


The message has come through loud and clear. We need to look seriously at our game, plot and plan its restructure and develop an environment in which we can produce a lot more quality professionals.

DON YATES LOOKS BACK TO A MATCH FROM YESTERYEAR

When Great Britain visited Australia in 1914, they opened the tour in Adelaide, at the Hawthorne Oval, where a crowd of 2,000 saw Britain defeat South Australia 101-0 Oldham's Alf Wood landed 15 goals in that match but the opening weeks of the tour were not so comfortable for the tourists who encountered no end of administrative and injury problems.

The first test was switched from Queensland to Sydney and put back eleven days to a date just 48 hours before the second?

Britain won that first test 23-5

despite a mounting injury list but
Australia hit back to level the series
with a 12-7 victory two days later.
Unbelievably, the third test was
brought forward six weeks and
played at Sydney Cricket Ground
the following Saturday. The Lions
management complained bitterly at
the prospect of playing three tests in
eight days with a depleted squad but
the message from England
instructed them to play and added,
'England expects every man to do
his duty'.

They did more than that. Before a crowd of 34,420 the following two teams line up to do battle: Australia: Howard Hallett: Bob Tidyman. Wally Messenger, Sid Deane, Dan Frawley; Chook Fraser, Pony Holloway; Frank Bruce, Sandy Pearce Don Sullivan, Tedda Courtney, Bob Craig & Bill Cann. Great Britain: Alf Wood (Oldham), Frank Williams (Halifax), Harold Wagstaffe (Huddersfield), Billy Hall (Oldham), Willie Davies (Leeds): Stuart Prosser (Halifax), Fred Smith (Hunslet), Chick Hanson (Widnes), Percy Coldrick (Wigan), Dave Hooland (Oldham), Doug Clark (Hudderfield), Dick Ramsdale (Wigan) & Jack Chilcott (Huddersfield).

Britain's misfortune was carried over into the third test in the opening minutes winger Frank Williams suffered a twisted ankle and Doug Clark broke his thumb later in the half. With no substitions in those days, both players carried on. The muddy conditions caused by weeks of rain in the Sydney area, suited Great Britain. They took an early led when Alf Wood landed a penalty but then spent much of the match on desperate defence.

Tedda Courtney had a try disallowed and both Frank Burge and Wally Messenger went close but Britain held out and then increased their lead before the interval. First Willie Davies was awarded a penalty try which Alf Wood converted and Wood then added a penalty. Half time and Britain led 9-0.

The opening ten minutes of the second-half could have proved disastrous for the tourists. Doug Clark added a broken collar bone to

his broken thumb and was taken off. He was followed by Frank Williams who aggravated his ankle injury and then Billy Hall was carried off with concussion. With only ten men on the field, britain's task looked hopeless but remarkably, the tourists extended their lead. Harold Wagstaffe made the decisive break and Chick Johnson, a second-row who had been switched to the wing, carried on the attack by dribbling the ball half the length of the pitch to score. Alf wood again converted and to the astonishment of

everyone present, Britain led 14-0. The depleted British side could just not hold out for 30 minutes and late on centres Wally Messenger and Sid Deane scored tries nevertheless Great Britain had won 14-6 and the Ashes were on their way to England. The heroic performance of the British team was not lost on the Australian press. The match was named the 'Rourke's Drift' test after a famous battle in the Zulu War of 1879 when 80 British officers fought of 4,000 Zulu warriors at Rourke's Drift settlement. One leading Sydney writer put the initials 'RD' behind each players name after future appearances. Their efforts that day have gone down in Rugby League history and it is only right that we should recall them from time to time.

- 4 Elias Paiyo Made Australian first grade debut for RAMS this season. Joined Adelaide from Wadag, Enga Province, Port Moresby. Played for Papua New Guinea in '95 World Cup and was named Captain of Papua New Guinea in three Tests in 1996. Plays half back and hooker.
- 5 Jason Donnelly Kiwi international who made late start to season following knee reconstruction in 1996. Tough, hard playing winger who joined RAMS from St. George where he made his first grade debut in 1992. Donnelly was pursuing an athletics career, training with Olympic decathlete Daley Thompson, before deciding on Rugby League. Had two seasons with Keighley (UK) in 1990 and 1991.


representative. Made debut with Parramatta in 1994. Playing 36 first games from 1994-1996. Hernia operation has kept Marty on sidelines for most of 97 season.

- 44 Joe Tamani Australian born Fijian who played rugby union with Randwick in 1995 before trialling with St. George. Strong winger with good hands and made an impact during one season with Bradford Bulls in 1996 before returning to Adelaide. Played one Test for Fiji against Great Britain in 1996. Represented Fiji at 1997 World Nines. Has missed five games because of ligament damage to an ankle.
- 50 Andrew Peirce Has missed the last six weeks of competition with a knee injury, Played with Cronulla from 1993 1996, making his mark with 19 first grade games last year. Played in Reserve Grade grand finals with Cronulla in 1994, '95 and '96. Youngster with promising future.
- 51 Luke Williamson Joined RAMS from Brisbane Wests. Originally in RAMS Under 19's team for season '97 but promoted to first grade squad. Made first grade debut against Auckland in round four of Telstra Cup season. Represented Old Under '19's (1996 1997) and played for Australia (Under 19's) in this year's test against New Zealand. Has played centre and 5/8th.

TASTE THE ACTION

ON THIS DAY...

DON YATES

It was on this day in 1981, Saturday 25th July, that Papua New Guinea staged their first official test match. Boroko Oval Port Moresby was the venue with France providing the opposition. The visitors led 10-6 at half-time but the Kumuls hit back to force a 13-13 draw before a sell-out crowd of 14.000.

France have been involved in international competition since 1934 but their introduction to this game all began at a Management Meeting of the Rugby Football League in Leeds which was held on Tuesday 25th July 1933. At that meeting it was decided to attempt to spread the game in France, following the severing of relations between the French Rugby Union and the Home Unions because of alleged professionalism within French rugby circles. A match was arranged between Great Britain and Australia in Paris and that led to the game eventually becoming established in France.

Rugby League had been played in England since 1895 with regular tours

to Australia having been undertaken since 1910. It was during the 1914 tour that the British Lions met Auckland on Saturday 25th July with the tourists winning 34-12. Oldham had three tourists on that trip and all three played and scored in the match. Prop Dave Holland scored two tries centre Billy Hall one try whilst fullback Alf Wood landed five goals. The British Lions were back in Auckland on Saturday, 25th July 1970 when they completed a 3-0 whitewash of New Zealand by winning the third test 33-16. Oldham had only one tourist that year, second-rower Bob Irving but he played in that Auckland test although failed to get on the scoresheet. One player who frequently figured on the scoresheet was that brilliant inside back Brett Kenny. It was on this day in 1993, Sunday 25th July that he broke the Parramatta appearance record with his 259th first grade match for the Eels. Unfortunately Kenny failed to score that afternoon as Cronulla won 14-12 at Parramatta

but Kenny did score 110 tries during his record 265 club matches. That very same afternoon, Sunday 25th July 1993, centre Steve Renouf equalled the Brisbane club record of four tries in a match. His four tries came in a 38-18 home victory over Canterbury which incidentally, was watched by a crowd of 54,751. That Brisbane club record has been achieved on four occasions, and each time their scorer has been Renouf. It was on 25th July 1908 that the now defunct Cumberland club of Sydney suffered their biggest ever defeat when they lost 45-0 to North Sydney. Cumberland existed for only one season, 1908 during which time they won only one of their eight matches and finished bottom of the Premiership table. Finally, it was on this day in 1978, Tuesday 25th July that the World's first test tube baby, Louise Brown, was born just across the road from

this stadium at the Royal Oldham

Hospital. Happy Birthday Louise.

The latest recruit to Oldham is ball playing loose forward Ian Russell. He is an experienced player who has spent the biggest part of his career playing with Illawarra. Russell played in 110 first grade matches for the Steelers. Only eight players have made more appearances in the history of that club. It was during his Illawarra days that Russell spent the 1991-92 winter season here in England playing for Sheffield Eagles. Russell made 17 appearances that season with the Eagles and scored three tries. He was loose-forward in the Eagles team which lost 24-14 at home to Oldham in October of that year. In 1995 when the North Queensland club was formed, he was recruited by the Cowboys and to date he has made 12 appearances for them. Last June he enjoyed a short spell in Europe where he played in three Super League matches for Paris St Germain. Although he was with PSG when they visited Boundary Park, he was absent from their line up. However, he is now at Boundary Park on a more permanent basis and we wish him well as he assists Oldham to maintain their Super League status and perhaps enjoy a lucrative run in September's Premiership competition. As the professional season reaches an exciting climax, the amateur game gets out on its winter season this weekend with the first of the pre-season Challenge competitions. Tomorrow afternoon the action begins over at Dewsbury Moor where an eight club knock-out competition it staged involving Conference League clubs. The draw for the tournament had not been made at the time these notes were compiled but tomorrow two quarter-final ties will be played, kick-off Ipm and 3pm. The other two quarter -finals will be staged next weekend, Saturday 2nd August with the two semi-finals the week after, (Saturday 9th August). The final is on Saturday 16th August with a 2.30pm kick off.
