The Panther are a top outfit - but on Monday, Saints showed their true grit. They looked dangerous with the ball and their defence kept shape - and that was the most pleasing aspect. They could have capitulated at 30-10

Everyone of Shaun McRae's men put in the graft to keep the dream alive - and if they play with that passion in their remaining Super League matches, the oppositions will be in for a rough ride.

Man for man, Saints possess a top quality outfit and on their day can match any side. Even in the Australian Super League, not many sides will score 26 points at Penrith.

So with brisbane looming, we should look at that game with optimism. Okay, with Steve Renouf, Wendall Sailor, Kevin Walters, Alfie Langer and Co the task is monumental.

But as I say, miracles can happen.

I MUST say I have been disappointed with the coverage of the game on our national newspapers.

There has been no close season - and as a result, RL and the fans have suffered. It just makes you glad that the game is now played in summer. Because what would happen in the winter when football has well and truly kicked in? Add to that the 'other' oval ball game's mega exposure - the answer would be not much.

SHAUN McRae had never been as pleased with a defeat before. But after the Saints - Penrith reverse, you had to spare a thought for the Panthers. Played six, won six - and out! Life's not fair - but coach Royce Simmons was not complaining - he knew the rules beforehand.

But is seems a shame that the likes of multi-talented Ryan Girdler and Sid Domic will play no further part in the championship.

Girdler is a class act to say the least and his personal points tally passed over the ton over the six games.

He is definitely a star of the future and when the Kangaroos come over this Autumn, he will be one to watch - that's for sure.

welcome to OLDHAM BEARS

Saints opponents for this evening's Super League encounter are Oldham Bears. The Bears are currently bottom of the Stones Super League table. Tonight's game is the first of four very vital encounters for Saints against each of the bottom four outfits. On Wednesday third bottom Paris St Germain visit Knowsley Road in the World Club Challenge play off. Next Sunday Saints visit 2nd bottom Castleford at Wheldon Road and the following weekend visit 4th bottom Warrington at Wilderspool. Each game will be very difficult with Saints unable to afford to slip up.

At present the Bears have three wins and a draw for a total of 7 points from their 17 Super League matches. They are only one point adrift of Castleford Tigers and Paris St. Germain and three points behind Warrington and Wolves. With only 5 games remaining and only one for the drop each of the Bears remaining games are of vital importance for them. They have had a disappointing season to date but this must be put behind them during the Super League run in if they are not to be relegated.

Oldham's victories have been over Paris St. Germain 19-18 and Salford Reds 19-10 at Boundary Park and Sheffield Eagles 18-14 at Don Valley Stadium. Their draw was a 12 all effort at home to Castleford Tigers. The Bears losses have been against Bradford Bulls 18-30, London Broncos 22-32, Halifax Blue Sox 29-30, Leeds Rhinos 26-43, St. Helens 30-34 and Sheffield Eagles 20-21 on their home ground and on their travels at Leeds Rhinos 22-32, Salford Reds 26-35, Warrington Wolves 18-28, Wigan Warriors 10-44, Bradford Bulls 28-42, Castleford Tigers 20-25 and London Broncos 28-36.

In the World Club Challenge Oldham have been eliminated. They did win a match though - beating North Queensland Cowboys at home 20-16. Their losses were 2-18 at home to Adelaide Rams and 16-54 at the Cowboys and 14-42 at the Rams.

In coach <u>BOB LINDNER</u> Oldham have one of Australia's finest players. He took over from a former Gt. Britain star <u>ANDY</u> <u>GOODWAY</u> mid way through the campaign. Bob is very shrewd and knowledgeable and his coaching skills are ever so slowly coming to the fore during the games. The Bears are competitive. They are an entertaining outfit. They need to learn how to win however - how to kill a game. Three of their Championship losses have been by less than 4 points whilst a further 6 defeats have been by 10 points or less. Their squad for this evening's game are as follows:-Occupying the last line of the Bears defence is outstanding full back <u>PAUL ATCHESON</u>. A former Blackbrook Amateur, Paul joined Widnes in 1990 before joining Wigan and then Oldham in June 1995 for £50,000. Patch's main strengths include his speed and strength together with his eye for a gap. Having represented Gt. Britain at Academy and U'21 level he is also a full Welsh international.

AFI LEUILA is the Bears tough tackling winger. Needs little introduction to the St. Helens faithful as he spent a rather frustrating time at Knowsley Road during 1994. Became a Bear following spells at Counties Manukau in New Zealand and North Queensland. Afi, noted for his phenomenal strength whilst in possession of the football and his intelligent support play played Rugby Union for Tonga. With injuries to DARREN ABRAM and VINCE FAWCETT, the Bears have struggled somewhat in the centres during the last couple of months. Darren has always been a prolific try scorer with Oldham whilst Vince crossed for a hat trick of tries for the Bears against Saints at Boundary Park earlier in the season. HOWARD HILL has answered the call and in the centre position has turned in some fine displays. Equally at home in the Back Row, Howard joined Oldham from Hensingham ARLFC in July 1994 following BARLA international honours. A Great Britain U'21 representative, Hill could be destined for full international honours in the future. LUKE GOODWIN is equally at home in the three quarters as well as at half back. It is in the centre position however where he has recently been playing. At 24 years of age Luke is a matchwinner who

joined the Bears last November from Perth Reds. A clever ball player and magnificent place kicker, Goodwin has previously played for Canberra, Penrith, Parramatta and Canterbury. Also in competition for a position in the centres this evening are <u>MIKE NEAL</u> the former Parkside and Wigan St. Patricks Amateur who joined the Bears from Wigan in 1985. <u>PAUL</u> <u>TOPPING</u> the former Leigh threequarter noted for his prolific points scoring and JIMMY COWAN</u> who is just making his name at 1st Grade.

On the left wing is likely to be <u>DAVID JONES</u>. David is another former Wigan St. Patricks Amateur who joined Oldham from Wakefield Trinity in 1993. He is very fast and a big favourite amongst the crowd. David has spent the last two summers playing in Townsville, Australia and last winter back

> at Wigan St. Pats. The other wingers competing with AFI LEUILA and DAVID JONES are SCOTT RANSON, the Bears former Lion's prolific try scoring wing who hails from Thatto Heath ARLFC, and former Warrington star ROB MYLER.

FRANCIS MALONEY is Oldham Bears stand-off and positional kicker. A product of the St. John Fisher Amateur club in Dewsbury, Francis joined Leeds in 1990. He moved

onto

Featherstone Rovers in 1992 and won Gt. Britain U'21 honours whilst with the Post Office Road outfit. He joined Warrington in 1994 but did not settle so he moved onto Oldham for £50,000 in July 1995. He is now in addition to being the Bears main play maker, the club's no. 1 goalkicker, who has been their top scorer over the last couple of seasons. Scrum half, captain and orchestrator of most of Oldham's attacking moves is MARTIN CROMPTON. Former Warrington and Wigan star, who joined the Bears in September 1993 for a bargain £35,000, Martin has become one of the side's main players. A brilliant organiser and tactical kicker, Martin has been a regular in the Irish team over the last couple of years and played for Gt. Britain in the World Nines earlier this year.

In the forwards the Bears are also very competitive. Due to an unfortunate knee injury sustained last week during training by main prop forward <u>BRETT GOLDSPINK</u> which rules him out for the rest of the Super League campaign. <u>IAN GILDART</u> and <u>JASON TEMU</u> will face Saints this evening. Ian is a very hard working lad who is a workhorse of the Bears puck. A former Wigan and Wakefield Trinity favourite he joined Oldham in August 1995 for £45,000. A Great Britain U'21 international, Jason hails from New Zealand. At 25 years of age he joined the Bears from Counties Manukau. At 16 stone 6 lbs he is a huge man who is a very powerful running prop forward. The king of the big hitters, Jason has become a firm favourite with the Oldham crowd.

In competition for the hookers jersey are JOHN CLARKE and DAVID STEPHENSON. John is the Bears current no. 1 hooker. A former East Leeds Amateur he joined Oldham in May 1993. Excels in the dummy half role. John's main assets are his distribution skills, his broken field running from acting half back and his tenacious defence. Clarke toured Australia with BARLA in 1993 and represented Gt. Britain U'21s against the touring 1974 Kangaroos. David is equally at home at hooker or in the Back Row. At 25 years of age he is a versatile player who always gives 100%. At present David plays most of his 1st Team rugby off the bench and has proven to be a more than useful impact player. He joined the Bears in February 1992 from Queens Park juniors in Leeds. In the 2nd Row for the Bears PAUL DAVIDSON is currently enjoying a fine run of form scoring a brace of tries in the recent World Club Championship win over North Queensland Cowboys and in Oldham's narrow Super League loss at Castleford Tigers. A very hard-working player, Paul is at his best when making his very strong powerful runs out wide amongst the three quarters. A product of Hensingham ARLFC in Cumbria, Davidson signed pro for Widnes in 1990, before ioining Oldham in 1994 for £17,000. Paul's Second Row partner will be JOE FAIMALO. An ever present during Super League in 1996, Faimalo is a product of the Eastern Suburbs club in New Zealand. He had brief spells at Workington Town. Oldham and Swinton during 1991-92 without doing anything special. He returned home and enjoyed success with Hawkes Bay which prompted his return to Oldham in 1994. His determination and stamina since then have made him one of the mainstays of the Roughyed pack.

With <u>DAVID BRADBURY</u> currently unavailable for selection new signing <u>IAN RUSSELL</u> and <u>MATT MUNRO</u> are in competition for the loose forwards jersey. Ian hails from Australia. He is a very tough and uncompromising player who always gives 100%. Possessing a fine pair of hands, once he settles into the Oldham outfit, Ian will establish himself as one of Super Leagues finest Back Row Forwards. Matt is equally at home playing in any of the Back Row positions. A very fast forward, Matt has a terrific workrate. Hailing from Australia Munro joined the Bears from Sydney Tigers at the start of the 1996 season and has quickly established himself as one of Oldham's most consistent performers week in and week out.





His powerful burst enabled Paul Newlove to cross the whitewash for a fine second half touchdown. Jovnt was closely followed by Kieron Cunningham, who put in a fine performance in the loose. Yet the side still failed to control the ball in far too many sets of sixes to come

It looked distinctly like a two-man tackle to me as the ball was knocked out...but the referee waved play on and Auckland were off to a dream start! The second try should also have been disallowed courtesy of a blatant obstruction earlier in the movement. Yet you got the feeling that the Saints were not going to get anything out of this match as once again they were pulled back for offside. This fellow seemed to be pulling us back twelve metres. Compare this to the much more realistic 8/9 metres in the London/Brisbane match and you wonder whether we will ever get consistency. Alan Hunte was subjected to a most dangerous tackle, which went totally unpunished. Most tackles which end up as 'spears' are totally unintentional. So what! It is still dangerous play and should be penalised without hesitation. Please don't get the impression that I


Where **DO WE STAND?**

After the qualifying rounds of the Visa World Club Championship where do European Super League clubs stand? That is the question taxing some of the best minds in the British game following what can only be described as a handsome beating by the Australian and New Zealand clubs. As far as St. Helens are concerned the visit of the Oldham Bears right after the return

from Australia is a perfect illustration of the difficulties the Euro game is experiencing. St. Helens are a proven force in Super league with attendance records of five figures while the Bears have been forced by debt to sell their traditional home Watersheddings and move in with their soccer neighbours Oldham Athletic at Boundary Park.

Now the Bears have to rely on their gates and what few commercial activities they can work up because they no longer have their own income streams.

Without your own ground there is no chance of taking bar receipts and of staging the other money-raising activities associated with modern professional sport. While Saints have their own financial



headaches - doesn't every club in the league these days - they are spared Oldham's situation.

Without sufficient cash the Bears cannot afford the players the need to challenge for the top in Super League while they have been perennial strugglers both in First Division and Super League regimes. It is a great shame because Oldham is a 'rugby town' and their position at the bottom of the Super League is starting to look very serious. But there is a message for other clubs in the Bears' troubles. Financial problems can hit anybody and once you are on the slippery slope it is very difficult to pull back.

That is why clubs such as Salford Reds and Hull Sharks were so excited when they earned promotion to Super League as First Division champions. Besides playing at the top level they have the greater financial rewards from News Corporation cash and the ability to raise more money from sponsorship and related activities. Just look what is happening down the road at Naughton Park where the Widnes Vikings appear to be in serious trouble following their relegation to the Second Division. They are the perfect illustration of what can happen when things start going wrong for your club.

Australian coach lack Gibson once said that a successful club starts with a good front office. And his words are coming back to haunt many a British club who find themselves at odds with the bank manager. On the field it is back to square one and many a well-paid player should be looking to himself after European clubs just won eight matches in the qualifying rounds. The Rugby League has played its part in the in-depth self examination by asking its Technical Director to investigate why Down Under players look better than ours. I say look because there is a school of thought that our players are mentally cowed by the Australian players even before the kick off. Whether I subscribe to that theory I'm not prepared to say. Let's just say the results speak for themselves.





Chapter of **DISASTER FOR DEAN**



The team may have had its ups and downs, but there is one ill-fated Saints' star who would have moved heaven and earth to have been on the club's World Club Challenge

venture to Australia and New Zealand. Spare a thought for back-row forward Dean Busby, who had to forego his trip of a lifetime due to suffering a broken leg after being on the field just two minutes at Oldham - and only a fortnight before Saints jetted out to Sydney. The sickening injury is the latest in a catalogue of misfortune that has dogged 24 year old, 6ft 1in 15 stone Dean since being transferred from Hull to Knowsley Road in readiness for the launch of the Centenary Season in 1995. For he was destined to break a bone in his hand on his 'A' team debut but he bounced back into action, only to then endure medical ligament damage to his knee in Saints' Silk Cup win at Castleford on the day Shaun McRae took charge.

This meant a 12-week spell on crutches and with it intensive physiotherapy and rehabilitation for the popular 'Buzz' - as he is known to his team mates - before he was ready to resume playing once more when the Warrington Alliance side visited Knowsley Road. It is now a matter of painful history for luckless bachelor Busby that tragedy reared its ugly head once more when he snapped the cruciate ligaments of the other knee after 10 minutes and that, as they say, was that for the remainder of the 1996 campaign.

Never a man to submit easily, Dean spent last winter yet again travelling the often-rocky road back to full fitness, and his perseverance was rewarded when, after several reserve team games, he found himself on the first team bench against Auckland Warriors and Cronulla Sharks.

Busby also starred for the full 80 minutes when short-handed Saints won at Halifax but, being naturally anxious for regular Super League rugby, he requested a transfer and a fee of £75,000 was placed on him, but a proposed deal with Salford failed to materialise. However, given such an encouraging return, it appeared that the playing fortunes of Humberside-born Dean were finally enjoying an

upsurge, as indeed they were until that traumatic - albeit innocuous - tackle in the 76th minute at Boundary Park. The diagnosis was that the ankle was dislocated and the fibia fractured, which meant Dean Busby was well and truly 'plastered' from foot to thigh and was refused permission to travel on medical grounds, and his reservation on Singapore Airlines Flight No. SQ377 to Australia went to teenager Jason Johnson. Small wonder that Great Britain Under-21 star Busby, who has also played for England against Wales in 1992 and was then, conversely, in the Welsh World Cup squad, wonders when the tide will turn on a Saints' career so far decimated by an injury jinx.

"It's been a difficult two years for me at Knowsley Road, with missing out on successive Wembley triumphs among my greatest disappointments," said former building worker Dean who has made 18 full appearances and nine substitutions, scoring three tries en-route. "But there is little point in being a doom-andgloom merchant and I am keeping my fingers crossed that I steer clear of further injury in 1998 in order to show supporters what I am really capable of."

We'll drink to that!

The Club was formed in 1993 by a group of rugby league enthusiasts who felt that it was time the youth of the area had a chance to try their hand at rugby league.

The Australians had not lost on British soil since Great Britain won the second test at Bradford in 1978, a remarkable winning run of 32 matches. The coveted Man of the Series awards went to Kevin Ward and Wally Lewis.




