to leave Oldham trailing 16-4 at the interval.

Despite their numerical disadvantage, the Roughyeds staged a revival early in the second half, Ged Byrne and Keith Newton scored tries which, converted by Tommy Martyn, put Oldham level at 16-16 on the hour. A David Mycoe try then edged Sheffield in front but a similar effort from Scott Ranson again equalised the scores. Oldham were now feeling the effects of the Sherratt dismissal and late tries by Tim Lumb and Keith Mumby plus three goals from Mark Aston, taking his total to five, made the final scoreline 34-20 in favour of the Eagles.

It had been a spectacular final between two teams who had played open, entertaining rugby to thrill the large Old Trafford crowd. We don't expect such a big crowd at Watersheddings this afternoon but, no doubt, the rugby will be of similar high standard.



On this day.

This weekend sees the start of the 1996-97 amateur season, a weekend which, in the past has brought both triumph and disaster. In 1990, for instance, Saturday 25th August saw Saddleworth Rangers lose 24-18 over at Leigh Miners whilst down at the Lancaster Club, Failsworth the now defunct British Aerospace squad were enjoying a bright start to the campaign. They defeated Lock Lane 22-12 with tries from Harry Maher (2) and Rick Clarkson plus five goals from the trusty boot of Bill

Way back on Saturday, 25th August 1928 Great Britain met New Zealand before a crowd of 21,000 at English Park, Christchurch. The Lions won this third test and therefore the series with a narrow 6-5 victory thanks to tries from Les Fairclough (St Helens) and Tommy Askin (Featherstone). Oldham had one representative on that tour, Bob Sloman, but he was not involved in this match.

Oldham had no players selected for the 1962 Australasian tour which called off for three matches in South Africa on the way home. On Saturday, 25th August 1962 the Lions played South Africa in Durban where they won 39-33. A lengthy injury list

caused British coach Shaun Hutton to turn out as a second half substitute in that match.

On 25th August 1965 Oldham travelled up to the Recreation Grounds to take on Whitehaven in a league match. They returned home with the spoils after beating the Cumbrians 12-0. Full-back John Winton scored a try and three goals whilst centre Stan McLeod crossed for the other try.

It was on Sunday 25th August 1985 that the inaugural Charity Shield was staged at the Douglas Bowl, Isle of Man. Despite heavy rain, there was a crowd of 4,066 to see Wigan defeat

The 25th August 1970 proved to be a successful day for the Barrow and former Welsh rugby union centre Keith Jarrett. He scored two tries and landed 11 goals as the Shipbuilders defeated Doncaster 64-2

Finally, it was on this day in 1993 that Oldham signed utility forward Iyan Green from St Helens on a free transfer. The former Golbourne (Leigh) junior made his debut later that month at Halifax and, to date, has made a total of 38 appearances for Oldham, scoring five tries.

It must be recognised however that 1st team calls take precedence over everything else. In the event the sides named on Wednesday night included 9 Academy players and four trialists.


Prior to the game the non arrival of two trialists again affected preparations and the seventeen man squad had to be boosted with two sixteen year olds, Simon Svabic and Jimmy Bownner coming onto the bench. With the confidence lifted Oldham settled into a controlled pattern of play and looked to be capable of increasing their lead. Against the run of play Chris North, the trialist centre from Dewsbury, had the ball stolen in a one man tackle just inside his own half. After stealing the ball the Warrington centre turned into an open field to run 40 metres unopposed to the corner. Wire followed this up with a good move direct from a penalty which the full back finished in the corner to bend the scores at 12-12.

Oldham did not let their heads go down and hit back when Gartland found Mike Prescott running into a large hole in the Wire defence. With minutes remaining of the 1st half Chris North, put Julian Mike in at the corner, again beautifully converted by Deacon to give Oldham a 24-12 1st half lead.

In the 2nd half Oldham competed for 30 minutes with a try direct from the scrum by Rob Myler matching another try by the Warrington full back. For the final 10 minutes Warrington had us under siege with a number of 50/50 decisions going their way. At a time when our young forwards were tiring fast I had no fire power on the bench to boost them, and the possession given to Warrington was made to count. ANDY HAY










NEWS From The



Thoughts from the

Terraces...


As we reach the end of the first Super League season, it is perhaps appropriate to look both backwards and forwards. Back, at what has been achieved. And forward, to what the future might hold.

Although there have obviously been disappointments, the predominant feeling must surely be one of genuine achievement on the pitch. With a small squad, and pitiful gate receipts, we have held our own in the rarified atmosphere of Super League. In the farcical Centenary season, we won eight games out of twenty, including 5 out of the last 6, to finish eighth in the table, equal on points with Bradford, and above both Warrington and London. We were also one of only two teams, (Leeds were the other!) to defeat Wigan. And then, in Super League itself, we have won eight and drawn one out of 21 today, and will finish no worse than 9th in the table. We have been stuffed only by the top three sides, twice each, and have doubles over Halifax and Leeds to our credit. First round defeats in both the Regal Trophy and the Challenge Cup were obviously very disappointing, in terms of revenue as well as on the field, but we must surely count our blessings, and thank the Goodway-led coaching staff for what has been achieved. Certainly, in comparison with the current situation in Cumbria and on Humberside, or at Featherstone, Leigh, Wakefield and Widnes, we have an awful lot to be thankful for.

When it comes to individuals, we all have our own views. The two half-backs have clearly been crucial in our successes, and

have worked incredibly hard, as has Paul Atcheson, who thoroughly deserves his inclusion in the GB shadow squad. Belle, for his unstinting effort, and Topping for his durability, also deserve honourable mentions. But for me, it is the grafters in the pack who cannot be praised too highly. Gildart, Temu, Clarke, Munro, Lord and Bradbury have all been remarkably consistent, and missed only a handful of games each, but I would have to regard Joe Faimalo as top man during the Super League season. There can't be many forwards throughout the league who have not missed a game, and his willingness to take on the opposition in both offense and defence, whatever the state of the game, has been inspirational.

Turning to the future, Mr. Lindsay's depressing failure to provide clear leadership means that no-one really seems to know where the game is going. But as far as we are concerned, the objective should be fairly clear. On the field, a bit of sensible team strengthening, and then hopefully a realistic stab at the top half of the table in 1997. Off the field, though, a major marketing effort is absolutely crucial. If we are to have a chance of sustaining a Super League place, we simply have to get the ground position sorted out, and produce crowds averaging at least 5,000, quickly, I would have thought. That presumably would mean a carefully structured and professional strategic plan, put together as soon as this season ends, and implemented with real commitment. See you in '97!





And stand-off Jason Bell who is switching to Parramatta next year made some exciting breaks, scoring a try after regathering his own kick midway through the second half. Captain allan Langer was one of the few Broncos players not to blot his copybook.
