However, they do have a home quarter final, finishing second in the European pool behind Wigan and now likely to face Cronulla.

Despite taking a fourth minute


6-0 lead from a magnificent try by Wes Cotton on his debut, London never fully got to grips wth the Aussies.

Cotton opened the scoring running through on to a pinpoint kick over the top by Josh White. London held on to the lead until the 17th minute when quick handling created the chance for Shane Marteene to score a try

for the Bulldogs, converted by Halligan.



The last word went to the Bulldogs in the last minute of the game. Full back Rod Silva broke through the London defence from inside his own half and raced away to score. Halligan's conversion ensured the 22-42 win for the Bulldogs.


Penrith. How different is the structure here? I don't really know too much about how the game is being run

over here, but it is quite obvious changes have to be made, but the administrators are talking tough about making changes. I guess we will have to wait and see.


Do you think London is a Rugby League force here to stay?





sional centre - who started his professional career with Widnes. With little first team experience behind him he was snapped up by Wigan. He then joined Oldham for the start of the Stones Centenary Season. Paul has regularly gained representative honours - initially with Gt. Britain at Academy and Under-21 levels and more recently with Wales.

2 SCOTT RANSON WINGER

Scott has been a regular for the Bears for the past five years during which time he has scored over 50 tries. Started his career with the St Helens-based Thatto Heath club before moving into the pro' game with Swinton with whom the former amateur international scored 69 tries.

3 DARREN ABRAM CENTRE

It's a double take! The life and times of Ranson and Abram have run in parallel. Both born within a week of each other 30 years ago next month, they both had spells with Thatto Heath before turning pro. Abram has arguably been the most successful, a regular try scorer during his time with Oldham and earlier with east Lancashire rivals Rochdale Hornets. Darren spent the early part of his career with Warrington and had a season with both Chorley and Trafford. The similarities continue. like Ranson centre Abram has also scored over 100 career tries.

4 PAUL TOPPING CENTRE

It's a treble take! The third ex Swinton player on the Bears books. Paul had a spell with Swinton a la Ranson and Abram. He was also with Leigh for part of his career and has been a prolific goal kicker in his prime. A schoolboy tourist to Australia he has since represented Lancashire. A good utility player able to play stand-off and loose forward.

5 ROB MYLER WINGER

A player who has been unlucky with injuries during his time with the Bears. Spent the early part of his career with Warrington where he was a regular try scorer. Now also frequents the full back position. A £50,000 buy for the Bears after he had a loan spell with Salford.

FRANCIS MALONEY STAND OFF

The Yorkshire-born stand off - son of former Hull and York player John Maloney - is a product of the St John Fisher club in Dewsbury and has just passed

the century mark for the third consecutive season with the Bears. He scored 113 points in 1995-6 and in the first Super League season scored 116 points - he is already well on his way to a personal record. A former schoolboy international he joined Leeds on turning professional and has since had spells with Featherstone and Warrington, A Gt. Britain international at Under-21 level.

7 MARTIN CROMPTON **SCRUM HALF**

The organiser behind the Bears. A good tactician who is now in his fifth season with the Bears after service with Warrington and then Wigan. Martin made his 100th appearance for Oldham in the Boundary Park match against London Broncos in April. The captain of the Bears and a member of the Gt. Britain Nines squad earlier this year, he was a member of the Irish team which played against France early this season.

8 IAN GILDART PROP FORWARD

A former player with Wigan and then Wakefield, lan has won representative honours including county and international recognition at Schools and Colts level,



and gained Gt. Britain Under-21 honours against the French on no less than six occasions between 1988 and 1990. Ian joined the Bears at the start of the Centenary season and - at the time of writing these notes - he was still looking for his first score in Oldham colours.

S JOHN CLARKEHOOKER

A former BARLA international John gained extensive recognition in the amateur game, twice winning the Youth Player of the Year award. During his time with the East Leeds amateurs he also toured Australia with the BARLA Under-18 team and, since turning professional with the Bears, he has gained Gt. Britain Under-21 recognition - against the 1994 Kangaroos.

10 JASON TEMU PROP FORWARD

Jason has missed the early rounds of Super League II through injury but on his day he can be one of the biggest impact players in the game. Originally with the Maris club in New Zealand he moved into the 1994 Lions Red Cup competition with the Counties-Manukau outfit. He represented New Zealand Residents during their 1995 tour of Australia and was a member of the Cook Island team which lifted the 1995 Emerging Nations Championship. Jason joined Oldham in 1994.

11 GARY LORD SECOND ROW

One of the most experienced players in the Oldham ranks. Gained BARLA honours at Under

19 level before joining Castleford. In those days he was a Full-back and during his time with the Wheldon Road club he gained one Gt. Britain Under-21 cap. Moved to Leeds, Halifax and then Oldham where he has developed into a very good second row forward.

12 JOE FAIMALO SECOND ROW

Brother of Esene - the current Salford forward who previously played with Widnes and Leeds. Joe has also had spells with different English clubs, first with Workington Town before moving into Lancashire where he made his Oldham debut as long ago as the 1991-92 campaign.

13 DAVE BRADBURY LOOSE FORWARD

A product of the amateur game in the Leigh area Dave has been at the Oldham club since the 1991-92 campaign - but his service to the Bears may be coming to an end as he has been placed on the transfer list recently at his own request at £200,000. Dave was a member of the 1996 Gt. Britain tour party to the South Pacific where he scored two tries in his four outings. He was one of the "non-Test" team but looks set for a full international debut at some stage of his career.

14 MATT MUNRO UTILITY FORWARD

Australian who joined Oldham for the start of the first Super League season. Spent the 1995 Australian season with Sydney Tigers where he made 11 appearances - all from the substitutes bench. Generally a back row forward but can also fill in at hooker.

15 PAUL DAVIDSON SECOND ROW

One of the many amateur products who have moved away from Cumbria to find fame. Originally with Whitehaven club Hensingham he journeyed south to Widnes. The move to Oldham was made in 1994 and the second row forward - who has occasionally turned out at centre - recently chalked up his 50th appearance for the Bears. A consistent try scorer he recently grabbed a pair in the excellent Visa World Club Challenge victory over North Queensland.

18 HOWARD HILL LOOSE FORWARD

18 CHRIS MCKINNEY FORWARD



22 VINCE FAWCETT CENTRE



27 DAVID STEPHENSON HOOKER



IN TITE LOGIZER ROOM

Brisbane-born Stephanie Rea joined Broncos as club physio while travelling round the world. A job a girl would die for?

For Stephanie Rea the opportunity to become physio to the Broncos while in the middle of doing the 'overseas thing' on the other side of the world, was too good to miss.

But is it a job a girl would die for? With her easy going nature Steph is neutral to the macho 'locker room' mentality. Although she could tell a few 'bare' truths, Steph spends most of her waking hours making sure players don't get injured in the first place or recover as quickly as possible.

With what could loosely be termed an injury crisis, we spent last week following Steph.

Saturday: 10am start for a first team squad session at Staines. Normally no big deal for Steph but a late night changes all that. House mate David Krause ensures everyone knows about Steph's hangover. Then it's off to the Alliance game at Wasps against Wakefield.

Sunday: Brisbane Broncos loom. Steph normally escapes fairly lightly with a late start for evening kick offs. The Academy game goes well but the first team game is a different matter. Bruised and battered Broncos suffer serious injuries to Spencer and Tollett. Steph encourages the guys to rehydrate and pack in the carbohydrates.

Monday: Recovery session for the first team squad at Richmond Pool - swim, stretch and stock take of injuries. Steph goes back to The Stoop to tend to the



injuries and liaises with the club doctor to arrange visits to the specialists.

Tuesday: The first group are in the gym at 8.30am stretching followed by a weights session. Steph usually spends the time in the treatment room depending on the injury load or checks on individual rehab programmes.

Then it's back to the club where the electrotherapy machines are called on. Steph also confirms training programmes with the coaching staff to suit injuries before heading to Staines to put plans into action. Back to The Stoop for more treatment sessions for the nonsquad Academy and Alliance players before 6.30pm training.

Wednesday: A ball work session for the first 17 at Staines. Steph cadges a lift with the promise of breakfast! Back to the club where the masseur is busy.

Thursday: A change to the training programme sees a few

appointments being rescheduled. A relatively quiet day on the treatment table, Steph catches up on some paperwork and organises food/drink and masseurs for the Canterbury game. In the afternoon a stream of customers ensures time passes quickly until the 6.30pm session.

Friday: Match day again, there is no let-up. Steph doesn't need to be at the ground until 4pm.

Saturday: A sweat and stetch session starts the weekend and Broncos enjoy a football match as variety. The Oldham match only three days away. Then it's back to Wasps for the Alliance.

"The job does involve long days, little contact with other women and a non-existant social life but it is rewarding," says Steph. "Besides if it doesn't work out I can always take out litigation on some of the players and live off the profits, or maybe I can market that locker room diary I've been writing..."
